LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL.

SUPPLEMENTARY ELECTORAL LISTS, 1915.

T is hereby notified that Tuesday, the 1st day of June next, is the last day on which Electors' Rights can be obtained for enrolment on the Supplementary Lists of Non-ratepaying Electors for the Legislative Council.

Qualified persons, women as well as men, who are not already enrolled and who have not obtained Electors' Rights, will be entitled to have their names entered on such Lisks by obtaining Rights from the Registrars for their respective Divisions before or on that date.

No person whose name is on, or is entitled to be on, any Roll of Ratepaying Electors for any Division of a Province may obtain an Elector's Right for such Province.

Each applicant for an Elector's Right for the Legislative Council should provide himself with the duty stamp (6d.) necessary for payment for the Right.

CONSOLIDATED RULES RELATING TO THE QUALIFICATION OF CANDIDATES TO PRACTISE AS, AND FOR AND REGULATING THE ADMISSION OF, BARRISTERS AND SOLICITORS

AND

TEMPORARY RULE RELATING TO THE QUALIFICATION TO PRACTISE AS BARRISTERS AND SOLICITORS.

TEMPORARY RULE.

The Nineteenth day of April, 1915.

WHEREAS it is desirable to remove hindrance to candidates joining the Naval or Military Forces of the Crown in the present war; and whereas the University of Melbourne has made provision whereby special examinations may be held in the case of candidates for degrees leaving Victoria with the Expeditionary Forces.

Now therefore in pursuance of the authority conferred by the Legal Practitioners Reciprocity Act 1903 the Council of Legal Education hereby makes the following Rule relating to the qualification of candidates to practice as barristers and solicitors, that is to say:—

Where any candidate has left Victoria for service with the Naval or Military Forces of the Crown in the present war and has passed any of the subjects of his course at a special examination of the University of Melbourne, he shall receive credit for the subjects so passed as if they had been passed at an annual or supplementary Examination.

The powers of the Council as to Rules are contained in section 7 of Act No. 1887, and as they appear to be limited to three classes of cases an attempt has been made to frame this Consolidation in such a shape as to enable any member of a class to ascertain without difficulty all the requirements applicable to his particular case.

It has been found impracticable to group all such requirements under each class Division—because many of them are common to several classes and such grouping would cause much repetition.

The three classes above referred to are-

- Practitioners in the Supreme Court of any State of the Commonwealth in which
 there exists a reciprocal right as to Victorian barristers and solicitors.
 Cf. No. 1887, sections 2 and 7 (2.)
 - 2. Candidates, ib. 7 (3).
 - 3. British practitioners, ib. 7 (4).

As to Class 1.—It will be observed that certain of the existing Rules refer to persons not previously admitted "in some other part of His Majesty's Dominions" or to persons not previously admitted "elsewhere." As these expressions seem to go beyond the legislative powers of the Council (see *supra*) they have been omitted in this Consolidation.

As to Class 2.—"Candidates" is not defined in Act No. 1887, but in Consolidating it has been assumed that this expression is meant to include all persons applying other than Commonwealth or British practitioners or New Zealand practitioners qualifying under section 4, No. 2437.

As to the last-mentioned practitioners, no "alteration" in or "amendment" of the existing law is contemplated, and accordingly these practitioners are not included in the Consolidation.

As to Class 3.—Certain of the existing Rules tabulate the various practitioners entitled to apply (e.g., r. 13, 16th February, 1905); but as No. 1887, section 7 (4) is so general in its terms such tabulation has not been adopted in this Consolidation, and the terms of the section have been strictly followed.

Though the collocation and verbiage of certain existing Rules have been in many cases altered it is believed that (with the exceptions hereafter noted) the whole of the existing Rules are embodied in this Consolidation; and the rights of all persons under existing Rules have been carefully preserved.

It was thought advisable to give to managing clerks who at a December examination Sept. 1913 r. 6. pass in two or more subjects and fail in one the like privil ge in resp. ct of the next supplementary examination as is given to certain other candidates; and accordingly this has been done. Cf. r. 14.

In accordance with the wishes of the Law Institute in order to enable inquiries to be made as to the antecedents of intending Commonwealth and British applicants, provision has been made that such applicants shall give the Secretary of the Institute one month's notice of application. Cf. r. 35. A similar notice was required by section 3, No. 2437, in the case of managing clerks.

Certain of the existing Rules which purported to deal with the Board of Examiners have been omitted because there appears to be no power in the Council to legislate concerning the Board.

The following existing Rules in this Consolidation have been dealt with as under-

16th February, 1905, Part I., R. 1.—Has been omitted because it seems to be ultra vir.s the Council. No. 1887, section 7 (3) is the enabling section; and by virtue of that section and not of any rule of the Council Statutes and Rules of Court are to be deemed to be altered or amended by Council Rules. It is submitted that the Court and not the Council is to determine whether or not Council Rules "alter or amend" qualifications of candidates required by any Statute or Rule of Court.

- R. 2.—No. 1216, section 11, provides for this; and this Rule does not "alter or amend" that section. However, this Rule 2 has been incorporated in Rule 4 of the Consolidated Rules because though perhaps inoperative its incorporation may be helpful to an intending candidate.
- R. 3.—Has been modified by Consolidated Rule 5, as this Rule 3 seems ultra vires the Council which it is submitted cannot legislate concerning "some other part of His Majesty's Dominions "---the Council's powers being limited by section 7, No. 1887.
- R. 5.—The words "and passed at a public examination in Latin" have been inserted in Consolidated Rules 5 (2) and 7. This imposes no new burden, and is necessary because candidates for the LL.B. degree, under new regulations of the University, are not required to pass in Latin at a public examination before beginning the course; they are required to pass in Latin at an annual examination before beginning the law work of the third year.
- Ib.—It is not apparent why the last paragraph of (b) should have been retained when the amendments of 1st May, 1913, Rule 1 (a) and 15th December, 1913, were enacted; for this Rule 5 is really embodied in those amendments.
- R. 6 (as amended by Rules, 1st May, 1913, R. 2 (5).—This has not been expressly included, but has been incorporated in Consolidated Rule 33, which otherwise is based on Rule of 16th February, 1905, Rule 3 as amended by Rule of 28th November, 1905, Rule 6.
- R. 8.—This is embodied with an amendment in Rule 17. The existing Rule allows candidates the alternative of the final examination or the University examinations. single candidate could now call for a final examination, which would cost £50. If he failed, he could call for another, but not within four years. In these circumstances, it is considered that the final examination may well be dropped altogether. So far as is known, there are no candidates preparing for it.
 - R. 9, 1-R. 9, 2, 1, are embodied in Rules 6 and 7 of the Consolidation.
- R. 9, 2, 2.—This is embodied with an amendment in Rule 18. The existing Rule provides for a fourth year of articles in lieu of the final examination and provides that the final examination may be passed at the same or different examinations. The new Rule does not purport to abolish the final examination, but by repealing the indulgence whereby the six subjects required might be passed at the same or different examinations is intended to induce candidates to accept the other alternative, viz., the fourth year of Articles.

Part 11., R. 2.—Has been omitted as ultra vires the Council.

R. 5.—The like.

1st May, 1913, R. 5.-Appears to have been enacted in similar terms on 26th March, 1913, and is now comprised in Rule 31.

The heading to the following rules appears to be in accord with section 7, No. 1887. The heading of the Rules of 16th February, 1905, is "for the admission" whereas these Rules contain Rules "relating to the qualification" Cf. No. 1887, section 7 (3).

COUNCIL OF LEGAL EDUCATION.

Rules Relating to the Qualification of Candidates to Practise as, and for and REGULATING THE ADMISSION OF, BARRISTERS AND SOLICITORS.

The nineteenth day of April, 1915.

No. 1887 s. 7.

In pursuance of the authority in this behalf conferred upon the Council of Legal Education by the Legal Practitioners Reciprocity Act 1903, such Council hereby makes the following Rules, that is to say :--

PRELIMINARY.

- 1. These Rules are hereby declared to be Rules consolidating and amending all the Rules of the said Council in force immediately prior to the coming into operation of these Rules.
 - All the Rules of the said Council so in force are hereby repealed. Provided that such repeal shall not :-
 - (a) Revive any Rule of the said Council or Statute or Rule of Court not in force at the time at which the repeal takes effect; or
 - (b) Affect the previous operation of any Rule so repealed or anything duly done thereunder; or
 - (c) Affect or abridge any right or privilege acquired under any Rule so repealed.
- 3. The headings of the Parts, Divisions, and Subdivisions into which these or any subsequent Rules of the said Council are divided, shall be deemed to be part of such Rules, but neither any marginal notes nor any footnotes to any such Rules shall be deemed to be a part thereof.

PART 1.

QUALIFICATION OF CANDIDATES.

4. "Candidate" means a natural born or naturalized British subject of the full age of 21 years applying for admission, and not previously admitted to practice in Victoria as a barrister and solicitor, and who is not a "Commonwealth Practitioner" or a "British Practitioner," as hereinafter respectively defined, or a barrister or solicitor of the Supreme Court of New Zealand qualifying under section 4 of the Supreme Court Act 1912.

5. A candidate must have-

- (1) Obtained the degree of Bachelor of Laws of the University of Melbourne;
- (2) Qualified under the Statutes and Regulations of that University to enter for examination for the first year of the course for the degree of Bachelor of Laws and passed at a public examination in Latin; or
- (3) Obtained a certificate as a "Managing Clerk," as hereinafter mentioned; or
- (4) Qualified under one of the Divisions of Part V. hereof;

and must have complied with all the provisions relating to his candidature contained in these or any subsequent Rules of the said Council, or in any Statute or Rule of Court not altered or amended by any such Rules of the said Council. Subject as aforesaid, but not otherwise a candidate may be admitted to practise as a barrister and solicitor.

8. - (d) Three years (if before the commencement of such term he has completed as aforesaid a term of clerkship of not less than five years and if he has passed the Senior Public Examination of the University of Melbourne or any substantially equivalent examination of that or any other University or teaching or examining authority or body);

has as clerk to and under the immediate direction and supervision of a barrister and solicitor practising in Victoria directed not less than one other clerk (not being a typist or office boy or messenger) in the employ of such barrister and solicitor and managed :-

- The practice of such barrister and solicitor; or
- (f) The Common Law or Conveyancing Department and in either case some other department of such practice; or
- (g) The Common Law or Conveyancing Department of such practice in case the transactions of either of such departments have been of so extensive and varied a character as to have required the whole of his time and attention thereto:

and has obtained the certificate hereinafter referred to;

Provided :-

- (1) That each such person has not during the term of his management been engaged in any other employment or occupation except with the sanction of a Judge of the Supreme Court which may be granted before, during or after the term of such other employment or occupation; and
- (2) That a Common Law Department must include practice in the Supreme Court or the High Court; and
- (3) That the said respective terms of clerkship and management must be continuous or substantially continuous and may be served in the office of more than one such barrister and solicitor and either before or after or partly before and partly after the coming into operation of these Rules; and
- (4) That for the purposes of the foregoing sub-clause (g) management shall include joint management provided each joint manager claiming the benefit of that sub-clause has (subject to the exception in the foregoing proviso (1)) devoted the whole of his time and attention to the business of the department jointly managed; and
- (5) That any examination in this Rule required to be passed may be passed either before during or subsequent to any term of clerkship or manage-

- 11. At any time after the expiration of such respective terms of management (but not being more than one year after he has ceased to so manage as aforesaid) any such person may apply to the Council of the said Institute for a certificate that the applicant is a managing clerk. Such application shall be in writing and shall be supported and supplemented by such evidence and information as the Council of the said Institute shall from time to time reasonably require.
- 12. If the Council of the said Institute shall refuse or within three calendar months shall fail to grant such certificate any such person may within one month after such refusal or failure on notice in writing to the Council of the said Institute apply to the Full Court for a certificate that the applicant is a managing clerk. Such application shall be in the nature of a re-hearing and the Council of the said Institute shall be entitled to be represented thereat.
- 13. An application to the said Institute or Court for such certificate may be renewed from time to time (at intervals of not less than six months) upon further material.
 - 14. A candidate who is a managing clerk must have-
 - (a) Filed such certificate with an affidavit of verification in the office of the Prothonotary; and thereafter
 - (b) Passed at the examinations of the University of Melbourne in each of the nine subjects specified in Rule 7 hereof.

But for the purposes of this Rule-

- (c) No managing clerk may present himself for examination in Equity unless he has passed in the Law of Property and Conveyancing at an examination held not less than six months previously; and
- (d) No managing clerk shall be entitled to credit for any subject passed at any examination unless he has passed thereat in two subjects; except—

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC PARK AND GARDENS RESERVE IN THE TOWN AND PARISH OF WOODEND.

E, Richard Cornish, Edmund Felix Daniel, Henry Coop, Malcolm Richard McKenzie, Charles Henry Overton, Patrick Hayes, and Daniel Winter Birrell, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land temporarily reserved by Order in the Council of 9th December, 1913, as a site for Public Park and Gardens in the town and parish of Woodend, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and deceny therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199 of the Land Act 1901:—

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sun-

- 1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge.
- 2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
- 3. No person shall climb or jump over the fences in or around the Reserve or gates, or stick bills thereon, or in any way deface, damage, or destroy any of the trees, fences, gates, seats, or buildings in the Reserve.
- 4. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
- 5. No person shall erect any dwelling nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, nor without a like permission shall any person hawk, offer for sale, or sell any article in the Reserve.
- 6. No person, except labourers or workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees, shrubs, or plants.
- 7. No person shall enter any enclosure set apart for any purpose within the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 8. No person shall wilfully obstruct the portions set apart and used as fairways within the Reserve.
- 9. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless led on a chain or a cord.
- 10. All dogs, except as provided in Regulation No. 9, and all goats, pigs, and poultry, found in the Reserve shall be liable to be destroyed.
- 11. No person shall take part in any assembly in the Reserve nor in any fête, pionic, concert, or public function therein without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 12. No person shall bet in the Reserve or in any part thereof, and any person found betting in the Reserve shall be liable to expulsion therefrom a
- 13. No person shall remove from the Reserve any flowers, shrubs, or other material without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, nor shall any soil be removed from the Reserve.
- 14. No person shall deposit any rubbish in the Recerve, nor leave therein any bottles or other litter.
- 15. No vehicle drawn by one or more horses or other animals shall be driven or led into or pass through or over the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
