## QUARTERLY STATISTICAL ABSTRACT, 31ST DECEMBER, 1914.

*Population.*—The estimated population on 30th June, 1914, was 1,421,985; on 30th September, 1914, it was 1,430,878—thus showing an increase of 8,893 persons. The natural increase in the population was 5,193, and the excess of immigration was 3,700. During the quarter Victoria gained from the United Kingdom 2,436 persons, from South Australia 2,824 persons, and from Tasmania 976 persons, but lost 1,967 of population to New South Wales, and 302 to Queensland.

*Vital Statistics.*—For the whole State there were 11,830 marriages, 36,225 births, and 16,503 deaths for the year 1914, as compared with 11,324, 35,978, and 15,475 respectively for the previous year. Of the total deaths 1,031 were due to phthisis, 196 to other tubercular diseases, 1,185 to cancer, 106 to typhoid fever, and 211 to diphtheria, as against 1,053, 217, 1,168, 95, and 245 respectively in 1913. In Melbourne and suburbs the births were 17,767, or 370 more, and the deaths were 8,609, or 649 more than in the previous year. Of the metropolitan deaths, 593 occurred from phthisis, 132 from other tubercular diseases, 699 from cancer, 38 from typhoid fever, 116 from diphtheria, and 58 from whooping cough, as compared with 563, 141, 674, 29, 122, and 27 respectively in 1913. The deaths of infants under one year of age numbered 1,502, which was equivalent to a death rate of 8·45 per 100 births, as against a rate of 7·63 for the preceding year.

*State Revenue and Expenditure.*—The total revenue for the quarter was £2,329,019, which represents a decrease of £153,281 on that for the corresponding quarter of the previous year. The principal items of revenue were—Railways, £1,322,243, Pr<sup>obate</sup> Duty, £125,554, and Interest, £102,948. The total expenditure was £3,045,031, an increase of £187,401 on that for the corresponding quarter of 1913.

*Railways.*—Compared with the corresponding quarter of the preceding year, the revenue of the Railway Department decreased by £126,136, but the expenditure increased by £56,815. The tonnage of goods and live stock carried fell off to the extent of 73,391, but the number of passengers carried was 182,618 more in December quarter, 1914, than in December quarter, 1913.

*Victorian Banking Returns.*—On the 31st December the liabilities to the public of the Associated and Commonwealth banks were £51,575,850, and the assets £51,568,494, as against £48,714,500 and £49,828,030 on the 31st December, 1913. The reserves of the Associated banks amounted to £11,163,061, and their paid-up capital to £17,515,482. The ratio of coin, bullion, and notes to the liabilities of all the banks was 21·69 per cent.

*Savings Banks.*—On the 31st December the amount at credit of the 762,495 depositors in the State and Commonwealth Savings Banks was £25,251,302. During the quarter 32,465 accounts were opened, and 25,606 were closed; the deposits made were £4,974,502, and the withdrawals £4,419,439.

*Gold Yield.*—The total yield of gold up to the end of December, 1914, is 73,954,874 ounces.

*Imports and Exports.*—The total value of oversea imports into Victoria during the quarter under review was £4,691,468, and the total oversea exports during the same period were valued at £4,296,296, as compared with £6,723,969 and £8,205,996 respectively in the corresponding quarter of the previous year. The oversea imports for the year 1914 were valued at £23,109,678, and the oversea exports at £14,791,121; these figures represent decreases of £1,277,395 and £3,044,274 respectively below those for 1913.

*Exports of Frozen, Preserved, and Perishable Products.*—For the quarter ended 31st December, 1914, the total value of these exports oversea through Cool Stores was £970,507, of which £898,279 went to the United Kingdom, £23,668 to South Africa, and £48,560 to Eastern and other ports. The principal exports were—Butter, valued at £518,547; Mutton and Lamb, £355,075; Beef, £58,475; and Milk and Cream, £21,692.
