Factories and Shops Act.

DETERMINATION OF THE TANNERS BOARD.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be read. determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of a tanner, currier, or leather-dresser other than a tanner of sheep skins, has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That the previous Determinations of this Board are hereby amended and such amendments shall come into force and be operative on and after the 8th day of February, 1915.

The Determination and amendments are printed hereunder.

APPRENTICES AND IMPROVERS.

"Apprentice" means any person under 21 years of age bound by indentures of apprenticeship, or any person over 21 years of age who, with the sanction of the Minister, is bound by indentures of appren-

or any person over 21 years of age who, and an apprentice) who does not receive a piece-work price or a wages rate fixed by any Special Board for persons other than apprentices or improvers and who is not over 21 years of age, or who, being over 21 years of age, holds a licence from the Minister to be paid as an improver. (Act 2386, Section 5.)

(a) the lowest rates which may be paid to an apprentice or an improver; and

(b) the proportionate number of apprentices and improvers who may be employed in any factory or place

SPECIAL RATES FOR SUNDAYS AND PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.

(6) That the following shall be the rates payable to any person for all work done on-Sunday, Christmas Day, Double time.

New Year's Day, 26th January (Foundation Day), Good Friday, Easter Monday, 21st April (Eight Hours Day),

Time and a half.

3rd June (King's Birthday), Boxing Day,

but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rates shall only be payable for work done on the day substituted.
