BY-LAW No. 55.

A By-law for the providing of proper receptacles for
the temporary deposit of household refuse, made under
Part 3 of the *Health Act 1890*.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health
Act 1890*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the
City of Brunswick orders as follows:—

(1) The occupier of any house or premises within
the City of Brunswick shall, when so required
by notice in writing or print, signed by an
inspector of such Council, provide and keep
in such house or on such premises a receptacle
of the kind hereinafter specified, or as many
such receptacles as may be necessary for the
deposit of all the house and yard refuse from
such premises, and shall cause all such refuse
to be placed in such receptacles with the least
possible delay, and kept effectually covered
until such refuse is removed from such house
or premises. Such receptacle or receptacles
shall be placed so as to be conveniently
accessible to the persons charged with the
duty of removing the contents of same.

- (2) Every such receptacle must be of a size not exceeding 3 cubic feet in capacity, must be watertight, and constructed of galvanized or plain sheet steel, with a proper fitting cover or lid. The said receptacle shall be in every respect similar to patterns which can be inspected at Town Hall.
- (3) Every person who shall commit a breach of this By-law shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10) and not less than Five shillings (5s.).
- (4) This By-law shall have operation throughout the whole of the municipality of the City of Brunswick.

We hereby certify that the foregoing By-law No. 55 was duly made and passed by the Council of the City of Brunswick on the 26th day of October, 1914, and was confirmed on the 23rd day of November, 1914; and that a copy of the foregoing By-law No. 55 was posted in a conspicuous place on the door of the office of the Council, Sydney-road, Brunswick, from the 28th day of November, 1914, to the 5th day of February, 1915, in order to conform with the requirements of section 33 of the *Health Act 1890*.

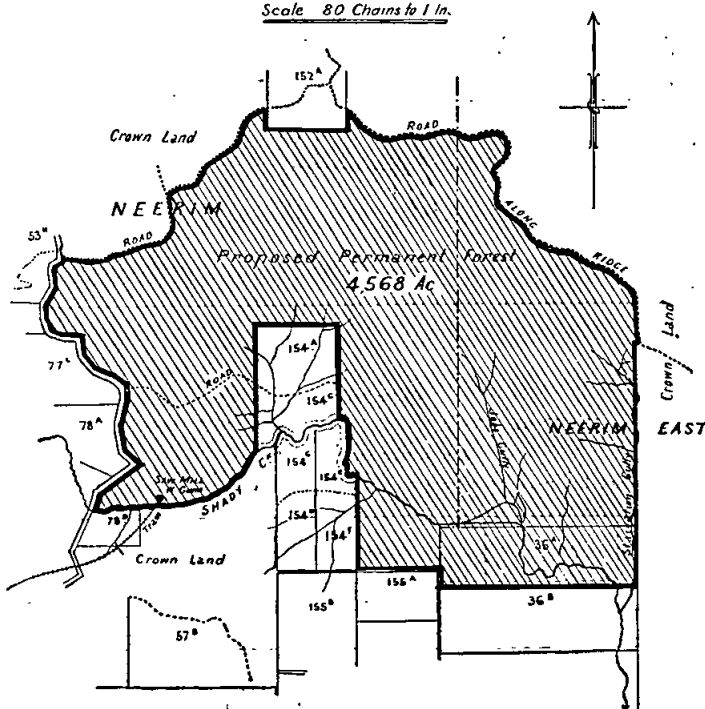

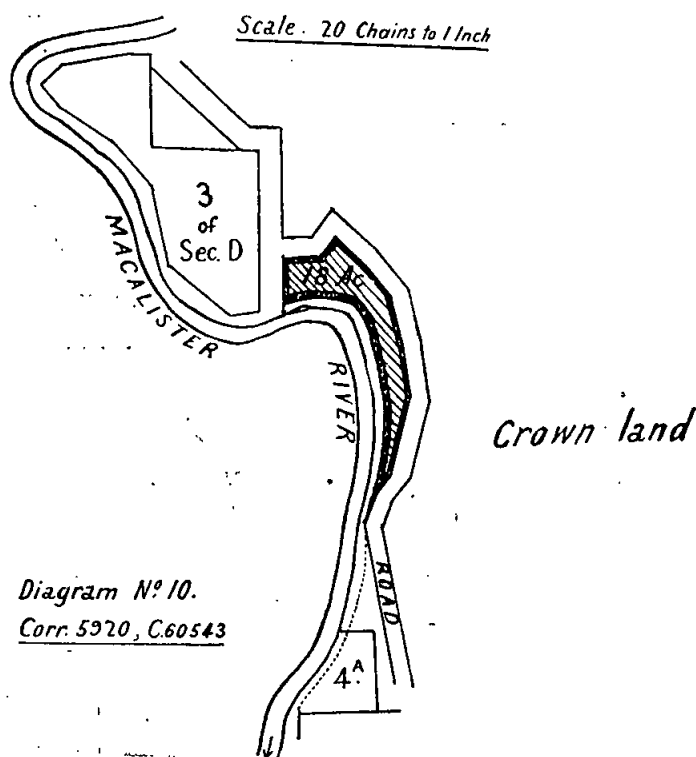

Land Surveyors Act 1895.

REGULATIONS FOR EXAMINATIONS FOR LAND SURVEYORS AND ISSUE OF LICENCES TO SURVEY.

REGULATIONS approved by the Governor in Council, 8th November, 1910, are hereby rescinded, and the following Regulations are substituted therefor:—

1. Examination of candidates for certificates as surveyors will be held in Melbourne in the months of March and September of each year, and at such other times as may be deemed advisable.

2. A candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

(a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for the examination, due notice of which will be given in the *Government Gazette*.

(b) An examination fee of £2 2s., which must be paid on or before the date of examination.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no certificate will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of 21 years.

4. A candidate shall produce satisfactory evidence as to character.

5. (a) A candidate shall have served under articles, or other similar agreement, with some qualified surveyor or surveyors, for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field; and shall produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

NOTE.—Applies only to candidates whose articles or other similar agreements were entered into prior to 1st March, 1910.

(b) Or he shall have passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed under articles or other similar agreement with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

(c) Or shall have passed the examination for the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, and have been professionally employed under articles or other similar agreement in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

(d) Or shall have passed the examination for the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at the Melbourne University on examination in which a representative of the Surveyors Board acted as co-examiner, and shall have been at some time professionally employed in the field for a period of eighteen months on work satisfactory to the Board.

6. In addition to evidence of service, a candidate shall produce in the following form, or to like effect, a certificate from a qualified surveyor or surveyors, with whom he has served, that he is competent to undertake surveys:—

Form of Certificate for presentation to the Board of Examiners.

I, A.B., a qualified land surveyor, hereby certify that C.D. has been professionally and continuously employed with me as _____ in the practice of land surveying, for the period of _____, viz., from _____ to _____, or has served under articles or other similar agreement for a period of _____ years (_____ of which have been in the field), and that he is fully competent to undertake surveys.

[Here describe the survey work on which C.D. was engaged.]

NOTE.—For this purpose a "qualified surveyor" shall mean any person entitled to practise as a land surveyor in any part of the British Empire, where the standard of examination is, in the opinion of the Board, equivalent to that prescribed by these Regulations.

7. A candidate shall produce his original field notes and plan plotted by him therefrom of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water-course or other natural feature or an irregular road, and also a plan, field notes, and description of a survey of a town lot built upon, as made for the purpose of an application under the provisions of the Real Property Act or Land Transfer Act.

The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the candidate to be entirely his own work.

8. If the foregoing preliminary conditions are complied with to the satisfaction of the Board, the candidate will be admitted to examination.

9. Each candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan-drawing, except paper.

SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

10. A candidate shall undergo an examination which shall embrace the following subjects:—

Mathematics.

- (a) Trigonometry, plane and spherical; geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

Computation.

- (b) Reduction of traverses, computation connected with triangulation and the setting out of roads and curves; adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

Principles and Practice of Surveying.

- (c) Detail of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical, trigonometrical, and underground surveying, setting out of areas, redetermination of boundaries, laying out of roads, setting out curves, plotting by co-ordinates and from field notes, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurement of heights, surveying under Transfer of Land Act, writing descriptions of boundaries.

Candidates may be required to effect surveys under supervision.

Engineering Surveys.

- (d) Levelling and contouring; grading; setting-out, and measurement of earthworks, including practical tests.

Use of Instruments.

- (e) Principles of construction, adjustment and use of the following instruments:—Theodolite, plane-table, sextant, tachometer, level, compass, clinometer, barometer, thermometer and steel band.

Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.

- (f) Determination (including practical tests) of time, latitude, and azimuth; the use of ephemerides; elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians; declination of the magnetic needle.

Drawing.

- (g) Plan-drawing, drawing of sections and contours, compilation of plans, projection of maps and charts.

Miscellaneous.

- (h) Elementary physics, elementary geology, elementary forestry.

[The scope of the examination in elementary physics will be that covered by "Balfour Stewart's Elementary Physics," Fourth Edition, omitting chapters 8, 10, and 11, and the scope of the examination in elementary geology will be that covered by "Geikie's Class-book of Geology," Fourth Edition.]

11. Candidates producing satisfactory evidence of having passed the matriculation or senior examination at a University, or of having completed a course of the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, may be exempted from working out papers in elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algebra, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers. Candidates holding satisfactory certificates or diplomas from any University recognised by an Australasian University or from recognised public technical schools may be exempted from working out papers in physics and geology, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers.

Candidates admitted under clause 5(d) may be exempted from working out papers other than those prescribed in clause 10(c), and from such portion of the practical examination as the Board may determine.

CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

12. A candidate qualifying and passing the examination held under these regulations shall be entitled to a certificate that he is qualified for the position of a land surveyor in Victoria.

13. A surveyor applying to the Board for a certificate of competency without examination on the grounds of his holding a licence and certificate entitling him to practise in any of the other Australian States or in the Dominion of New Zealand, shall produce such licence or certificate of competency from the Board of the State or Dominion in which he is licensed or authorized to survey, together with satisfactory evidence as to

character; provided that, should such licence or certificate have been issued upon examination held prior to September, 1895, or in virtue of a certificate issued prior to September, 1895, he shall further produce a written recommendation or a certificate, dated not more than twelve months previously, from such Board; provided also, that any surveyor prevented by absence from the State or Dominion in which he obtained his licence or certificate from obtaining the recommendation of the Board of that State or Dominion, may be granted a certificate on passing such examination under these regulations as the Board may require. Each application shall be accompanied by a fee of £2 2s.

14. The Board may grant a certificate of competency or a letter of recommendation to any surveyor holding a Victorian certificate dated prior to September, 1895, and desiring to be registered in another State or the Dominion of New Zealand, either without examination or on such *visu voce* examination as in the opinion of the Board may be necessary. Application for such certificate shall be accompanied by a fee of £2 2s.

REGISTRATION OF ARTICLES OF INDENTURE.

15. Articles of indenture or other similar agreement for the tuition of surveying by a qualified surveyor shall be forwarded to the secretary for registration within three months of the date of commencement of service thereunder. Applications for registration shall be accompanied by evidence of the pupil having passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto. The fee for each registration shall be five shillings. Transfers of articles or agreements shall be registered within three months of such transfers.

16. On and after March, 1913 (except as hereinafter provided), no candidate shall be eligible for examination unless he shall have passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause; provided that, subject to his passing a special examination prescribed by the Board which shall include English, arithmetic, geometry, and algebra, a candidate who has not passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause may be admitted to examination if—

- (a) He failed at an examination held prior to March, 1913; or
(b) He produces certificates of six years' satisfactory field service.

LICENCES TO SURVEY.

17. The Board may issue a licence to any person to whom it has issued a certificate of competency, or who holds a certificate of competency issued by any reciprocating Board of Examiners for land surveyors in Australasia subsequent to 1st January, 1896, and who is still entitled to practise as a land surveyor in the State or Colony where he obtained his certificate, or to any surveyor holding a certificate of competency issued by the Department of Land and Survey prior to 1st January, 1896, or who holds a licence to practise as surveyor under the Transfer of Land Act issued by the Surveyor-General prior to 1st January, 1896. Each application shall be accompanied by the fee (£1 1s.), the declaration as prescribed by the *Land Surveyors Act 1895*, and satisfactory evidence as to character.

PROHIBITION OF ANY PERSON KEEPING, GRAZING, OR MILKING COWS ON CERTAIN SPECIFIED PARTS OF THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF THE TOWN OF KEW.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Arthur Lyulph Stanley, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 31, sub-section (a), of the *Milk and Dairy Supervision Act 1905*, the Governor in Council is empowered, on the application of the Council of any municipal district within a milk area, if approved by the Minister, to prohibit any person keeping, grazing, or milking cows on any part or parts or in any part or parts of such municipal district; and whereas the Council of the municipal district of the Town of Kew has applied to the Governor in Council to prohibit any person keeping, grazing, or milking cows on the following area, being part of such municipality:—

Commencing at the junction of Princess-street with the outer circle railway line; thence south by Princess-street to High-street; thence south-west by High-street to Barker's-road; thence east by Barker's-road to Kew railway line; thence north by the railway line to Wellington-street; thence west by Wellington-street to Denmark-street; thence north by Denmark-street to High-street; thence north-east by High-street to Cotham-road; thence east by Cotham-road to Glenferrie-road; thence south by Glenferrie-road to Barker's-road; thence east by Barker's-road to Wrixon-street; thence north by Wrixon-street to Sackville-street; thence east by Sackville-street to Thomas-street; thence north by Thomas-street to Cotham-road; thence west by Cotham-road to Ridgeway-avenue; thence north by Ridgeway-avenue to the junction of Park Hill-road with High-street; thence north-east by High-street to Childer's-street; thence north-west by a creek east of Childer's-street to the outer circle railway line; thence north-west by the railway line to the commencing point.

And whereas the Minister administering for the time being the *Milk and Dairy Supervision Act 1905* has approved of such application to prohibit as aforesaid: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation prohibit any person keeping, grazing, or milking cows on such specified area, being part of the municipal district of the Town of Kew, in the State of Victoria aforesaid, on and after the 1st day of July, 1915.

MINIMUM LENGTHS IN LIEU OF MINIMUM WEIGHTS FOR CERTAIN SPECIES OF FISH.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Arthur Lyulph Stanley, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation prescribe, for the species of fish mentioned

hereunder, the sizes or lengths set opposite the names thereof, less than which it shall be unlawful for any person to take, attempt to take, sell, or consign, or expose for sale, or have in his possession, house or shop, or under his control, fish of such species, in lieu of the weights set opposite the names of such species of fish in the Second Schedule to the *Fisheries Act 1890*, or of the weights substituted for any of such weights by any subsequent Proclamation:—

Bream, 8 inches;
Crayfish, 11 inches;
Garfish, 9 inches;
Mullet, 8½ inches;
Schnapper, 10½ inches;
Trout (non-indigenous to Victoria), 11 inches;
Whiting, 11 inches.

The size or length of all such fish (except Garfish and Crayfish) shall be ascertained by measuring them overall, that is, from the point of the snout to the end of the tail; in the case of Garfish the length shall be ascertained by measuring from the tip of the upper jaw to the end of the upper half of the tail; and in the case of Crayfish by measuring from the rostrum or small central horn between the eyes to the end of the telson or central flap of the tail.

Every licence granted under section 187 of the Land Act 1901 shall be subject to the conditions set forth in the schedule hereto and to such special conditions and payment in advance of such fee as the Minister may determine, and shall be issued by an officer of the Department of Lands and Survey duly authorized in that behalf.

Conditions.

1. BY-LAWS OF THE FOUNDLING HOSPITAL AND INFANTS' HOME (INCORPORATED).

CONFIRMED BY A GENERAL MEETING OF CONTRIBUTORS HELD AT THE HOSPITAL ON THE 8TH DAY OF FEBRUARY, 1915, AT THE HOUR OF HALF-PAST TWO O'CLOCK IN THE AFTERNOON.

Name.

1. The name of the institution shall be "The Foundling Hospital and Infants' Home (Incorporated)."

Objects.

2. The objects of the institution shall be:—

- (a) To carry on, maintain, and take charge of the existing Foundling Hospital and Infants' Home at Berry-street, East Melbourne, and at Beaconsfield, and all property and assets belonging thereto, and to build, establish, take over, furnish, equip, and maintain any other hospitals, houses, buildings, or homes as may from time to time be found necessary or convenient, and to let or lease the same or any of them if and whenever thought fit.
- (b) The prevention of infanticide; the saving of infant life from the many evils arising from baby-farming; rescuing mothers of illegitimate children from further degradation; and assisting them to become useful members of society.
- (c) To receive, maintain, and provide homes, nursing, medical and surgical treatment, and education for foundlings and infants, and also to provide a home, nursing, and medical attention to women prior to, during, and (or) after confinement.
- (d) To receive voluntary subscriptions, contributions, and donations in money or property for the support, extension, or benefit of the institution, or for promoting any of its objects.
- (e) To expend any of the funds of the institution in subscriptions or donations to or for the promotion or assistance of any other similar institutions or any institutions or charities in any way connected with the betterment of infants or the saving of infant life or the lives of mothers.
- (f) To assist in the education and proper training of females in the special duties of infants' nurses.
- (g) For all or any of the above purposes to borrow or raise money on mortgage or charge over all or any of the property of the institution.
- (h) To do all such other things incidental to or conducive to the attainment of the above objects or any of them.

Contributors.

3. All persons who shall have paid to the funds of the institution a voluntary contribution of not less than £1 per annum, or £20 in one donation (hereinafter referred to as "contributors"), shall be deemed contributors within the meaning of these By-laws.

4. Any person who shall contribute to the funds of the institution £20 or upwards in one donation shall be a life member, and entitled to vote at all meetings of contributors during his or her life.

5. Any person who shall annually contribute £1 or upwards shall be deemed to be a member of the institution for the current year covered by such contribution, and shall be entitled to vote at all contributors' meetings in the year in which the contribution was made. Annual contributions shall be payable on the 1st of July in each year, and for the purposes of these By-laws the period covered by each annual contribution shall be the period between the date of payment thereof and the next following 30th of June.

6. Contributors of £1 or upwards per annum shall be entitled to the following privileges:—

- If a contributor of £1, to recommend one indoor patient;
- If a contributor of £2, to recommend one indoor patient;
- If a contributor of £5, to recommend three indoor patients;
- If a contributor of £10, to recommend five indoor patients;

and so in proportion to the amount of the contribution. Contributors shall not be entitled to vote or exercise their other privileges until they shall have paid the contribution.

8. The executor, if only one, or the first-named executor if more than one, of any will through which the institution shall receive not less than the sum of £20, shall, for the purposes of these By-laws, be deemed to be the contributor of such sum, and he or his nominee may be appointed by the Committee of Management a life member.

9. Any church congregation or any society, league, club, association, charitable trust or public or corporate body which shall contribute £20 or more in one sum shall be entitled by notice, in writing, to the secretary of the institution to nominate some one person a life member.

10. Any person who has conferred any signal benefit on the institution which the Committee of Management shall consider worth more than £20, may, irrespective of any monetary contribution, be appointed by the Committee of Management an honorary life member.

Meetings of Contributors.

11. A general meeting of the contributors shall be held once in every year not later than the last Thursday in the month of July, and such meeting shall be called the annual meeting.

12. Special meetings of the contributors may be convened at any time in manner hereinafter provided by the secretary on the requisition by any ten or more contributors.

13. Every annual meeting and every special meeting of the contributors shall be convened by the secretary by notice served in manner hereinafter prescribed, and in such notice the nature of the business to be transacted shall be shortly expressed. At any annual or special meeting convened as aforesaid no business (except ordinary business in the case of an annual meeting) shall be transacted other than that specified in the notice.

14. At every annual or special meeting the chair shall be taken by the honorary president if present, or in her absence by such person as shall be nominated by the members present, and four shall form a quorum. If at any meeting a quorum shall not be present within half an hour of the time appointed for the meeting such meeting shall stand adjourned until the following week at the same day, place, and time.

15. Every question submitted to any annual or special meeting shall be decided by a majority of the votes of the members, and every member shall be entitled to vote as follows:—An annual sum of £1 shall entitle the contributor to one vote. An annual sum of £3 or over shall entitle the contributor to two votes. Every life member shall be entitled to one vote, irrespective of any vote or votes he or she may be entitled to as an annual contributor. No contributor shall be entitled to exercise more than three votes. In the event of equality of votes at any meeting, the person occupying the chair shall have a second or casting vote.

16. Joint contributors shall only vote through one of their number. Every firm or partnership who is a contributor may exercise their privilege as such through some one member of such firm.

17. No member shall be allowed to vote by proxy.

18. The voting at annual or special meetings shall be by show of hands, but any member present may demand a poll which shall thereupon be immediately taken, and the result declared by the person in the chair.

19. At each annual meeting an annual report of all the affairs of the institution (including the number of infants and adults attended to and admitted, boarded out, and discharged), also a medical report and a full statement of receipts and expenditure shall be presented by the Committee of Management, and there shall be elected the honorary officers and auditors for the year (including the members of the Committee of Management, auxiliary committee, and finance committee), in place of all retiring officers, auditors, and members of committee.

20. A minute-book shall be kept and proper entries made therein of all business transacted at every meeting of the members.

Committee of Management.

21. The institution shall be governed by a Committee of Management (hereinafter called the "Committee"), consisting (in addition to the *ex officio* members) of 20 elective members elected by the committee in annual meeting to be held on the last Thursday in the month of July, in every year, and such committee, or any four of them, shall have and may exercise all the powers and authorities by Part 1 of the *Hospital and Charities Act 1890*, vested in the Corporation, and one-fourth part of such committee, or such fractional part as shall be nearest to one-fourth part, but no more, may be honorary medical men on the staff of the institution, and the president, vice-presidents, and treasurer of the institution shall, by virtue of their respective offices, be members of such committee.

22. On the last Thursday in the month of July in every year one-third part of the elected members of the committee shall go out of office, but may, nevertheless, be re-elected, and the persons who shall go out of office shall be those who have been the longest in office without re-election, or where two or more shall have been in office for the same length of time, then those who shall go out of office shall be determined by lot. Any member shall vacate his office in any of the events specified in section 15 of the *Hospitals and Charities Act 1890*.

23. The committee shall have power to manage and superintend all the affairs of the institution, and shall elect or appoint and prescribe the duties of and may dismiss at pleasure all or any of the paid officers and servants of the institution, and may at any time constitute any officers in addition to those provided for by these By-laws, and may make, vary, and repeal such rules and regulations as they may from time to time think fit in relation to the conduct and management of the institution and its affairs, including the receiving of infants and adults, the boarding out of infants, the duties of the matron and nursing staff, and any other matters, and may appoint sub-committees with power to act, and report only as the Committee of Management may from time to time determine.

24. The committee shall meet fortnightly, or oftener if required, on such day and at such hour as the committee may from time to time determine.

25. A special meeting of the committee may at any time be convened by notice served in manner hereinafter prescribed on every member of the committee stating the object of the meeting. No business shall be transacted at any such meeting except that for which it was convened.

26. At all meetings of the committee the honorary president, or, in her absence, one of the honorary vice-presidents or the honorary treasurer, shall take the chair, but in the absence of all these officers the meeting shall choose some member present to take the chair.

27. A minute-book shall be kept, and the secretary shall make proper entries therein of all business transacted at every meeting of the committee.

28. The committee shall, every year, make a report of all their proceedings during the previous year to the annual meeting of contributors, and shall cause accurate accounts to be kept of all receipts and expenditure, and shall make up such accounts to the 30th June in each year, and lay the same, with the proper vouchers, before the auditors, so that they may be duly audited one week at least before the annual meeting.

Auxiliary Committee.

29. At every annual meeting the contributors may appoint not less than four nor more than twenty contributors to be an auxiliary committee to co-operate with and assist the Committee of Management or to undertake any special or departmental work, and each member of such auxiliary committee shall hold office for one year. Any retiring member may be re-elected. Casual vacancies may be filled up by the Committee of Management, and any person elected to fill a casual vacancy shall hold office only during such time as the person in whose place he or she is elected would have held office.

Finance Committee.

30. The finance committee shall consist of not less than three gentlemen members and three members of the house committee. Every member of the finance committee shall be elected at the annual meeting of the contributors, and shall hold office for one year and until his or her successor is appointed. Any retiring member may be re-elected. Casual vacancies may be filled up by the Committee of Management, and any person elected to fill a casual vacancy shall hold office only during such time as the person in whose place he or she is elected would have held office.

31. The finance committee shall investigate and from time to time report to the Committee of Management upon all the accounts, investments, funds, and property of the institution, and shall perform such other duties as the Committee of Management may from time to time prescribe.

Medical Staff.

32. The medical staff shall consist of not less than three nor more than ten persons, who shall be duly qualified physicians or surgeons, and one of whom shall be the honorary consulting medical adviser. The members of the medical staff, including honorary consulting medical adviser, shall be elected by the annual meeting of contributors, and shall hold office for a term of one year, and until his or her successor is appointed. Any retiring member may be re-elected. Casual vacancies may be filled up by the Committee of Management, and any person elected to fill a casual vacancy shall hold office only during such time as the person in whose place he or she is elected would have held office. In

addition to the honorary medical officers, the Committee of Management may at any time appoint any resident or other medical officer at such salary and on such terms as they may think fit.

Medical Committee.

33. The members of the honorary medical staff shall form a medical committee, which shall meet at least once a month to advise the Committee of Management on all matters that may be referred to them by such latter committee, and to confer as to professional matters affecting the institution. Two members shall form a quorum.

34. A special meeting of the medical committee shall be convened by the secretary if and whenever three members of the medical committee or four members of the Committee of Management shall make a requisition to that effect.

35. The medical committee shall make regulations respecting the attendances of the members of the honorary medical staff, and shall be responsible to the Committee of Management for the keeping of proper accounts or registers of matters attended to by them, and shall report on all matters referred to them by the Committee of Management.

Officers.

36. The institution shall have the following honorary officers, namely:—Honorary president, two honorary vice-presidents, honorary treasurer, honorary secretary, honorary oculist, honorary dentist, and such other honorary officers as the contributors in general meeting may from time to time think fit to appoint.

37. All honorary officers (except where herein otherwise provided) shall be appointed by the contributors at the annual meeting, and every officer so appointed shall hold office for one year and thereafter until her or his successor shall have been appointed. Every retiring officer shall be eligible for re-election. Casual vacancies may be filled up by the Committee of Management.

38. The honorary treasurer or such other officer or officers as the contributors shall from time to time appoint shall receive subscriptions, donations, and legacies to or for the benefit of the institution, and shall give receipts for the same.

Matron.

39. There shall be a matron, who shall reside at such home of the institution as is directed by the Committee of Management, and she shall have the selection and management, and shall be the responsible mistress of the nurses and wardmaids, but she shall not permanently engage any nurse who has not been approved by the Committee of Management, and she shall not discharge any nurse or wardmaid without the sanction of such committee. The Committee of Management shall have power to appoint a deputy matron and define her duties.

40. No male visitors shall be allowed at either institution to staff or inmates except in cases covered by the next following By-law.

Spiritual Consolation.

41. Any in-patient desiring spiritual consolation shall at all times be accessible to the minister of her religion, who shall perform the duties of his office at the bedside of the patient in such a way as not to disturb other patients.

Bankers—Payments—Investments.

42. The bankers of the institution shall be the Bank of New South Wales or such other bankers as the Committee of Management shall from time to time determine. Cheques shall be drawn by order of the Committee of Management, and shall be signed by the honorary president or by one of the honorary vice-presidents, and countersigned by the honorary treasurer.

43. In addition to a general account a building account and such other account or accounts as the Committee of Management may from time to time direct, may be kept with the bankers of the institution, and such sums as such committee may from time to time determine shall be transferred from the general account to the building account or any other account.

44. All moneys at any time standing to the credit of the general or other account which shall not be required for current expenses may be invested by the finance committee under the direction of the Committee of Management in or upon any investments authorized by the law of Victoria for the investment of trust funds, and such investments may be varied from time to time under the like direction.

45. All payments of and incidental to maintaining and carrying on the institution, and all rent payable in respect of the lands and buildings thereof, and the cost of repairs and insurance and all other current outgoings

shall be paid out of the general account or such other account as the Committee of Management shall determine.

Auditors and Accounts.

46. The auditor or auditors shall be appointed by the contributors at the annual meeting, and such meeting shall fix the amount of the remuneration to be paid to such auditor or auditors.

47. Any person desirous of being elected an auditor of the institution shall give to the secretary notice, in writing, seven days at least before the date on which the meeting is to be held, but this rule shall not apply to an auditor retiring from office, who shall be assumed to be desirous of being re-elected unless he shall give notice to the contrary, and no person shall be eligible as an auditor unless he holds the qualifications for the time being required for an auditor under the Companies Acts for the time being in force.

48. Every auditor shall, at all reasonable times, have access to the books of account and other documents in the institution.

Notices.

49.
