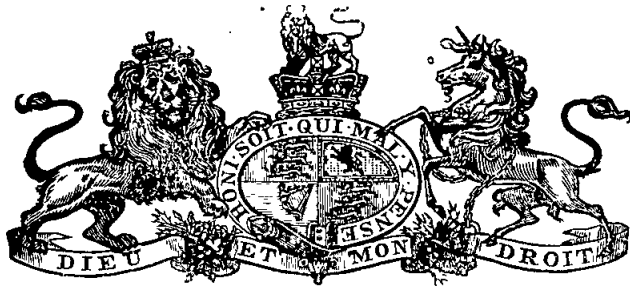

DETERMINATION OF THE SPECIAL BOARD

APPOINTED

TO DETERMINE THE LOWEST PRICES OR RATES WHICH MAY BE PAID TO ANY PERSON FOR WHOLLY OR PARTLY PREPARING OR MANUFACTURING, EITHER INSIDE OR OUTSIDE A FACTORY OR WORK-ROOM, BOOTS, SHOES, AND SLIPPERS OF EVERY DESCRIPTION.

Factories and Shops Act 1915.

DETERMINATION OF THE SPECIAL BOARD APPOINTED TO DETERMINE THE LOWEST PRICES OR RATES WHICH MAY BE PAID TO ANY PERSON FOR WHOLLY OR PARTLY PREPARING OR MANUFACTURING, EITHER INSIDE OR OUTSIDE A FACTORY OR WORK-ROOM, BOOTS, SHOES, AND SLIPPERS OF EVERY DESCRIPTION.

IN accordance with the provisions of the *Factories and Shops Act 1915*, the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person for wholly or partly preparing or manufacturing, either inside or outside a factory or work-room, boots, shoes, and slippers of every description, has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That previous Determinations of this Board are hereby amended, and such amendments shall come into force and be operative on and after the 1st day of July, 1916.

The Determination and amendments are printed hereunder:—

- (2) That the lowest rates of wages to be paid to the following persons shall be—

APPRENTICES AND IMPROVERS.

(3) "Apprentice" means any person under 21 years of age bound by indentures of apprenticeship, or any person over 21 years of age who, with the sanction of the Minister, is bound by indentures of apprenticeship. (Act 2386, Section 5.)

The Boot Board has prescribed a form of apprenticeship agreement. Section 187 requires that the indentures must be in that form.

"Improver" means any person (other than an apprentice) who does not receive a piece-work price or a wages rate fixed by any Special Board for persons other than apprentices or improvers and who is not over 21 years of age, or who, being over 21 years of age, holds a licence from the Minister to be paid as an improver. (Act 2386, Section 5.)

(4) That the time of beginning and ending work in any factory shall be—

OVERTIME.

(5) That the following rates shall be paid for all work done :—

Between 12.15 p.m. and 2.15 p.m. on Saturday	...	Time and a quarter.
Between 6 p.m. and 8 p.m. on the other working days	...	Time and a quarter.
At any other time outside the hours for beginning and ending work	...	Time and a half.
Within the hours fixed in clause 4 in excess of 48 hours in any week—

SPECIAL RATES.

(6) That double time shall be the special rate for all work done on—

- New Year's Day,
- Good Friday,
- Easter Monday,
- Eight Hours Day (21st April),
- Christmas Day,
- Boxing Day,

but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named Public Holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.

INSIDE WORKERS.

(7) Employers shall supply all grindery, colours, and materials, and also find work-shop room and outside light for inside workers, free of charge.

OUTSIDE WORKERS.

(8) Employers shall supply all grindery, colours, and materials (except for wax-thread work) for workers, free of charge.

PIECE-WORK PRICES.

(9) That the lowest piece-work prices shall be as follow :—

The Board determines, under the provisions of sub-sections (1) and (2) of section 144 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1915*, that any employer may fix and pay piece-work prices to any person employed at making cripple corks, provided that such employer shall base such piece-work prices on the earnings of an average worker working under like conditions, and such piece-work prices shall be fixed so that an average worker can earn not less than the wages rate fixed by the Board for such work.
