SHIRE OF BANNOCKBURN.

BY-LAW No. 11.

A By-law of the Shire of Bannockburn, made under the provisions of the *Health Act* 1915 and numbered cleven, for the prevention of the pollution of the Barwon River within the limits of the said shire.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Act 1915, and of any other power enabling it on that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Bannockburn, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said shire, doth hereby order and direct as follows:—

(1) Whosoever causes or permits or suffers to run or be brought discharged thrown or cast into the Barwon River being that portion of the same within the municipal district of the said shire the water of any sink sewer drain engine or boiler or any dye chemical refuse fifth dirt grease decomposed substance or substance liable to decompose or any poisonous noxious offensive or unwholesome matter or drainage or does or permits or suffers to be done anything whatever whereby any water in the said portion of the said river is fouled polluted obstructed or damaged shall be guilty of a breach of this By-law and for every such breach be liable on conviction to a penalty of Ten pounds or if such breach be a continuing act or default he shall be liable to a penalty of One pound for every day during which such breach shall be committed or continued Provided nevertheless that the Justices or Court before whom any complaint may be made or proceedings taken in respect of any such breach may order the whole or part only (not being less than Five shillings) of such penalty to be paid.

By-law of the Shire of Heidelberg, made under section 198 of the Local Government Act 1915, and numbered 59, for regulating and restraining the erection and construction of erections or hoardings, and with regard to pulling down erections or hoardings, and for the other purposes hereinafter mentioned.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1915, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the shire of Heidelberg order as follows:—

(1) Save as hereinafter provided no person shall erect build or construct or alter or add to or cause to be erected or constructed or altered or added to any crection or hoarding without first obtaining the consent of the Council and unless such erection or hoarding is erected or constructed or altered or added to in accordance with the plan and specification prepared by such person and previously approved of by the Council.
