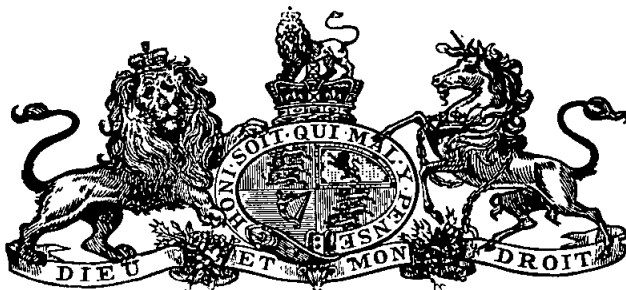

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VI. of the *Public Service Act* 1890 (54 Vict. No. 1133), I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates hereunder mentioned to be observed as Public Holidays or Public Half-Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively specified, viz. :—

## INSTRUCTIONS TO SURVEYORS.

## Carriage of Inflammable Liquids on Board Ship.

1. The following rules have been drawn up for the guidance of the Board's Surveyors in dealing with shipments of inflammable liquids at ports in the United Kingdom. It will be remembered that the carriage of these liquids on vessels carrying explosives is regulated by by-laws made by the various local authorities; and their carriage on vessels containing Indian stores is dealt with by special regulations made by the India Office.

2. *Turpentine*.—Pure turpentine ( $C_{10}H_{16}$ ), and compounds of pure turpentine, flashing at 93 deg. F. and over (close test), and packed in drums not exceeding 5 gallons, or in cases containing two 4-gallon tins, or in cases containing sixteen 1-gallon tins, or in strong steel barrels containing not more than 40 gallons each with no probability of leakage, and with special stowage, may be allowed below deck in emigrant ships, but not more than 1,000 gallons may be carried in any one emigrant ship, whether it is on deck or under deck, without the special permission of the Board.

No special rules are laid down as to the conveyance of pure turpentine or its compounds on other vessels, except that turpentine in casks is not allowed in sailing ships carrying explosives.

For rules as to mineral turpentine or turpentine substitutes see para. 4 below.

3. *Alcohol Compounds*.—Varnishes and other compounds made with alcohol may be carried on deck in emigrant ships if made up in tins or stone jars containing not more than 1 gallon, packed in sawdust in strong iron-bound cases containing not more than 16 gallons, and subdivided, where stone jars are used, by thin wooden partitions between each jar; or if made up in bottles holding not more than 4 fluid ounces each, securely corked and fitted with a metallic capsule and packed with corrugated paper and sawdust in boxes containing not more than 48 ounces and packed in strong wooden cases containing not more than 12 gallons. The total quantity carried in any one ship must not be excessive and must have been agreed to by the Emigration Officer.

In the case of ordinary passenger and cargo ships these compounds may be carried either on deck or under deck with special stowage either as stated above or in strong sound casks and iron or steel drums or barrels of a capacity up to 40 gallons properly labelled. If carried in larger quantities only iron or steel drums or barrels should be used.

4. *Compounds of petroleum flashing at 73 deg. F. and over*—

(a) *Mineral turpentine or turpentine substitutes flashing at 93 deg. F. or over.*

These may be carried under the conditions laid down for pure turpentine in para. 2 above.

(b) *Mineral turpentine or turpentine substitutes flashing at 83 deg. to 92 deg. F.*

In emigrant ships these may be carried on deck, if packed in tins containing not more than 1 gallon, packed in sawdust in strong iron-bound cases containing not more than 16 gallons or in cases containing two strong 4-gallon square tins. In cargo vessels they may be carried either on or under deck if packed in either of the two methods described above, or contained in strong 5 to 10 gallon drums.

(c) *Other compounds of petroleum flashing at 73 deg. F. to 92 deg. F.*

These may be carried on deck in emigrant ships, and either on or under deck in other vessels, if made up in tins containing not more than 1 gallon, packed in sawdust in strong iron-bound cases, containing not more than 16 gallons. Liquid metal polishes, boot creams, &c., flashing at 83 deg. F. or over, may be packed in small screw-stoppered tins, in cases as above; and pastes and semi-solids may be put up in tight-fitting

tins each containing only a few ounces with a total of not more than 1 cwt. net of the compound in each case.

(d) *Other compounds of petroleum flashing at 93 deg. and over.*

These may be carried under the conditions laid down for pure turpentine in para. 2 above.

Compounds having a flash point of 110 deg. F. and upwards may also be carried on deck or under deck in emigrant and other ships if packed in any way mentioned in paragraph (c) or in drums containing not more than 2 cwt.

5. *Compounds of petroleum flashing under 73 deg. F.*—These are not allowed at all in emigrant ships, or ships carrying explosives.

Permission may be given to carry these compounds under deck in ordinary cargo vessels if they are made up in small quantities packed in sawdust in strong cases, but each application must be dealt with separately on its merits.

6. *Ships Compositions*—

(a) A limited quantity may be allowed on deck in emigrant ships if the flash-point is from 93 deg. to 100 deg. F., and under deck with special stowage, if it is 110 deg. F. or over, and if the composition is packed in drums containing not more than 2 cwt.

(b) In other ships the compositions are allowed below deck if the flash-point is 93 deg. F. or over, and if they are packed in drums containing not more than 2 cwt., but it will be remembered that special stowage is required in the case of vessels carrying explosives.

7. *Marking*.—In all cases the name of the substance, and the flash-point as determined by Abel's close test, or if the flash-point can be guaranteed to be above 110 deg. F. a statement to that effect, must be clearly scrieved or stencilled on the outside of the package.

8. Attention is called to the penalties incurred under sections 446 and 447 of the *Merchant Shipping Act 1894*, by persons sending or attempting to send dangerous goods by any vessel under a false description, or without distinctly marking their nature on the outside of the package containing the goods, and giving written notice of their nature to the master or owner of the vessel.

9. This circular supersedes Circular 1486, which is now cancelled.

ALBERTON TO WON WRON RAILWAY

REGULATION No. 1.

FOR CONVENING MEETINGS OF THE TRUST, AND GENERALLY  
FOR REGULATING THE CONDUCT OF THE BUSINESS OF THE  
TRUST.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the  
fourth day of May, 1915.

WHEREAS by section 25 of the *Railway Lands Acquisition Act 1893* (No. 1288) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make Regulations relating to any Railway Construction Trust appointed and created under Part I. of the said Act for the purposes following:—

- "(a) The mode in which meetings of the members of Trusts under the said Part of the said Act are to be convened;
- "(b) The form of any notice or order which may be required to be given by any Trustees under the said Act; and
- "(c) Generally for regulating the conduct of the business and the proceedings of such Trusts and the numbers of members to form quorums thereof, and the appointment of the Chairman of each Trust, and for carrying into effect the provisions of the said Part of the said Act."

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the said provisions of the now in part recited Act, doth for the purposes aforesaid, so far as these may relate to a certain Railway Construction Trust duly appointed and created under the Railway Lands Acquisition Acts, and known as the Alberton to Won Wron Railway Construction Trust, make the Regulation following, viz:—

1. First meeting.—The first meeting of the Trust shall be convened by the Minister, at such time and place as he may direct.
2. Time and place of meeting.—The subsequent meetings of the Trust shall be held at such time and place as the Trustees may from time to time appoint, or, in default of such appointment, as the Minister may direct.
3. Quorums of meetings.—There shall be present at least three members at such first meeting in order to constitute a quorum, and all future quorums shall consist of two members, exclusive of the Chairman.
4. Chairman.—The Chairman shall be elected at the first meeting of the Trust, or at any adjournment thereof, and thereafter annually, by a majority of votes of those present, and he shall hold office as Chairman for one year if he remain a member of the municipal council of his district, and may be willing to act.
5. Vacancy of Chairman, how filled.—Any vacancy in the position of Chairman shall be filled at the next meeting of the Trust after such vacancy has occurred, or at any adjournment thereof, in the same manner as aforesaid, and such election shall be the first business on the notice-paper for such meeting.
6. Appointment by Minister.—In the event of the Trust failing or neglecting to elect a Chairman the Minister may, by writing under his hand, appoint one of the members of the Trust to be Chairman, who shall hold office for one year if he remain a member of the municipal council of his district, and be willing to act.
7. Vice-Chairman.—In the absence of the Chairman, through illness or otherwise, at any meeting the members shall elect a Vice-Chairman to conduct the business of that meeting.
8. Special meetings.—The Trust may hold special meetings, which may be called upon the requisition of the Chairman, or upon the requisition, in writing under their hands, of any three members, addressed to the Chairman; but no such special meeting shall be held unless three clear days' notice thereof at least be given.
9. General conduct of business.—In all cases not herein provided for resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of Parliament, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the Trust.
10. Meetings, notice of.—A notice of every meeting of the Trust shall be, by the Secretary, delivered or sent by the post, addressed to the usual or last-known place of abode of each member, three clear days at least prior to the day upon which such intended meeting is to be held.
11. Minutes of meeting to be read at subsequent meeting.—At every meeting of the Trust the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting of a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and the reading of the minutes of the proceedings of any Committee presented at any such preceding meeting, and no discussion shall

be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings; and the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting shall then be signed by the Chairman.

12. Order of business of meetings.—After the signing of the minutes, as aforesaid, the order of business of any ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable, but, for the greater convenience of the Trust at any particular meeting thereof, it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

- (I.) Reading of copies of letters sent by authority of the Trust.
- (II.) Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
- (III.) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
- (IV.) Presentation of reports of Committees.
- (V.) Payments.
- (VI.) Ordinary business, including dealing with tenders.
- (VII.) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.
- (VIII.) Extraordinary business, new rules and regulations.
- (IX.) Other motions of which previous notice has been given.
- (X.) Notices of motion.

And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

13. Addresses to the Governor in Council.—All addresses and applications to the Governor shall be presented by the Chairman and Secretary of the Trust, unless otherwise ordered by the Trust.

14. Motions.—All notices of motion shall be given in writing to the Secretary at least ten clear days before the meeting at which the motion is intended to be moved, and the Secretary shall, seven clear days at least before such meeting, cause notice of such intended motion to be sent to each Trustee, or notice of motion may be handed to the Secretary at any meeting, and, on being read to the meeting, may be dealt with at the next meeting.

15. Notice of motion to be given.—No member shall make any motion initiating a subject for discussion, but in pursuance of notice given, as prescribed in the last preceding clause.

16. Petitions.—No motion, except that for receiving the same, shall, unless under most urgent circumstances, and then only by leave being granted by a two-thirds majority of those present at the meeting, be made on any petition, memorial, or other like application until the next ordinary meeting of the Trust after that at which it has been presented.

17. Motions to be moved in order.—Except by leave of a majority of the Trustees present, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received, and if not so moved shall be struck out.

18. Motion to be moved by member giving notice.—No motion shall be proceeded with in the absence of the member who gave notice of the same, unless by some other member producing written authority from him to that effect.

19. Mover of motion appointing committee to be a member.—The mover of every motion appointing a committee shall be a member of such committee.

20. Draft of address or petition to be submitted at previous meeting.—No motion for any address or petition shall be entertained unless the mover shall at some previous meeting have submitted a draft of the same.

21. Order, &c., of debate.—Any member desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the Chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the member calling to order shall have been heard thereon, and the question of order disposed of, when the member in possession of the Chair may proceed with his subject.

22. Nature of motion to be stated.—Any member desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the Trust thereon.

23. No motion to be withdrawn without leave.—No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of a majority of the Trustees present.

24. Motion to be seconded.—No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the Trust unless it be seconded; but a member may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the Trust by directing the Chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

25. Mover of motion.—A member moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a member merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

26. Motions, &c., how decided.—All questions shall be decided in accordance with the terms of section 21, clause 1, of Act No. 1288.

27. Resolutions, how revoked or altered.—No resolution shall be revoked or altered except in accordance with clause 2 of section 21 of the same Act.

28. Priority of members.—If two or more members rise to speak at the same time, the Chairman shall decide, by naming the member, who is entitled to priority.
29. Members to stand while addressing the Trust.—Every member, including the Chairman, shall stand while addressing the Trust.
30. Points of order.—The Chairman, when called upon to decide on points of order or practice, shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case, without discussion or commenting on the same; and his decision as to order or practice in each case shall be final.
31. Member not to digress.—No member shall digress from the subject-matter of the question under discussion, or comment upon the words used by any other member in a previous debate; and all imputations of improper motives, and all personal reflections on members, shall be deemed highly disorderly.
32. Members to apologize for disorderly or offensive expressions.—Whenever any member shall make use of any expression disorderly, or capable of being applied offensively to any other member, the member so offending shall be required by the Chairman to withdraw the expression, and to make a satisfactory apology to the Trust.
33. Members called to order to sit down.—A member called to order shall sit down, unless permitted by the Trust to explain.
34. Members twice offending to be liable to a penalty.—Any member using disorderly or offensive language, and having been twice called to order, or to withdraw, and to apologize for such conduct, and refusing to do so, shall be liable to a penalty for a breach of this Regulation.
35. Strangers.—Any person, not being a member of the Trust, who shall, having been admitted to any meeting of the Trust, be guilty thereof of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who shall not leave when requested by the Chairman to do so, may, on his order, be forthwith removed, and shall be liable to a penalty for a breach of this Regulation.
36. Members may demand documents.—Any member may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the Trust applying to the question under discussion.
37. No second amendment until previous one disposed of.—No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or on an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.
38. Mover of motion to have right of reply.—The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right of reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the Chair; but no other member shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question unless permission be given to explain, or the attention of the Chair be called to a point of order.
39. No discussion on motion for adjournment of Trust.—No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for an adjournment of the Trust; but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice-paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment shall be entertained; but if the motion for adjournment be carried, the debates on motions moved and seconded, or any order of the day, may be resumed at the next adjourned meeting of the Trust at the point at which it was so interrupted.
40. Protests.—Any member may protest against any resolution of the Trust, and notice of intention to protest shall in every case be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against; and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the Trust by the protesting member, in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the Secretary, and signed by such member, and shall also be entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the Trust to be not in accordance with truth, or in its terms disrespectful to the Trust.
41. Lapsed questions.—If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of members present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.
42. Lapsed order of the day may be restored.—If a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by such insufficiency of number as aforesaid happening, such order may be restored to the notice-paper for a future day on motion upon notice, and then such debate shall be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.
43. Committees.—Minutes of all proceedings of Committee shall be entered in the Committee's minute-book, and, being signed by the Chairman of the Committee, shall be presented to the Trust.
44. Meetings of Committees.—The Secretary shall convene every Committee within ten days of its first appointment, or at any other time by order of the Trust, or on the written order of the Chairman, or of any two members of the Committee.
45. Petitions.—No petition shall be presented after the Trust shall have proceeded to the orders of the day; and every member presenting a petition to the Trust shall acquaint himself with its contents, and ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Trust, and that its contents do not violate any Regulation herein contained, and shall write his name at the beginning of the said petition.
46. No debate shall take place upon petitions.—No debate shall take place upon any petition or memorial, except as to its being received and taken into consideration as an order of the day at any future meeting, or, if necessary, that it be referred to a Committee.
47. Secretary.—The Secretary shall keep all minutes of meetings of the Trust, or of any Committee of the same; he shall also keep all accounts, books, and documents, conduct all correspondence, and perform all clerical work required to be performed for the Trust; and shall attend all meetings of the Trust or Committees when required, and at the office for the transaction of business as provided for under this Regulation; and shall perform all other acts which shall be deemed by the Trust incumbent upon the Secretary to discharge; he shall also have the receipt and disbursement of all moneys, and shall provide a guarantee for such amount for his fidelity and due fulfilment of his duties, and for the proper management and disposal of the funds of the Trust, as they may direct. All moneys received by him shall, as soon as possible thereafter, be paid into the account of the Trust to the bank wherein the same is kept. That he shall at no time hold in his hands more than Twenty pounds (£20) for 72 hours without banking the same. That all payments of the Trust shall be made by cheque, signed by the Chairman or Vice-Chairman and two members, and countersigned by the Secretary. That he shall take account of all moneys received by the Collector, and supervise his accounts as provided for under these Regulations.
48. Treasurer.—The Treasurer shall provide a guarantee for such amount for his fidelity and due fulfilment of his duties, and for the proper management and disposal of the funds of the Trust, as they may direct.
49. Collector.—The Collector shall give security for his fidelity and due fulfilment of his duties, and for the proper management and disposal of the funds of the Trust, for such amount as they may determine. He shall give no receipts except upon the printed forms provided for the same; and every receipt shall have a butt filled in by him, containing all particulars of moneys received and from whom. He shall pay the Treasurer or Secretary all moneys received by him at least once a week, and he shall at no time hold more moneys of the Trust than Twenty pounds (£20) for 72 hours without paying the same to the Treasurer or Secretary. He shall, at the close of each month at least, submit his books and butts, with a statement of all amounts collected, to the Secretary, and render to him a full account then, or whenever demanded by him, of all moneys received by him on account of the said Trust.
50. Appointment, &c., of officers.—No appointment to any office at the disposal of the Trust shall take place until seven clear days' notice shall have been given, by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in the Construction District, inviting applications from qualified candidates for the same. Where the number of candidates are in excess of the number required, the Trust may reduce the same by ballot.
51. Salaries of officers, &c.—The salary or allowance attached to all offices and places at the disposal of the Trust shall in all cases be fixed before they proceed to appoint any person to fill the same, and before the advertisement inviting applications as aforesaid, and shall be specified in such advertisement.
52. Expense of preparing security.—In all cases of security being given for the faithful performance of any duty, the expense of such security shall be borne by the Trust.
53. Common seal.—The Secretary of the Trust shall have the custody of the common seal, and shall be responsible for the same; and impressions shall only be made by order of the Trust, verified by the signatures of the Chairman, a member, and Secretary.
54. Suspension of rules.—With the exception of clauses 25 and 26, any one or more of the clauses of this Regulation may be suspended *pro tem.* in cases of emergency, and with the consent of a majority of the whole Trust.
55. Penalty.—Any person guilty of a breach of this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

## THE ALBERTON TO WON WRON RAILWAY CONSTRUCTION DISTRICT AND THE ALBERTON TO WON WRON RAILWAY CONSTRUCTION TRUST CONSTITUTED.

WHEREAS I, the Honorable Sir Arthur Lyulph Stanley, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor in and over the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., by an Order in Council dated the 17th day of March, 1915, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 24th day of March, 1915, and in the *South Gippsland Chronicle* and the *Gippsland Standard* newspapers circulating in such proposed district, announced my intention to constitute, under the provisions of the *Railway Lands Acquisition Act 1893*, the land hereinafter described, a Railway Construction District, under the name, style, or title of the Alberton to Won Wron Railway Construction District: And whereas no petition has been received by me praying that such Railway Construction District be not constituted, and that the line of railway from Alberton to Won Wron authorized by the *Alberton to Won Wron Railway Construction Act 1914* be not constructed: Now therefore I, Sir Arthur Lyulph Stanley, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor in and over the State of Victoria, and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon me by the *Railway Lands Acquisition Act 1893* and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, hereby by this my Order constitute the lands hereinafter described a Railway Construction District under the name, style, or title of the Alberton to Won Wron Railway Construction District; and I do hereby constitute a Trust for the said Railway Construction District, consisting of nine (9) trustees, being the members for the time being of the municipal council of the municipal district of Alberton.

The size or length of all such fish shall be ascertained by measuring them overall; that is, from the point of the snout to the end of the tail.

#### REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE CLARKESDALE AND LYNCHFIELD COMMON.

IN pursuance of the regulations relating to Commons made by the Governor in Council on 8th January, 1902, the Managers of the Clarkesdale and Lynchfield Common, having drafted the following regulations for the management thereof, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works, and approval of the Governor in Council, in lieu of the regulations heretofore in force in respect of such Common:—

##### REGULATIONS.

1. Ratepayers, holders of miner's rights, business licences or carriers' licences, and farmers residing within a distance of 5 miles from the Common may respectively depasture thereon four (4) head of large cattle or the equivalent of the whole or portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three (3) head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on the Common one additional head of large cattle or the equivalent in small cattle for every ten (10) acres of such land cultivated by him.

2. The fees for depasturing stock on the Common shall be as follows, and shall be payable quarterly in advance, on the first day of January, the first day of April, the first day of July, and the first day of October in every year:—For every horse, 6s. per annum, and for every head of other large cattle, 4s. per annum; for every head of small cattle, 3s. per annum; for every goat, 2s. per annum. Progeny under six months old of stock legally depasturing on the Common, free.

3. All stock upon which the prescribed fees shall remain unpaid for a period of seven days shall be liable to be impounded.

4. No bull or entire horse shall be depastured on the Common without the permission, in writing, of the Managers.

5. The Managers of the Common shall appoint certain times and places for registering and branding stock, and shall give due notice thereof, and the Managers or the Herdsman shall attend at such times and places for the purpose aforesaid, and all persons desirous of depasturing stock upon the Common shall be in attendance therewith, at the times and places appointed, for the purpose of giving a full and correct description of such stock, and assisting to brand the same, and shall pay the prescribed fees for such stock before the same shall be registered or branded with the Common brand.

6. All stock, except travelling cattle or sheep, found upon the Common without the Common brand thereon, shall be deemed to be trespassing thereon, and shall be liable to be impounded forthwith by the Herdsman.

7. No person shall remove any stock from the Common without having first given notice to, and obtained permission in writing to do so, from the Managers or Herdsman of the Common.

8. The Managers shall not be responsible for loss or injury to any stock depasturing on the Common, but shall, by their Herdsman, take every possible care of such stock, and in the event of loss thereof, or injury thereto, shall give to the owners of such stock every information and assistance.

9. The Managers shall cause to be removed from the Common all diseased stock, or stock which by a competent person shall be deemed to be diseased and dangerous to the health of other stock on the Common, and the owner of such diseased stock shall be required to keep the same off the Common, and should the owner thereof refuse or neglect to do so, the Managers may cause such diseased stock to be forthwith destroyed, and the owner thereof shall not be entitled to compensation.

10. The Managers of the Common shall be responsible for any damage done to property thereon, and shall obtain the permission of the Board of Land and Works before proceeding with any works on the Common.

11. No person shall wilfully injure, or destroy, or unnecessarily disturb, or drive away from the Common any stock legally depasturing thereon. Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20) for each offence.

#### BOROUGH OF OAKLEIGH.

##### By-Law No. 14.

A By-law of the Borough of Oakleigh, made under the provisions of section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered 14, for suppressing nuisances and for compelling residents or occupiers of premises to keep them free from offensive or unwholesome matters.

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Oakleigh order as follows:—

1. Every occupier of premises within the Borough of Oakleigh shall cause to be provided and kept therein one or more covered galvanized iron receptacles not exceeding one and one-half cubic feet in contents and of a uniform size and pattern corresponding with the following:—

Every receptacle to be cylindrical in shape, of galvanized iron, 24 gauge, coated inside with distilled tar strengthened at the top with a wrought iron band, and at the bottom with wrought iron band  $1\frac{1}{2}$  inches wide and one-eighth of an inch thick to keep bottom off ground.

Receptacle to be 14 inches in diameter and 15 inches deep, or thereabouts, and provided with two rigid side handles and conical cover.

Any receptacle not complying with the above standard must have the special approval of the Council.

2. Every such occupier shall cause all refuse and garbage arising from or upon such premises from time to time to be deposited in such receptacles, which receptacles must be constantly kept covered, and must at all times be kept as clean as practicable, and maintained in good order and condition, and, when necessary, such receptacles shall be sufficiently disinfected.

3. Every occupier shall cause such receptacles to be placed within four feet inside the gateway or doorway of his premises on the days appointed by the Council for emptying the same.

4. Every person who shall by any wilful act or default be guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of the foregoing By-law shall be liable for any such offence to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds nor less than Five shillings for each such breach.

5. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout such portion of the municipal district as the Council may from time to time by resolution direct.

6. This By-law shall come into operation and commence to have effect immediately upon its publication, as provided by the *Local Government Act 1903*, in the *Government Gazette*.

SHIRE OF ALEXANDRA.

FOURTEENTH SCHEDULE.

A By-law of the Shire of Alexandra, made under sections 197 and 498 of *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered 10, for regulating the conditions under which "cattle" may be driven on to any road or street for purpose of grazing there with the council's consent.

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Alexandra order as follows:—

1. That any ratepayer or resident occupier shall be entitled to and may apply to register a number not exceeding six head of horned cattle and three head of horses in each of the quarters provided in clause 7 hereof.

2. Application to be registered shall be in the form in the schedule hereunder supplied by the Council, and shall be signed by the applicant, and the applicant shall make a declaration as to the *bona fides* of his ownership of the animals sought to be registered.

3. Such form shall specify *inter alia* the particulars and descriptions and brands, or apparent brands and marks, age, and sex of stock desired to be registered, and the roads or reserves on which the applicant desires to graze such stock.

4. Such form of application shall be submitted to the Council for approval.

5. If the Council approve the application it shall issue a permit or licence in the form to be approved by the Council to the applicant.

6. The charges of fees subject to increase or decrease by a resolution of the Council from time to time for grazing shall be:—

- (a) For each horse above the age of six months, Five shillings per quarter.  
 (b) For each head of cattle above the age of six months, Three shillings per quarter.

7. Such charges or fees shall be payable quarterly in advance to the herdsman of the Council, and the quarters shall begin on the first days of the months of October, January, April, and July in each year.

8. Fees payable under permits to register granted during the currency of a quarter shall be apportioned according to the unexpired term of that quarter.

9. Any person entering stock during the currency of any quarter shall pay for the unexpired portion of the quarter, but not less than one month's fee shall in that case be accepted.

10. That the Council shall have a discretion as to number of cattle or horses which each applicant shall be entitled to register under clause 1 hereof, or to graze upon such roads, street, or reserves from time to time, and the Council may regulate the increase or diminish the numbers to be grazed in any quarter.

11. That no person shall be permitted to graze any sheep, entire horse, or bull, on any road or reserve in the Shire of Alexandra, and any such animals found upon any road or reserve will be impounded by the Council's herdsman, as also will any sheep, cattle, or horses found grazing upon any such road or reserve without the Council's registered permit under this By-law.

12. The permit to graze stock within the township boundaries of Alexandra shall extend to milking cows only, and to the hours between sunrise and sunset, and any other live stock found grazing within such boundaries, or any milking cows found within those boundaries between the hours of sunset and sunrise, even though registered, will be impounded by the herdsman.

13. The Council shall not be responsible or liable for any loss by theft or death, or for any injury or damage to, or straying of any cattle or horses under the aforesaid permit, nor for the supply of a sufficiency of grass or water, and the permit or licence to graze shall be applied for and obtained strictly upon these conditions.

14. Each animal for which application is made to register shall be the *bona fide* property of the applicant, and the applicant shall make a statutory declaration to that effect.

15. Calves and foals under six months of age, the progeny of the registered cows or mares, may run with their mothers free of charge up to that limit of age.

16. Nothing in this By-law shall prevent the operation of section 17 of *Police Offences Act 1890*, nor shall the Council be responsible or accountable, in any way, to the owner of any animal for any penalty incurred by such owner under such sections, or for the impounding of any animal by the owner or occupier of property abutting upon any street or road or by any other person.

17. If the tag has, previous to the passing of this By-law, been issued by the Council to any applicant such tag must be returned or its loss satisfactorily accounted for as a condition precedent to the registration of any animal by such applicant.

18. A registered owner of animals shall acquaint the herdsman of the fact of the sale or death or removal or withdrawal of any registered animal, and in case of sale, of the name and address of the purchaser.

19. The Council shall have the power to terminate the permission to graze any animal of the applicant at the end of any current quarter, or earlier, if reported by the herdsman to be suffering from any form of complaint or disease, or if a nuisance, breaking or getting through fences, or if feed or water become scarce or insufficient.
