MUNICIPAL CLERKS BOARD.—CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY AND QUALIFICATION.—REGULATIONS.

MUNICIPAL CLERKS BOARD.

REGULATIONS as to the issue of Certificates of Competency and Qualification, made under section 169 of the Local Government Act 1915.

CERTIFICATE OF COMPETENCY.

1. Examinations of candidates desirous of obtaining certificates of competency to exercise the office of Municipal Clerk will be held in Melbourne, in the months of February and August in each year, at a place and times to be hereafter appointed, and at such other places and times as the Board may deem advisable.

2. Every intending candidate must give at least twenty-one clear days' notice in writing to the Secretary of the Board of his intention to present himself for examination.

3. Satisfactory evidence must be produced of the age and respectability of character of any candidate, and no candidate shall be eligible for examination under the age of twenty-one (21) years, or who has been convicted of a breach of trust.

4. Should the evidence supplied in compliance with the foregoing Regulation be deemed satisfactory, the candidate, on receipt of notice to that effect, will be required to remit to the Secretary of the Board the sum of £2 2s. as fee for examination.

5. Candidates for a certificate of competency will be examined in—

Municipal and Mercantile Bookkeeping, and

The Laws relating to Local Government in Victoria.

6. The examination will occupy the space of one day of six hours, that is, from Ten a.m. to One p.m., and from Two p.m. to Five p.m.

7. After the distribution of any set of questions candidates in attendance will not be allowed to leave the examination room until the expiration of half-an-hour from the time of commencement, and at the termination of that half-hour no candidate will be admitted.

8. In answering the questions set, one side only of each sheet of paper may be written upon. The different sheets are to be each signed by the candidate, arranged in consecutive order, pinned together, and handed in punctually at the expiration of the time allowed.

9. Any candidate detected in the act of using books of reference or notes, or engaging in conversation with any other candidate during the progress of the examination, may be summarily dismissed from the room.

10. Candidates who pass the prescribed examination will be granted a certificate of competency, to be issued by the Board.

CERTIFICATES OF QUALIFICATION.

The Board will grant certificates of qualification—

11. To any person proving to the satisfaction of the Board that he has held the office of Municipal Clerk in any municipality or municipalities in Victoria, including the city of Melbourne and the town of Geelong, for five years at least, either before or after and after the passing of the Local Government Act of 24th December, 1903, or was at the time of the passing of the said Act acting or officiating as Municipal Clerk in any municipality, including the city of Melbourne and the town of Geelong, and has for ten (10) years, at least, been employed in a municipal office.

12. Every applicant for a certificate of qualification must forward to the Secretary of the Board—

(a) A copy of the minute of his appointment under seal of the municipality by which he has been employed, and certified to by the Chairman thereof.

- (b) The precise nature of the duties performed under such appointment.
- (c) The exact period or periods within which such duties have been performed by the applicant.
13. Each application for a certificate of qualification must be accompanied by a fee of £1 1s.
14. Every applicant, whether for a certificate of competency or qualification, must legibly give his name in full and postal address in the margin of his letter of application, which should be addressed to—

SEYMOUR PUBLIC CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers vested in them, the Trustees for the Seymour Public Cemetery rescind the Rules and Regulations published in the *Government Gazette* of the fifth day of August, 1908, and make the following Rules and Regulations, that is to say:—

1. That all fees and charges payable to the trustees shall be paid when applications are made or orders given.
2. That any person desiring ground in the cemetery for a private grave, vault, tomb, monument, cenotaph, or tombstone or for any other purpose, shall apply to the trustees therefor. If approved, the trustees, on the payment of the required fees, shall issue to such person so applying a certificate of right of burial in the form specified in Schedule A.
3. That any person desiring to construct add to alter or amend a brick grave, vault, or tomb, or to erect add to or amend a monument, tombstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or any other construction or erection in any part of the cemetery, shall apply in writing to the trustees for permission to do so, and at the same time submit in writing a statement, plan, design or drawing of the same, with full particulars and shall obtain such permission in writing before proceeding with the work. All monuments and tombstones shall be constructed or erected at the end of the grave furthest from the pathway.
4. That all applications for interment shall be made to the secretary at least eight working hours prior to the time fixed for the burial, otherwise an extra charge shall be made. No free interment shall be allowed, unless applications therefor be made at least eight working hours prior to the time fixed for same.
5. That the name, age, late place of residence, probable cause of death of the deceased, and other particulars mentioned in Schedule C, shall be furnished at the time of giving the order.
6. That the trustees shall cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but any person wanting a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same under directions of the secretary, on payment of the required fees, and every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate or iron.
7. That every coffin shall have on the lid a plate with the name of the deceased inscribed thereon.
8. That every adult's grave shall be at least six feet deep and every child's grave five feet deep and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than four feet from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the ground.
9. That no interment shall be permitted in any private grave or vault, without the production of the certificate of right of burial, or other satisfactory evidence that the person desiring to bury therein is entitled to do so, except as provided for in the next rule.
10. That in the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault, to which during life the deceased person had no claim, the written consent of the owner shall be given with the application.
11. That no burial shall be permitted to take place in the cemetery without a certificate from a Deputy Registrar of Deaths or a coroner. Such certificate shall be delivered to the sexton before the funeral enters the cemetery.
12. That the grave of any person having died from any infectious or contagious disease shall not be re-opened within two years from the interment of such person.
13. That the hours fixed for burials shall be as follows:—On week days—September to April inclusive, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.; May to August inclusive, from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. On Sundays throughout the year from 2 to 5 p.m.
14. No interment shall be allowed on Sunday except where it is certified in writing by the Officer of Health of the district or the Medical Practitioner attending the deceased or a Police Magistrate or a Coroner or Deputy Coroner that for sanitary reasons it is necessary that the burial should take place on that day.
15. That no burial shall be allowed to take place between the hours of 7 p.m. and 7 a.m. except by special permission of the trustees.
16. That the time fixed for any burial shall be the time when the funeral is to be at the cemetery, and the same shall be punctually observed.
17. No vehicle except hearses and mourning coaches shall be permitted to enter the cemetery without the permission of the trustees. Horses shall not be allowed to proceed faster than at a walking pace within the cemetery.
18. That every grave, vault, tomb, monument, tombstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or any other erection shall be maintained and kept in thorough repair and proper condition by or at the expense of the owner.
19. That every person prior to placing any inscription epitaph or other writing or drawing in any part of the cemetery shall apply in writing to the trustees and submit a copy thereof to the trustees, and shall obtain their written permission for the same.
20. That any person violating the provisions of clauses 3 and 19 hereof, shall be liable to the penalties imposed by law for so doing, and to be further dealt with as a trespasser.
21. That every erection shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations and if required by the trustees shall extend to the bottom of the grave. No bath, caen, or other soft stone shall be allowed to be used in any work. All refuse, and other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be removed from the cemetery at once by and at the expense of the person causing the same. Copper cramps only shall be allowed in the erection of tablets or other exposed stone work.
22. That all materials required in the completion of any stone or other work shall be fully prepared before being taken into the cemetery, and shall be admitted only at the principal entrance, and no vehicle conveying any such materials with wheels less than four inches broad shall be permitted to enter the cemetery.
23. That no catacomb shall be allowed.
24. That no wooden erection shall be allowed.
25. That the trustees shall not (unless in very exceptional cases) permit the removal of any corpse from any grave for reinterment in this or any other cemetery.
26. That before any such exceptional case be dealt with by the trustees a written application setting forth the reasons for the proposed removal and verified by a statutory declaration shall be produced by the nearest available representative of the deceased, and in the event of such application being granted the permission of the Minister administering the *Coroners Act 1915*, or any amendment or substitution thereof, in addition to the permission of the trustees, shall be obtained. If found necessary, the coffin shall be enclosed in a second and air-tight coffin, prior to removal.
27. That any workmen or other employee whether employed by the trustees or by any other person, shall at all times while in the cemetery, be subject to the supervision, directions, and control of the secretary or a trustee and shall obey all such directions, and shall be removable from the cemetery upon any breach of the Regulations, or any refusal, or neglect to comply with or obey any such directions.
28. That any person taking any part in dressing or attending to any grave shall comply with the following rules, viz.:—First—That no rubbish, clay, or other material removed in dressing a grave, shall be placed on any other grave, and if placed on any adjoining ground, shall be removed immediately after the completion of the work. Second—That no loam shall be taken from any portion of the cemetery, for the purpose of dressing any grave. Third—That no grave shall be dressed in wet weather, except by special permission of the secretary, nor shall any materials be wheeled or carted along any path or road while the surface is soft from rain or otherwise. Work in all cases is to be carried on with due despatch, and only during regulation hours.
29. That, unless otherwise ordered, the principal entrance shall be open daily from 6 a.m. to 6 p.m. from 1st September to 30th April, and from 7 a.m. to 6 p.m. during the other months of the year.
30. That no child under 10 years shall be admitted into the cemetery, except in charge of a responsible person.
31. That no smoking shall be allowed within the cemetery, nor shall any fireworks be discharged therein.
32. That no dogs shall be admitted into the cemetery.
33. That no person in the cemetery or its approaches shall commit any nuisance, or trespass, or be guilty of any breach of decorum, or cut, pluck, gather, or take

out of the cemetery any flower, plant, shrub, or tree, or any part thereof, or do any injury whatsoever thereto, or to any grass plot, border railing, fence, or any other erection or road therein, or remove or interfere in any way with anything laid, built or placed on or in any grave, or burying place.

34. That no person shall promote, or advertise, or carry on within the cemetery or its approaches, any trade, business or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars, or cards or otherwise, or by any other system of advertisement whatsoever.

35. That "the secretary" as referred to in these Rules means the person for the time being employed by the trustees as the secretary of the cemetery, and such person shall, subject to the trustees, exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the cemetery and to the carrying out and enforcement of these Rules, and subject to the provisions of the Cemeteries Acts the direction of such person shall in all such matters, and for all purposes, be presumed to be and to have been the direction of the trustees.

36. That any person committing any breach of any of these Rules or Regulations, or of any other Rules, Regulations, or By-laws lawfully made under the authority of any Act relating to cemeteries, shall be thereupon forthwith removable from the cemetery by the trustees or the secretary, and shall be treated as a trespasser, and may be proceeded against accordingly in addition to any other proceedings or penalties to which such person may be subject.

37. That licences to grave diggers or grave decorators may be issued by the trustees in the form set out in Schedule B.

38. That a plan of the cemetery showing the distribution of the land, compartments, situations and numbers of the graves, and a Registry of all Certificates of Right of Burial shall be kept at the office of the secretary.

TRAMWAYS WITHIN THE CITY OF RICHMOND:

EXTENSION OF VICTORIA-STREET ELECTRIC TRAMWAY.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the thirtieth day of May, 1916.

WHEREAS by the *Tramways Act 1915* it is provided that tramways may be constructed in any municipal district (except the municipal districts of Fitzroy, Collingwood, Prahran, Kew, Port Melbourne, and St. Kilda), when authorized by an Order of the Governor in Council made in that behalf, upon the application of the council of the municipality in compliance with the provisions of the said Act, and of the Rules and Regulations to be from time to time made by the Governor in Council: And whereas the Prahran and Malvern Tramways Trust, in pursuance with the powers vested in it under the provisions of the Prahran and Malvern Tramways Trust Acts, and under the provisions of the *Tramways Act 1915* (No. 2739), has now made application by and with the consent of the Council of the city of Richmond, to construct a short line of tramway along Victoria-street, and the said Prahran and Malvern Tramways Trust having duly complied with the requirements of the said Acts and Regulations made thereunder with regard to the application of its intention to so apply, and no objection having been lodged thereto within the time provided by such rules, the Governor in Council being satisfied that it is expedient and proper that the said application should be granted has determined to grant the same subject to all the restrictions and conditions hereafter contained: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Acts, doth for the purpose aforesaid, make the Order following (that is to say):—

That the Prahran and Malvern Tramways Trust shall be and is hereby authorized to construct a short line of tramway along Victoria-street in the municipal district of the city of Richmond.

ROUTE.

That the route of such tramway shall be as follows:—Commencing at the western terminus of the electric tramway in Victoria-street, Richmond, as authorized by Order in Council dated the 5th October, 1914; thence westerly along Victoria-street for a distance of 230 feet.

GAUGE.

That the gauge of such tramway shall be four feet eight and a half inches (4 ft. 8½ in.), and that the said tramway shall be constructed in the manner set out and described in the working plans and specifications numbered from 1 to 7 inclusive, now deposited in the Public Works Department, and which plans and specifications are indorsed with a memorandum of the Minister of Public Works identifying the said plans and specifications so deposited as the plans and specifications referred to in this Order, and which plans and specifications are to be deemed to be incorporated in this Order, and to be as much part of the same as if they were set out in detail in this Order.

MOTIVE POWER.

That the motive power to be used upon the said tramway shall be electricity.

MAXIMUM SPEED.

That the maximum speed of the progression of the cars while travelling on the said tramway shall not exceed four (4) miles an hour.

TIME OF COMPLETION.

That the tramway shall be completed and open for traffic within a period of three months from the date of the Order in Council authorizing the construction of the tramway.

TRAFFIC.

That the tramway shall be used for the carriage of passengers and such parcels or packages as they may have in their possession.

NECESSARY PRECAUTIONS FOR SAFETY OF PASSENGERS AND PUBLIC TO BE OBSERVED.

That every precaution necessary to secure the safety of the passengers upon the said tramway, and also to secure the safety of passengers passing along the streets upon the route of such tramway, shall be taken and ordered by the said Trust.

STOPPAGES FOR TAKING UP AND SETTING DOWN PASSENGERS.

That for the convenience of the public the cars shall stop for the purpose of taking up and setting down passengers at such points upon the route of the tramway as are indicated by notice-boards or other sufficient devices, and as may be convenient and in such manner as not to interfere with or endanger the general traffic of the streets or the safety of the passengers in the cars.

TOLLS AND CHARGES.

That the charge to be made for each passenger upon the said tramway, with the right to travel upon the tramway, authorized by Order in Council dated the 5th October, 1914, between Victoria-street terminus and the junction of High-street and Cotham-road, without extra charge, shall be One penny (1d.).

For each child under twelve years of age (other than children under four years of age carried on passenger's lap, who shall be carried free), One penny for one or two continuous sections.

FARES FOR CHILDREN UNDER TWELVE YEARS OF AGE.

That for any single section of the said tramways the fare for two children travelling together under the age of twelve (12) years (other than children under four years of age carried on passenger's lap, who shall be carried free), shall be One penny, provided that for any one or more sections the fare to be charged for two children travelling together under the age of twelve years shall not exceed the fare charged for one adult.

COST OF ALTERATION TO POSTAL WIRES INCIDENTAL TO USE OF ELECTRICITY.

In the event of the Postal Department demanding any special alteration of its wires in consequence of the introduction of a high tension or other electrical current in connexion with the tramway, the cost of any special arrangement of or provision for the wires because of such current shall be paid and borne by the Trust.

GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL TO BE SOLE JUDGE OF BREACH OF ORDER.

That the Governor in Council shall be sole judge of the compliance with, or of the breach of any of the requirements contained in this Order, and for the purpose of enabling the Governor in Council to arrive at a just decision, an inquiry into the facts of each case shall be conducted in the manner provided in clause 25 of the Regulations contained in the Second Schedule to the *Tramways Act 1915* before an officer to be appointed in that behalf by the Governor in Council as provided in the Regulations in the said Schedule.

If, upon report to the Governor in Council by the Referee, made under the said clause 25 of the Regulations in the Second Schedule of the said Act, the Governor in Council shall, as such sole judge, determine that there has been any failure of or non-compliance with, or that any breach of any of the requirements contained in this Order has occurred by way either of commission or omission, then the powers conferred by this Order shall be forfeited, or shall cease and determine, or shall be suspended, as the Governor in Council shall direct; and in the case of the Governor in Council ordering a suspension only of such powers, then the Governor in Council shall, in his adjudication, state for what period such suspension shall take effect.

If in such adjudication the Governor in Council shall determine that the powers conferred by this Order shall be forfeited, or shall wholly cease and determine, then the Prahran and Malvern Tramways Trust shall forthwith proceed to restore the streets along which the said route is laid out to their condition previous to the construction of such tramway, unless the Governor in Council otherwise order.

That, in the event of the Trust finding it necessary to provide work of a more substantial or expensive character than that provided for in this Order, the said Trust shall take upon itself all such additional expenditure, and no claim whatever shall be made upon the Government, or upon the Board of Land and Works, for any pecuniary assistance or aid in respect of such expenditure, or to provide funds therefor.

And the Honorable William Addison Adamson, His Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions accordingly.

Samples of the whole of the above-mentioned articles, where indicated in the schedule as to sample, can be seen at the offices of the Secretary to the Tender Board.

Printed forms of tender and the conditions of contract may, in all cases, be obtained from the Secretary to the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne; and for the respective districts from the Receivers and Paymasters at Geelong, Ararat, Ballarat, Beechworth, Bendigo, Castlemaine, and Sale; for Sunbury, from the Medical Superintendent, Hospital for the Insane; for Lara, from the Superintendent of the Inebriates Retreat, and the Receiver and Paymaster at Geelong; for Greenvale, from the Superintendent at the Sanatorium; for Aborigines, from the police at stations as follow:—Coranderk, at Healesville; Lake Condah, at Heywood and Portland; and Lake Tyers, at Bairnsdale and Cunninghamham; for Rutherglen, from the Superintendent, Viticultural College; for Wyuna, from the manager, at the Irrigation Farm, and from the police at Kyabram; for Wahgunyah, from the manager, at the Vine Nursery; and for the Forest School, from the senior master, by whom also any information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

Security will be required, either in Victorian Government debentures, Savings Bank Deposit Book, or Bank Deposit Receipt, in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board, or cash deposit, as the tenderer may elect.

Tenders must be accompanied by a preliminary deposit, as shown above, in bank notes, or a bank draft payable to the order of the Secretary to the Tender Board (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application. Such deposit to be forfeited in the event of the tenderer withdrawing the tender before notification of acceptance, or, in the event of being successful, failing to complete by lodging the security and contract form, duly signed, within the prescribed period. *It is also stipulated that if a tenderer be a member of a firm and such firm be interested in the contract, then his tender is to be in the name of the firm and not in that of the individual; and that for breach of this condition the preliminary deposit will be forfeited and the tender declared informal.*

The security must be completed and contract signed within ten days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

Tenderers withdrawing their tenders before notification of acceptance or failing to take up their accepted tenders within the prescribed period, when notified of acceptance, may be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contracts for Government supplies for a period of twelve months, such disqualification to date from the notification of acceptance of tender.

Preference will be given by the Tender Board to tenders for articles manufactured within the Commonwealth, provided the quality of such articles is satisfactory and the prices are considered reasonable.

Preference will also be given to articles of British manufacture as against those of foreign manufacture.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

Tenders, enclosed in an envelope, and having the words "Tender for" (as the case may be) written thereon, must be deposited in the Tender-box at the Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne, or, if sent by post, postage must be prepaid, and the tenders addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, which office they must reach by first post on the date of closing of tenders.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. All the articles are to be of the best quality of the several kinds, in the best condition, and in conformity with the Pure Food Act, and to be delivered in sound packages, free from all charges for cartage, freight, &c. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply.

2. As the exact quantity of any article which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated in the schedule, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same as ordered.

3. Supplies for country stations for which no local contract may have been taken, or for which the contract has been terminated, may be ordered under the Melbourne contract.

4. The Melbourne District will include places within a radius of six miles from the General Post Office, with the exception of places for which separate contracts are provided; Williamstown includes supplies for s.s. *Lady Loch* and *Albert*; the Ararat, Beechworth, and Ballarat Districts will include the Hospitals for the Insane, Gaols, and Police Gaols, at these places; and the Geelong District embraces a radius of two miles from the Post Office; Lara, the Inebriates Retreat; Greenvale, the Sanatorium; Rutherglen, the Viticultural College; Wyuna, the Irrigation Farm; Wangunyah, the Vine Nursery; and Creswick, the Forest School. The lock-ups at City Watch-House, Bourke-street West, Brunswick, Carlton, Coburg, Collingwood, Fitzroy, Fitzroy North, Hotham Hill, Little Bourke-street, North Melbourne, Port Melbourne, Prahran, Richmond, St. Kilda, South Melbourne, and South Yarra are included in the contracts for the Melbourne District. Delivery must be made at the places, institutions, &c., named in the schedules.

5. Packages suitable for transport of goods supplied must be provided by the contractor free of expense, and the value of these packages, whether in bulk or otherwise, is to be included in the price demanded, except brandy casks, porter cases, hogsheds, butter firkins or boxes, and soap boxes (not including fancy soaps), jam jars, flour, meal, and potato bags, which will remain the property of the contractor, and only the actual net weight or quantity received will be paid for. The empties to be removed from the place of delivery at the contractor's expense.

6. The meat supplied under these conditions must, if practicable, be slaughtered at abattoirs which are under proper authorized inspection and supervision. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor, on report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account, or from the security money.

7. The supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts are to be delivered direct to the establishment entitled thereto on the written order of the officer in charge. All other supplies will be ordered by the head of the department concerned or any officer authorized by him.

8. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor, and the account is to be rendered as soon as possible after the delivery of the supplies, accompanied by the receipted delivery order. For the supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts, the account is to be rendered monthly for such quantities only as are issued, the difference between the supply and issue to be kept at the contractor's credit. Supplies not issued at the termination of the contract to be removed by the contractor. The rates or quantities quoted in the orders cannot be exceeded.

9. When a contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the carriers to act as agent for, and charge the freight to, the Stores and Transport Department. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be retained by himself. Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition may subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under clause 18 of these conditions.

10. Should the contractor fail to supply any articles at the time mentioned in the order, they or any like supplies suitable for the service will be otherwise procured, and the expense over and above the contract price will be deducted from his account or from the security money.

11. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency of defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.

12. If the officer in charge of stores be not satisfied as to the quantity or quality of the stores, or if, after taking delivery of any stores or material, he shall discover any deficiency or defect therein, he may return such deficient or defective stores or material to the contractor, and shall report the same to the head of his department and to the Tender Board.

13. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supplies as to the quality, the same is to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a board of survey composed of persons named by the Treasurer of the State for the time being; and the decision of the board is to be considered final. In the event of the decision being against the contractor, the survey fees and expense (if any) will be deducted as in clause 10.

14. In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or when from some other cause injury would be sustained either by the persons to whom the rations or stores are due or to the contractor in waiting for a board of survey, the head of the department or officer authorized to take delivery will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing, and that the contractor must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead; failing which, it or any like supply suitable for the service, will be obtained by the officer requiring it as in clause 10. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies so rejected or returned.

15. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor;

failing which, it or any like supply suitable for the service will be procured by the officer requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 10.

16. In the case of supplies for Hospitals for the Insane, it will be competent for a board of survey, consisting of the medical superintendent (or, in his absence, of the medical officer) and any two officers named by him, to examine and reject any supplies that may be objected to. It must be distinctly understood, however, that the contractor will have a right of appeal to the Treasurer of the State for the time being; but, pending such appeal, he must take back the rejected articles and at once supply others of approved quality; failing which, the supplies required or any like supplies suitable for the service may be obtained by the officer concerned, and the expense charged to the contractor.

17. In the case of supplies for Hospitals for the Insane, it will also be competent for two or more of the official visitors, in conjunction with the medical superintendent, to reject any supplies that they may consider not in accordance with contract; and in such cases the reference to a board of survey will not be deemed to be necessary on the part of the contractor.

18. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the said Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in clause 10. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and forfeit the whole or any part of the security money.

19. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government. *If it is found during the currency of the contract that the contractor has not conformed to the condition of advertisement—which stipulates that if a tenderer be a member of a firm and such firm be interested in the contract, then the tender is to be in the name of the firm and not in that of the individual—then the Honorable the Treasurer may determine the contract, and forfeit the security money.*

20. It will be competent for the Secretary to the Tender Board to terminate the contract, without notice, should there be reason to know that the contractor takes advantage of his contract to communicate with a prisoner.

21. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or vitiated by the importation of stores for the Government service, or by any contracts or purchases made by the Imperial Commissariat, or on account of the Commonwealth Government; or by the consumption of the produce or surplus stock of any Government establishment, or by any article being made at and supplied for the use of any Government establishment.

22. For the purpose of the contracts entered into under these conditions, it is hereby expressly provided that in the event of any alteration in the Tariff affecting any of the items included in these contracts, the Government or the contractor (as the case may be) may give two months' notice, through the Secretary to the Tender Board, of the termination of the contract for the particular item or items so affected to the opposite party, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the first day of the month, and within the period for which the contract is made. The contract for the unaffected items to remain in full force and effect. Any notice to be served under this condition shall be deemed to have been duly served if sent to the contractor in a registered letter at his last-known place of business or abode.

23. Under no circumstances other than those mentioned in clause 22 will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited; and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

24. For the purposes of those contracts the word Government shall mean Government of the Commonwealth as regards supplies for the Commonwealth, and Government of the State as regards supplies for the State; and the word Treasurer shall mean Treasurer of the Commonwealth as regards supplies for the Commonwealth, and Treasurer of the State as regards supplies for the State.

25. Where specially indicated in the schedules no subletting will be allowed, and no delivery shall be made on Sundays; all work must be carried out by the contractor, and the hours of employment of any person engaged in the preparation or manufacture of the articles tendered for in the schedules, or engaged in the delivery of or in any way engaged in connexion with the supply of the articles tendered for in the schedules under this contract, are not to exceed forty-eight per week (unless otherwise stated), and every such person shall be paid such wages and shall be employed subject to such conditions as are or may be determined by any Wages Board under the Factories and Shops Act to which such persons are subject as employees, and a copy of the labour condition, as indorsed on the schedules affected, shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted, in legible Roman characters, in the factory, shop, or dairy (and in each part of the factory, shop, or dairy where several rooms are in use) in which goods are prepared or manufactured under these contracts. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £50 (Fifty pounds), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money; and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement and in all other respects.

For admission of every adult, such sum as the Council may determine, not exceeding Two shillings.

For admission of every saddle horse, exclusive of rider, such sum as the Council may determine, not exceeding Two shillings.

For admission of every carriage, cart, or other vehicle drawn by one horse, such sum as the Council may determine, not exceeding Two shillings.

For the admission of every additional horse, such sum as the Council may determine, not exceeding One shilling.

3. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct.

4. No society, club, picnic party, or other combined body shall use the Reserve without the consent, in writing, of the Council.

5. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, cut names on the fences, trees, or senta, or in any way damage any of the buildings, gates, fences, or other property in or around the Reserve, or pollute any water thereon, or remove therefrom any soil, sand, or manure.

6. No person shall interfere with the trees, shrubs, or other property in the Reserve, or roll or throw any stones or other missiles thereon, or commit any nuisance, or leave in the Reserve any bottles, paper, cast-off clothing or other litter.

7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the Reserve, or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, or hawk or offer for sale therein any goods or articles of any description, without the permission, in writing, of the Council.

8. No person shall light any fire in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Council.

9. No person, except workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations for young trees or shrubs.

10. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless led by a cord or chain, without the authority, in writing, of the Council; and all dogs, goats, and poultry found wandering in the Reserve shall be liable to be destroyed.

11. No person shall place in the Reserve any horses, cattle, sheep or other animals without permission, in writing, of the Council.

12. No person shall engage in any game or sport or dancing in the Reserve on Sundays.

13. Every person hiring or erecting in the Reserve any booth, tent, table, or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, or for the purpose of any game or amusement, shall pay such fee as the Council may from time to time determine.

14. No person shall play any unlawful game or make any wager for money, or by unseemly conduct interfere with the comfort and enjoyment of others within the Reserve.

15. Any person offending against this Regulation shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Ten pounds.
