ACTS OF PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the State of Victoria, and Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the said State and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

"An Act to continue the Foodstuffs and Commodities Acts."

"An Act to continue the Price of Goods Act 1914 and the Price of Goods Act 1914 (No. 2) and to repeal section 2 of the last-mentioned Act."

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria, at Melbourne, this thirtieth day of April, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and fifteen, and in the fifth year of His Majesty's reign.

Candidates must state at which place they desire to present themselves for examination—which must be that nearest their residence—and must forward, either with their application, or on or before Wednesday, the 26th May, 1915, a crossed postal note payable to the Secretary to the Public Service Commissioner (Victoria), for Ten shillings (10s.) in the case of candidates for the Clerical Examination, and Five shillings (5s.) in the case of candidates for the General Division Examinations, being the fees for such examinations.

At the Clerical Examination fifty (50) candidates will be selected for registration for appointment as Clerks. Candidates must at the date of examination be between the ages of sixteen and twenty-one years at last birthday; but no person twenty-two years of age or over can be appointed. The commencing salary is £60, rising to a maximum of £204 a year by increments, which may be granted at intervals of not less than one year if recommended by the Permanent Head of the Department and the Public Service Commissioner.

For the position of Penal Warder applicants must be between the ages of 25 and 35 years, and must furnish a certificate of fitness from the Deputy Inspector-General of Penal Establishments, Melbourne, not later than Friday, the 14th May, 1915. No applicant shall be registered as a candidate for such position if he shall be less than 5 feet 8 inches in height, or measure round his chest less than 36 inches, or weigh less than 11 stone.

For the position of Junior Attendant, Public Library, or Junior Messenger applicants must be between the ages of sixteen and twenty years. After attainment of the age of twenty-one years and completion of three years' service an officer may be granted a salary of £108 a year.

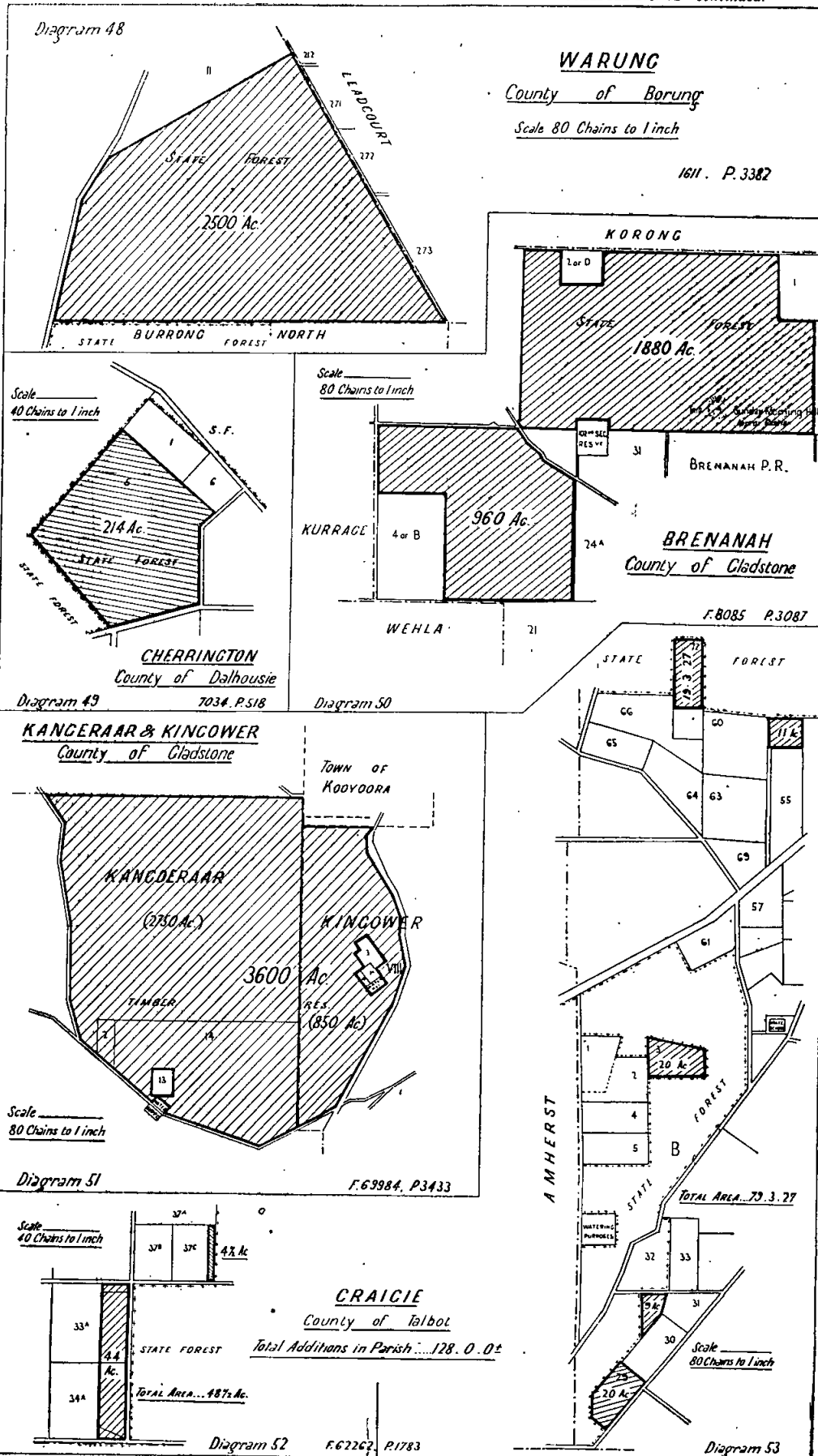
PROPOSED ADDITIONS TO FOREST RESERVES.—DIAGRAMS TO ACCOMPANY SCHEDULE No. 12—continued.



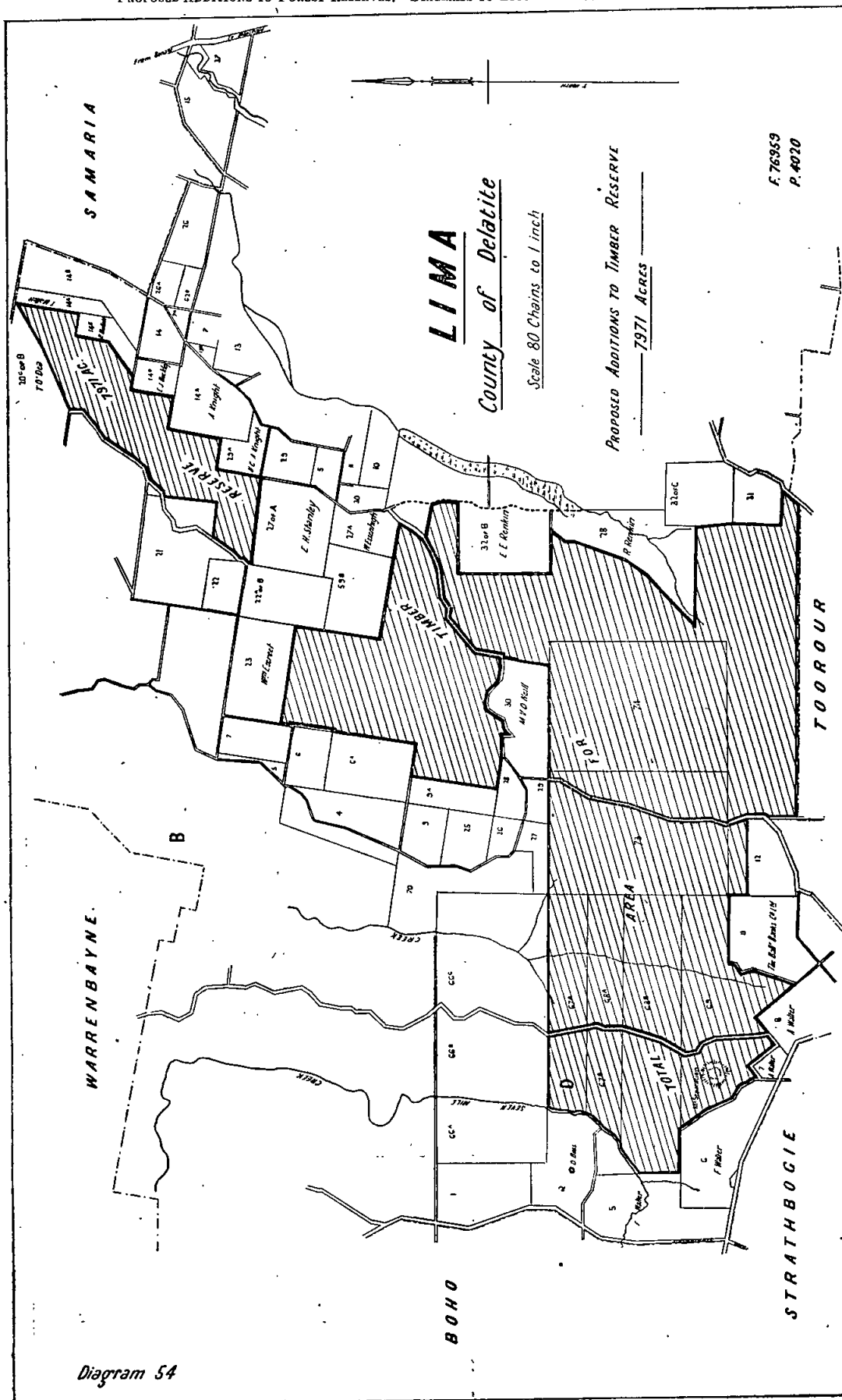
PROPOSED ADDITIONS TO FOREST RESERVES.—DIAGRAMS TO ACCOMPANY SCHEDULE No. 12—continued.



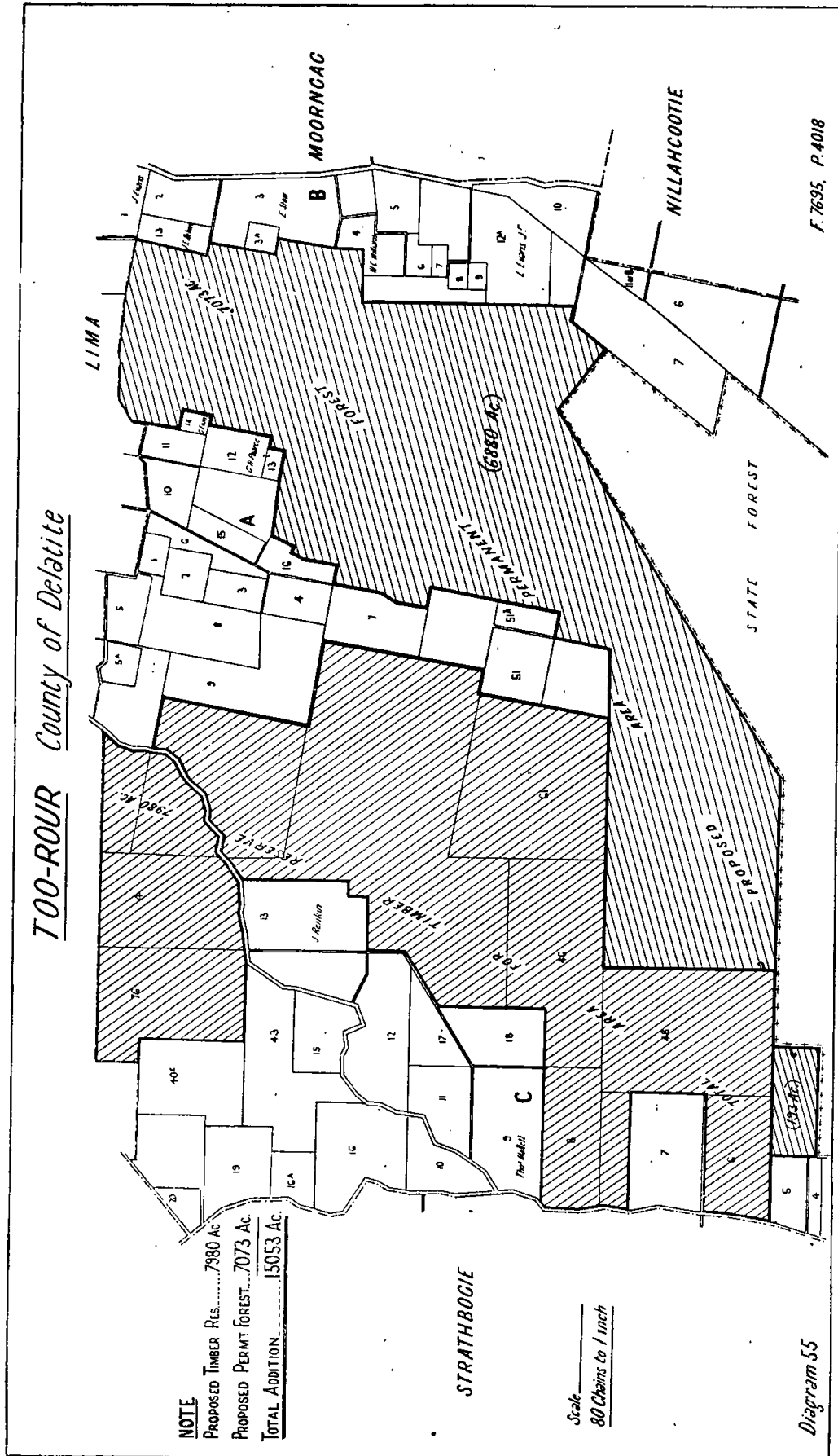

7. No person shall deposit any foreign matter of any description in the lake, fountain, or artesian well basin in the Reserve.
8. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
9. Any dog found wandering in the Reserve may be seized by the borough dog officer and dealt with under the provisions of the Dog Act.
10. No person shall erect any dwelling in the Reserve, nor any booth or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, nor without such consent offer for sale any article therein.

11. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed or unenclosed for plantations of young trees, shrubs, or flowers.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence, and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

A By-law of the City of Camberwell, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered 37, for prohibiting cattle being allowed to graze or wander upon land not enclosed by a substantial fence, and for repealing By-law 35.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Camberwell order as follows:—

1. By-law 35 of the Town of Camberwell, prohibiting cattle being allowed to graze or wander on land not enclosed by a substantial fence, made by the Council on the 9th December, 1912, is hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Camberwell.

3. No person, being the owner, or having the possession, care, charge, custody, control, or supervision of any cattle, shall allow such cattle to graze or wander upon any land not enclosed by a substantial fence.

4. Any person who shall be guilty of any breach of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty for each head of cattle of not more than One pound, and not less than Five shillings, for the first offence, and not more than Two pounds, nor less than Ten shillings, for the second offence, and not more than Five pounds, nor less than One pound, for the third and any subsequent offence.

CITY OF CAMBERWELL.

BY-LAW No. 38.

A By-law of the City of Camberwell, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered 38, for maintaining the good rule and government of the municipality, and for prohibiting the spilling of any material on the streets or roads within the municipality.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Camberwell order as follows:—

(1) No person shall spill, or permit to be spilt, or fall off from any vehicle any material on to or upon any of the streets or roads in the municipality.

(2) No person shall deposit, or cause to be deposited any material on any such streets or roads, except in pursuance of some contract which such person may have with the Council, or with the written consent of the Council, or the Town Clerk, or City Surveyor thereof.

"Council" shall mean the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Camberwell.

"Vehicle" shall mean any dray, lorry, or cart, and shall also include any other vehicle used for the transport of material.

"Material" shall mean bricks, stone, road metal, clay, earth, and manure, and shall also include any other materials used for building, road-making, garden, or other purposes.

Any person who by any wilful act or default be guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Camberwell.

SHIRE OF FERNTREE GULLY.

BY-LAW No. 14.

A By-law of the Shire of Ferntree Gully, made under the provisions of section 198 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered 14, for regulating and restraining the erection of removed wooden buildings in the Shire of Ferntree Gully.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Ferntree Gully order as follows:—

1. No person shall remove, or transport, or cause to be removed, or transported, into any part of the Shire of Ferntree Gully, or from any one part of the Shire to another part of the same, any building or erection contrary to the provisions of this By-law.

2. Before any building or erection is removed into the Shire or from any one part of the Shire to another, the owner or person carrying out the removal shall give to the Council, its Secretary, or Engineer, not less than ten clear days' notice, in writing, of his intention to remove and re-erect such building, and shall, accompanying such notice, supply the following particulars:—

- (a) The situation of the building which it is proposed to remove.
- (b) The situation of the land upon which it is proposed to re-erect or place such building.
- (c) A plan giving the dimensions of the building, any alterations, or additions thereto, and a tracing copy of such plan, to be retained by the Council.
- (d) A specification giving particulars of the construction of the existing building and of the alterations and additions (if any) which it is intended to make when the building is re-erected. And shall at the same time produce to the Council, its Secretary, or Engineer, satisfactory evidence that such house has not been condemned as dilapidated, insanitary, or unfit for human habitation. On receipt of such notice, the Engineer shall inspect such building or erection before removal, and shall report to the Council whether, in his opinion, such building, when re-erected, will be in compliance with the provisions of this By-law and the Building Regulations and By-laws of the Council or not. If the Engineer certifies that such building, when removed and re-erected, will be in accordance with this By-law, then the Council may grant a permit for its removal and re-erection in the Shire, but not otherwise.

3. No building or erection that has been condemned as dilapidated, insanitary, or unfit for human habitation, shall be removed or re-erected within the Shire.

4. No building or erection which is intended to be used as a dwelling-house, in which any case of infectious or contagious disease has occurred during the preceding three months, shall be removed into or re-erected within the Shire unless the same has been thoroughly fumigated and disinfected to the satisfaction of some duly qualified medical practitioner or of the Health Inspector of the Council.

5. No building or erection intended or adapted to be used as a dwelling-house shall be removed or re-erected within the Shire unless the same, when re-erected, shall cover an area of 800 square feet at the least. Such building shall be properly framed, and shall comply with the following conditions as to spacing and scantlings of timbers, &c.:—

- (a) Stumps to be not less than 4 inches x 4 inches redgum or jarrah, spaced to 4 feet centres and fixed on 8 inches x 8 inches x 2 inches sole plates.
- (b) Studs and ceiling joists to be not less than 4 inches x 1½ inches, spaced not more than 18 inches apart centre to centre, and properly braced.
- (c) Rafters not less than 4 inches x 1½ inches, spaced 3 feet centre to centre.
- Floor joists not to be less than 4 inches x 2 inches, spaced 18 inches apart centre to centre, on 4 inches x 3 inches bearers, spaced 6 feet apart.

(d) Vermin plates to be provided to all walls.

(e) Floors to be fixed level, and to be in no part less than 12 inches above the surface of the ground.

(f) All window sashes to be made to open, and sufficient ventilation to be provided in each room.

(g) The height of the main or living rooms to be not less than 10 ft. 6 in. between the floors and ceilings.

(h) The internal lining of walls and ceilings to be made of lath and plaster, stamped steel, or sheet asbestos preparations; matchboard lining may be retained in rooms other than the main or living rooms, but, if so retained, must be thoroughly cleaned down and painted with three coats of oil and whitelead.

(i) All roof coverings to be of incombustible material.

All timber and material which, in the opinion of the Engineer, is unsound or defective shall be removed and replaced with sound material.

6. Nothing herein contained shall prevent the alteration of the position of any building within the boundaries of the land on which the same stands.

7. If the Engineer shall certify in writing that any building or erection has been removed into or erected within the Shire contrary to any of the provisions of this By-law, or that any removed building, erection, or structure is in such a dilapidated, ruinous, or unsafe condition as to be dangerous to the public safety, the owners of such building, erection, or structure, upon receiving from the Council, its Secretary, or Engineer a notice in writing requiring him to alter, repair, or remove, or pull down such building, erection, or structure, shall alter, repair, remove, or pull down such building, erection, or structure within the time limited by such notice, and if default shall be made in complying with such notice, the Council may, on the expiration of the time therein limited, pull down or remove such building, erection, or structure, and may sell any of the materials thereof and apply the proceeds of such sale in reimbursing the costs and expenses of pulling down, removing, and selling such building, erection, or structure, and in paying into the Municipal Fund any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof.

8. The following fees shall be payable by the owner or person removing any building upon giving the notice mentioned in section 2 of this By-law:—

- (a) For examining any building which it is proposed to remove into the Shire of Ferntree Gully, whether the same is approved or not, £2.
- (b) For issue of a permit to remove any building and re-erect same in the Shire of Ferntree Gully, additional to the fee of inspection, £1.

9. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Shire of Ferntree Gully, but shall not apply to any Government, railway, or municipal building.

10. *Penalties.*—Any person who shall be guilty of any wilful breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty of not less than Five pounds, and not exceeding Twenty pounds. And if such offence is a continuing one, to a further penalty of not less than One pound per day, and not exceeding Five pounds per day for each day such offence is continuing.
