(h) Elementary physics, elementary geology, elementary forestry

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE PARISH OF MURRAMUR-RANGBONG.

W E, Alfred Ernest Hill, Joseph Coulston, jun., William Bottel, the duly appointed Connor, August William Bartel, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Public Recreation in the parish of Murramurrangbong, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges, for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the Land Act 1915. - 2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
- 3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, flowers, or shrubs in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall put in the reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, or pigs, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the money received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvements of the reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

5. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates in or around the reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats in the reserve. or roll or throw stones therein.

6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dogs unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

For the admission of every vehicle, such a sum as the Committee of Management may determine not exceeding One shilling.

Every person who, knowingly and wilfully offends against any such rules and regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiffs of Crown lands, or by any member of the police force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiffs or member of the police force, and taken before some justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

2. That the said market shall be open for the reception and sale of stock and produce of every description on the third Thursday in each month, until further order, and on special sale days, duly advertised, from 8 o'clock in the forenoon to 7 o'clock p.m. of the same day.

3. All live stock yarded in the said market yards for sale by public auction shall be divided into the following classes, that is to say:—

(1) Sheep.(2) Fat neat cattle.

(2) Fat near cattle.
(3) Dairy cattle, that is to say, cows in milk, cows with calf at foot, springers, and calves.
(4) Store or other cattle not exceeding five in number, the property of one owner.
(5) Store or other cattle exceeding five in number, the property of one owner.
(6) Pios.

Pigs. (7) Horses.

(8) Other commodities not above specified.
4. That all cattle and other commodities shall be sold in the classes above mentioned, and in the above order enumerated.

5. That all live stock shall be sold in the pens or selling yard at the discretion of the auctioneer having the sale of them.

6. No auctioneer shall start selling fat cattle before

7. That on each market day the auctioneers having 1. That on each market day the auctioneers having the sale of cattle shall draw lots for priority of sale in each class in the presence of the Market Inspector or, other officer of the Council, and they shall sell or offer for sale the whole of the cattle in each separate class in the order of such drawing before another is commenced, and any person interfering with or in any way prevent-ing such auctioneer from conducting such sale shall be

guilty of an offence against this By-law.
8. That no two auctioneers shall sell or offer for sale

8. That no two auctioneers shall sell or offer for sale by public auction at the same time any cattle or other commodities in the market yard.

9. That all disputes as to the classification of cattle under the provisions of this By-law shall be referred to the Market Inspector, and his decision shall be final.

10. There shall be appointed by the Council, if the Council shall think fit, an Inspector for the said market, whose duty shall be as follows:—

1st. To see that the market regulations are duly observed.

observed.

2nd. To preserve order and regularity in the market. 3rd. To inspect all articles intended for human food that may be brought to the market, and such articles as may be deemed unfit for use to report the same to the proper authorities,

to report the same to the proper authorities, or take such measures as may be desirable to prevent the sale thereof.

11. All such tolls and dues as may be chargeable under any order of this Council in that behalf shall be payable and collected on the entance of the articles into the market or prior to their being sold and leaving the market in the discretion of the said Inspector.

12. Any person who shall place anything or any matter so as to obstruct the thoroughfare in the market, and shall refuse or neglect to remove same on being required by the said Inspector to do so, or who shall place any cart or carriage or wheelbarrow in any part of the said market contrary to the direction of the Inspector thereof, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this

13. No person shall place or drive any hook, nail, or peg or other instrument into any part of the wood, stone, or brickwork of any shed or stall, or shall in any way fit up or enclose any stall, without the consent of the Council, in writing.

14. Any person resisting or obstructing or interfering with the Inspector in the discharge of his duties shall, independently of any penalty he or she may incur for assault or otherwise, be deemed to have committed a breach of By-law.

15. No person shall offer for private or public sale in

No person shall offer for private or public sale in any part of the market any produce, goods, horses, or cattle, &c., before the hour of opening and after the hour of closing the said market, nor upon any day not fixed by the Council, or a day upon which the market will be open, without the sanction of the Council, in writing.

16. All live stock must be removed out of the market

16. All live stock must be removed out of the market before 8 o'clock p.m. on the day of sale.
 17. Any person who shall wilfully offend against, or commit a breach of, any of the provisions of this By-law shall, for every such offence or breach, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.
