BENDIGO MINE DRAINAGE BOARD.

REGULATIONS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the ninth day of May, 1916.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor of Victoria.

Sir A. J. Peacock Mr. McLeod

Mr. Hagelthorn.

W HEREAS by section 480 of the Mines Act 1915 (Act No. 2698) it is enacted the Governor in Council may make Regulations for or with respect to—

- (a) the appointment the term of office remuneration and the resignation or removal of members of Boards and the filling of vacancies in any
- Board;

 (b) the election term of office resignation or removal of chairmen of Boards;

 (c) the regulation of the proceedings of the first and other meetings of Boards and the keeping of minutes thereof the giving of and forms
- (d) the appointment remuneration and removal of officers or employees of Boards and the performance of the duties of such officers or
- employees;
 (c) the accounts of Boards and the audit thereof; (e) the accounts of Boards and the audit thereof;
 (f) all matters which are incidental to the performance of the duties or the exercise of the powers of Boards or which by Division IV. Part III. of the said Act are required or permitted to be prescribed or which are necessary or convenient to be prescribed for carrying out or giving effect to such Division.

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the said provisions of the now in part recited Act doth for the purposes aforesaid make the Regulation following (that is to say) :-

1. Term of Appointed Members.—Members of the Board appointed by the Governor in Council shall hold office for the term of three years unless sooner removed in the manner hereinafter provided and shall be eligible

of the manner nerennater provided and shall be engaged for re-appointment.

2. Removal of Appointed Members.—In addition to the events vacating a member's seat specified in section 463 of the Mines Act 1915 any person appointed a member of the Board by the Governor in Council may be removed from office at any time by an Order in

Council.

3. Filling Vacancies.—The Governor in Council upon the nomination by the owners or a majority thereof within the drainage area may fill any vacancies in the Board. If no nomination be made within one month after a vacancy occurs the Governor in Council may fill the vacancy.

4. Resignation of Members.—Any member of the Board desiring to resign his office shall forward to the Minister for the time being administering the Mines Act a written notification of such his desire, and such resignation shall date from the time when such notification is left at or would reach in due course of post the office of the Minister. the Minister.

at or would reach in due course of post the office of the Minister.

5. Remuneration of Board.—Each member shall be entitled to receive out of the funds of the Board the sum of Ten shillings for every meeting of the Board the sum of Ten shillings for every meeting of the Board at which he shall attend. The Board may grant an allowance to the Chairman to cover his expenses.

6. Chairman.—In the event of the Chairman not being appointed under section 464 (3) of the Mines Act the Chairman shall be elected annually by a majority of votes of those present and he shall hold office as Chairman for one year if he so long remain a member of the Board and be willing to act.

7. Resignation of Chairman.—Any elected Chairman may at any time by writing addressed to the Board revign his office of Chairman.

8. Vacancy of Chairman Filled.—Any vacancy in the position of elected Chairman shall be filled at the next meeting of the Board after such vacancy occurs or at any adjournment thereof in the same manner as aforesaid and such election shall be the first business on the notice-paper for such meeting.

9. Appointment by Minister.—In the event of any Board failing or neglecting to elect a Chairman the Minister may by writing under his hand appoint one of the members of the Board to be Chairman who shall hold office for one year if he so long remain a member and be willing to act.

- 10. Quorum of Board .- At the meetings of the Board four members shall form a quorum.
- 11. Time and Place of Meeting and Office of Board.-The Board shall meet at such time and place as it may from time to time by resolution determine. The Board may appoint a certain place to be the office of the
- 12. Special Meetings.—The Board may hold special meetings which may be called upon the requisition of the Chairman or upon the requisition in writing under their hand of any two members addressed to the Chairman but no such special meeting shall be held unless two days' notice thereof shall be given.
- 13. Resolution not to be Revoked unless under certain 13. Resolution not to be Kevoked uniess under certuin Gircumstances.—No resolution or other act of the Board at any meeting shall be revoked or altered at any subsequent meeting except upon notice of motion or unless such meeting be specially convened for the purpose nor unless such revocation or alteration be determined upon by a majority of the members of the Board.

 14. Committees.—The Board shall have power to appoint Committees for any purpose it may deem fit and shall make rules and regulations for the conduct of such Committees. Minutes of all proceedings of Committee Shall be entered in the Committee's minute-book and being signed by the Chairman of the Committee shall be presented to the Board.

 15. Contributions.—The contributions payable by each owner to the Board shall from time to time be ascertained assessed and apportioned by the Board upon the basis that the total cost of draining each line of reef within the drainage area shall be borne by all the owners holding areas on such line of reef proportionately to the length held by each owner upon such line of reef as determined by the Board. Contributions shall be made payable at such periods as the Board may determine. may determine.
- may determine.

 16. Determination of Cost to the Owner.—In determining the cost of raising or draining water from a mine where efficient machinery is used by the owner the Board shall take into consideration the proportionate cost of fuel expended the cost of oil grease and packing the wear and tear of such machinery and plant the wages of engine-drivers and other persons in such proportions as such persons may be deemed to be employed in draining the mine and such other expenses as the owner can prove to the satisfaction of the Board have necessarily been incurred in respect of the drainage effected by any such machinery.

 17. Estimates Framed.—As soon as practicable after
- age effected by any such machinery.

 17. Estimates Framed.—As soon as practicable after the appointment of the Board the Board shall make an estimate of the amount required to defray all costs charges and expenses for drainage purposes and thereafter shall make such estimate during the month of June in each year provided always that the Board may from time to time as required make supplementary estimates and levy supplementary contributions.
- 18. Powers of Board.—In addition to the powers conferred by the Act the Board shall have power to borrow money and secure payment thereof with power of sale and may purchase and hold lands necessary for the purposes of the Board and may alienate such lands, and may purchase supplies of electrical or other forms of energy for the purpose of operating machinery used in raising water or incidental thereto.
- 19. Deductions for Water Used by Owner.—Where the whole or any portion of the water raised or drained from his mine by the owner is used or sold by the owner the Board shall deduct from the amount payable Once penny for each thousand gallons so used or sold. The water raised by machinery operated by the Board shall be the property of the Board to be disposed of as it doesna fit. it deems fit.
- 20. Secretary.—The Secretary shall keep all minutes of meetings of the Board or of any Committee of the same; he shall also keep all account books and documents; conduct all correspondence and perform all clerical work required to be performed for the Board, and shall attend all meetings of the Board or Committee when required, and attend at the office for the transaction of business as provided for under these Regulations, and shall perform all other acts which shall be deemed by the Board incumbent upon the Secretary to discharge.
- to discharge.

 21. Treasurer.—The Treasurer shall have receipt and disbursement of all moneys, and shall provide a guarantee for such amount for his fidelity and the due fulfilment of his duties, and for the proper management and disposal of the funds of the Board as the Board may direct. All moneys received by him shall as soon as possible thereafter be paid into the account of the Board in the bank wherein the same is kept. The Treasurer shall at no time hold in his hands more than Twenty pounds (£20) for longer than seventy-two hours without banking the same.

- 22. Analgamation of Offices.—The Board may amulgamate the offices of Secretary and Treasurer but at any time subsequent to such amalgamation such Board may on its own motion or shall when required in writing by the Minister separate and appoint a separate person to fill each office.
- 23. Payments.—All payments of the Board shall be paid by cheque signed by two members and counter-signed by the Treasurer.
- 24. Appointment &c. of Officers.—No appointment to any office at the disposal of the Board shall be made until seven clear days' notice has been given by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in the Bendigo district inviting applications from qualified candidates for the same.
- 25. Salaries of Officers &c.—The salary or allowance attached to all offices and places at the disposal of the Board shall in all cases be fixed before they proceed to appoint any person to fill the same and before the advertisement inviting applications as aforesaid.
- 26. Determination of Employment of Officers .- No 26. Determination of Employment of Officers.—No appointment of any person as an officer or employee of the Board shall be made or operate or have effect on any terms or conditions which would in any way provent the Board from at any time determining such person's employment by notice which notice may by agreement be provided to run for any time less than but shall in no case exceed three months. In the absence of any express agreement providing for notice all officers and employees of the Board shall hold office during pleasure only.

Accounts to be Kept of Receipts and Disbursements.—The Board shall cause books to be provided and kept and true and regular accounts to be entered therein of all sums of money received and paid for or on account of the Board's business and undertakings and of the several purposes for which sums of money shall have been received and paid and which books shall at all reasonable times be open to the inspection of any porson appointed by the Minister or owner which person may take copies of or abstracts from the said books without payment.

Accounts to be Audited and Furnished.—The accounts of all moneys received and disbursed by the Board shall be audited once at least in every year by some person approved for that purpose by the Minister such person shall have in respect to such accounts all the powers conferred on the Auditor-General by any law now or hereafter to be in force relating to the audit of the public accounts and such Board shall at least once in every year furnish to the Minister and to each owner a true copy of the accounts so audited as aforesaid together with a particular statement of the moneys received by the Board and of the expenditure thereof.
- 30. Common Seal.—The Secretary of the Board shall have the custody of the common seal and shall be responsible for the same and impressions shall only be made by order of the Board verified by the signatures of two members and the Secretary.
- 31. Proceedings of Board.—The Board may by resolution provide from time to time for the efficient conduct of its official proceedings.
- 32. Indemnity.—Each member officer and servant of the Board shall be indemnified out of the funds of the Board against all losses damages and exponses (including travelling expenses) howsoever incurred or sustained by him in the bona fide discharge of his duty or what he reasonably considers to be his duty or in consequence of the acts neglects or defaults, of any member officer servant agent or banker of the Board or for joining in receipts for the sake of conformity and the members of the Board shall pay or retain the same out of the funds of the Board. Except in case of actual fraud or dishonesty by him no member officer or servant of the Board shall be liable for any loss damage or expenses that may happen to or be incurred by the Board in consequence of any act omission or default while purporting to act as such member officer or servant.

Each examination shault be held at such place in Melbourne as the Board may from time to time appoint.
- 2. Every candidate must be in attendance at the examination-room punctually at the appointed time, and in the event of an adjournment, at the hour named for such adjournment.
- 3. Every candidate must forward to the Secretary of the Board fourteen (14) clear days at least before the commencing day of the examination at which he intends to present himself, notice in writing of such intention, with satisfactory documentary evidence of having complied with one of the following conditions:—
- (a) Of having completed articles of indenture for a period of not less than three (3) years under some practising civil engineer.
 (b) Of having had three (3) years' experience in designing or executing civil engineering work. Each candidate must submit a detailed statement of the nature and extent of the work on which he has been engaged.
- 4. A certificate will not be issued to any candidate until he has attained the age of twenty-three (23) years, and satisfactory evidence must be produced, if required, as to respectability of character. No person will be cligible for examination who has been convicted of a breach of trust.
- 5. Every candidate will be required to pay to the Secretary of the Board the sum of £3 3s. at least one week before the commencing day of the examination at which he intends to present himself.
- 6. The examination will occupy such times as the Board may from time to time direct.
- 7. Each candidate for examination must provide himself with a book of logarithms, plotting scales, parallel ruler, and all necessary appliances (except paper) for drawing and computing.
