REGULATIONS FOR THE ELECTION OF COMMISSIONERS AND AUDITORS.

W HEREAS by the Mildura Irrigation Trusts Acts it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, subject to the provisions of the said Acts from time to time make Regulations for the purposes following:—

- e make Regulations for the purposes following:—

 (a) For determining the period or different periods, not exceeding three years, for which Commissioners of any Trust, including Commissioners for Urban Districts, shall hold office, the time of their election, and the order of their retirement from office.

 (b) For determining the manner in which elections of Commissioners and Auditors shall be held, and in which lists or rolls of voters thereat shall be prepared, and the mode of voting thereat, and the time, mode, place, and all other matters connected with the nomination of Commissioners and Auditors.

 (c) For determining the mode of appointment or election of returning officers and their deputies, and their powers and duties.

election of returning officers and their deputies, and their powers and duties.

(d) For determining the manner in which any vacau cies in the office of any such Commissioners or Auditors shall be filled up.

(e) For determining questions as to the due election of any such Commissioner or Auditor.

(f) For prescribing any other matters necessary for giving effect to the said Acts.

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Acts doth, so far as regards the First Mildura Irrigation Trust under the said Acts, make the Regulations following, viz.:—

1. The Regulations made on the eleventh day of April

3. Extraordinary Vacancies, How Filled, and Term of Office.—Should any vacancy in the office of Commissioner or Auditor be occasioned by death, resignation, removal, disqualification, or any other cause whatever, an election shall forthwith be held to fill such vacancy, sioner or Auditor be occasioned by death, resignation, removal, disqualification, or any other cause whatever, an election shall forthwith be held to fill such vacancy, provided that when any such vacancy occurs within three months of the day fixed for the holding of an annual election, such extraordinary election may be held on the day fixed for the holding of such annual election. Form of Voters' List—First Schedule.—Such voters' list shall be in the form of the First Schedule hereto, and shall contain in regular numerical sequence and alphabetical order of surname the christian name or names, surname, and address, so far as these may be known, of each person entitled to vote under the provisions of the said Acts, and shall also specify the extent of and indicate with reasonable certainty the land of each such person, in respect of which he appears by the assessment books of the Trust to be rated, and shall state the number of votes to which, under the provisions of the said Acts, each such person is entitled.

 10. Voting in Respect of Lands Jointly Owned.—In the case of partners, joint occupiers, joint owners, or tenants in common, the person whose name shall appear first on the assessment book shall, subject to the provisions of the said Acts and of these Regulations, be placed in respect of such land upon the voters' list in like manner as if such land were occupied or owned solely by him, and he alone shall be entitled to vote

and no other question shall be put to any person tender ing a vote; and no person who shall refuse to answer such questions, or who shall not answer the second, fifth, and seventh questions absolutely in the negative, and all the other questions absolutely in the affirmative, shall receive a ballot-paper or be permitted to vote.

receive a ballot-paper or be permitted to vote.

27. Voting by Proxy.—Fifth Schedule.—All proxy forms shall be in the form prescribed in the Fifth Schedule to these Regulations or to the like effect, and shall in all cases be signed by the person entitled to vote by proxy in his own actual handwriting, or, if unable to write, by his own mark, and such signature or mark shall be attested by a magistrate, a justice of the peace, a commissioner for taking affidavits or declarations, a legal practitioner, a bank manager, a public or State school teacher, or a postmaster or postmistress, either in Victoria or elsewhere, and all such proxy forms shall be lodged with the returning officer or his deputy at least forty-eight hours prior to the hour fixed for the opening of the poll.

28. False Answer, Polling Twice, and Personation.—Every person who shall wilfully make a false answer to any of the questions aforesaid, or who shall poll more than once, or offer to poll more than once at the same election, in his own right or in right of the same person, or who shall use or attempt to use more than three proxies, or who shall depart or attempt to depart from any polling-booth after having received a ballot-paper without having deposited the same in the ballot-box as hereinbefore provided, or who shall personate any other person for the purpose of polling at such election, shall be guilty of a breach of these Regulations; but nothing contained in this clause shall apply to any person only by reason of his exercising the right of voting as often as he is entitled so to do.

29. Result of Polling, How Ascertained.—Returning Officer to have Casting Vote.—Immediately upon the close of the poll, the returning officer snall, in the presence of and subject to the inspection of so many of the scrutineers of the candidates as please to be present, proceed to ascertain the number of votes for each candidate; and such returning officer shall abstann from inspecting the number, and take care that the same is not seen by any person before being scaled up as herein provided; and the returning officer shall seal up the bailot-papers deposited in the booth, and, as soon as conveniently may be on or after the day of the poll, publicly declare the candidates not exceeding the number of votes to have been duly elected Commissioners or Auditors of the Trust (as the case may be); and if two or more candidates have received an equal number of votes, the returning officer shall in each case have the casting vote in addition to any other vote or votes he may have.

30. Ballot-papers, How Disposed of.—The returning

30. Hallot-papers, How Disposed of.—The returning officer small, forthwith after the declaration of the poli, indurse with a description of the contents thereof, and sign the sealed parcer of ballot-papers, and shall deliver such sealed packet to the Secretary of the Trust, to be by him safely and secretly kept for six months then next ensuing, and then by him cause to be destroyed in the presence of three Commissioners of the Trust.

31. Questions Arising upon Elections to be Determined by Trust.—If any question arise as to the due election or any Commissioner or Auditor at any election (whether ordinary or extraordinary), such questions shall be determined by the Commissioners of the Trust at the first ordinary meeting held after the election; but no Commissioner in respect of whose election such question shall have arisen shall act as a Commissioner at such meeting, or be entitled to take any part in the proceedings thereof, or in any manner or at any time to act as a Commissioner until such question shall have been determined, and a majority of the Commissioners whose election is not in dispute shall form a quorum.

32. Appeal to Minister from Determination of Trust.—
In event of any voter or candidate feeling aggrieved by the determination of the Trust with reference to any such question as last aforesaid, he may appeal therefrom to the Minister within fourteen days from the date upon which the Commissioners shall have determined the question, and the Minister may make such inquiry as to the merits of the question as may appear to him to be necessary, and determine such question in such manner as to him may appear just, and such determination of the Minister shall be final and binding.

33. Failure to Elect Deemed to Create Extraordinary Vacancies.—If at any election of Commissioners or Auditors no vacancies or a number of vacancies less than the whole number which should have been filled up at such election are filled up, then the vacancies which are not so filled shall severally be deemed extraordinary vacancies, and to have occurred on the day appointed for such election. Provided always that the Commissioners eventually elected to fill such vacancies shall go out of office as if elected at such election.

34. Expenses of Election to be Paid by Trust.—The expenses incurred by the returning officer, or inider his direction, in connexion with any election; shall be delrayed by the Trust.

35. Interpretation.—In these Regulations words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, unless there is something in the context repugnant to or inconsistent with this interpretation.

36. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in regard to any election of Commissioners for the urban section of the Trust, these Regulations, with the necessary consequent alterations, shall apply to such elections, and any previous Regulations made in regard to the election of Commissioners for such urban section shall be read as if the provisions of these Regulations were in force.

Alexander Mail, a newspaper generally circulating in the several municipalities of Chewton Borough and Metcalfe Shire (that is to say, in the Argus of the 15th, 16th, and 18th of October, 1915, and in the Mt. Alexander Mail of the 16th, 18th, and 19th of the same month). And whereas, the said Minister has given to the Councils of the municipalities of Chewton Borough and Metcalfe Shire (no creditor of either of them within the period of three months from the 19th day of October now last past or at all having notified the Minister of his or its desire so to do), full opportunity of showing cause why an Order in Council uniting the borough of Chewton to the shire of Metcalfe should not be passed. I N pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Vegetation and Vine Diseases Act 1915, I, thie Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation declare as follows, that is to say:—

1. The insects hereunder named shall be insects within the meaning and for the purposes of the Vegetation and Vine Diseases Act 1915; viz: :-

Termitidæ (White Ants). Buprestidæ (Serricorns). Cerambycidæ (Longicorns). Curculionidæ (Weevils).

2. Every abnormal condition of or in any plant or of or in the product or part of any of the same, whether consisting of the presence of or caused by or due to the operations, development, growth, or decay of the insects set out in this Proclamation, shall be a disease within the meaning and for the purposes of the Vegetation and Vine Diseases Act 1915.
