WHEREAS by the *Justices Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1105) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, at any time after the passing of the said Act, make, and when made, rescind, alter and add to, rules in relation to the matters in the said Act mentioned: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby rescind the List of Fees in Courts of Petty Sessions, and in proceedings before a Justice or Justices made under the provisions of the *Justices Act 1890* aforesaid, and bearing date the 24th day of February, 1910, and doth substitute therefor the List following, that is to say:—
