

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO PRESCRIBE MINIMUM LENGTHS IN LIEU OF MINIMUM WEIGHTS FOR CERTAIN SPECIES OF FISH.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the date of the first publication of this notice in the *Victoria Government Gazette*, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to make a Proclamation prescribing, for the species of fish mentioned hereunder, the sizes or lengths set opposite the names thereof, less than which it shall be unlawful for any person to take, attempt to take, sell or consign, or expose for sale, or have in his possession, house, or shop, or under his control fish of such species, in lieu of the weights set opposite the names of such species of fish in the Second Schedule to the *Fisheries Act 1890*, or of the weights substituted for any of such weights by any subsequent Proclamation:—

Pike, 14 inches.
Red Mullet, 8 inches.
Skipjack, 9 inches.
Silver Bream, 8½ inches.

Mariners and others are hereby notified that the Dredger *Thomas Bent* will, on or about the 14th instant, resume dredging at the eastern end of Hopetoun Channel.

The usual signals will be exhibited from the dredger, viz.:—By day a basket ball, and by night two vertical red lights 6 feet apart, also an anchor light at the stem and stern.

When not working, the dredger will (weather permitting) be moored on the north side of, and clear of, the Channel.

In connexion with the dredging operations, two out-riggers will be placed on the North (or Channel) side of the Black (or Port hand) Beacons, and extending 17 feet therefrom; care should be taken to avoid fouling the same.

DEVIATION OF ROAD IN THE PARISH OF GEMBROOK.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1903* (3 Edw. VII. No. 1893) it is amongst other things enacted that if the council of any municipality prove to the satisfaction of the Minister that it is desirable that any road should be deviated, and that such deviation can be conveniently made through Crown land or land held by licensees or pastoral lessees under the *Land Act 1890* or any Act amending the same, the Minister may cause such road to be deviated accordingly at the cost of the municipality : And whereas it has been proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that it is desirable to deviate a certain road in the parish of Gembrook : Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of provisions contained in section 477 of the Act No. 1893 aforesaid, doth hereby declare the new road in the parish of Gembrook defined in the following description to be a public highway in lieu of an existing road in the parish named, of which road technical description is also hereunder given (that is to say) :—

And whereas the said Act among other things provides that the Governor in Council might by Order published in the *Government Gazette* confirm such Resolution whereupon any road mentioned in such Resolution should be a main road. 



WHEREAS by the Local Government Acts 1903 and 1914 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Order published in the *Government Gazette*, make regulations prescribing the place or places and the manner in which the Municipal Auditors Board is to exercise the duties conferred upon it by the said Act, and the test to which the candidates must conform for the several certificates respectively which such Board is empowered to grant, and the fees payable by such candidates: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth

hereby rescind the Regulation as to the Examination for Municipal Auditors, &c., made in pursuance of the provisions of the Acts aforesaid, and bearing date the 25th day of September, 1894, and in lieu thereof doth make the Regulations following, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS AS TO THE EXAMINATION FOR MUNICIPAL AUDITORS, ETC.

(1) Examinations of persons desirous of obtaining certificates of competency to exercise the office of Municipal Auditor or Inspector of Municipal Accounts will be held in Melbourne when necessary at a place and time to be hereafter appointed.

(2) Every intending candidate must give at least twenty-one clear days' notice, in writing, to the Secretary to the Board, of his intention to present himself for examination, accompanied by satisfactory documentary evidence of good conduct and character.

(3) Every candidate for a certificate of competency must, with his application, as prescribed in the foregoing Regulation, forward documentary evidence of—

(a) having had three years' experience in dealing with municipal accounts, as a municipal clerk, or

(b) of having been in practice as a public accountant for not less than two years, or of having held the position of principal accountant to a corporation, registered or incorporated public company, or in a Government Department, or in public, mercantile, or professional employment not less than four years, or

(c) Of having had such other experience as the Board may deem sufficient to entitle him to admission to examination.

(4) No candidate will be admitted to examination for a certificate of competency under the age of 25 years.

(5) Should the evidence supplied in compliance with the foregoing Regulations be deemed satisfactory, the candidate, on receipt of notice to that effect, will be required to remit to the Secretary of the Board the sum of £2 2s. as fee for examination.

(6) Candidates for a certificate of competency will be examined in—

(a) Bookkeeping,

(b) Auditing,

(c) The laws relating to Local Government in Victoria.

(7) The examination will occupy the space of one day of six hours, that is—from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m., and from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m.

(8) After the distribution of any set of questions, candidates in attendance will not be allowed to leave the examination-room until the expiration of half-an-hour from the time of commencement, and at the termination of that half-hour no candidate will be admitted.

(9) In answering the questions set, one side only of each sheet of papers may be written upon. The different sheets are to be each signed by the candidate, arranged in consecutive order, pinned together, and handed in punctually at the expiration of the time allowed.

(10) Any candidate detected in the act of using books of reference or notes, or engaged in conversation with any other candidate during the progress of the examination may be summarily dismissed from the room.

(11) Candidates who pass the prescribed examination will be granted a certificate of competency to be issued by the Board.

(12) In all cases where documentary evidence is required of candidates, original certificates of testimonials shall be furnished, together with one copy of same for retention by the Board.

(13) Every applicant for a certificate of competency must legibly give his name in full and postal address in the margin of his letter, which should be addressed to—

Public Works Department, Melbourne.

And the Honorable F. Hagelthorn, His Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

Workers' Compensation Act 1914 (Act No. 2496).

REGULATIONS AMENDED.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the first day of June, 1915.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Workers' Compensation Act 1914 (Act No. 2496)*, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the *Workers' Compensation Regulations (Amendment) 1915*, and shall be read and construed as one with the *Workers' Compensation Regulations 1914* as amended (hereinafter referred to as the "Principal Regulations").

2. In Regulation No. 23 of the Principal Regulations the words "either by reason of depreciation or" before the words "owing to portion thereof" are hereby repealed.

3. (a) In paragraph (i) of Regulation 37 of the Principal Regulations for the words "a fee of 7s. 6d." there shall be substituted the words "a fee of 10s. 6d."

(b) In sub-paragraph (iii) of the same Regulation for the words "a fee of 2s. 6d." there shall be substituted the words "a fee of 10s. 6d."

4. Paragraph (ii) of Regulation 48 of the Principal Regulations is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof there shall be substituted the following paragraph:—

"(ii) Where, in order to examine the 'worker,' the medical referee is compelled to travel to a place distant more than two miles from his residence or such other centre as may be prescribed by the Governor in Council in addition to the above fee, 5s. for each mile beyond two distant from such residence or centre."

5. Regulation No. 4 of the *Workers' Compensation (Amending) Regulations 1914* is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof there shall be substituted the following Regulation:—

"4. For any certificate given under Regulation No. 2 the certifying medical practitioner shall be entitled to charge a fee not exceeding 2s. 6d."

6. Regulation No. 5 of the *Workers' Compensation (Amending) Regulations 1914* is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof there shall be substituted the following Regulation:—

"5. The remuneration which the certifying medical practitioner shall be entitled to charge in respect of any certificate of disablement by accident given by him under paragraph 4 of the First Schedule to the *Workers' Compensation Act 1914* shall be a fee of 7s. 6d.; and where the 'worker' is unable to present himself for examination at the residence of the said practitioner an additional fee of 2s. 6d. per mile for every mile or portion thereof (after the first mile) up to three miles, and 5s. per mile for every mile or portion thereof after three miles which the certifying medical practitioner is required to travel therefrom is to be paid."

"For a copy of any certificate given under this Regulation a fee of 1s. is to be paid."

7. Regulation No. 6 of the *Workers' Compensation (Amending) Regulations 1914* is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof there shall be substituted the following Regulation:—

"6. Where an employer applies under paragraph (13) of the First Schedule to the *Workers' Compensation Act 1914* for an employé to submit himself for examination by a duly qualified medical practitioner, provided and paid for by the employer, and such practitioner be one appointed in accordance with the provisions of the Act, a fee of 7s. 6d. shall be paid; and where in order to examine the 'worker,' such practitioner has to visit the 'worker,' an additional fee of 2s. 6d. per mile for every mile or portion thereof (after the first mile) up to three miles, and 5s. per mile for every mile or portion thereof after three miles which the certifying medical practitioner is required to travel is to be paid."

And the Honorable John Murray, His Majesty's Chief Secretary for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR FRIENDLY SOCIETIES RECREATION PURPOSES IN THE BOROUGH OF HAMILTON.

WE, Thomas Francis O'Neill, Laurence Thomas Lynch, Robert McLuckie, Austin Bemrose, Hugh Mitchell, Charles Whatmore, Gerald Crean, William Thomas Stephens, William Arthur Draper, John Alexander Hodges, James Lindsay Brown, John Jennings, Samuel William Spillman, Arthur Robert Dark, Alfred James Rolland Tallock, and William John Pidwell, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the reserve for Friendly Society Recreation purposes in the Borough of Hamilton, having framed the following regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 190 of the *Land Act 1901*.

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be parcelled out in the following Divisions:—

First Division.—The grand stand building and enclosures contiguous thereto.

Second Division.—The playing or sports ring and cycle track, which is fenced in.

Third Division.—The remainder of the reserve which is fenced in with a close fence, together with the buildings and fixtures thereon.

2. The reserve shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except as hereinafter provided:—

The maximum scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to the reserve or any part thereof on such days, not exceeding fifty in any one year, as the reserve may be set apart for sports, fetes, or holiday amusements, shall be as follows:—

For the admission of every adult to the first division of the reserve, such sum as the Committee of Management may from time to time determine, not exceeding 2s.

For the admission of every adult to the third division of the reserve, such sum as the Committee of Management may from time to time determine, not exceeding 1s.

For the admission to the reserve of every person for the purpose of training as a cyclist or pedestrian, such sum as the Committee of Management may from time to time determine not exceeding per week, 1s., or per annum, 2s. 6d.

For the admission to the reserve of every trotting horse for the purpose of training, such sum as the Committee of Management may from time to time determine, not exceeding, per annum, £1 1s.

3. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

4. Any person committing in the reserve or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon any of the following offences shall be liable to be forthwith removed from the reserve, notwithstanding the fact that such persons may have paid for or be in possession of a ticket of admission to the reserve or any part thereof:—

(a) Being drunk or using any profane, indecent, or abusive language.

(b) Assaulting any person, making use of any abusive, threatening, or insulting expressions, or behaving in an improper or riotous manner.

(c) Crossing or trespassing on the playing ground during a cricket or football match or other outdoor game, or during any sports gathering or when crossing or trespassing upon the playing ground would be injurious to it.

(d) Being found in any part of the first, or third division of the reserve, and not producing, on demand, or surrendering if required, to any gatekeeper or other person duly authorized to demand the production or surrender of tickets, a ticket duly authorizing the admission of such person to the places wherein he or she may be found.

(e) Obtaining admission to any part of the first, second, and third division of the reserve when not entitled to such admission under these regulations.

5. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers, or buildings, or other improvements in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

6. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates in or around the reserve, or cut names on the fences, trees, seats, or buildings, or stick bills thereon.

7. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

8. No person shall erect a booth or building of any description, or use a vehicle for the purpose of offering for sale any article, or expose any article for sale in the reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

9. Persons who may obtain permission to erect booths or other temporary structures in the reserve shall conform to such instructions as the Committee of Management may deem expedient to issue, with the view of insuring decency and cleanliness.

10. No person, except labourers or workmen employed in the reserve by the Committee of Management, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of trees, shrubs, or flowers.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act* 1901, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence, and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

The Melbourne District will include places within a radius of six miles from the General Post Office, with the exception of places for which separate contracts are provided; Williamstown includes supplies for s.s. *Lady Lock* and *Albert*; the Ararat, Beechworth, and Ballarat Districts will include the Hospitals for the Insane, Gaols, Police Gaols, and Lock-ups at these places; and the Geelong District embraces a radius of two miles from the Post Office; Lara, the Inebriates Retreat; Geenvale, the Sanatorium; Rutherglen, the Viticultural College; Wyuna, the Irrigation Farm; Waingunyah, the Vine Nursery; and Creswick, the Forest School. The lock-ups at City Watch-House, Bourke-street West, Brunswick, Carlton, Coburg, Collingwood, Fitzroy, Fitzroy North, Hotham Hill, Little Bourke-street, North Melbourne, Port Melbourne, Prahran, Richmond, St. Kilda, South Melbourne, and South Yarra are included in the contracts for the Melbourne District. Delivery must be made at the places, institutions, &c., named in the schedules.
5. Packages suitable for transport of goods supplied must be provided by the contractor free of expense, and the value of these packages, whether in bulk or otherwise, is to be included in the price demanded, except brandy casks, porter cases, hogsheds, butter firkins or boxes, and soap boxes (not including fancy soaps), jam jars, flour, meal, and potato bags, which will remain the property of the contractor, and only the actual net weight or quantity received will be paid for. The empties to be removed from the place of delivery at the contractor's expense.
6. The meat supplied under these conditions must, if practicable, be slaughtered at abattoirs which are under proper authorized inspection and supervision. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor, on report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account, or from the security money.
7. The supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts are to be delivered direct to the establishment entitled thereto on the written order of the officer in charge. All other supplies will be ordered by the head of the department concerned or any officer authorized by him.
8. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor, and the account is to be rendered as soon as possible after the delivery of the supplies, accompanied by the receipted delivery order. For the supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts, the account is to be rendered monthly for such quantities only as are issued, the difference between the supply and issue to be kept at the contractor's credit. Supplies not issued at the termination of the contract to be removed by the contractor. The rates or quantities quoted in the orders cannot be exceeded.
9. When a contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the carriers to act as agent for, and charge the freight to, the Stores and Transport Department. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be retained by himself. Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition may subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under clause 18 of these conditions.
10. Should the contractor fail to supply any articles at the time mentioned in the order, they or any like supplies suitable for the service will be otherwise procured, and the expense over and above the contract price will be deducted from his account or from the security money.
11. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.
12. If the officer in charge of stores be not satisfied as to the quantity or quality of the stores, or if, after taking delivery of any stores or material, he shall discover any deficiency or defect therein, he may return such deficient or defective stores or material to the contractor, and shall report the same to the head of his department and to the Tender Board.
13. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supplies as to the quality, the same is to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a board of survey composed of persons named by the Treasurer of the State for the time being; and the decision of the board is to be considered final. In the event of the decision being against the contractor, the survey fees and expenses (if any) will be deducted as in clause 10.
14. In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or when from some other cause injury would be sustained either by the persons to whom the rations or stores are due or to the contractor in waiting for a board of survey, the head of the department or officer authorized to take delivery will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing, and that the contractor must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead; failing which, it or any like supply suitable for the service, will be obtained by the officer requiring it as in clause 10. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies so rejected or returned.
15. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, it or any like supply suitable for the service will be procured by the officer requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 10.
16. In the case of supplies for Hospitals for the Insane, it will be competent for a board of survey, consisting of the medical superintendent (or, in his absence, of the medical officer) and any two officers named by him, to examine and reject any supplies that may be objected to. It must be distinctly understood, however, that the contractor will have a right of appeal to the Treasurer of the State for the time being; but, pending such appeal, he must take back the rejected articles and at once supply others of approved quality; failing which, the supplies required or any like supplies suitable for the service may be obtained by the officer concerned, and the expense charged to the contractor.
17. In the case of supplies for Hospitals for the Insane, it will also be competent for two or more of the official visitors, in conjunction with the medical superintendent, to reject any supplies that they may consider not in accordance with contract; and in such cases the reference to a board of survey will not be deemed to be necessary on the part of the contractor.
18. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the said Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in clause 10. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and forfeit the whole or any part of the security money.
19. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government. If it is found during the currency of the contract that the contractor has not conformed to the condition of advertisement—which stipulates that if a tenderer be a member of a firm and such firm be interested in the contract, then the tender is to be in the name of the firm and not in that of the individual—then the Honorable the Treasurer may determine the contract, and forfeit the security money.
20. It will be competent for the Secretary to the Tender Board to terminate the contract, without notice, should there be reason to know that the contractor takes advantage of his contract to communicate with a prisoner.
21. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or violated by the importation of stores for the Government service, or by any contracts or purchases made by the Imperial Commissariat, or on account of the Commonwealth Government; or by the consumption of the produce or surplus stock of any Government establishment, or by any article being made at and supplied for the use of any Government establishment.
22. For the purpose of the contracts entered into under these conditions, it is hereby expressly provided that in the event of any alteration in the Tariff affecting any of the items included in these contracts, the Government or the contractor (as the case may be) may give two months' notice, through the Secretary to the Tender Board, of the termination of the contract for the particular item or items so affected to the opposite party, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the first day of the month, and within the period for which the contract is made. The contract for the unaffected items to remain in full force and effect. Any notice to be served under this condition shall be deemed to have been duly served if sent to the contractor in a registered letter at his last-known place of business or abode.
23. Under no circumstances other than those mentioned in clause 22 will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited; and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.
24. For the purposes of these contracts the word Government shall mean Government of the Commonwealth as regards supplies for the Commonwealth, and Government of the State as regards supplies for the State; and the word Treasurer shall mean Treasurer of the Commonwealth as regards supplies for the Commonwealth, and Treasurer of the State as regards supplies for the State.
25. Where specially indicated in the schedules no subletting will be allowed, and no delivery shall be made on Sundays; all work must be carried out by the contractor, and the hours of employment of any person engaged in the preparation or manufacture of the articles tendered for in the schedules, or engaged in the delivery of or in any way engaged in connexion with the supply of the articles tendered for in the schedules under this contract, are not to exceed forty-eight per week (unless otherwise

stated), and every such person shall be paid such wages and shall be employed subject to such conditions as are or may be determined by any Wages Board under the Factories and Shops Act to which such persons are subject as employees, and a copy of the labour condition, as indorsed on the schedules affected, shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted, in legible Roman characters, in the factory, shop, or dairy (and in each part of the factory, shop, or dairy where several rooms are in use) in which goods are prepared or manufactured under these contracts. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £50 (Fifty pounds), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money; and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement and in all other respects.

TENDERS FOR GRAZING LANDS.

Tender Forms can be obtained on application to the Lands Department, Melbourne, or any of the Land Offices in the country.

Tenders should be placed in the Crown Lands Office Tender-box on or before Monday, 28th June, 1915.

NOTE.—No tender will be accepted unless the fee for the period as shown in the head-lines, and fee of Five shillings for licence, are forwarded.

TENDERS will be received on or before Monday, 28th June, 1915, for the right to depasture stock on the following unappropriated portions of land subject to the Regulations approved by the Governor in Council and also the subjoined Special Conditions.

Every licence granted under section 187 of the *Land Act 1901* shall be subject to the conditions set forth in the schedule hereto and to such special conditions and payment in advance of such fee as the Minister may determine, and shall be issued by an officer of the Department of Lands and Survey duly authorized in that behalf.

Conditions.

1. The issue of this licence shall not prevent the land comprised therein, or any part or parts thereof, being sold, leased, licensed, alienated, or dealt with under any of the provisions of the *Land Acts*, except under the 187th section of the *Land Act 1901*, or being resumed by order of the Governor or Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, for any of the purposes for which land may be reserved under section 10 of the *Land Act 1901*, or for mining purposes.

2. In case the said land, or any part thereof, should be sold, leased, licensed, alienated, dealt with, or resumed as aforesaid, the licensee shall not be entitled to any compensation other than that which the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the *Land Acts* may think fit.

3. This licence is subject to the rights of the holders of miners' rights or of mining leases now issued or hereafter to be issued to enter upon the allotment hereby licensed, and to search for gold, and to mine thereon, and to erect and occupy mining plant and machinery, without making any compensation to the licensee, his executors, administrators, or assigns, for surface or other damage.

4. Subject to these conditions, the licensee shall be entitled to use the land for the purpose for which this licence has been granted, until such land, or any part thereof, has been sold, leased, licensed, alienated, dealt with, or resumed as aforesaid, and thereupon all the interest of the licensee therein shall cease and be determined.

5. No land comprised in roads from time to time surveyed and marked out within the boundaries of the land comprised in this licence shall be deemed within its operation.

6. This licence shall entitle the holder thereof, during the period for which it is granted, to use the land therein comprised for depasturing purposes only, but shall not confer any right to build thereon, or to cultivate or, without the permission of the Minister, fence any portion thereof, or construct a dam or tank.

7. The taking in of stock for agistment or otherwise allowing the use of the land, or part thereof, without authority in writing by the Minister, is forbidden.

8. That in the event of the Minister granting permission to fence the whole or any part of this area, the licensee shall provide gates or slip panels in suitable places for the convenience of the public. No compensation will be allowed for fencing erected on boundaries of allotments alienated or in course of alienation.

9. That where improvements are authorized under section 189 of the *Land Act 1901* the licensee shall notify, on completion, that such improvements have been made, otherwise the work will not be recognised.

10. The interest in this licence shall not be transferred without the consent of the Minister, and the payment of a fee of Ten shillings.

11. The licence shall be liable to forfeiture if the licensee commit a breach of or neglect to comply with these conditions.

12. The publication of a notice in the *Government Gazette*, purporting to declare that the Governor or Administrator, with the advice aforesaid, has forfeited this licence, shall be conclusive evidence that the licence is forfeited.

13. The ring-barking of the timber upon the land by the licensee is forbidden, and he shall not be entitled to destroy or cut and take away any such timber.

14. Free access to water shall be kept open at all times for travelling and other stock and for persons desiring to take water for domestic purposes.

15. The licensee shall destroy all thistles on the land, and on the half width of the adjoining roads, and shall be responsible for the destruction of thistles under the *Thistle Act 1890* in like manner as holders of freehold lands.

16. The licensee shall keep the land free from vermin, and, should he fail to do so, the licence shall be liable to forfeiture.

17. This licence is issued subject to the right of saw-millers to graze on this area such horses and bullocks as are actually used in connexion with their licensed operations on this land.

18. In the event of the area being damaged by fire, the licence may be forfeited unless the licensee satisfy the Minister that neither he, directly or indirectly, nor his workmen or servants, were in any way responsible therefor.

Special Conditions.

1. The period of occupation will, except where otherwise specified, be for fifteen months from 1st July, 1915, to 30th September, 1916.

2. The fee for the period as shown in the head-lines—for which the licence will be issued, and fee for licence—must accompany the tender, otherwise the offer of the next highest tenderer who complies with this condition may be accepted.

5. The highest or any tender not necessarily accepted.

6. Tenderers must give their full name and ordinary postal address.

7. The areas are given as more or less, and all appropriated, alienated, or licensed lands (if any) within the boundaries are excluded.

8. The outgoing tenant has the option to remove any existing fencing within one month or to require the incoming tenant to pay for it in accordance with the provisions of section 190, *Land Act 1901*.

Section 13, *Land Act 1904*, provides:—

1. Where a licensee under section 187 of the *Land Act 1901* has, with the consent of the Minister, enclosed with a substantial fence the land which is the subject of his licence, he may impound any cattle, sheep, or other animals found trespassing thereon.

2. Where the licensee holds land under the said section which is unfenced, he may, in any Court of competent jurisdiction, sue the owner of any cattle, sheep, or other animals for damages arising from trespass by such cattle, sheep, or other animals.
