CITY OF NORTHCOTE. BY-LAW No. 25.

A By-law of the City of Northcote made under the provisions of the Health Act 1890, and numbered 25.

The pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Act 1890, and of every other power and authority enabling it so to do, the Council of the municipality of the Mayor, Councillors, and citizens of the City of Northcote, in the name and on behalf of the said municipality, orders as follows:—

1. The occupier of every house, hulding, or premises within the City of Northcote shall provide and keep thereon a covered receptacle or receptacles constructed of non-absorbent material, and shall cause all house refuse, rubbish, or garbage produced or accumulated in and about such house, building, or premises to be from time to time deposited in such receptacle or recontacles.

from time to time deposited in such receptacle or receptacles.

2. Every such receptacle shall be kept constantly covered (except when such refuse or garbage is being deposited therein or discharged therefrom) and a sufficient quantity of some efficient deodorant shall be from time to time introduced therein when necessary to keep the same in an inoffensive condition.

3. Once a week on such day in each week as may be appointed by the Council for the removal of house refuse from such house, building, or premises, such occupier shall cause such receptacle or receptacles to be placed close to the entrance to such house, building, or premises from the street, lane, or right-of-way on which such house, building, or premises abut, in order that the contents of such receptacle or receptacles may be conveniently removed by the person or persons authorized in that behalf by the Council.

4. No person shall place or cause to be placed any such receptacle in or upon any street, lane, or right-of-

SHIRE OF CRESWICK.

BY-LAW NO. 11 UNDER THE HEALTH ACT 1890.

By-law of the Shire of Creswick, made under the provisions of the *Health Act* 1890, and numbered 11, for regulating the removal and disposal of night-soil, closet pans, house and yard refuse, and other matters within the Shire of Creswick.

- $m{L}^N$ pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Act 1890, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Creswick make the following By-
- 1. This By-law shall come into force on its confirma-tion by the Board of Public Health and immediately after its publication in the Government Gazette.
- 2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation within the boundaries of the townships of Allendale, Broomfield, Kingston, and Smenton, as hereinafter defined:—

d, Kingston, and Smenton, as hereinafter defined:—

Allendale.—Crown allotments 5, 6, 7, 8, 17, and 16, parish of Spring Hill.

Broomfield.—Government township of Broomfield, parish of Creswick, and Crown allotments 19 and 4a, parish of Spring Hill.

Kingston.—Crown allotments 1, 2, 3, 11, 12, 13, 14, parish of Spring Hill, and the portions of allotments B, A1, and C, parish of Spring Hill, south of railway line.

Smeaton.—Government township of Smeaton, in the parishes of Smeaton and Spring Hill, and Crown allotments 34, 35, 40, 41, 42, and 43, parish of Smeaton.

- 3. The Council may, upon the recommendation of the Officer of Health and the Sanitary Inspector, exempt any premises within the above areas from the operation of this By-law.
- 4. The occupier of every house or premises within the said areas shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto, or occupied in connexion therewith, to be kept thereto, or occupied in connexion therewith, to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all filth, rubbish, and refuse matter to be from time to time removed from such yard or ground, and if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such filth, rubbish, or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid the Council may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.
- 5. Every such occupier shall provide and maintain on 5. Every such occupier shall provide and maintain on his premises a proper closet or privy building in the yard or area of such premises, which privy building must have a door and be properly screened from public view, and be as far as practicable fly proof.
- 6. Every such occupier shall furnish and provide in each such closet or privy building a suitable galvanizediron pan with proper handles, and such pan to be of the following dimensions, viz.:—15 inches wide, 144 inches deep; no pan shall in any case exceed the capacity of 2 cubic feet.
- 7. Every such occupier shall cause to be kept in every closet a plentiful supply of dry earth, ashes, lime, charcoal, or some other effective deodorant for effectively deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil deposited in the pan to be sufficiently covered with such deodorizing material.
- 8. At least once in every week, or so much oftener as may be necessary, and as the Shire Council may from time to time direct, the pan shall be emptied by the nightman employed by the Shire Council.
- 9. No pan shall be removed or emptied, and the contents conveyed through the streets or roads of the shire, except between the hours of 11.30 o'clock p.m. and 5 o'clock a.m., and in a cart or carts approved of by the Shire Council.
- 10. The night-soil removed shall be taken to the depôt set apart for the purpose by the Shire Council, and shall there be buried in trenches and covered with at least 9 inches of dry loam or earth.
- 11. No occupier or person shall employ any person for the removal of night-soil save those authorized by the Shire Council for the purpose.

No person shall place, carry, or have in any cart or vehicle containing manure or offensive matter any fruit, vegetables, milk, or other food, or any case or other receptacle customarily used for the reception and carriage of fruit, vegetables, milk, or other food in such a manner that such fruit, vegetables, milk, or other food in such case and receptacles shall be in contact with or liable to be in contact with such manure or offensive matter, or be contaminated by moisture or effluvia therefrom; and no such person shall carry or have in any cart in which manure or other offensive matter has been carried any fruit, vegetables, milk, or other food until such cart shall have been effectually cleansed.

 13. All former By-laws so far as they relate to the
- 13. All former By-laws so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law are hereby repealed.

Any occupier or person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall, on conviction, forfeit a sum not exceeding Ten pounds (£10) for every breach thereof, or not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued; but the justices before whom any penalty is sought to be recovered shall order the whole or any part only (not being less than Five shillings (5s.)) of such penalty to be paid.

STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION.

By-law No. 511.—Werribee Urban District within the Werribee Waterworks District.

HE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law follow-ing for the Werribee Urban District within the Werribee Waterworks District:—

1. All previous By-laws and Regulations relating to the 1. All previous By-laws and Regulations relating to the subject-matter herein shall be and the same are hereby revoked, but not so as to relieve, discharge, or absolve any person from liability to pay any charge made in accordance with the provisions of the revoked By-laws or Regulations for payment of which charge such person may have become liable prior to or at the date of this By-law coming into operation; or to abrogate or diminish the power of the said Commission to recover and enforce payment of any such charge; or to annul or stay any proceedings taken or business initiated, as in conformity with the provisions of the By-laws or Regulations hereby revoked prior to the date of this By-law coming into revoked prior to the date of this By-law coming into operation, but the same respectively may be continued

proceedings taken or business initiated, as in conformity with the provisions of the By-laws or Regulations hereby revoked prior to the date of this By-law coming into operation, but the same respectively may be continued and carried to completion.

2. Every person using or supplied with water for other than domestic purposes solely shall, at his own expense, provide a meter, and keep and maintain the same in good working condition to the satisfaction of the Commission or its proper officer.

3. No hose or pipe shall be attached to any pipe or tap for the purpose of watering ground, or trees; or plants, or washing house walls or carriages, or for any similar purpose, except where the water is charged for by measure. Syphon pumps will not be allowed except where the water is supplied by measure.

4. Before any plumber, workman, or other person affix any meter or any service-pipe to any pipe of the Commission, or alter, repair, or in any manner interfere with any meter or pipe of the Commission, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Commission, he shall obtain from the Commission a licence to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such meter, pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid, shall be guilty of an offence.

5. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not; who shall open any ground so as to uncover any pipe the property of the Commission, without giving three days' notice to the Commission, without giving three days' notice to the Commission, without giving three days' notice to the Commission or its proper officer being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, valve, pipe, or other work, the property of the Commission or its proper officer being first obtained, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of the proper officer of the Commission, or who shall hay any leaden or other pipe

for which shall be at the rate per annum of—
For i-inch meter, Seven shillings;
For i-inch meter, Eight shillings;
For any meter of larger size than is inch the rent
per annum shall be at the rate of 10 per centum
upon the cost of such meter, fixed complete.
Such rents shall be exclusive of and in addition to the
amount chargeable for the recorded consumption of
water, and shall become due and be paid yearly, in
advance, on the first day of the month of September in
each year. Such hired meters shall be kept in repair at
the cost of the Commission, except as to external injuries, the cost of repairing which shall be borne by
the hirer.

the hirer.

9. In the event of the hirer being dissatisfied with the registering of a meter hired from the Commission, he may, by notice in writing, require the Commission to cause such meter to be removed and tested; and, together with such notice, shall forward a sum of Ten shillings, which, if the meter be found to register correctly, shall be applied in paying the cost of the removing, testing, and replacing, and the balance, if any,

shall be returned to him; but if such meter be found to fail to register, or be found to register incorrectly, it shall be repaired and replaced, or another meter shall be placed instead thereof at the cost of the Commission, and the amount deposited by the hirer shall be returned to him. Any person so hiring a meter from the Commission, who shall cease to occupy the premises on which such meter is fixed without having previously given, in writing, at least six days' notice to the Commission of his intention to do so, shall be guilty of an offence.

10. If any meter cease registering, or be found to be out of repair, or registering inaccurately, the Commission may estimate and charge for the water consumed during the period such meter was not in working order and until repaired and re-fixed, either by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter, or during the corresponding period of the provious year.

11. Meters, other than such as are hired from the Commission, will be tested on delivery thereof at the Pumping Station of the Commission at Bacchus Marsh, a fee of One shilling shall be charged for each test.

12. The Commission, by its officers, may, at any time, after six days' notice, in writing, of its intention, attach a check meter to the service-pipes of any consumer; and may, for such purpose, enter such premises at any time between the hours of Ten in the forencon and four in the afternoon, and then and there do all things necessary therefor.

13. Any person supplied with water by the Commission who shall wilfully or negligently allow such water to

rour in the atternoon, and their and there do an things necessary therefor.

13. Any person supplied with water by the Commission who shall wilfully or negligentry allow such water the rout to waste shall be guilty of an offence; and, in the event of continuing the same, shall be guilty of a further offence for each day, after notice from the Commission, on which such waste is continued.

14. All water troughs supplied from the pipes of the Commission shall be lined with metal, so as to be watertight, and shall have proper and efficient fittings for supplying them automatically and for preventing overthow. All such troughs and fittings shall be kept in proper order and repair. No water trough shall be of greater capacity than twenty-five gallons. Should any trough or the fittings thereof be out of repair or leaking the supply thereto may be cut off until efficiently repaired. paired.

paired.

15. If any person supplied with water by the Commission does, or causes to be done, anything in contravention of this By-law, or fails to pay any rates or charges lawfully due by him, or fails to do anything which under this By-law ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Commission may, in addition to any other remedy, cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

16. The charge to be paid for water supplied by mea-

or is not remedied.

16. The charge to be paid for water supplied by measure from the pipes of the Commission shall be Eighteen-pence per 1,000 gallons.

17. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by measure in each case where water is supplied from the pipes of the Commission shall be as follows:—

(1) Where the supply is for domestic as well as for other than domestic purposes, the quantity which, if charged for at Eighteen pence per 1,000 gallons, would give an amount equal to that payable in respect of the premises so supplied under the provisions of any By-law of the Commission for making and levying rates, if such premises were supplied otherwise than by measure.

by measure.

(2) Where the supply is solely for other than domestic purposes, a quantity which, if charged as provided by the last preceding section, would give a sum of Five shillings for any continuous

give a sum of Five shillings for any continuous period of three months.

15. In the construction of this By-law the word "person" shall extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole; the expression "proper officer" shall mean an officer or servant of the Commission authorized to perform any act or to accept service of any notice or to execute any function on behalf of the Commission.

19. Any person guilty of an offence against this Bylaw shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, recoverable summarily before any Court of competent jurisdiction.

SHEPPARTON URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW RELATING TO WATER SUPPLY.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Shepparton I Urban Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Act 1905 and all powers enabling them in this behalf, do make the following

- 1. Any person affixing any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust shall connect such by a lead pipe three (3) feet in length, with proper brass connexions, and before any person in any manner interferes with any service-pipe, any person in any manner interferes with any service-pipe, cock, or fitting up to the building line connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall give a clear twenty-four (24) hours' written notice of his intention to do so to the secretary of the Trust, and shall before doing such work obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works, and any person offending against this By-law in any way shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).
- 2. Such licence shall be at and during the pleasure of the Trust, and the Trust may at any time cancel such licence in the event of the holder thereof being judged by the Trust to be incompetent, or by himself or his employees committing any breach of the Water Act 1905, or any other Act or Acts relating to water supply or of this By-law or any By-law of the Trust.
- 3. Before any such licence shall be granted by the Trust the person applying for same shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent plumber, and shall pay in advance a licence fee of Ten shillings (10s.) per annum; but the Trust may, if it so see fit, refuse to grant such licence.
- 4. No person shall lay down a pipe at a less depth than two (2) feet from the surface of the earth.
- 5. The Trust may require a meter to be used in any case where it is deemed necessary.
- 6. The bore of any service-pipe for the supply of water from the pipes of the Trust shall not exceed—

 - (a) One-half of an inch in diameter where such service is to any premises valued at the municipal valuation for rating purposes of Twenty pounds (£20) or under; and
 (b) Three-quarters of an inch in diameter where such service is to any premises valued as aforesaid at a sum exceeding Twenty pounds (£20); and this By-law shall be taken as a consent of the Trust to any such services. of the Trust to any such service. Before any service-pipe with a bore, the dimensions of which are contrary to this clause, is laid down to any premises, the consent of the Trust must first be obtained.
- 7. No person shall use, or permit to be used, or allow to run on any premises, any water for other than domestic, manufacturing, or fire-extinguishing purposes before the hour of Seven o'clock a.m. or after the hour of Nine o'clock p.m. during the months of November, December, January, and February, or before the hour of Seven (7) o'clock a.m. or after the hour of Eight (8) o'clock p.m. during the other months of the year. Any person committing or permitting a breach of this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).
- 8. Any person who shall allow water to run to waste, or who shall use the same in any manner for irrigation purposes (except where the supply is by meter), shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).
- 9. Any person not having agreed to be supplied with water by the Trust who shall, or who having so agreed shall, contrary to such agreement, use, take, or carry away, or wilfully permit to be used, taken, or carried away, water from any drinking tap, water-trough, or private or public water service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).
- 10. Every person upon whose premises a water-trough stands shall keep such trough provided with a ball tap, and shall keep such water-trough and ball tap at all times in a state of thorough repair. Any person committing a breach of this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).
- 11. No person shall use any water on, or allow any 11. No person shall use any water on, or allow any water to run on any land, garden, plantation, or vegetation, wherever growing, otherwise than by means of a garden hose, or at any time other than between the hours of Seven (7) o'clock a:m. and Nine (9) o'clock p:m. during the months of November, December, January, and February, or between the hours of Seven (7) o'clock a:m. and Eight (8) o'clock p:m. during the other months of the year. Any person committing a breach of this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

- 12. Every person supplied with water shall keep the pipe or pipes on the premises occupied by him disconnected and free from any hose pipe or other conduit during the times the use of water is forbidden under clause seven (7) hereof. Any person committing a breach of this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).
- 13. No person shall use water, or permit water to be used, or allow water to run in any manner whatsoever upon any land upon which is growing lucerne, maize, millett, amber cane, sorghum, or other fodder crop, or other crop of any nature whatsoever, without a permit from the secretary of the Trust, who shall, subject to the approval of the Trust, issue the same. The fee for such permit and conditions thereof shall be as may be fixed by the Trust. No person shall so use water, or permit its use, or allow water to so run upon more than one-eighth (1) of an acre of any land occupied by such person without a permit as aforesaid and unless a meter be attached by such person to the service-pipe supplying be attached by such person to the service-pipe supplying such land, and kept and maintained in good working condition by such person to the satisfaction of such officer as the Trust may appoint. Any person committing a breach of this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).
- 14. If any person does, or causes, or permits, allows, or suffers to be done, anything in contravention of this By-law, or fails to do anything which under this By-law ought to be done for the prevention of the waste, misuse, undue consumption, or contamination of the water, he shall be liable (where no penalty is otherwise herein provided for such offence) to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5), and a further penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for every day such misfeasance or unonfeasance shall continue after notice of the offence from the Waterworks Trust; and the Trust may cut off the water supply from the premises of such person or persons by cutting the pipe by or through which the water is supplied or otherwise, and may discontinue the supply so long as the cause or injury remains or is not remedied to the satisfaction of the Trust. Provided that neither this By-law or anything done hereunder shall in any way lessen or extinguish the rights of the Trust under the Water Act 1905, or any other Act or Acts relating to water supply.
- 15. The officer or officers of the Trust, or other person appointed for that purpose, may at all lawful times enter any house, tenement, or land to, through, or into which water is supplied by the Trust, in order to inspect the meters, instruments, pipes, and apparatus for measuring, conveying, reception, or storage of water, or for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of water supplied or consumed, or examining if there be any waste or misuse of such water, or breach of this Bylaw; and if any person hinders or prevents such entry or examination he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5). The Trust may turn off the water supplied by it from any house, tenement, or land to which such entry is refused, or on which such examination is hindered, and cease to supply the same with water until such inspection shall have been permitted and effected.
 - 16. The word "person" in this By-law shall include

SHEPPARTON URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST. RATING BY-LAW FOR 1915.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Act 1905, and of all powers enabling them in this behalf, do make the following Balaw:

By-law for determining the rates and charges which shall be made for water supplied within the boundaries of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust District:—

1. A rate of One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) in the pound (£1) sterling on the municipal value of all rateable property valued at Thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence (£13. 6s. 8d.)

1. A rate of One shilling and sixpence (18. 6d.) in the pound (£1) sterling on the municipal value of all rateable property valued at Thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence (£13. 6s. 8d.) and upwards situated within the Waterworks District of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust is hereby made for the year 1915.

2. The minimum rate for such properties valued at less than Thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence (£13. 6s. 8d.) sterling on the municipal value shall be Twenty shillings (20s.).

3. On each unoccupied allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust District before mentioned separately from any building, the annual rate of Five pounds (£5) sterling per cent on the amount of the annual valuation of same shall be charged, provided that no allotment or piece of land shall pay less than Seven shillings and sixpence (7s. 6d.) per annum.

4. Water supplied by measure to be used in private domiciles or other premises for domestic use or for the watering of private gardens or distribution otherwise on or about such premises, shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling (1s.) per thousand (1,000) gallons up to an annount equal to that the Trust would be entitled to receive under the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of One shilling (1s.) per thousand (1,000) gallons for any quantity of water used for the before-mentioned purposes beyond such an annount aforesaid.

5. For every steam boiler or engine using water the charge shall be the sum of Twelve shillings and sixpence (12s. 6d.) per annum for each horse power (actual) of such steam boiler, in addition to the charge for domestic use, where water is supplied for domestic purposes also. In cases where the charge by measure would exceed the charge for domestic use, where water is supplied for menufacturing purposes (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), the charge will be Ninepence (9d.) per thousand (1,000) gallons, provided that the municipal charge shall not be le

gallons or under, Sixpence (6d.) shall be charged.

9. For a temporary supply during the laying down of any new works or the erection of new buildings, or repairs, or additions, the charge shall be by meter measurement at the rate of Two shillings (2s.) per thousand (1,000), which shall include supply of meter. The meter, with box enclosed, shall be supplied by the Trust officer or officers, and the applicant for the temporary supply shall have all pipes and connexions to the main ready before the meter is so fixed. All persons requiring a supply of water under this clause shall first notify the Trust and shall not use any water for such purposes until authorized in writing so to do. The Trust officer or officers shall be entitled at any time to go upon the premises to inspect and supervise the meter and the supply and use of the water.

10. Such rates are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of January and the first day of July in the said year 1915. The charges for the sale of water by measure

shall be payable monthly, or at such other time or period as the Trust may in any case determine.

11. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to de-mand and receive the said rates and charges.

The foregoing By-law was made by the Chairman and Commissioners of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, under and by virtue of the powers contained in the Water Act 1905, on the evening of Monday, fifteenth day of March, 1915.





In Schedule 56, Chapter IX., Part 2, where the purpose is "For obtaining and removing stone," the words "Not less than £10 per annum payable quarterly in advance according to area and position of land and value of the stone" in the second column shall be omitted, and the words "To be approved by the Minister" substituted therefor, and the words "To enter upon Crown lands the position and area of which to be approved by the Minister," shall be inserted in the third column.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC PARK AND RECREATION PURPOSES IN THE PARISH OF JIKA JIKA AT FAIRFIELD.

PARFIELD.

The Council of the Shire of Heidelberg, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 20th February, 1914, as a site for Public Park and Recreation purposes in the parish of Jika Jika at Fairfield, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199 of the Land Act 1901:—

1. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve

1. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

2. No person shall interfere with or damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

3. No person shall climb upon or jump over the fences or gates in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut or in any way damage the trees, fences, gates, or seats, or roll or throw stones or other missiles, or commit any nuisance in the reserve, or leave therein any bottles, orange peel, paper, cast-off clothing, or any litter, nor climb any tree in the Reserve.

4. Any person found in a state of intoxication, or behaving in a disorderly manner, or creating or taking part in any disturbance, or committing any act of indecency in the Reserve, shall be liable to be forthwith removed therefrom, and to prosecution for an offence against these Regulations.

5. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog,

5. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first oh tained.

6. No person shall put in the Reserve any vehicles or any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, or pigs without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

7. No person shall vide a blench in the Person with

7. No person shall ride a bicycle in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person shall engage in cricket, football, tennis, lacrosse, or any other like games in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, unless such person is at the time of playing a member of any club which is duly authorized to play therein.

9. No person shall hawk or offer for sale in the Reserve any intoxicating liquors, goods, or articles of any description without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

10. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

11. No person shall play or practice cricket or football, or any other game, or engage in any sport in the

Reserve on Sunday.

12. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any building or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any articles without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

13. No persons shall assemble in the Reserve for fêtes, 13. No persons shall assemble in the Reserve for fêtes, picnics, or concerts, or for the purpose of public worship, preaching, or public speaking of any kind, or meetings of a like character, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

14. No person shall perform in any band of music, or take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

15. Betting in any part of the Reserve shall not be permitted, and any person found betting therein shall be liable to expulsion from the Reserve.

be liable to expulsion from the Reserve.

16. No person shall carry on the trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker in the Reserve.

17. No motor or any delivery cart, tradesmen's cart, dray, lorry, waggon, van, or truck shall enter or pass over or through the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the Land Act 1901, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been

KNOWN AS THE "ROYAL GARDENS."

WE, Arthur Ferrara Paten, Joseph Henry Deeble, Joseph Chartres Henderson, Osear Frederick Thomas, William Bererton, Herman Franz Classen, and Charles Wolfe, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land permanently reserved by Order in Council of 14th August, 1882, as a site for Public Gardens in the town of Avoca, known as the "Royal Gardens," having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199 of the Land Act 1901.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

4. No person shall climb upon or jump over the fences or gates in or around the Reserve, stick hills, or cut names thereon, or in any way damage the buildings or other improvements in the Reserve, or roll or throw stones, or leave therein any bottles or broken glass.

5. No person, club, society, or association shall put or bring any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, or any other animals into the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first ob-

tained.

7. No person shall erect any dwellnig in the Reserve, or any booth, or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees

or shrubs.

9. No person shall cross or trespass upon that portion of the Reserve used for games and sports when crossing or trespassing would interfere with any such games

ing or trespassing would interfere with any such games or sports.

10. No person shall play or engage in cricket, football, golf, or any game whatever in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, unless such person, at the time of playing, is a member of any club which has been duly authorized to play in the Reserve, or is a member of a visiting team engaged in competition with any such club.

11. Any person committing in the Reserve or in any of the buildings or other structures for the time being

11. Any person committing in the Reserve or in any of the buildings or other structures for the time being thereon any of the following offences shall be liable to be removed from the Reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased and shall or may be in possession of a ticket of admission thereto:—

(a) Assaulting any person.

(b) Being drunk.

(c) Using profane or obscene language.

(d) Using abusive or insulting words.

(e) Behaving improperly or riotously.

(f) Obtaining admission to the Reserve or any of the buildings thereon, when not entitled to such admission, or refusing to produce or surrender, if so required, to any gatekeeper or other person duly authorized to demand production or surrender of tickets duly authorizing the admission of such person to the Reserve. the Reserve.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the Land Act 1901, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

If in the third class, improvements to the value of 6s. per acre must be made on the land before the end of the third year from the date of the lease, and the balance of 5s. per acre before the end of the sixth year of the lease.

The first half-year's rent and lease-fee must be paid prior to issue of lease.

That the lessee shall go into residence on the land within twelve months after the date of the lease, and shall reside for at least three years and nine months on, or within five miles of, the land during the first six years of the term of the lease, and shall also clear and cultivate at least one-fourth of his allotment within two years of obtaining a permit to occupy the land.

That the lessee shall not transfer, assign, mortgage, or sublet, or part with the possession or grant the use of the whole or any part of the allotment during the first six years of the term of the lease, and that after the first six years of the term of the lease, and that after the first six years of the term of the lease the lessee shall not sell, transfer, assign, mortgage, or sublet the whole or any part of the allotment unless and until the lease has been indorsed under the seal of the Board to the effect that all the conditions and covenants of the lease during the first six years thereof have been complied with.

No person who already holds or has previously selected the area of Mallee land allowed by classification will be eligible to apply.

The total area of Mallee land which may be selected is 640 acres if in the first class, or 1,000 acres if in the second class, or 1,280 acres if in the third class. Any further area. (limited as by the next succeeding paragraph) can be obtained only by purchase from other persons.

That a special condition shall be inserted in the lease and the Crown Grant, providing that the land referred to therein shall at all times be maintained and used for the purpose of residence or agriculture and grazing, and that no person will be permitted to subsequently acquire or hold, or have an interest in, more than 1,000 acres, if the land be in the first class, or more than 1,600 acres, if the land be in any other class.

That the lessee or grantee or owner shall preserve the timber on, or plant an area of, not less than 3 per cent of the total extent of his holding. (N.B.—Along the exposed boundary lines, viz., the western and southern, would be preferable.)

No person, unless specially authorized, will be permitted to clear timber from any portion of areas retained for the purposes of roads and windbreaks.
