ROMAN CATHOLIC CHURCH.—LAND AT MORANDING.—POWER TO DISPOSE.

A STATEMENT of Trusts having been submitted by the head or authorized representative of the denomination known as Roman Catholic, under the provisions of the "Act to provide for the Abolition of State Aid to Religion," for allowance by the Governor, the same was allowed by him on the thirteenth day of July, 1915, and the following is the form in which such Statement of Trusts has been allowed:—

Description of Land.—2 acres, county of Dalhousie, parish of Moranding, being allotment 5A: Commencing at the south-west angle of the allotment, bounded thence by a road bearing north 7 degrees 30 minutes east 4 chains 99 links; thence by allotment 5 bearing south 82 degrees 30 minutes east 4 chains, and south 7 degrees 30 minutes west 5 chains; and thence by a road bearing north 82 degrees 20 minutes west 4 chains to the point of commencement.

Names of Trustees.—The Roman Catholic Trust Corporation for the Diocese of Melbourne.

Power of Disposition.—To sell, transfer, mortgage, charge, lease, exchange, give, grant, or dispose of the whole or any part of the said land.

Purposes to which Proceeds of Disposition are to be Applied.—To such purposes of the Roman Catholic Church in the Diocese of Melbourne as a Council of such Diocese under the provisions of Act No. 2100 may from time to time by resolution direct.

WHEREAS the provisions of section 4, sub-sections (1), (2), and (3) of the Foodstuffs and Commodities Act 1914, No. 2517, provide that—

All persons having in their possession or control a quantity of any of the foodstuffs and other commodities being—

- in the case of foodstuffs or other commodities specified in the first column of the Schedule greater than the quantity specified opposite thereto in the second column of the Schedule; or
- in the case of foodstuffs and other commodities not specified in the first column of the Schedule greater than is prescribed by regulations,

shall from time to time, upon being required by the Board to furnish returns of such foodstuffs and other commodities within such time as is fixed by the Board, furnish such returns in the form prescribed by regulations to each of the following authorities, namely—

- (a) the Board; and
- (b) such commission heretofore or hereafter appointed by the Governor-General in Council as is specified in the requisition by the Board to furnish returns.

Any such person failing to so furnish returns shall be guilty of an offence against this Act, and shall, on conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding One thousand pounds and, in the discretion of the Crown, to forfeiture of the whole or part of the foodstuffs and other commodities in respect of which the failure to furnish a return occurred.

A requisition by the Board to furnish returns under this section may be made by general notice published in the *Government Gazette*.

It is hereby notified that all persons holding supplies of potatoes 1 ton or in excess thereof are requested to furnish, on or before the 27th day of July, 1915, a return of potatoes held by them or under their control on the evening of 24th day of July, 1915, such return to be furnished in conformity with the Regulation published in this issue of the *Government Gazette*. Every such return shall be addressed to the Secretary of the Prices Board, and shall be delivered at or forwarded by post to the Board's office, Law Offices, Lonsdale-street, Melbourne. ALTERATION OF AMENDMENT MADE ON 1ST SEPTEMBER, 1911, OF THE REGULATIONS MADE ON 8TH JANUARY, 1902.—PART II., CROWN LANDS OTHER THAN MALLER LANDS.—SCHEDULE 57, CHAPTER IX., PART 2, SECTION 145, MISCELLANEOUS LICENCES.—LICENCES WHICH DO NOT CONFER THE EXCLUSIVE RIGHT TO ENTER ON CROWN LANDS.

In Schedule 57, Chapter IX., Part 2, where the purpose is "For removal of sand from unappropriated Crown lands within Sandridge Bend" in the third column (1) after the words "each load" where they first occur there shall be inserted the words "unless back loading of approved material be delivered where directed, in which case the charge shall be One shilling and sixpence."

Education Acts 1890 and 1910.

REGULATION ADDED.

WHEREAS by section 23 of the Education Act 1890 (54 Vict. No. 1036), and section 29 of Act No. 2301, it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make and rescind regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying the said Act into effect: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby add Regulation XLIII.—Schools of Domestic Arts—to the Regulations under the Education Acts 1890 and 1910, that is to say:—

REGULATION XLIII.

Schools of Domestic Arts.

A.

1. Schools of Domestic Arts may be established by the Minister in suitable localities to provide a two years' course of instruction in Domestic Arts for girls over 12 years of age in attendance at elementary State Schools.

2. Elementary schools will be associated with each School of Domestic Arts, and these schools will provide in Grades VII. and VIII., courses of instruction for girls only.

3. Any girl over 12 years of age who may wish to attend the School of Domestic Arts will be required to enrol at one of the associated schools. Unless with the special permission of the Director, no pupil shall be admitted to a School of Domestic Arts who is not enrolled as a pupil of a school associated with such School of Domestic Arts.

4. The group of girls from each of the associated schools will attend the School of Domestic Arts and the associated school at such times as may be prescribed by the Director.

5. The course of instruction in the schools of Domestic Arts will include Cookery, Laundry work, Needlework, Dressmaking, Millinery, Housewifery, and personal and Domestic Hygiene.

In the school associated with each School of Domestic Arts a modified curriculum in the subjects prescribed in Regulation I. will be taken.

B.

6. Each School of Domestic Arts shall be in charge of a mistress assisted by a suitable staff.

7. A qualified teacher, appointed as mistress of a School of Domestic Arts, shall be classified in either Class III. or Class IV. as decided by the Director, with the approval of the Minister, and be paid the salary set out in the Second Schedule to the Teachers' Act 1911, No. 2330, for female teachers of such class.

8. The number of assistant teachers appointed to Schools of Domestic Arts shall be in accordance with the requirements of such school, and the classification of such teachers shall be as follows:—

9. Evening classes in Domestic Arts for adults and for girls employed during the day may be established for a course of instruction in one or more subjects.

The fees to be charged will be such as are fixed by the Committee and approved by the Minister.

10. There will be three terms, viz.:—From 1st March to 31st May, 1st June to 31st August, 1st September to 30th November.

11. Payment will be made to teachers of evening classes in accordance with the following scale:—

- (a) Head Teachers.—Ten shillings for each meeting at which such teacher was necessarily present for two hours;
 (b) Assistant Teachers.—Seven shillings and six pence for each meeting at which such teacher attended and taught for two hours.

12. In connexion with each School of Domestic Arts the Governor in Council may appoint an Advisory Committee.

13. Before any arrangements are made for the appointment of an Advisory Committee for a School of Domestic Arts, the approval of the Minister of Public Instruction must first be obtained.

14. The duties of an Advisory Committee shall be:—

- (a) To foster local interest in the School of Domestic Arts, and especially in the establishment of evening classes;
 (b) To advise on the course of instruction;
 (c) To concert with the mistress of the school suitable measures for extending the usefulness of the institution;
 (d) To arrange for lectures and the like with a view of promoting the social side of the work of the school;
 (e) To visit the school from time to time, and to record the opinion of the Committee as to the general condition of the school and its efficient management.

15. Except as otherwise directed by the Minister, the Advisory Committee shall consist of not fewer than three nor more than seven members, who shall be nominated by the School Committees of the State Schools within the area served by the School of Domestic Arts.

16. All members of the Advisory Committee shall retire on the thirtieth day of June, 1917, but such members shall, upon nomination by the School Committees, be eligible for re-appointment for such further period thereafter as may be directed by the Minister.

17. The Governor in Council reserves the right to terminate the appointment of any member at any time.

Any member of the Committee who shall absent herself from the meetings of the Committee for three months consecutively, having been duly summoned to attend, shall be liable to be removed, and may thereupon be removed by the Governor in Council.
