RESUMPTION OF LAND FOR A PUBLIC ROAD.

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS a residence licence of an agricultural allotment under the provisions of section 47 of the Land Act 1901 and dated the first day of March in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and nine was duly issued to William Earnest Harbert of Launching Place in the State of Victoria farmer (and thereinafter called the licensee) in respect of all that agricultural allotment situated in the parish of Woori Yallock county of Evelyn in the State of Victoria containing seventy-one acres more or less and delineated on the plan kept in accordance with the provisions of the 5th section of the Land Act 1901 and thereon numbered 9a subject to the payment of the fee stated in such licence and to the exceptions conditions and provisions therein contained And whereas by the said licence it is among other things provided that the Governor of the said State by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the same might on behalf of His Majesty his heirs and successors at any time during the currency of the said licence resume possession of all or any part or parts of the said allotments required among other purposes for road And whereas I as such Governor by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said allotments required among other purposes for road And whereas I as such Governor by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said allotments required among other purposes for road And whereas I as such Governor by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said allotment 9a hereinafter set out and described should be resumed the same being required for a public road Now therefore I under the powers in that behalf reserved by the said licence and under all other powers me enabling in that behalf do hereby resume possession of the following parts of the said allotment 9a (that is to say):—

Commencing at a point bearing south two degrees twelve minutes east three chains fifty-eight links from

minutes east three chains one link thence by lines bearing respectively north fifty-six degrees twenty-three minutes west eight chains eighty-two links and south eighty degrees five minutes west forty-five links and two-tenths of a link and thence by allotment 57s bearing north two degrees twelve minutes west one chain one link to the point of commencement.

Also: Commencing at the north-east angle of the allotment bounded thence by a road bearing south two degrees eight minutes east four chains fifteen links thence by lines bearing respectively north sixty-two degrees twenty minutes west four chains fifty-eight links and two-tenths of a link south seventy-two degrees thirty minutes west four chains sixty-seven links and eight-tenths of a link north eighty-six degrees seven minutes west four chains intety-two links and six-tenths of a link north thirty-seven degrees twenty-eight minutes west eight chains thirty-four links and three-tenths of a link and north fourteen degrees fifty-two minutes east three chains thirty-one links and three-tenths of a link thence by a road bearing south fifty-eight degrees thirty minutes east one chain four links and four-tenths of a link thence by lines bearing respectively south fourteen degrees fifty-two minutes west two chains fifty-five links and two-tenths of a link south thirty-seven degrees twenty-eight minutes east seven chains forty links south eighty-six degrees seven minutes east three chains twenty-eight minutes east seven chains forty links south twenty-eight links and six-tenths of a link and north seventy-two degrees thirty minutes east eight chains twenty-six links and eight-tenths of a link and thence again by the last-mentioned road bearing south eighty-three degrees there minutes east sixty links and one-half of a link to the point of commencement.

RESUMPTION OF LAND FOR A MUNICIPAL SHEEP, DIP.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Arthur Lyulph Stanley, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

In pursuance of the powers in that behalf contained in an indenture of lease dated the fourth day of March One thousand nine hundred and twelve made between the Governor for the time being of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof on behalf of His Most Gracious Majesty the King of the first part the Lands Purchase and Management Board of the second part and William Purdy of Tatura dairy farmer of the third part certain land being allotment 110 of section C parish of Tongala county of Rodney which lease is entered in the Registerbook vol. 917 fol. 183306 to resume such part of the land by the said lease demised as might at any time be required for reserves for public purposes I the Governor of the said State acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof do by this my Proclamation set out (the same being required as a site for a municipal sheep dip) the land described below such land being portion of the land comprised in the lease aforesaid with the intent and object that the land so set out by this Proclamation and upon notice in writing to the lessee of such land his executors administrators or

assigns by me acting with the advice of the Executive Council aforesaid shall thereby be resumed and the right to the immediate possession thereof become vested in His Majesty the King discharged and freed from any estate right title claim or interest in or by any person or body whomsoever or whatsoever.

LAND ABOVE REFERRED TO.

Three roods thirty-seven perches county of Rodney parish of Tongala being part of allotment 110 of section C commencing at a point bearing south eighty-nine degrees fifty-nine minutes east fifteen chains thirty-eight links from the north-west angle of the said allotment bounded thence by lines bearing respectively south six minutes west two chains forty links south eighty-nine degrees fifty-nine minutes east four chains seventy-two links and one-half of a link and north twenty-seven degrees thirty-four minutes west two chains seventy-one links and thence by a road bearing north eighty-nine degrees fifty-nine minutes west three chains forty-seven links to the point of commencement.
