ADJUSTMENT OF THE POWERS OF THE STORE-
MEN PACKERS AND SORTERS BOARD AND OF
THE PAPER BOARD.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Factories and Shops Act 1915*, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers (exclusive of hawkers and pedlars) keeping shops within the township of Mirboo North, within the municipal district of the shire of Mirboo, of the particular classes to be affected, doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

- (1) All shops (except shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat, hairdressers' shops, and shops of the classes or kinds mentioned in the Fourth Schedule to the *Factories and Shops Act 1915*) within the township of Mirboo North, within the municipal district of the shire of Mirboo, shall be exempted from the provisions of section 77 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1915*.
- (2) All such shops shall be closed in each week during the whole of each year from the hour of—
 - (a) Ten o'clock on the evening of Saturday;
 - (b) Seven o'clock on the evening of Friday;
 - (c) One o'clock on the afternoon of Wednesday.

And the Honorable Sir Alexander James Peacock, His Majesty's Minister of Labour for the State of Victoria shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

*Factories and Shops Act 1915.***EXEMPTION FROM SATURDAY HALF-HOLIDAY AND REGULATION OF SHOPS FOR THE SALE OF FRESH UNCOOKED MEAT WITHIN THE TOWNSHIP OF WILLAURA.**

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Factories and Shops Act 1915*, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers (exclusive of hawkers and pedlars) keeping shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat within the locality to be affected, doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

- (1) All shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat within the township of Willaura, within the municipal district of the shire of Ararat, shall be exempted from the provisions of sub-section (1) of section 98 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1915*, so far as the closing hours on Saturday, Friday, and Wednesday are concerned.
- (2) All such shops shall be closed in each and every week during the whole of each year from the hour of—
 - (a) Ten o'clock on the evening of Saturday;
 - (b) Six o'clock on the evening of Friday;
 - (c) One o'clock on the afternoon of Wednesday.

And the Honorable Sir Alexander James Peacock, His Majesty's Minister of Labour for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

*Education Act 1915.***ADDENDUM TO REGULATION XLII.**

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the fourth day of July, 1916.

PRESENT :

WHEREAS by section 81 of the *Education Act 1915* (6 Geo. V. No. 2644) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying the said Act into effect: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby add the following clauses to Regulation XLII.—Training of Teachers for Technical Schools—to the Regulations under the *Education Act 1915*, that is to say:—

ADDITION TO REGULATION XLII.

Course of Training for Instructors in Trade Subjects, Applied Science, Applied Art, or other Technical Subjects.

14. Subject to the consent of the Minister being first obtained, the councils of approved technical schools may appoint as assistant teachers persons who are desirous of being trained for positions as trade or technical instructors.

15. Applicants desirous of being trained for such positions must produce evidence that they have reached a satisfactory standard of general education, and must produce satisfactory evidence of health, character, and aptitude for teaching.

16. In appointing assistant teachers to be trained as instructors preference will be given to applicants who have completed or are about to complete approved trade or other technical courses of work in technical schools.

17. After appointment such assistant teachers will be paid at the rate of £20 per annum, and will be required—

- (a) to assist in teaching trade or other subjects for or at least one evening per week;
- (b) to attend classes in the theory and practice of teaching and other subjects specified, and to pass the prescribed examinations;
- (c) to show diligence and skill in their work.

18. On completion of a satisfactory course of training, and on passing the prescribed examinations, such teachers will be recorded as eligible for appointment as trade or technical instructors at such rates of payment as may be approved by the Minister.

19. Subject to the consent of the Minister being first obtained, the councils of approved technical schools may appoint as assistant teachers persons who are desirous of being trained for positions as teachers of science, art, or other special subjects. Applicants must be University graduates, or must hold diplomas from recognised technical schools, or produce evidence of qualifications fitting them to be trained as teachers of such subjects. They must also furnish satisfactory evidence of health, character, and aptitude for teaching.

20. Successful applicants for training in subjects mentioned in clause 19 will be paid such salary as may be approved by the Minister, and will be required—

- (a) to assist in the teaching of the special subjects in which they are qualified;
- (b) to attend classes of instruction, and pass the necessary examinations in the theory and practice of teaching.

21. On completion of a satisfactory course of training, and the passing of the prescribed examinations, such persons will be considered eligible for appointment as teachers of their special subjects in technical schools.

22. For the purpose of assisting in the training of student teachers (trade teachers, teachers of applied science, applied art, and other technical subjects), instructors approved by the Minister will be appointed and paid for such services at such rates as may be approved by the Minister.

23. Every person trained under the above conditions as set out in clauses 17 and 20, will be required, as a condition of such training, to enter into an agreement by himself and an approved surety, not to relinquish his course of training without the permission of the Minister, and for at least two years afterwards to teach in any technical school to which he may be appointed.

And the Honorable H. S. W. Lawson, His Majesty's Minister of Public Instruction for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

REGULATIONS AS TO INDETERMINATE SENTENCES AND RELEASE ON
RECOGNISANCES OF FIRST OFFENDERS.

WHEREAS by section 541 of the *Crimes Act 1915* (6 Geo. V. No. 2637), and by section 11 of the *Indeterminate Sentences Act 1915* (6 Geo. V. No. 2758), it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time, by Order published in the *Government Gazette*, make, alter, and repeal Regulations for the purposes set forth therein: Now therefore the Governor in Council doth by this Order make the following Regulations:—

PROBATION OFFICERS.—REGULATIONS.

1. In these Regulations "Board" means the Indeterminate Sentences Board constituted under the *Crimes Act 1915*.
2. Nominations of persons to be probation officers shall be made by the Board to the Chief Secretary.
3. There shall be a Chief Probation Officer, who, for the purposes of the *Crimes Act*, shall be a probation officer for the whole of the State of Victoria. The Chief Probation Officer shall perform the duties of a probation officer as prescribed by the *Crimes Act* and these Regulations. He shall visit a person released on recognisance and placed under his supervision in accordance with the requirements of the Court's direction.
4. Subject to the direction of the Board the Chief Probation Officer shall have authority—
 - to exercise a general supervision over the work of other probation officers;
 - to inquire into and report on the work of any probation officer;
 - to require returns and reports from each probation officer;
 - to make recommendations and submit reports concerning probation work;
 - to collect statistics in relation to probation work under the Act.
5. Each probation officer other than the Chief Probation Officer shall be assigned to a city, town, district, or place as the Governor in Council may direct.
6. It shall be the duty of a probation officer immediately a case is committed to his supervision to furnish full particulars of the case to the Board in the form No. 1 of Schedule A.
7. Each probation officer shall make a return to the Board for each quarter of the year ending on the last days of the months of March, June, September, and December, on or before the 15th day of the month following each quarter in the form No. 2 of Schedule A of all persons placed under his supervision, stating particularly the steps he has taken to satisfy himself that the conditions imposed by the Court are being observed, and the general conduct and surroundings of each probationer.
8. Each probation officer shall keep a register in which he shall record full particulars in the form No. 3 of Schedule A of each person placed under his supervision. He shall also record periodically particulars of all matters ascertained by him in regard to the conduct, associations, and environment of each probationer.

Electric Light and Power Act 1915.

REGULATIONS IN REGARD TO ELECTRIC TRACTION.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne,
the fourth day of July, 1916.

PRESENT :

His Excellency the Governor of Victoria.
Sir A. J. Peacock | Mr. Hagelthorn
Mr. McLeod | Mr. Adamson.

WHEREAS by the *Electric Light and Power Act 1915* (6 Geo. V. No. 2645) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make such regulations as he thinks expedient for securing the safety of the persons and property of the public from injury from fire or otherwise, and may by any regulation amend or repeal any condition contained in any order in relation thereto: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby repeal the Regulations made on the 10th day of April, 1899, and doth hereby substitute therefor the following, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS IN REGARD TO ELECTRIC TRACTION.

Definitions.

In the following Regulations—

- The expression "energy" means electrical energy.
The expression "generator" means the dynamo or dynamo or other electrical apparatus used for the generation of energy.
The expression "motor" means any electric motor carried on a car and used for the conversion of energy.
The expression "pipe" means any gas or water pipe or other metallic pipe, structure, or substance.
The expression "wire" means any wire or apparatus used for telegraphic, telephonic, electrical signalling, or other similar purposes.
The expression "current" means an electric current exceeding one-thousandth part of one ampere.
The expression "undertakers" shall mean the person or body of persons conducting or controlling the service of any tramways under an Order or Act.
The expression "the Minister" shall mean the Minister charged with the administration of the *Electric Light and Power Act 1915*.

Regulations.

1. Any dynamo used as a generator shall be of such pattern and construction as to be capable of producing a continuous current without appreciable pulsation.
2. One of the two conductors used for transmitting energy from the generator to the motors shall be in every case insulated from earth, and is hereinafter referred to as the "line"; the other may be insulated throughout or may be uninsulated in such parts and to such extent as is provided in the following Regulations, and is hereinafter referred to as the "return."
3. Where any rails on which electric cars run, or any conductors laid between or within three feet of such rails, form any part of a return such part may be uninsulated. All other returns or parts of a return shall be insulated, unless of such sectional area as will reduce the fall in potential along the uninsulated portion of the return, so that it shall not at any time exceed the rate of three and a half volts per mile of tramway whether single or double track.
4. When any uninsulated conductor laid between or within three feet of the rails forms any part of a return, it shall be electrically connected to the rails at distances apart not exceeding 200 feet by means of copper strips having a sectional area of at least one-sixteenth of a square inch, or by other means of equal conductivity.
5. (1) When any part of a return is uninsulated, then either—
 - (a) the uninsulated return shall be connected with the negative terminal of the generator, and the negative terminal of the generator shall be connected directly through a current indicator with earth; or
 - (b) the uninsulated return shall be connected with the negative terminal of the generator by one or more insulated return conductors, of which the ends connected with the uninsulated return shall be connected through a current indicator with earth; and the generator shall have no other connexion with earth.

(2) If in any case the current indicator cannot be conveniently placed at the connexion of the uninsulated return with the insulated return, the instrument may consist of a current indicator at the generating station connected by insulated wires to the terminals of a resistance interposed between the return and the earth connexion or connexions, or it may consist of a suitable low resistance maximum demand indicator. The said resistance or the resistance of the maximum demand indicator shall be such that the maximum current laid down in Regulation 6(i) shall produce a difference of potential not exceeding one volt between the terminals. The indicator shall be so constructed as to indicate correctly the current passing through the resistance when connected to the terminals by the insulated wires before mentioned.

(3) The earth connexions required by this Regulation shall be either two separate earth connexions, or connexions with a main for water supply of not less than three inches internal diameter.

(4) The two earth connexions shall be placed not less than 20 yards apart, and shall be constructed, laid, and maintained so as to secure electrical contact with the general mass of earth, and so that an electro-motive force not exceeding 4 volts shall suffice to produce a current of at least two amperes from one earth connexion to the other through the earth, and a test shall be made at least once in every month to ascertain whether this requirement is complied with.

(5) No portion of either earth connexion shall be placed within 6 feet of any pipe except a main for water supply of not less than 3 inches internal diameter, which is metallically connected to the earth connexions with the consents hereinbefore specified.

(6) Nothing in this Regulation shall authorize the connexion of any generator or return to any main for water supply without the consent of the owner of the main.

(7) Where from the nature of the soil or from other reasons, the electric authority can show to the satisfaction of the Minister that this Regulation cannot be complied with without undue expense, the provisions of this Regulation shall not apply.

6. When the return is partly or entirely uninsulated the undertakers shall in the construction and maintenance of the tramway—

- (a) so separate the uninsulated return from the general mass of the earth, and from any pipe in the vicinity;
- (b) so connect together the several lengths of the rails;
- (c) adopt such means for reducing the difference produced by the current between the potential of the uninsulated return at any one point and the potential of the uninsulated return at any other point; and
- (d) so maintain the efficiency of the earth connexions specified in the preceding Regulations as to fulfil the following conditions—

(i) That the current passing from the earth connexions through the indicator to the generator, or through the resistance to the insulated return, shall not at any time exceed either two amperes per mile of single tramway line or 5 per cent. of the total current output of the station.

(ii) That if at any time and at any place a test be made by connecting a galvanometer or other current indicator to the uninsulated return and to any pipe in the vicinity, it shall always be possible to reverse the direction of any current indicated by interposing a battery of three Leclanche cells connected in series if the direction of the current is from the return to the pipe, or by interposing one Leclanche cell if the direction of the current is from the pipe to the return. The owner of such pipe may require the undertakers to permit him at reasonable times and intervals to ascertain by test that the conditions specified (ii) are complied with as regards his pipe.

In order to provide an indication that the condition (i) is complied with, the circuit of the current indicator provided for in Regulation 5 shall be closed twice per day for periods of five minutes each at intervals of not less than six hours, and as nearly as possible to the times of maximum output. The maximum reading through the current indicator during each of such tests shall be recorded, together with the output at the time such reading was taken.

7. (1) When the return is partly or entirely uninsulated the difference of potential between the points of the

uninsulated return furthest from and nearest to the generating station shall not on any route at any time exceed 3½ volts per mile of tramway, whether single or double track, and the fall in potential along any portion of such uninsulated return shall in no case exceed the rate of 3½ volts per mile.

(2) In order to provide an indication that the above condition is complied with, a record of such difference of potential and of the output at the time of such observation shall be taken upon each route twice per day for periods of five minutes each at intervals of not less than six hours, and as nearly as possible to the times of maximum output.

8. Every electrical connexion with any pipe shall be so arranged as to admit of easy examination, and shall be tested by the undertakers at least once in every three months.

9. Every line, except feeders, shall be constructed in sections not exceeding one-half of a mile in length, unless with the special approval of the Minister, and means shall be provided for isolating each such section for purposes of testing.

10. The insulation of the line, and of the return when insulated, and of all feeders and other conductors, shall be so maintained that the leakage current shall not exceed one-hundredth of an ampere per mile of tramway. The leakage current shall be ascertained daily, so far as practicable arrangements can be made, before or after the hours of running when the line is fully charged and, in any case, not less frequently than once a week.

If at any time it should be found that the leakage current exceeds one-half of an ampere per mile of tramway, the leak shall be localized and removed as soon as practicable, and the running of the cars shall be stopped unless the leak is localized and removed within 24 hours. Provided that where both line and return are placed within a conduit this Regulation shall not apply.

11. The insulation resistance of all continuously insulated cables used for lines, for insulated returns, for feeders, and for other purposes, and laid below the surface of the ground shall not be permitted to fall below the equivalent of ten megohms for a length of one mile. A test of the insulation resistance of all such cables shall be made at least once in each month.

12. In the disposition, connexions, and working of feeders the undertakers shall take all reasonable precautions to avoid injurious interference with any existing wires.

13. The undertakers shall so construct and maintain their system as to secure good contact between the motors and the line and return respectively.

14. The undertakers shall adopt the best means available to prevent the occurrence of undue sparking at the rubbing or rolling contacts in any place, and in the construction and use of their generator and motors.

15. Where the line or return or both are laid in a conduit the following conditions shall be complied with in the construction and maintenance of such conduit—

- (a) The conduit shall be so constructed as to admit of easy examination of and access to the conductors contained therein, and their insulators and supports.
- (b) It shall be constructed as to be readily cleared of accumulation of dust or other debris, and no such accumulation shall be permitted to remain.
- (c) It shall be laid to such falls and so connected to sumps or other means of drainage as to automatically clear itself of water without danger of the water reaching the level of the conductors.
- (d) If the conduit is formed of metal, all separate lengths shall be so jointed as to secure efficient metallic continuity for the passage of electric currents. Where the rails are used to form any part of the return they shall be electrically connected to the conduit by means of copper strips having a sectional area of at least one-sixteenth of a square inch, or other means of equal conductivity, at distances apart not exceeding 100 feet. Where the return is wholly insulated and contained within the conduit, the latter shall be connected to earth at the generating station or sub-station through a high resistance galvanometer suitable for the indication of any contact or partial contact of either the line or the return with the conduit.
- (e) If the conduit is formed of any non-metallic material not being of high insulating quality and impervious to moisture throughout, the conductors shall be carried on insulators, the supports for which shall be in metallic contact with one another throughout.

(f) The negative conductor shall be connected with earth at the station by a voltmeter, and may also be connected with earth at the generating station or sub-station by an adjustable resistance and current indicator. Neither conductor shall otherwise be permanently connected with earth.

(g) The conductors shall be constructed in sections not exceeding one-half mile in length, and in the event of a leak occurring on either conductor, that conductor shall be at once connected with the negative pole of the dynamo and shall remain so connected until the leak can be removed.

(h) The leakage current shall be ascertained daily, before or after the hours of running, when the line is fully charged, and if at any time it shall be found to exceed one ampere per mile of tramway, the leak shall be localized and removed as soon as practicable, and the running of the cars shall be stopped unless the leak is localized and removed within 24 hours.

16. Any condition or occurrence resulting in the falling of live trolley wires or line feeders, or making alive of street poles or metallic supports, shall be forthwith reported to the Minister.

17. The undertakers shall, so far as applicable to their system of working, keep records as specified below. These records shall, if and when required, be forwarded for the information of the Minister.

Daily Records.

Number of cars running.
Maximum working current.
Maximum working pressure.
Maximum current from the earth connexions (vide regulation 6 (i)).
Leakage current (vide Regulations 10 and 15 (h)).
Fall of potential in return (vide Regulation 7).

Monthly Records.

Condition of earth connexions (vide Regulation 5).
Insulation resistance of insulated cables (vide Regulation 11).

Quarterly Records.

Conductance of joints to pipes (vide Regulation 8).

Occasional Records.

Any tests made under the provisions of Regulation 6 (ii).
Localization and removal of leakage, stating time occupied.
Particulars of any abnormal occurrence affecting the electric working of the tramway.
