By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Arthur Lyulph Stanley, Knight Commander of the Most Distin-guished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependen-cies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

"An Act relating to the Adjustment of Rents in respect of certain Licensed Victuallers' Premises affected by the operation of the Intozicating Liquor (Temporary Restriction) Act 1915 and to the Rebate of certain Fees under the Licensing Acts and for other purposes."

"An Act to facilitate Marriages between British Subjects resident in Victoria and British Subjects resident in the United Kingdom."

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria, at Melbourne, this first day of De-cember, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and fifteen, and in the sixth year of the reign of His Majesty King George V.

Evidence Act 1915.

EXAMINATION OF APPLICANTS FOR LICENCE AS SHORTHAND WRITERS.—REGULATIONS.

THE Public Service Commissioner, pursuant to the THE Public Service Commissioner, pursuant to the provisions of section 130 of the Evidence Act 1915 (No. 2647) hereby makes the following Regulations for determining the nature or character, standard, and requirements of the examinations or tests to be applied to applicants for licence as Shorthand Writers, and submits the same for the approval of the Governor in Council, in lieu of Regulations hitherto made, which we hereby revoked: are hereby revoked:-

1. Examinations shall be held at such times and places as may from time to time be notified by the Public Service Commissioner in the Government Gazette and in two newspapers.

2. Every applicant shall, prior to admission to examination, produce to the Commissioner satisfactory evidence-

(a) Of name in full.
(b) Of having attained the age of 21 years.
(c) Of good moral character.

- 3. Every applicant who has produced the aforesaid evidence, and who shall, before such examination, forward to the Commissioner a postal note for Ten shillings and sixpence, being fee for the examination, may be admitted to the examination.
- 4. Before an applicant can be registered as qualified for licence he must pass, to the satisfaction of the examiners, examinations in-
 - (a) Rapidity and correctness in writing shorthand.(b) Rapidity and correctness in transcribing short-

hand notes.

(c) Rapidity and correctness in reading shorthand

5. The standard required for passing shall be-

5. The standard required for passing shall be—

(a) To write correctly from the examiner's dictation 600 words at the rate of 120 words a minute; five minutes in all.
(b) To transcribe at once in longhand, legibly and correctly, without abbreviations, in 24 minutes, the passage written from dictation under sub-clause (a).
(c) To write correctly in shorthand from the examiner's dictation, 1,500 words at the rate of 150 words a minute; ten minutes in all. The writings of all candidates shall be collected at once, without revision.
(d) To read aloud correctly to the examiners, in not more than 20 minutes, the paper written in accordance with sub-clause (c).

While condidates are under commission no committee the standard of the

6. While candidates are under examination, no communication between them will be allowed.

- 7. Immediately after each examination the examiners shall forward to the Commissioner a return, signed by every examiner, of the names of those candidates who satisfied the examiners thereat.
- 8. Candidates who may have passed the examination to the satisfaction of the examiners shall be registered as qualified for licence as shorthand writers in the Law
- Courts.

 9. Notwithstanding the conditions imposed in the preceding Regulations, any applicant for licence as a Shorthand Writer who at the time of such application is the Government Shorthand Writer, or a member of his staff, or of the Victorian Hansard Staff, and who may have served on either of such staffs as a shorthand writer for a period of five years, and who shall produce evidence of his fitness satisfactory to the examiners, may, on the certificate of such examiners, and without further examination or test, be registered as a person qualified for licence as a Shorthand Writer in accordance with the Evidence Act 1915 (No. 2647).

I N pursuance of the provisions of section 40 of the Fruit Act 1915 (6 Geo. V. No. 2657), the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth order and make Regulations as

INTERPRETATION.

1. In the construction of these Regulations the following terms, that is to say: "cool store," "cool stores area," "fruit," "machinery," "orchard," "owner," "prescribed," and "Trust" shall, if not inconsistent with the context or subject-matter, have the respective meanings assigned to them in the said Act.
"The secretary" shall mean the person for the time being acting as secretary to any Trust.
"The Act" shall mean the Fruit Act 1915 (No. 2657) and any Act amending the same.
"Minister" shall mean the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the Act, and shall, unless the contrary intention appears, be deemed to include any Minister for the time being acting for or on behalf of such Minister.
"Government Representative" shall mean any member of a Trust nominated by the Minister and appointed.
"Member" shall mean any member of a Trust elected by the owners of orchards. The singular shall include the plural, and the masculine shall include the feminine. 1. In the construction of these Regulations the follow-

FORMATION OF TRUSTS.

2. Every instrument signed in pursuance of section 5, sub-section 2 (a) of the Act shall be in the form set forth in Schedule A to the Regulations or to the like

offict.

3. The scale of every map or plan prepared in pursuance of section 5, sub-section 2 (c) of the Act shall be any scale not less than two inches to the mile.

THE NOMINATION AND APPOINTMENT, THE TERM OF OFFICE AND THE RESIGNATION OF REMOVAL OF MEMBERS OF, AND THE FILLING OF VACANCIES IN, TRUSTS.

4. The nomination of any person by the Minister to be 4. The homination of any person by the Minister to be a Government representative shall be in writing, and his appointment or removal shall be by Order in Council published in the Government Gazette.

The term of office of every Government representative shall (subject to the Act) be that set forth in the Order in Council appointing him or in any subsequent order amending the same.

5. The term of office of members shall be as follows:— As soon as may be after the Trust first meets the Trust As soon as may be after the Trust first meets the Trust shall divide the members into two classes as nearly equal in number as practicable. Such classes shall be formed from a list compiled in order of the lowest number of votes received at the election, and so upwards; and the half (or approximate half) of the candidates who shall stand lowest on such list shall form the first class and the remainder shall form the second class; and (subject as hereafter provided) the places of members of the first class shall become vacant at the expiration of the first year, and the places of those of the second class at the expiration of the second year, from the beginning of their term of service, and afterwards the places of members shall become vacant at the expiration of two years from the beginning of their term of service. If, within three calendar months after any such first election, any Trust shall not have made such division, the Minister may, by writing under his hand, and to be notified in the Government Gazette, make the same.

The election to fill vacant places shall be made in the year at the expiration of which the places are to become vacant.

vacant.

For the purpose of these Regulations the term of service of a member shall be taken to begin on the 1st day of July following the day of his election, except in the case of the first election, when it shall be taken to begin on the day of his election and notwithstanding anything in these Regulations contained, the terms of service of all members elected at such first election shall have added to them the period between the date of their election and the next ensuing 1st day of July.

Members appointed under section 11 (1) of the Act shall, for the purposes of these Regulations, be deemed to be elected.

The provisions of the second paragraph of sub-section (2) of said section 11 shall apply to all members appointed under said sub-section (1) or elected to fill a racanev.

Any Government representative or member may resign his office by notice under his hand delivered to the Chair-man or Secretary of the Trust, who shall forthwith note thereon the day and hour of its receipt by him and-transmit every such notice to the Minister.

The secretary shall also forthwith send notice, in writing, to the Minister of the vacation of any seat under section 15 of the Act, which notice shall contain full particulars of the name of the person vacating such seat and the day (and if possible the hour) of such vacation and the ground thereof.

FOR THE ENBOLMENT OF PERSONS ENTITLED TO VOTE IN THE ELECTION OF MEMBERS OF TRUSTS, AND FOR THE CONDUCT OF THE ELECTION OF SUCH MEMBERS.

Conduct of the Election of such Members.

6. The Minister shall cause to be prepared a roll of the names of all persons entitled under the Act to vote as owners of orchards. This roll shall be certified by the Minister as being a correct compilation of 'the names of owners of orchards entitled to vote as by the Act provided. Such roll shall be available for inspection by any person at the most centrally-situated post-office in the Trust area to which it relates continuously for fourteen days at least 'prior to the holding of the first election of members of such Trust.

Notification of the intention to so make the said roll.

Notification of the intention to so make the said roll so available shall be given by advertisement in the Government Gazette, and in at least one daily newspaper generally circulating in the Trust area, not more than fourteen, nor less than seven, days prior to its being made so available.

The Minister may at any time, not less than 48 hours prior to the holding of any such first election, amend any such roll by adding thereto or removing therefrom the names of any persons as owners of orchards so entitled

All such amendments shall be dated and initialed by the Minister.

The Minister may, by writing under his hand, delegate any of his duties or powers under this Regulation to any

Such roll shall be used at the election of members, and shall remain in force until a new roll has been prepared and revised as hereafter provided.

The secretary shall, between the 1st and 6th days of June in each year, make out, according to the form in Schedule B hereto, or to the like effect, a roll of the names of owners of orchards entitled to vote in the elec-

names of owners of orchards entitled to vote in the election of members of the Trust, and shall arrange such roll according to the alphabetical order of surnames contained therein, and shall state in such roll against the name of each person the several particulars indicated in the several columns of the said schedule.

In compiling any such roll all detached orchards of any owner shall be considered as one orchard only.

The secretary shall forthwith, after making out the said roll, notify by advertisement in the Government Gazette, and at least one daily newspaper generally circulating in the Trust area, that such roll is in his custody and available for inspection at the Trust office, and shall keep such roll to be inspected by any person at all reasonable hours between the 6th and 10th days of June in each year. in each year.

Any person whose name has not been included on any such roll, and who claims to have his name inserted therein; and any such person or any person whose name has been inserted in such roll, and who claims that the name of any other person ought or ought not to be included therein, may, on or before the said 10th day of June, give or send by post to the secretary, and also give or send by post to the last known address in Victoria of any person affected by such claim notice, in writing, of such claim, stating the particulars of the grounds of such claim, and shall sign the same with his name; and the secretary shall cause a list to be prepared of all such

claims.

The said roll, together with the said list of claims, shall The said roll, together with the said list of claims, shall be submitted for revision by the secretary to a police magistrate sitting in a court of petty sessions in the Trust area (or if there be no such court within such area, then at the court of petty sessions nearest to the Trust office) at such time as the police magistrate shall appoint between the 10th and 20th days of June in every year; and the police magistrate shall, at the expense of the Trust, give three days' notice at least of the holding of a court for such revision and of the time and place thereof, by advertisement in the Government Gazette and in some dealy newspaper generally circulating in the and in some daily newspaper generally circulating in the

The police magistrate shall, after proof of due giving of the requisite notice of claim as aforesaid, insert or

retain in the said roll under revision, or remove there-from, the name of every person named in any such claim who is proved to his satisfaction to be entitled or liable or disentitled or not liable, as the case may be, to be inserted in the said roll.

The police magistrate shall initial all alterations so made by him in the said roll, and sign and certify the same, and forthwith deliver the same to the secretary, who shall keep the same at the Trust office, where it shall be available for inspection by any person at all reasonable times.

Every election of a member or members of a Trust shall be held before some person, hereinafter called the Re-turning Officer, who shall be some person appointed by the Minister by notice in the Government Gazette.

The Returning Officer may appoint a deputy to assist him or to act in his room at any such election; and such deputy may do all or any of the acts or things which the Returning Officer is hereby authorized or required to do.

No person who acts as Returning Officer or as his de-

puty at any such election shall be, or become, a candidate at such election.

Until the establishment of a Trust office every election of members shall be held at such place within the Trust area as the Returning Officer shall appoint (and the expense of providing which shall be borne by the Trust); thereafter every such election shall be held at the Trust

Fourteen days at least before any such election the Returning Officer shall give public notice thereof by advertisement in the Government Gazette and in some daily newspaper generally circulating in the Trust area, and by such notice shall require all candidates at such elec-tion to be nominated at some place within the Trust area (and which place, after the establishment of a Trust and which place, after the establishment of a Trust office, shall be such office), and between the hours of 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. on some day, before or on the day of nomination, which day of nomination shall be not less than three nor more than six days after the time of giving such notice and named therein; and any person desirous of nominating a candidate shall, before 4 p.m. of the day of nomination, cause to be delivered at the place aforesaid to the Returning Officer or his deputy, a nomination-paper in the form in Schedule C hereto or to the like effect; and such nomination-paper shall be signed by not less than five persons eligible to vote at such election, and also signed by the person named therein as a candidate in token of his assent of his being so named.

If, at the expiration of the time limited as hereinbefore provided for the nomination of candidates, the number of persons who have become candidates as aforesaid does not exceed the number of members then to be elected, the

If, at the expiration of the time limited for the nomination of candidates, the number of candidates exceeds the number of members to be elected, the Returning Officer shall forthwith cause ballot-papers to be printed or typewritten with the christian names and surnames of all the candidates in full in the form in Schedule D hereto, or to the like effect, and shall forthwith give public notice, by advertisement in the Government Gazette and in some daily newspaper generally circulating in the Trust area, stating the names of the persons so nominated, and that a poll will be taken (at the place to be named therein) for the election of such members on the day appointed for holding the election and named in such notice, and such poll shall take place accordingly, and shall commence at 1 p.m. and close at 8 p.m.

sp.m. Such notice shall be published not more than fourteen days, nor less than seven days, prior to such election.

Not later than 4 p.m. four days before the day so appointed for such election any candidate may, by notice in the form or to the effect set forth in Schedule E hereto, signed by him and by at least two of his nominators, and delivered to the Peturonia Officer or his depuits withdress. delivered to the Returning Officer or his deputy, withdraw his nomination, and the election shall then proceed as if he had not been nominated; and the Returning Officer shall, if necessary, crase his name from all ballot-papers already prepared.

Each candidate shall be entitled to appoint, in writ-

Each candidate shall be entitled to appoint, in writing, one scrutineer to be present at the polling place, and such scrutineers and the Returning Officer and his deputy, and any voters not exceeding six in number actually engaged in voting, and to be named if necessary by the Returning Officer or his deputy, shall alone be permitted at any one time to enter or remain in the polling place. The Returning Officer or his deputy shall provide in every polling place sufficient pencils for the voters; and also a locked box, to be called the ballot-box, with a cleft or opening therein capable of receiving the ballot-papers, and such box shall be opened and exhibited to the poll clerks and scrutineers before the polling begins, and then locked and kept locked until the poll is concluded, and shall stand on a table opposite the Returning Officer or deputy, who shall keep the key of such box,

The Returning Officer or his deputy shall deliver to The Returning Officer or his deputy shall center to every voter who shall require the same a ballot-paper in the form aforesaid and initialed by the Returning Officer or his deputy, and every such voter shall, without leaving the booth, strike out from such paper the name of every candidate for whom he shall not desire to vote, but so as to leave uncancelled a number of names of candidates neither more nor less than the number of vacancies dates neither more nor less than the number of vacancies to be filled; and in case any voter shall be unable to read or write, the Returning Officer or his deputy, if required, shall, in view of such one, if any, of the scrutineers as such voter may desire, strike out the names as such candidate may designate; and after such names shall be so struck out the ballot-paper shall be forthwith deposited in the said box.

Before delivering any ballot-paper to a voter the Returning Officer or his deputy shall write upon the back of each such ballot-paper, as near as practicable to the lower edge thereof, the number corresponding to the number set opposite to the voter's name in the roll of voters, and shall thereupon upon such roll, or a copy thereof, check off such voter's name as having voted.

If any voter shall cause or suffer to remain upon his ballot-paper a greater or lesser number of names than the number of members to be elected, the vote given on and by such paper shall be void and of no effect.

At each election the Returning Officer or his deputy may, if he see fit, or if required so to do by any candidate or scrutineer, shall put to any person tendering his vote either or both of the following questions:—

Immediately upon the close of the poll the Returning Officer or his deputy shall proceed, in the presence and subject to the inspection of any poll clerks and of any scrutineers of the candidates as shall please to be present, to ascertain the number of votes for each candidate, and such Returning Officer or deputy shall abstain from inspecting the number written as aforesaid on any ballot-paper, and take care that the same is not seen by any person before being sealed up as herein provided; and the Returning Officer or his deputy shall immediately make up under the inspection of the said scrutineers a list of the total number of votes for each candidate.

The Returning Officer shall forthwith, after the The Returning Omeer snail forcawish, after the declaration of the poll, cause the sealed parcel of ballot-papers to be indorsed with a description of the contents thereof signed by him, and forward it to the Trust, which shall cause them to be safely and secretly kept for six months and then to be destroyed.

If at any election no members, or a less number of members than is necessary to fill the vacancies, to fill which such election was held, shall be elected, the Returning Officer shall notify the same forthwith to the Trust and also to the Minister.

When an extraordinary vacancy occurs in the office held by any member, the same course of procedure shall be adopted in and about the election of a person to fill such vacancy as in hereinbefore prescribed for an election to fill an ordinary vacancy.

All the expenses of and incident to the holding of any election shall be borne and paid by the Trust, and shall be recoverable in a court of petty sessions. No moneys shall be paid by the Trust for refreshments in connexion with the conduct of any election.

THE APPOINTMENT, TERM OF OFFICE, RESIGNATION OR REMOVAL OF THE CHAIRMAN OF ANY TRUST.

The appointment of a chairman shall be by open

voting.

The term of office of a chairman shall be twelve calendar months, from the 1st day of July in the year of his appointment, provided always that, as to the chairman first elected, he shall have added to his term of office the period between his appointment and the 1st day of July then next ensuing.

A chairman may resign his office as chairman at any time by writing under his hand and handed to the socretary.

Every chairman shall vacate his office as such upon ceasing to be a member.

Any chairman may be removed from office by a unani-

Any chairman may be removed from office by a unanimous vote at a full meeting of members. The absence of such chairman from such meeting shall not preclude the same from being considered as a full meeting.

Any vacancy in the office of chairman may be filled in the same manner as that prescribed for the original appointment of a chairman.

Any person appointed to fill such vacancy shall hold office as long as the person in whose place he was appointed would have held office if he had continued in office, and no longer. office, and no longer.

V .- THE REGULATION OF THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE MEET-INGS OF TRUSTS AND THE KEEPING OF MINUTES OF SUCH PROCEEDINGS AND THE GIVING OF AND FORMS of Notices.

8. The Trust shall cause entries of all its proceedings, with the names of the Government representatives and members who attend at each meeting, and the names of all persons voting upon any question for the decision of which a division is called, to be duly made from time to time in books to be provided for the purpose, which shall be kept by the secretary under the superintendence of the Trust; and every such entry shall be signed at the meeting next succeeding the meeting at which such pro-ceeding or attendance has taken place, by the chairman of such meeting; and every such book shall at all reason-able times be open to the inspection of any Government

able times be open to the inspection of any Government representative or member and by any creditor of the Trust or his agent at the Trust office.

The Trust shall meet when and as often as it may appoint; provided that it shall hold one meeting at least in each calendar month.

All meetings of the Trust shall be held at the Trust office when established, and meanwhile at any place within the Trust area appointed by the chairman, subject to the approval of the Minister.

Any person on the voters' roll-shall be entitled to be present in the room where any such meeting may be held, but shall not take part in interfere with, or interrupt such meeting.

terrupt such meeting.
All powers vested in the Trust under the Act may be All powers vested in the Trust under the Act may be exercised at any meeting holden in pursuance of the Act by any four members present thereat (and for the purposes of this Regulation the word "members" is to be deemed to include a Government representative) or by any smaller number forming the major part of the number of members for the time being assigned to the Trust; and no business shall be transacted at any meeting of the Trust unless the said number of members be respectively Trust unless the said number of members be respectively

Where there is an equality of votes upon any question it shall, unless otherwise provided by the Act or by these Regulations, be decided by lot.

At all meetings of the Trust, save where it is otherwise

herein provided, all members (including Government re-presentatives) shall vote, and the questions there con-sidered shall be decided by open voting and by the ma-

sidered shall be decided by open voting and by the majority present, subject to the casting vote of the chairman, as provided by the Act. Every person declining to indicate his vote shall be deemed to vote in the negative. No Government representative or member shall vote upon or take part in the discussion of any matter in or before the Trust in which he has, directly or indirectly by himself or his partner, any pecuniary interest. The Trust may from time to time adjourn any meeting; and if at any meeting there be not a quorum present within half-an-hour of the time appointed for holding the same, the secretary may adjourn such meeting to

ing the same, the secretary may adjourn such meeting to any time not further distant than seven days from the date of such adjournment.

No resolution of the Trust shall be revoked or altered at any subsequent meeting unless written notice of the intention to propose such revocation or alteration be given to each member of the Trust (including Government representatives) seven days at least before holding the meeting, nor unless such revocation or alteration be determined upon by a majority consisting of two-thirds of the members (including Government representatives). of the members (including Government representative) present at such subsequent meeting, if the number present at such subsequent meeting be not greater than the

number present when such resolution was come to, or by a majority if the number present at such subsequent meeting be greater than the number present at such former meeting.

Notice of all meetings shall be given by the secretary at the times and in manner directed by the Trust.

The provisions of Part XI. of the 13th Schedule to the Local Government Act 1915 shall be and are hereby adopted at regulations applying to Trusts; provided that the words "council" and "municipality" wherever therein occurring shall respectively mean "Trust," the word "Act 1915 and any Act amending the same, the word "councillor" wherever therein occurring shall mean the Fruit Act 1915 and any Act amending the same, the word "councillor" wherever therein occurring shall mean "member" (including Government representative), the words "municipal clerk" wherever therein occurring shall mean "secretary," the word "ratepayer" wherever therein occurring shall mean "owner of an orchard."

VI.—THE ACCOUNTS OF TRUSTS AND THE AUDIT THEREOF.

9. Every Trust shall keep such accounts as shall be prescribed or approved of by the Minister. Such accounts shall be audited once at least every year.

Every auditor shall be appointed annually by the Trust subject to approval by the Minister. Vacancies for any unexpired period of an auditor's term may be filled in the same manner. If any vacancy shall occur and remain unfilled for one calendar month, it may be filled by the Minister.

VII.--SECRETARY'S DUTIES.

10. The secretary shall be in attendance at the Trust office at such hours as from time to time may be appointed by the Trust for that purpose, and be present at all meetings of the Trust. It shall be his duty to superintend the affairs of the Trust under the directions of the Trust. The secretary shall keep the books and accounts of the Trust in a neat and orderly manner; he shall conduct the correspondence and issue all summonses, take the minutes of all meetings for business, and read them, and make a report of all matters that come under his cognisance for the information of the Trust. He shall consult the chairman in any business requiring attention between the various meetings, and be responsible for the safe custody of all books, documents and property belonging to the Trust, which shall be under his control; and he shall find security in such sum as the Trust shall require in some fidelity or guarantee company, the premium upon which shall be paid by the Trust. 10. The secretary shall be in attendance at the Trust

Trust.

The secretary shall present to the Trust a monthly statement showing the receipts and expenditure for the past month, and shall also, in the month of June in each year, prepare and present to the Trust an annual balance-sheet showing the exact financial position of the affairs of the Trust.

All moneys of the Trust amounting to £10 and upwards shall, within 72 hours, or such shorter period as the Trust may direct, after they have come to the hands of the secretary or other proper officer of the Trust, be paid into such bank and in such manner as the Trust shall from time to time appoint and direct for that purpose; and no such money shall be drawn out of such bank save by cheque signed by any two members (or Government by cheque signed by any two members (or Government representative) and countersigned by the secretary.

VIII.—THE REMUNERATION OF MEMBERS OF THE TRUST.

11. Each of the members (including Government re-presentatives) shall be entitled to be paid out of the Trust funds an attendance fee of Ten shillings for each meeting of the Trust attended by him at which a quorum is present. Not more than one fee shall be paid to any such member (or representative) in respect of any one day. No such member (or representative) shall be en-titled to receive or be paid in any one year more than Twenty-six pounds.

- AND MANAGEMENT OF THE PORTION OF THE
RESERVE FOR PUBLIC PURPOSES IN THE

- 1. No person shall enter or remain on the "Foreshore Reserve" who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
- 2. No person shall damage in any way the trees, marram grass, or other vegetation in the Foreshore Reserve, nor light any fires, or burn any materials therein.
- 3. No person shall climb or jump over any of the fences in or around the Foreshore Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, seats, or other improvements therein, or otherwise disfigure, injure, or destroy the said fences, trees, seats, or other improvements. improvements.
- 4. No person shall put in or on the Foreshore Reserve any cattle, goats, pigs, horses, or vehicles.
- 5. No person shall erect any dwelling-house or tent in the Foreshore Reserve, nor any booth or other structure, nor offer for sale any article therein without permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first ob-
- No person, except labourers or workmen employed in the Foreshore Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantation of young trees, shrubs, or grass.
- 7. No person shall moor any boat in the Foreshore Reserve without the permission of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 8. No person shall erect any bathing-box or any boat-shed in the Foreshore Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first ob-tained, and such permission may be granted subject to such terms, fees, and conditions as may be deemed de-sirable by the Committee of Management.
- Every person bathing from the Foreshore Reserve shall be decently attired from neck to knees in a two-piece Canadian costume.
- 10. No person clothed in bathing costume shall sit, lie, loiter, or run on the Foreshore Reserve, but shall proceed in a direct line from the water to the dressing
- 11. No person shall throw, or cause to be thrown, any stone or other hard substance in the Foreshore Reserve, and no person shall play cricket, hockey, rounders, golf (or any similar game), with a hard or solid ball, nor play football upon the Foreshore Reserve.
- 12. No person shall drive or ride any motor car, bicycle, or other vehicle in the Foreshore Reserve.
- 13. No person shall, between the hours of 8 a.m. and 11 p.m., ride any horse in or bring any horse in to the Foreshore Reserve, nor within the said hours bathe any horse from the said Foreshore Reserve.

14. All persons using the closets provided by the Committee of Management on the foreshore shall pay such charge for the use of same as shall from time to time by fixed by the said Committee of Management.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 181 of the Land Act 1915, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for such offence; and any person who knowingly or wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may forthwith be apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.
