MELBOURNE WEST PROVINCE.—PETITION.

IT is hereby notified that a Petition, of which the following is a copy, was, on the 4th day of August, 1916, presented to the Honorable the President of the Legislative Council.

TO THE HONORABLE JOHN MARK DAVIES, PRESIDENT OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL OF THE STATE OF VICTORIA.

The humble petition of John George Aikman, of Holmes-road, Moonee Ponds, in the State of Victoria, merchant, respectfully sheweth :—

1. That a writ was duly issued on the sixteenth day of May, One thousand nine hundred and sixteen, to proceed to the election of a member to serve in the Legislative Council for the province of Melbourne West upon the retirement of your petitioner from the representation of the said province owing to his seat in the said province being vacated by effluxion of time.

The said election was held upon the first day of June, One thousand nine hundred and sixteen.

2. That your petitioner was a duly nominated candidate at such election, and was qualified and capable of being elected a member of the Legislative Council.

3. That one, Daniel Laurence McNamara, of Talbot-avenue, East St. Kilda, in the said State, secretary, was also nominated as a candidate at such election.

4. No other persons were nominated for or stood as candidates at such election.

5. That, as a result of such election, the Returning Officer announced that Daniel Laurence McNamara had received five thousand one hundred and seventy-seven votes, and your petitioner four thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven votes, and thereupon the Returning Officer declared the said Daniel Laurence McNamara duly elected as a member of the Legislative Council for the province of Melbourne West, and indorsed and returned the said writ accordingly.

6. That the said Daniel Laurence McNamara was not nominated as a candidate at such election in accordance with the provisions of *The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1915*, section 206.

7. That the said Daniel Laurence McNamara was not qualified to be or capable of being elected a member of the Legislative Council, inasmuch as the said Daniel Laurence McNamara had not for one year previously to such election been legally or equitably seized of or entitled to an estate of freehold in possession for his own use and benefit in lands or tenements in Victoria of the annual value of Fifty pounds above all charges and encumbrances affecting the same other than any public or parliamentary tax or municipal or other rate or assessment.

8. That the said Daniel Laurence McNamara delivered to the Returning Officer with his nomination paper a declaration to the effect that he was legally or equitably seized of or entitled to lands or tenements in Victoria sufficient to qualify him to be a member of the Legislative Council under *The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1915*, which declaration was false and false to the knowledge of the said Daniel Laurence McNamara.

9. That the said Daniel Laurence McNamara on taking his seat in the Legislative Council made and subscribed a declaration in the form set forth in the Fourth Schedule to the said Act to the effect that he was legally or equitably seized of or entitled to certain lands or tenements in Victoria set forth in the said declaration sufficient to qualify him to be a member of the Legislative Council under the said Act, which declaration was false, and false to the knowledge of the said Daniel Laurence McNamara.

10. That the said Daniel Laurence McNamara is not now and never was legally or equitably seized of or entitled to lands or tenements in Victoria sufficient to qualify him to be a member of the Legislative Council under the said Act.

11. That your petitioner claims that he was the only qualified candidate at such election, and was duly elected as a member of the said province at such election, and should be declared duly elected as such member.

Your petitioner therefore humbly prays—

That you will be pleased to communicate the matter of this petition to the Legislative Council of Victoria in order that the same may be referred to the Committee of Elections and Qualifications of your Honorable House.

And also prays—

That it be declared that the said Daniel Laurence McNamara was not a candidate at such election.

That the said Daniel Laurence McNamara be declared incapable of being elected or returned for the said electoral province of Melbourne West and of sitting as a member for the said province.

That the election of the said Daniel Laurence McNamara be declared void.

That it be declared that your petitioner was returned as member for the said electoral province and is entitled to serve as such member, and that the return for such province be amended accordingly.

That it be declared that the said Daniel Laurence McNamara is not now qualified as a member for the said province, and that his seat be declared vacant.

That it be declared that the said Daniel Laurence McNamara was elected to the Legislative Council and took his seat by unlawful means, and that his election be avoided and his seat vacated.

And that your petitioner may have such further and other relief as the circumstances of the case may require or as the said Committee of your Honorable House may see meet.

And your petitioner as in duty bound will ever pray.

BY-LAW No. 603 AMENDING BY-LAW No. 1.—
COLIBAN DISTRICT WATER SUPPLY.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission (hereinafter called "the Commission"), in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1915*, doth hereby make the By-law following for the district supplied with water from the Coliban system of waterworks:—

That By-law No. 1, made by the Commission on the 16th day of July, 1906, be and is hereby amended by substituting for the thirtieth clause of the said By-law No. 1 the following:—

30. The charge to be paid for water supplied from the channels of the Commission shall be One penny per 1,000 gallons, except in the cases hereinafter mentioned:—

- (1) For sluice mining by hand, without the aid of machinery or hose jets and nozzles, one-third of a penny per 1,000 gallons.
- (2) For sluice mining by machinery or hose jets and nozzles, two-thirds of a penny per 1,000 gallons during the period from 1st November in every year, beginning with the year 1916, to 30th April in each succeeding year, and one-third of a penny per 1,000 gallons during the period from 1st May to 31st October in every year, beginning with the year 1917.
- (3) For steam boilers, condensers, air compressors, and machinery for manufacturing purposes, Threepence per 1,000 gallons.

TOWN OF WILLIAMSTOWN.

BY-LAW No. 80.

A By-law of the town of Williamstown, made under section 314 of the *Health Act 1915*, and numbered 80, for the removal and proper disposal of night-soil from the tenements within the municipality of the town of Williamstown.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1915*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Williamstown order as follows:—

1. All former By-laws so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law are hereby repealed.

2. That on and after the first day of October 1916 the ordinary service for removal of night-soil by night shall be abolished and that instead thereof a double-pan service by day shall be furnished.

3. That this By-law shall come into full force and operation on the first day of October 1916.

4. This By-law shall apply to every unsewered tenement within the municipality.

5. The occupier of any premises on which there is a closet or privy shall cause the space under the seat of each closet or privy on such premises to be prepared and shall permit the same to be used for the double-pan service hereinafter provided for and shall cause the closet or privy to be kept in a fit state for such service.

6. The Council shall cause every closet or privy to be supplied and kept supplied with two pans for the reception of night-soil and a lid to closely fit the same and shall cause one or other of such pans to be kept continuously in use under the seat of such closet or privy.

7. The occupier aforesaid or other person having control or management of the premises shall cause to be kept in every closet or privy belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in the pan in such closet or privy to be immediately upon the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.

8. The Council shall at least once a week cause the pan in use to be closed with a lid and removed with its contents from the premises in the day time and the other pan to be left in its place.

9. Before leaving any pan in a closet or privy the Council shall cause the same to be cleansed by superheated steam or some equally efficient means and tar painted inside.

10. No person shall remove night-soil from any premises unless authorized to do so by the Council and no occupier or other person shall contract for the removal of night-soil from such premises except in accordance with this By-law.

11. The Council may, in lieu of making a rate, make a charge on the occupier of any premises for the pans supplied and for the removal of night-soil and the other work herein directed to be performed the amount in default of payment to be recovered in any Court of Petty Sessions.

12. If any person or the Council commit a breach of this By-law he or they shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings, or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

The foregoing By-law being By-law No. 80 of the town of Williamstown, was passed by the Council of

the town of Williamstown on the 2nd day of May, 1916, and confirmed by special order on the 13th day of June, 1916.

SHIRE OF SWAN HILL.

BY-LAW No. 32.

A By-law for the providing of proper receptacles for the temporary deposit of household refuse, made under Part 3 of the *Health Act 1915*.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1915*, and of every other power enabling them in that behalf, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Swan Hill (hereinafter called the Council) for the purposes of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction do hereby make the By-law following, that is to say:—

1. That clause 5 of By-law No. 15 be and the same is hereby repealed so far as it relates to the township of Swan Hill only.

2. That the word "house" have the same interpretation as set forth in clause 2 of said By-law No. 15.

3. The occupier of any house or premises within the township of Swan Hill shall, when so required by notice in writing or print, signed by an inspector of such Council, provide and keep in such house or on such premises a receptacle of the kind hereinafter specified, or as many such receptacles as may be necessary for the deposit of all the household refuse from such premises, and shall cause all such refuse to be placed in such receptacle or receptacles with the least possible delay, and kept effectually covered until such refuse is removed from such house or premises. Such receptacle or receptacles shall be placed so as to be conveniently accessible to the person or persons charged with the duty of removing the contents of same.

4. Every such receptacle must be of a size not exceeding 3 cubic feet in capacity, must be watertight, and constructed of galvanized or plain sheet steel, with a proper fitting cover or lid. The said receptacle shall be in every respect similar to patterns which can be inspected at the Shire Hall, Swan Hill.

5. Every person who shall commit a breach of this By-law shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10) and not less than Five shillings (5s.).

6. This By-law shall have operation throughout the township of Swan Hill.

7. This By-law shall come into operation and full force immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

The foregoing By-law No. 32 was made and passed by the Shire Council on the 16th day of May, 1916, and was confirmed on the 20th day of June, 1916; and a copy of the foregoing By-law No. 32 was posted in a conspicuous place on the door of the office of the Council, Shire Hall, Swan Hill, from the 21st day of June, 1916, to the 25th day of July, 1916, in accordance with the requirements of section 36 of the *Health Act 1915*.

- (b) To the best of his power knowledge and ability teach and instruct or cause to be taught and instructed the said apprentice in the process trade or business of* _____ and in all things incident or relating thereto.
- (c) Pay to the said apprentice (during such time as he shall observe and perform the terms of this indenture) wages at the rate following (that is to say):—

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and pursuant to the petition of the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Bulla, has, by Order made on the 31st day of July, 1916, under the provisions of section 148 of the *Local Government Act 1915* (6 Geo. V. No. 2686), directed that the provisions of Division 13 of Part V. of *The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1915*, applicable and severally referred to in the underwritten Schedule, shall apply to the election of Councillors for the said Municipality, with the alterations of such provisions as shown or indicated in the said Schedule, the same being alterations deemed necessary for the purpose of carrying into effect such provisions as so applied.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION,
AND MANAGEMENT OF A RESERVE FOR A
RACE-COURSE AND OTHER PURPOSES OF
PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE TOWN OF WOOD-
END, KNOWN AS THE "WOODEND RACE-
COURSE AND PUBLIC RECREATION RESERVE."

WE, Richard Cornish, William Donovan, Ernest Evans, Nicolaus Jongebloed, John Charles Keating, and Arthur Tass Keating, the majority of the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for a Race-course and other purposes of Public Recreation in the town of Woodend known as the "Woodend Race-course and Public Recreation Reserve," having framed the following Regulations for the care protection and management thereof and for the preservation of good order and decency therein and also for the collection and receipt of tolls entrance-fees or other charges for entering therein and thereupon submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act* 1915.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve which is parcelled into the following divisions shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset and at such other times as may be authorized by the Committee of Management except as hereinafter provided :—

1st Division—The portion set apart for the saddling paddock carriage paddock and grand-stand.

2nd Division—The judge's box, stewards' room, weighing room, secretary's office, jockeys' room, and stewards' stand.

3rd Division—The course proper and the training track.

4th Division—The remainder of the Reserve.

2. No person shall use the Reserve for the purpose of training horses without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.

3. No person except the judge and timekeeper and any person whom the Woodend Race Club may appoint to assist shall enter the judge's box on any day on which the Reserve is set apart for racing.

4. No person shall on the days on which the Reserve is set apart for racing enter the stewards' room or stewards' stand except the stewards and officials of the Woodend Race Club and such persons as they may invite.

5. No person shall on any day on which the Reserve is set apart for racing enter the area within the running rails known as the centre of the course, or the weighing room or weighing yard or jockeys' room except the stewards the secretary and the officials of the Woodend Race Club and those authorized by such stewards and also the jockeys requiring to dress or to be weighed and the owners and trainers of horses desirous of seeing their jockeys weighed.

6. Every member of the Woodend Race Club and every person paying for admission to the Reserve shall be supplied with a ticket which he shall upon demand produce or if required surrender to any gatekeeper servant or other person duly authorized by the Committee of Management to demand the production or surrender of tickets.

7. All members including the members of the Woodend Race Club renting or hiring for any race meeting the Reserve or any portion thereof or any booth or other structure upon the Reserve shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management in reference to the Reserve or the buildings or other erections thereon.

8. The maximum scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to the Reserve on such days not exceeding twenty-six in any one year as the Reserve

may be set apart for racing cricket or football matches sports fêtes or holiday amusements shall be as follows :—

For the admission of every adult to the 1st Division such sum as the Committee of Management may determine not exceeding 12s. 6d.

For the admission of every person over the age of sixteen years to the 4th Division such sum as the Committee of Management may determine not exceeding 2s. 6d.

For the admission of every person not over the age of sixteen years such sum as the Committee of Management may determine not exceeding 1s.

For the admission of every horse to the 3rd Division for training purposes such sum as the Committee of Management may determine not exceeding £1 per half-year.

For the admission of every horse carriage car cab or other vehicle exclusive of rider or passengers such sum as the Committee of Management may determine not exceeding 2s.

9. No person shall carry on any trade business or calling whatsoever on any portion of the Reserve other than upon such portions as may be respectively set apart for the purpose by the Committee of Management.

10. No person shall carry on the trade business or calling of a bookmaker in the Reserve without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained and then only in and on such portions thereof as may be set apart for that purpose.

11. Any person committing in the Reserve or any division or part thereof or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon any of the following offences shall be liable in addition to any other penalty provided by these Regulations to be removed from the Reserve notwithstanding such person may have purchased and is or may be in possession of a ticket of admission thereto :—

(a) Assaulting any other person.

(b) Being drunk.

(c) Riding crossing or trespassing upon the course entering or remaining on the running straight when the horses are in the hands of the starter or are running for any race.

12. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress language or conduct.

13. No person shall damage any of the buildings seats forms trees shrubs or flowers in the Reserve or without permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained light any fire therein.

14. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates in or around the Reserve stick bills thereon or cut names on the fences trees or seats or roll or throw stones in the Reserve.

15. No person shall bring into the Reserve or allow to stray therein any cattle horses sheep pigs goats or poultry without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

16. No person shall hawk or sell or offer for sale any article in the Reserve without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.

17. No person shall camp in the Reserve or erect therein any dwelling or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.

18. No person except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

19. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained and all dogs otherwise found in the Reserve shall be liable to be destroyed.

20. No person shall ride or drive any horse, or other animal upon or over the running track or any other portion of the Reserve without the consent in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.

21. The Committee of Management shall have power to charge any promoters of sports fêtes and holiday amusements a percentage not exceeding 10 per cent. on gross receipts from such gatherings.

22. All fees charged and taken in respect of the Reserve shall after deducting necessary expenses, be applied towards permanent improvements on the Reserve or the erection maintenance or repair of buildings and fences or otherwise improving the Reserve in such manner as the Committee of Management may determine.

23. Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained any of the Military Forces of His Majesty's Government in Victoria shall be allowed to use the Reserve for drilling and reviewing purposes at any time except days specially set apart for racing or for sports fêtes or holiday amusements.
