## SHIRE OF BELLARINE.

## BY-LAW No. 34.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1915*, and of any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Bellarine, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said shire, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law, that is to say:—

1. All former By-laws, so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law, are hereby repealed.
2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.
3. This By-law shall apply to, and have operation within, the following area in the shire of Bellarine, including the township of Ocean Grove:—

Commencing at the south-east angle of the subdivided area at a point at the junction of Tuckfield-street and Thacker-street; thence on the north side by Thacker-street to Field-street, on the east by Field-street, Ashbury-street, Newcombe-street, McCutcheon-street, Guthridge-street to Peer's-crescent; thence south-easterly along Peer's-crescent to Osborne-street; thence easterly along Osborne-street to the Esplanade; thence north-easterly along the Esplanade to Tuckfield-street; thence north along Tuckfield-street to the point of commencement.

4. The occupier of any premises on which there is a closet or privy shall cause the space under the seat of such closet or privy on such premises to be prepared, and shall permit the same to be used, for the double-pan service hereinafter provided for, and shall cause the closet or privy to be kept in a fit state for such service.

5. The Council shall cause every closet or privy to be supplied and kept supplied with two pans for the reception of night-soil, and a lid to closely fit the same, and shall cause one or other of such pans to be kept under the seat aforesaid.

6. The occupier aforesaid, or other persons having control or management of the premises, shall cause to be kept in every closet or privy belonging thereto, a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or other material efficient for deodorizing the night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in the pans in such closet or privy to be, immediately on the deposit thereof, covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material, sufficient to thoroughly and effectively deodorize the contents of such pan.

7. The Council shall, at least once a week, cause the pan in use to be closed with a lid, and removed with its contents from the premises in the day time, and the other pan to be left in its place.

8. Before leaving any pan in a closet or privy, the Council shall cause the same to be cleaned by superheated steam and tar painted inside, or by some equally efficient means.

9. The occupier aforesaid or other person shall not contract for the removal of the night-soil from such premises, except in accordance with this By-law.

10. The Council shall have the power, in lieu of making a rate, to make a charge on each occupier for the pans supplied, and for the removal of the night-soil, and the other work herein directed, the amount in default of payment to be recovered in any Court of Petty Sessions.

11. If any person or the Council commit a breach of this By-law he or they shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10) and not less than Five shillings (5s.), or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) and not less than Five shillings (5s.) for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

#### Agricultural Colleges Act 1915.

#### REGULATIONS UNDER THE AGRICULTURAL COLLEGES ACT 1915 FOR REGULATING THE MANNER IN WHICH LANDS VESTED IN THE TRUSTEES MAY BE DEMISED BY THEM, ETC.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the seventeenth day of July, 1916.

#### PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor of Victoria.  
Sir A. J. Peacock Mr. Hagelthorn.  
Mr. McLeod

**W**HEREAS by section 41 of the *Agricultural Colleges Act 1915* it is enacted that the Council of Agricultural Education may, from time to time, with the approval of the Governor in Council, make, alter, and repeal regulations for regulating the manner in which any of the lands vested in the trustees may be demised by them, and the forms of the leases, and the terms, covenants, and conditions to be therein contained: Now, therefore, the said Council of Agricultural Education, hereinafter called the Council, doth hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the above said recited Act, repeal the regulations made the 13th day of January, 1891, and make the following Regulations (that is to say):—

1. All lands vested in the trustees appointed, or to be appointed by the Governor in Council under the

said Act, hereinafter designated the trustees, shall be let by public auction or tender, as may from time to time be determined by the trustees, except in such cases as the Council may otherwise direct.

2. Lands vested in the trustees shall not be let unless notice of intention so to do shall have been published in the *Government Gazette*, and in one or more newspapers published in Victoria, at least fourteen days previous to any such lands being so let.

3. Prior to any lands vested in the trustees being let, the Council shall determine the purpose for which such lands may be used.

4. A sum equal to 10 per cent. of the amount offered per annum shall accompany each tender for land to be let by tender, and the trustees shall not be bound to accept the highest or any tender.

5. Within fourteen days after notice shall have been forwarded by the trustees to any tenderer of his tender having been accepted, such tenderer shall pay to the treasurer of the Council such amount as survey fee as the trustees may have previously determined, together with a sum which, in addition to the money previously deposited, shall amount to rent for three months.

6. The highest bidder for any land offered by auction shall, immediately after being declared the highest bidder by the auctioneer, pay down a sum equal to three months' rent of the amount offered, together with such sum as the trustees may have fixed as charge for survey.

7. The forms of leases shall be those described in the schedules hereunto annexed, marked "One" and "Two" respectively.

8. The covenants and conditions other than those in the forms of lease described in the schedule shall in every case be prepared by the trustees and approved by the Governor in Council.

The above Regulations were made by the Council this sixteenth day of October, 1914, as witness the signatures of the Chairman and Secretary of the Council.

Provided always and it is hereby agreed and declared between the parties hereto that should the Lessee his executors administrators or permitted assigns with the consent of the Trustees erect any buildings for the purpose of residence on the said land then and in such case the Lessee his executors administrators or permitted assigns at the end of the said term or within one month therefrom shall have the privilege to sell or remove the said buildings provided he or they shall not have committed any breach of the covenants conditions or provisions herein contained and on his or their part to be

observed or performed and he or they shall remove them or forfeit all claim to them if not removed within the time hereby allowed.

18. Provided also and it is further agreed and declared that at the termination of this demise or when this lease is determined surrendered avoided or forfeited all substantial and permanent improvements (including dams wells irrigation-channels check banks levee banks fencing clearing or draining dwellings farm or other buildings upon and permanently attached to the soil) on the said land (except the buildings referred to in clause number 17 hereof) shall thereupon become the absolute property of the Trustees and the Lessee his executors administrators or permitted assigns shall not be entitled to any compensation whatever for any substantial and permanent improvements as aforesaid.

19. Provided also and it is further agreed and declared that if the Lessee his executors administrators or permitted assigns shall at any time during the said term become or be made bankrupt or insolvent or shall assign his or their estate for the benefit of his or their creditors or if he or they shall fail to use the premises hereby demised *bona fide* for the purposes for which the same has been demised respectively or use the same for any other purpose or if and whenever any part of the said rent hereinbefore reserved shall be in arrear for one week whether the same shall have been demanded or not or if and whenever there shall be a breach by the Lessee his executors administrators or permitted assigns of any of the covenants conditions and provisos herein contained and on his or their part to be observed and performed then and in such case it shall thereupon be lawful for the Trustees to declare this lease to be forfeited and then the Trustees by their officers or agents may without any demand enter forthwith into and upon any part of the said demised premises in the name of the whole and the same to repossess and enjoy as fully and effectually as if these presents had not been made and executed.

And also will at once after the granting of this lease to the satisfaction of the Trustees commence and continue to destroy and will within one year after the granting of this lease have destroyed to the satisfaction of the officer appointed in that behalf by the Trustees upon the demised land all kangaroos wallabies dingoes or native dogs dogs run wild dogs at large foxes rabbits and any of the animals and birds included in the term "vermin" in the Act in that behalf or which the Governor with the advice of the Executive Council may by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare to be vermin for the purposes of the Land Acts and will keep the same land free of such animals and birds to the satisfaction of the officer appointed in that behalf during the currency of this lease.

8. And also will observe perform and comply with the requirements of the *Vermin Destruction Act 1890* or any further Act or Acts of the Parliament of Victoria relating to the suppression or destruction of rabbits.

9. And also will permit the Trustees and the holder or holders of any gold mining lease or leases or mineral lease or leases granted by the Government of Victoria in the name and on behalf of His Majesty by virtue of and pursuant to the Mines Acts their or any of their agents and servants and any person to whom the Trustees shall grant any licence in respect hereof to enter into and upon such land with or without horses carts waggons and vehicles and to search for mine extract and remove all or any minerals stone gravel brick earth and deposits of guano and to cut down and carry away any live or dead timber thereon without any leave or licence being required in that behalf from the Lessee his executors administrators or permitted assigns.

10. And also will permit the Trustees and their agents servants and licensees and the holder or holders of any gold mining lease or leases or mineral lease or leases aforesaid to sink and make all such shafts pits levels adits tramways rails or roads and use and occupy such portions of the demised land for brick-making purposes as the Trustees may direct or set out and use and divert all waters and direct all buildings and machinery on the demised land as may be requisite or necessary for making marketable the said live or dead timber minerals stone gravel brick earth and deposits of guano which may be found in on under or upon the said demised land.

11. And also will permit the Trustees and their agents servants and all persons authorized by the Trustees to set out make construct and use the said roads dams reservoirs basins aqueducts and drains.

12. And also will permit any person appointed in that behalf by the Trustees at any time to enter upon the premises hereby demised to ascertain if the conditions and covenants of this lease are being performed by the Lessee his executors administrators or permitted assigns.

13. And also will not do or permit or suffer to be done any act whereby the water in any dams reservoirs basins or aqueducts may be polluted or contaminated or whereby any such dams reservoirs basins or aqueduct works of the Trustees may be injured but will at all times use his and their best endeavours to conserve the purity of the water and to prevent injury and damage to the property of the Trustees.

14. And also will not assign sublet set-over mortgage charge subdivide part with or encumber this lease or the possession of the land hereby demised or any portion thereof without the previous consent of the Trustees signified in writing.

15. And also will not during the continuance of the term hereby granted fell ring injure destroy grub up or cut down any live timber or other trees in or upon the land hereby demised unless with the sanction of the Trustees signified in writing.

16. And also will observe perform and fulfil or cause to be observed performed and fulfilled the covenants conditions stipulations and provisions which are contained in the schedule hereto.

17. Provided always and it is hereby agreed and declared between the parties hereto that should the Lessee his executors administrators or permitted assigns with the consent of the Trustees erect any buildings for the purpose of residence on the said land then and in such case the Lessee his executors administrators or permitted assigns at the end of the said term or within one month therefrom shall have the privilege to sell or remove the said buildings provided he or they shall not have committed any breach of the covenants conditions or provisions herein contained and on his or their part to be observed or performed and he or they shall remove them or forfeit all claim to them if not removed within the time hereby allowed.

18. Provided also and it is further agreed and declared that at the termination of this demise or when this lease is determined surrendered avoided or forfeited all substantial and permanent improvements (including dams wells irrigation channels check banks levees banks fencing clearing or draining dwellings farm or other buildings upon and permanently attached to the soil) on the said land (except the buildings referred to in clause number 17 hereof) shall thereupon become the absolute property of the Trustees and the Lessee his executors administrators or permitted assigns shall not be entitled to any compensation whatever for any substantial and permanent improvements as aforesaid.

19. Provided also and it is further agreed and declared that if the Lessee his executors administrators or permitted assigns shall at any time during the said term become or be made bankrupt or insolvent or shall assign his or their estate for the benefit of his or their creditors or if he or they shall fail to use the premises hereby demised *bona fide* for the purposes for which the same has been demised respectively or use the same for any other purpose or if and whenever any part of the said rent herebefore reserved shall be in arrear for one week whether the same shall have been demanded or not or if and whenever there shall be a breach by the Lessee his executors administrators or permitted assigns of any of the covenants conditions and provisos herein contained and on his or their part to be observed and performed then and in such case it shall thereupon be lawful for the Trustees to declare this lease to be forfeited and then the Trustees by their officers or agents may without any demand enter forthwith into and upon any part of the said demised premises in the name of the whole and the same to repossess and enjoy as fully and effectually as if these presents had not been made and executed.

20. Provided also and it is further agreed and declared that in any such case it shall be lawful for the Trustees their agents or officers authorized in that behalf without any demand whatsoever to enter upon the land hereby demised and the Lessee his executors or administrators and all persons claiming under him or them for ever to expel and remove therefrom without any legal process whatsoever and as effectually as any sheriff might do in case the Trustees had obtained judgment in ejectment for recovery of possession of the said land and a writ of possession or other process had issued on such judgment directed to such sheriff in due form of law And then and in case of such entry and any action being brought or other proceedings taken for the same by any person whomsoever the defendants to such action may plead leave or licence in bar thereof and these presents shall be conclusive evidence of the leave and licence of the Lessee his executors or administrators and all persons claiming under him or them to the Trustees and all persons acting on their behalf for the entry or trespass or other matters to be complained of in such action or other proceedings.

## REGULATIONS.

*At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne,

WHEREAS by section 40 of the *Agricultural Colleges Act 1915* the Governor in Council is empowered from time to time to make, alter and repeal Regulations for regulating the election by members of agricultural societies subscribing not less than Ten shillings per annum to any such society of members of the Council of Agricultural Education, and for regulating the times and places of and the proceedings at meetings thereof, and for regulating, computing and limiting the amounts to be paid to members thereof as travelling expenses: And whereas the Governor in Council on the 13th day of January, 1891, and on the 13th day of January, 1904, made certain Regulations under the powers conferred by the *Agricultural Colleges Act 1900* as amended. And whereas it is desirable to repeal such Regulations and to make other Regulations in lieu thereof: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said first recited Act and of every other power enabling him in that behalf, order as follows (that is to say):—

1. The Regulations approved by the Governor in Council on the 13th January, 1891, and on the 13th January, 1904, for regulating the times and places and the proceedings at meetings of the Council of Agricultural Education, and for regulating amounts to be paid to members of the said Council as travelling expenses, and for regulating the election of members of the said Council, are hereby repealed.

## PART I.

## ELECTION OF MEMBERS OF COUNCIL.

2. The Governor in Council may from time to time appoint some fit and proper person to be the returning officer for each and every one of the five parts into which Victoria has been divided to conduct the election of members of the Council of Agricultural Education in each of such parts respectively, in accordance with the provisions hereinafter made in that behalf, and may from time to time remove such returning officer.

3. The expenses incurred by any returning officer for the purpose of holding and conducting any such election shall be repaid to him by the Council of Agricultural Education out of the Agricultural Colleges Fund.

4. The election of members of the Council of Agricultural Education shall take place on the 23rd day of the month of June, 1892, and on the second Wednesday in the month of June in every succeeding third year.

5. The returning officer for each of such parts shall give thirty-five days' notice of his intention to proceed on the day appointed to hold an election of members of the Council of Agricultural Education and such notice shall be given by advertisement in the *Government Gazette*; and the returning officer shall also in such advertisement name the day appointed by him as the day of nomination, being not less than nineteen days nor more than twenty-two days prior to the day named for holding such election, within which all candidates must be nominated as hereinafter provided; and he shall also in such advertisement name the time and place when and where such nominations will be received, and shall sign such notice and affix thereto the date on which it is given.

6. Any member of an agricultural society subscribing not less than Ten shillings per annum to any such society, and resident within any of the parts into which Victoria is divided for the purpose of the *Agricultural Colleges Act 1915*, whose name is on the roll of members of agricultural societies for such part, and being desirous of nominating any person as a candidate for election by such part as a member of the Council of Agricultural Education, shall fill up a nomination paper in the form in the first schedule hereto, stating therein the christian name and surname of such candidate, together with the other particulars required by the said schedule; and such nomination paper shall be signed by not less than four other persons whose names are on such roll as aforesaid and also by the person named therein as a candidate accepting such nomination. Such nomination paper must be lodged or delivered by post at the place appointed not later than Four o'clock in the afternoon of the day fixed as the day of nomination.

7. A roll of members of agricultural societies subscribing not less than Ten shillings per annum to any such society within each part shall be made out in accordance with section 18 of the said Act, under the direction of the Minister by the Director of Agriculture, and forwarded to the returning officer of each such part at least one clear month before the date of each and every election.

8. The returning officer shall, in the event of there not being more than one person duly nominated for any part, make a return to the Council of Agricultural Education, and declare such person to have been duly elected a member thereof; but if more than one person be duly nominated for any one part, the returning officer thereof shall forthwith publish in the *Government Gazette* a list of the names of such candidates, and a poll shall be taken, and such returning officer shall forthwith cause voting-papers to be printed in the form in the second schedule hereto, and shall initial each of such papers, and shall enclose it in an unfastened envelope having his own name and address printed thereon, and shall send by post under a fastened cover one of such voting-papers and addressed envelopes to each and every person whose name appears on the roll as aforesaid. The returning officer shall indorse on every voting-paper so sent a number corresponding to that placed opposite the name of such person on such roll, which roll the returning officer shall retain in his own custody until after the election as hereinafter provided.

9. The voter having recorded his vote on the voting-paper and signed it, shall enclose such voting-paper in the envelope furnished to him with the printed address of the returning officer thereon, and shall deliver, or cause to be delivered, or affix a stamp and post the same so that it shall be received by the returning officer before noon of the day fixed for holding such election. If there remain upon any voting-paper so received more names than that of one candidate, such ballot-paper shall be treated as informal and the vote given on and by such paper shall be void and of no effect, and shall not be counted by the returning officer.

10. Each candidate shall be entitled to appoint, in writing, one scrutineer, to be present when the returning officer opens the envelopes containing the voting-papers on the day of holding the election.

11. The returning officer shall at noon of the day named in such advertisement for holding any election proceed, in the presence of any scrutineers appointed by any candidate, to open the envelopes with his printed address thereon which have been returned to him, and to take out the voting-papers therein contained, and compare the number and signature thereon with the number and name on the roll, and shall count the votes for each and every such candidate; and as soon as conveniently may be after the day of holding such election the returning officer shall give public notice in the *Government Gazette* of the number of votes given to each and every candidate, and shall declare the candidate who has received the greatest number of votes to be duly elected as a member of the Council of Agricultural Education; and if two or more candidates have received an equal number of votes, and a larger number than any other candidate, the returning officer shall record his casting vote in favour of one of them. The returning officer shall, within seven days from and after the holding of any election, return to the Council of Agricultural Education the names of the candidates who have been duly elected members thereof.

12. The roll and all voting-papers so counted as aforesaid shall be at once enclosed in a packet, which shall be sealed up and indorsed by the returning officer. All voting-papers not counted as aforesaid shall be similarly enclosed and indorsed. All voting-papers received after noon of the day of election shall be indorsed by the returning officer with the time of their receipt, and shall be enclosed in separate packets, and all such several packets shall be transmitted by post to the Director of Agriculture. Such packets shall be kept for a period of twelve months, when the same may be destroyed.

## PART II.

## MEETINGS OF COUNCILS.

*Times and Places of Meetings.*

13. The Council shall meet once at least in every month at the Public Offices, Melbourne, or at such other place as the Council may from time to time determine, and the chairman shall at any time convene a special meeting if so required, in writing, by five members.

*Order of Proceedings.*

14. In the absence of the chairman at any meeting, the Council may appoint any member to act as chairman in his stead during his absence.

15. The Council shall commence business at the time appointed; but if at the expiry of fifteen minutes after the appointed time, there shall not be a majority of members of the Council present, the meeting shall lapse, but may be adjourned by the chairman or, in his absence, by the treasurer, for fifteen minutes.

16. Before any account shall be paid a resolution of the Council affirming same shall be obtained.

17. The first business at each meeting of the Council shall be to confirm the minutes of the preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon, except as to their accuracy as a record of proceedings. After the signing of the minutes, the order of business shall be as follows:—

- (1) Reading of copies of letters sent by the authority of the Council if called for.
- (2) Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
- (3) Consideration of accounts.
- (4) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
- (5) Receiving deputations.
- (6) Presentation of reports of committees, and considering and ordering thereon.
- (7) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings, and any business the chairman may think desirable, with the unanimous consent of the members of the Council present.
- (8) Motions of which previous notice has been given.
- (9) Notices of motion.

And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

18. No business other than routine shall be transacted at an ordinary meeting unless notice of motion shall have been given at a previous meeting, except as provided in clause (7) of the last preceding Regulation.

19. All notices of motion shall be in writing signed by the intending mover, and given at the meeting previous to that at which the same is to be taken into consideration.

20. No motion shall be proceeded with in the absence of the member who gave notice of the same, unless by some member having authority from him to that effect.

21. The Council may appoint committees to report on any subject or to carry out any business, subject to approval of the Council, and such committee shall report thereon to the Council at its first ordinary subsequent meeting.

22. No motion, the effect of which would be to rescind any previous resolution of the Council, shall be entertained unless a notice of motion be duly given for the purpose.

23. Any member desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down. The member calling to order shall then be heard upon such point of order, and the question decided before the subject is resumed.

24. Any member desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before addressing the chair in support thereof.

25. No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the consent of the Council, and no motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the Council unless it be seconded.

26. A member moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a member merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

27. If two or more members rise to speak at the same time, the chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.

28. No member shall speak a second time on the same question, unless entitled to reply, or in explanation when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.

29. No member shall digress from the subject-matter of the question under discussion, and all imputations or improper motives, and all personal reflections, shall be deemed highly disorderly.

30. The chairman's decision shall be final on all questions of order or practice, and he shall state the same without comment or argument.

31. Only one amendment shall be discussed at one time, and upon the adoption of any amendment, the original motion shall be deemed rejected, and the amendment so carried shall be acted upon as an original motion.

32. The chairman shall, in taking the sense of the Council, put the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative; and the votes of all members (if a division be called for) shall be entered in the minutes.

33. The Council shall vote by show of hands; any member may, however, call for a division upon any question, in which case the members voting in the affirmative shall stand up, and those in the negative shall retain their seats, until the vote is recorded.

34. A motion for adjournment of the Council or of a debate may be moved at any time, but no discussion shall be allowed thereon.

### PART III.

#### TRAVELLING EXPENSES OF MEMBERS.

35. Each member of the Council of Agricultural Education shall be entitled to be paid from the Agricultural College Fund the actual amount paid by him for conveyance from his home to, and return thereto from, the place of meeting of the Council, or if he use his horse, the forage for the same, together with a commuted sum of One pound and one shilling sterling for other expenses incurred in attending each ordinary or special meeting of the Council at which he shall be present, and like sums may be paid for attendance at meetings of committees appointed by the Council held on days other than days of ordinary or special Council meetings; but members of such committees may be paid the sum of Two pounds two shillings (£2 2s.) for expenses incurred in attending committee meetings held at any place other than Melbourne.

REGULATIONS UNDER THE SEEDS ACT 1915.  
(Consolidated.)

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Seeds Act 1915* to make Regulations as to any matters whatsoever not being contrary to the provisions of that Act, necessary to give effect to that Act, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby repeal the Regulations made on the 6th June, 1912, and in lieu thereof doth order as follows:—

1. "Foreign ingredients" shall be substances of the character following:—Stalks, husks, shells (other than those normally adhering to seeds), earthy matter (including sand or gravel), seeds of weed plants proclaimed under the *Victorian Thistle Act 1890* and *Victorian Thistle Act 1915*, and the *Federal Quarantine Act 1908*, and *Federal Quarantine Act 1915*, or seeds other than those specified in the invoice, and includes dead, diseased, and non-germinable seeds.
2. The weights of seeds to be taken as samples, for purpose of examination, shall be not less than as mentioned and set forth in the second column of Schedule A.
3. The proportion or amount of "foreign ingredients" which may be contained in any kind of seeds shall not exceed the proportion or amount set forth in Schedule B hereto.
4. The fees for examination of each sample of seed made under the Act shall be Five shillings.

*Penalties.*

5. The penalty for any contravention of these Regulations shall be a sum not exceeding Ten pounds.

# DEVIATION OF ROAD IN THE PARISH OF MILLEWA.

**W**HEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1915* (6 Geo. V. No. 2686) it is amongst other things enacted that if the council of any municipality prove to the satisfaction of the Minister that it is desirable that any road should be deviated, and that such deviation can be conveniently made through Crown land or land held by licensees under the *Land Act 1915*, the Minister may cause such road to be deviated accordingly at the cost of the municipality: And whereas it has been proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that it is desirable to deviate a certain road in the parish of Millewa: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the provisions contained in section 477 of the Act aforesaid, doth hereby declare the new road in the parish of Millewa defined in the following description to be a public highway in lieu of an existing road in the parish named, of which road technical description is also hereunder given (that is to say):—

## NEW ROAD.

## DETERMINATION OF THE BEDSTEADMAKERS BOARD.

IN accordance with the provisions of the *Factories and Shops Act 1915*, the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons (including the moulders of bedsteads and excluding the moulders of fenders) employed in the process, trade, or business of a maker of metal bedsteads or fenders, or parts thereof, has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That the previous Determinations of this Board are hereby amended, and such amendments shall come into force and be operative on and after the 21st day of August, 1916. The Determination and amendments are printed hereunder.

(2) That the lowest rates of wages to be paid to the following persons shall be:—

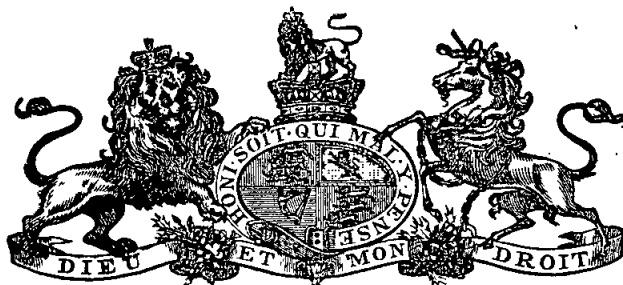
## (7) PIECE-WORK.

The Board determines under the provisions of Section 144 of the *Factories and Shops Act* 1915 that any employer may fix and pay piece-work prices to any person employed at any work for which the Board has fixed a minimum wage, provided that such employer shall base such piece-work prices on the earnings of an average worker working under like conditions, and such piece-work prices shall be fixed so that an average worker can earn not less than the wages rates fixed by the Board for such work.

## DETERMINATION OF THE SHIRT BOARD.

IN accordance with the provisions of the *Factories and Shops Act 1915*, the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or classes of persons for wholly or partly preparing or manufacturing, either inside or outside a factory or work-room, any Shirts, Shirt-fronts, Pyjamas, Underpants (except Knitted Goods), Collars, and Cuffs of every description, has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That previous Determinations of this Board are hereby amended, and such amendments shall come into force and be operative on and after the 16th day of August, 1916.

The Determination and amendments are printed hereunder—

(2) That the lowest rates of wages payable to the following persons shall be:—

Male cutters of white shirts, fashion shirts, collars or cuffs ...	70s. per week of 48 hours.
Female cutters of white shirts, fashion shirts, collars or cuffs ...	53s. " "

## APPRENTICES AND IMPROVERS.

"Apprentice" means any person under 21 years of age bound by indentures of apprenticeship, or any person over 21 years of age who, with the sanction of the Minister, is bound by indentures of apprenticeship. (Act 2650, Section 3.)

NOTE.—The Shirt Board has prescribed a form of apprenticeship agreement. Section 187 of Act No. 2650 requires that the indentures must be in that form.

"Improver" means any person (other than an apprentice) who does not receive a piece-work price or a wage rate fixed by any Special Board for persons other than apprentices or improvers, and who is not over 21 years of age, or who, being over 21 years of age, holds a licence from the Minister to be paid as an improver. (Act 2650, Section 3.)

(6) (a) The Board determines under the provisions of section 144 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1915* that any employer may fix and pay piece-work prices to any person employed at any work (except finishing or cutting) for which the Board has fixed a minimum wage, provided that such employer shall base such piecework prices on the earnings of an average worker working under like conditions, and such piecework prices shall be fixed so that an average worker can earn not less than the wages rate fixed for such work.

(b) The piece-work prices to be paid to any person employed at finishing shall be the same as the prices fixed for such work outside a factory.

## STANDARD STITCH.

The standard number of stitches for prices quoted shall be as follows :—

White and Fashion Shirts, bodies, 12 stitches to inch ; trimmings, 16 stitches to inch.

White Nightshirts, 18 stitches to inch.

Soft Shirts and Pyjamas (except silk), bodies and trimmings, 12 stitches to inch ; hem, 10 stitches to inch.

Silk Shirts and Pyjamas, 20 stitches to inch.

## PRICE FOR FINER STITCHING.

The additional price to be paid for work done with finer stitching than the "Standard" shall be as follows :—

White and Fashion Shirts—For all stitching finer than the "Standard," 1s. 6d. per doz. added.

Soft Shirts and Pyjamas (except silk)—Bodies and trimmings, 13 to 16 stitches to inch, one-fifth ( $\frac{1}{5}$ ) added.

Soft Shirts and Pyjamas (except silk)—Bodies and trimmings, 17 to 20 stitches to inch, one-third ( $\frac{1}{3}$ ) added.

NOTE.—(1) Piece-work prices or wages rates paid to indoor workers are net. Sewings and trimmings used in manufacturing of garments to be provided by manufacturer free of charge to workers.

(2) Piece-work prices for outdoor workers include an allowance for white and black cotton only ; all other sewings and trimmings used in manufacturing of garments to be provided by manufacturer free of charge to the worker.
