IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Act 1915, the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of manufacturing (except in Flour Mills) cereal foods, condiments, spices, coffee, chicory, or cocoa, has made the following determination, viz.:—

#### OVERTIME.

5. That any employé who works for any time in excess of 48 hours in any week shall be paid for such extra time at the rate of time and a half.

### CASUAL LABOUR.

6. That casual employés, i.e., persons who are employed during any week for not more than one-half the maximum number of hours fixed in this Determination as a week's work, shall be paid at the rate of time and a quarter.

#### SPECIAL RATES FOR SUNDAYS AND PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.

- 7. That the special price or rate of payment to any person for all work done on-
  - (a) Sundays;

(b) on the undermentioned public holidays (that is to say):-

#### PIECE-WORK.

8. The Board determines under the provisions of sub-sections (1) and (2) of section one hundred and forty-four of the Factories and Shops Act 1915 (No. 2650), that any employer may fix and pay piecework prices or rates to any person employed in the process, trade, or business of manufacturing (except in flour mills) cereal foods, condiments, spices, coffee, chicory, or cocoa provided that such employer shall base such piece-work prices or rates on the earnings of an average worker working under like conditions, and such piece-work prices or rates shall be fixed so that an average worker can earn not less than the wages rate fixed by the Board for such work.

"Apprentice" means any person under 21 years of age bound by indentures of apprenticeship or any person over 21 years of age who, with the sanction of the Minister, is bound by indentures of apprenticeship (Act 2650, Section 3).

"Improver" means any person (other than an apprentice) who does not receive a piece-work price or a wages rate fixed by any Special Board for persons other than apprentices or improvers, and who is not over 21 years of age, or who, being over 21 years of age, holds a licence from the Minister to be paid as an improver (Act 2650, Section 3).

#### 3. That-

- (a) the lowest rates which may be paid to apprentices or improvers; and
- (b) the proportionate number of apprentices or improvers who may be employed in any factory or place


#### PIECE-WORK.

6. The Board determines, under the provisions of sub-sections (1) and (2) of Section 144 of the Factories and Shops Act 1915, that any employer may fix and pay piece-work prices to any person employed in the process, trade, or business of a maker of candles, provided that such employer shall base such piece-work prices on the earnings of an average worker working under like conditions, and such piece-work prices shall be fixed so that an average worker can earn not less than the wages rate fixed by the Board for such work.
