BY-LAW No. 31.—REMOVAL OF HOUSE REFUSE.

A By-law of the Borough of Geelong West; made under the provisions of the *Health Act* 1915; and numbered 31.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Act 1915, the Mayor, Councillors and Burgesses of the Borough of Geelong West order as follows:—

- 1. All former By-laws so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law are hereby repealed.
- 2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health and iminediately after its publication in the Government Gazette.
- 3. Every occupier of prefitises, within the borough of Geelong West shall provide or cause to be provided and kept therein a ratproof, waterproof and flyproof receptable made of some non-absorbent material; the contents of such receptacle shall be not less than, five Imperial gallons nor more than twelve Imperial gallons:
  - 4. Every such occupier shall-
  - (a) cause all refuse or garbage receptacles in use on his premises, and the covers thereof, to be kept as clean as possible;
  - (b) cause such receptacles to be sufficiently disinfected with some efficient disinfectant and decodorant whenever necessary;
  - (c) cause such receptacles to be inaintained in good order and condition;
  - (d) cause all refuse and garbage arising from or upon such premises from time to time to be deposited in such receptacles;
  - (e) cause such receptacles to be continuously covered save when refuse or garbage is being deposited therein or discharged therefrom; and
  - of such receptacles to be placed in the yard of such premises close to the entrance from the street, lane or right-of-way on which such premises abut once a week on such day in each week as may from time to time be appointed by the Council for the removal of refuse or garbage.
- 5. No person shall place or cause to be placed any receptacle in or upon any street, lane or right-of-way.
- No person shall place or cause to be placed or deposited any refuse, garbage or garden refuse; in or upon any street, lane or right-of-way.
- 7. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the borough of Geelong West.
- 8. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and not less than Five shillings for every such breach, and if any breach be a continuing act or default to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds nor less than Five shillings for each and every day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

#### BY-LAW No. 12.

- A By-law of the Shire of Poowong and Jeetho, made under the Health Acts, and numbered 12, for the regulation of and prevention of nuisances in or about slaughteryards.
- N pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Acts, the Council of the Shire of Poowong and Jeetle, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said shire, hereby orders as follows, that is to say:—
- 1. All buildings or yards in which cattle or other stock for slaughtering are kept, and also all pig-sties and pig-yards; shall be cleansed daily, and all manure and other filth removed therefrom, and placed in such receptacles as the Council shall by order from time to time direct, and all such receptacles shall be emptied at least once a week.
- 2. In every slaughteryard the slaughter-pen and the hanging and dressing sheds shall be used exclusively for the purpose proper to each and all. Offal, blood, and other refuse shall, as soon as may be after slaughtering be removed from them, and disposed of as hereafter provided.
- 3. At the end of each slaughtering day, after the carcasses are hung, and before refuse begins to decay, the slaughter-pen and hanging and dressing shed; together with all drain and blood receptacles connected therewith, shall be, where necessary, thoroughly washed down with clean water, and left in a sweet and wholesome condition.
- 4. All the water used in cleaning carcasses shall be either clean roof water or other water properly cleared or well boiled.
- 5. The bone store or yard shall be emptied at such regular and frequent intervals as the Council may from time to time direct.
- .6. The boiling-down apparatus and brickwork shall be thoroughly cleaned, and eniptied, and scrubbed at such regular and convenient intervals as the Council may prescribe.
- 7: No blood or uncooked öffal shall under any circumstances be fed to the pigs. All blood shall as soon as practicable after slaughtering; and at least once daily, be oblicated and buried.
- 8. All materials intended to be passed through digestors shall be kept in a sweet and wholesome condition until so treated.
- 9. All stock intended for slaughtering, and all pigs kept on slaughtering premises, shall be provided with a sufficient supply of good water, free from contamination by drainage of slaughteryards, piggeries; and residences into the catchment area of such supply.
- 10. All yards and buildings on slaughtering premises shall be kept clean, and shall be whitewashed with lime regularly, and at least as frequently as may be prescribed from time to time by the Council.
- 11. Any person found guilty of infringing any of the provisions of this By-law shall be subject to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, and not less than Five shillings for every breach of such By-law, or a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.
- 12. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the nunicipal district.

A By-law of the Shire of Poowong and Jeetho made ander the Health Act 1915 and numbered 13 for regulating the removal and disposal of house and yard rubbish and to compel occupiers and owners of premises within the township of Korumburra to provide proper receptacles for the garbage arising from their

N pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Act 1915 and other Acts of Parliament hereunto authorizing them the Council of the Shire of Poowong and Jeetho in the name and on behalf of the President Councillors and Ratepayers of the said shire hereby orders as follows that is to say:—

- 1. The occupier of every house, building, tenement or premises shall provide and keep thereon a box or some other covered receptacle for the temporary deposit of house refuse, or so many of such boxes or receptacles as may be necessary to contain such refuse during one week and shall cause all dust, ashes, rubbish or other refuse produced, collected or accumulated on any such premises to be placed from time to time in such receptacle.
- Such box or receptacle shall be kept constantly covered, except at such times as the same may or shall be opened for the deposit therein of dust, ashes, rubbish or house refuse as aforesaid.
- 3. Such box or receptacle shall be placed on such days and at such times as shall be specified in any notice to that effect to be given by the Council, in the yard of such tenement or premises, and close to the entrance thereof from the street or right-of-way, or in such other place as the Council may approve of, in order that the contents of such receptacle may be readily and conveniently discharged and removed by the public scavengers or other person or persons authorized or appointed to collect and remove the same by the Council. remove the same by the Council.

4. Every such box or receptacle shall be of non-absorbent material and of such dimensions as that the same and the contents thereof, when full, shall not exceed 56 lbs. in weight and so constructed that the same can be readily and conveniently moved and emptied by one

man.

man.

5. The occupier of any house building or other tenement or premises shall cause the same, and the yard or ground occupied therewith, or adjacent or belonging thereto, to be kept in a cleanly condition, and so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

6. Such occupier shall cause all filth, blood, offal, manure, dung or soil on such premises to be collected in one place in such yard or ground, at a distance of not less than 4 feet from any street, and 6 feet from any dwelling house, and to be kept there in an inoffensive condition, and so that the same shall not be productive of any nuisance.

7. Such occupier shall cause all such filth, blood, offal, manure, dung or soil to be from time to time removed.

7. Such occupier shall cause all such filth, blood, offal, manure, dung or soil to be from time to time removed from such yard, ground or premises as often as it shall amount to in the case of horse manure to a quantity not exceeding 5 cubic yards and in all other cases at least once a week or when the same shall amount to a quantity equal to 1 cubic yard.

8. If at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such filth, blood, offal, manure, dung or soil so removed as aforesaid, the Council of the said shire may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier, and such expense may be recevered from such occupier in addition to the fine for which he shall be liable as hereafter mentioned.

9. No person shall place, deposit or cause or suffer to

which he shall be hable as hereafter mentioned.

9. No person shall place, deposit or cause or suffer to be placed or deposited in or upon any street, road or right-of-way, lane, passage, water channel or open unfenced ground, or in any creek, river or reservoir or in any public place any dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, offal, manure, dung or soil, bones, liquid or any refuse or offensive matter.

10. No foul or offensive smelling water or other fluid and no carbage, house sweepings or other refuse matter.

10. No foul or offensive smelling water or other fluid and no garbage, house sweepings or other refuse matter or thing shall be pumped, emptied, swept, thrown or otherwise discharged into or upon the water channel, footway, roadway or any part whatever of any street, lane or alley whether public or private.

11. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any house or premises shall cause all house or yard refuse as is hereinbefore mentioned to be deodorized and rendered and kept entirely inoffensive.

12. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the township of Korumburra.

13. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for every such breach.

10. The Council shall have power, in lieu of m king a rate, to make a charge on each occupier for the pans supplied, and for the removal of night-soil and the other work herein directed, the amount in default of payment to be recovered in any Court of Petty Sessions.

11. If any person or the Council commit a breach of this By-law, he or they shall, for every such breach, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings, or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

WHEREAS the Governor in Council is empowered by the Stock Foods Act 1915 (Consolidated) to make Regulations as to any matters whatsoever not being contrary to the provisions of this Act necessary to give effect to this Act, and whereas certain Regulations were made under the Chaff and Stock Food Act 1909 on the 30th day of November, 1910, and the 8th day of April, 1913, and under the Stock Foods Act 1915 on the 14th day of August, 1916, and whereas it is desired to consolidate such Regulations. Now therefore the Governor in Council in the State of Victoria doth hereby rescind the aforesaid Regulations, and order as follows, that is to say:—

(1) The substances mestioned and set forth in the second column of the Schedule hereunder are hereby prescribed to be "foreign ingredients" relative to "stock food." The proportion or amount of such "foreign ingredients" which may be contained in any kind of "stock food "shall not exceed the proportion or amount placed in the third column of the said Schedule opposite the name or description of such kind of "stock food" in the first column of such Schedule.

<sup>(3)</sup> On the sale or offering or exposure for sale of any mixed, concentrated, or prepared stock food or by-products the vendor shall set forth in every invoice, agreement, circular, or advertisement relating thereto the relative proportions of the constituents thereof.

<sup>(4)</sup> That all bags containing straw chaff shall be distinctly stencilled (in letters not less than 2½ inches in length) the words "straw chaff."

<sup>(5)</sup> That where possible straw chaff shall be stored on a separate floor from that on which the chaff-cutter is located, but where this cannot be done, the straw chaff shall be stacked at a distance from the chaff-cutter satisfactory to the Inspector

<sup>(6)</sup> That every firm dealing in straw chaff or oat hulls keep a register, open to the Inspectors during business hours in which shall be distinctly shown the quantities brought into store, that cut or produced on the premises, and how disposed of.

<sup>(7)</sup> On the face of every document delivered as an "invoice" under the Act the "vendor" shall cause to be legibly printed or written the word "invoice."

<sup>(8)</sup> The fee for any analysis under the Act shall be Ten shillings and sixpence per statutory sample (or for any sample of equal amount).

<sup>(9)</sup> Every vendor shall keep a copy of these Regulations constantly affixed in legible characters in or on some conspicuous place in every shop, shed, warehouse, or other place whatsoever (whether enclosed or not) where he or any employee or agent of him shall be engaged in cutting, selling, or distributing chaff.

<sup>(10)</sup> The penalty for any contravention of these Regulations shall be a sum not exceeding Ten pounds.

Crimes Act 1915 and Indeterminate Sentences Act 1915.

# REGULATIONS AS TO INDETERMINATE SENTENCES.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the seventeenth day of July, 1916.

# Present:

His Excellency the Governor of Victoria.

Sir A. J. Peacock Mr. McLeod Mr. Hagelthorn.

NDER the powers in that behalf conferred by section 541 of the Crimes Act 1915 (6 Geo. V. No. 2637), and section 11 of the Indeterminate Sentences Act 1915 (6 Geo. V. No. 2758), the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the same, doth make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

Applicable to Persons declared to be Habitual Criminals under Section 514, and to Persons dealt with under Sections 515 and 516 of the Act, and detained in a Reformatory Prison set apart for Declared Habitual Criminals.

- 1. In these Regulations "Board" means the Indeterminate Sentences Board, constituted under the Crimes Act 1915.
  - "Inspector-General" means the Inspector-General of Penal Establishments.
- "Superintendent" means the officer for the time being in charge of a reformatory prison, and includes the matron in charge of a reformatory prison for females.
- "Prisoner" means any person detained in a reformatory prison for habitual
- "Reformatory" means any prison or place set apart as a reformatory prison under the provisions of the Crimes Act 1915.

# The Board.

- 2. The Board, or two members thereof, shall visit each reformatory at least once in each month, and shall see all the prisoners confined therein.
- 3. The Board shall have free access to every part of the reformatory, and may see any prisoner in private, and inspect the diets and examine any book kept in the reformatory. They may also hear reports from officers on the conduct, industry, and progress of any prisoner, and inquire generally into the treatment of the prisoners and the operation and effect of these regulations.
- 4. The Board shall report to the Chief Secretary any matter connected with the management of the reformatory and the treatment of the prisoners which they consider calls for report, or on which he may desire information.

# The Superintendent.

- 5. The Superintendent shall furnish the Board with a full record of each prisoner admitted to the reformatory, accompanied by a report from the Medical Officer. He shall furnish such other returns as the Board may from time to time require.
- 6. The Superintendent shall keep a record of the conduct of each prisoner, and of the amounts earned, and of the amounts (if any) deducted for payment for food or clothing, or the purchase of extras, and the amounts (if any) remitted towards the maintenance of any persons dependent upon the prisoner for support, or deducted by way of punishment, and any prisoner shall be entitled to a monthly statement of the balance to his credit in his account.

#### Medical Officer.

7. The Medical Officer shall medically examine every prisoner as soon after admission as practicable, and shall furnish a report of the mental and physical condition of such prisoner to the Superintendent.

# TREATMENT OF PRISONERS.

# Classification.

- 8. Prisoners shall be classified into three grades—the first, or higher grade; the second grade; and the third, or lower grade. The higher grade shall consist of two divisions—lower and special. Each prisoner, on first admission, shall be placed in the second grade.
- 9. Promotion to the higher grade may be earned by good conduct, including prompt and cheerful obedience to all rules and regulations, loyalty to the government of the reformatory, faithful and diligent performance of work, and efforts to acquire skill and rapidity thereat, also attention to and interest in any lectures or classes, and generally the manifestation of a right spirit, and promise of reform.
  - 10. Promotions in grade will be made by the Board.
- 11. The Board, in determining a prisoner's eligibility for the special division, will, in addition to consideration of his conduct reports, have regard to the prisoner's habits and disposition, his powers of self-control, and potentiality of reform, and the probability of his remaining at liberty without violating the law, in the event of his release on probation.
- 12. Except in such cases as may, in the opinion of the Board, be considered deserving of special remission, good conduct must be shown for at least twelve months to earn promotion to a higher grade, and for a like period at least to earn promotion from the lower to the special division of the first grade.
- 13. Reduction to a lower grade may follow upon idleness, misconduct, or behaviour which, in the opinion of the Board, is likely to be injurious to the discipline of the prison or to other prisoners, and shall be for such period as to the Board may seem fit.
- 14. When not at work the prisoners of the respective grades shall, except with the special approval of the Board, remain in the portion of the reformatory set apart for their special use.
- 15. Any prisoner reduced to the third grade for punishment for misconduct shall, before becoming eligible for the first grade, be required to serve in the second grade such period as to the Board may seem fit.

#### PRIVILEGES OF GRADES.

#### Second Grade.

- 16. Prisoners of the second grade will take their meals in their cells. They will receive rations in accordance with the dietary scales under the gaol regulations, with the addition of  $\frac{1}{4}$  oz. of ration tea, 1 oz. of ration sugar, and, in the case of males, a ration of tobacco per diem during sustained good conduct.
- 17. Subject to the conditions contained in the rules and regulations under the Gaols Act, they will be allowed to receive and write one letter monthly, and to have a visit from relatives and friends at intervals of not less than two months.
- 18. They will be privileged, while conduct remains satisfactory, to be present at lectures or addresses that may be given in the prison, to change their library books thrice weekly, and, under proper supervision, to associate for recreation outside working hours in the part of the prison set apart for their particular use, at such times as may be sanctioned by the Inspector-General.

# First Grade.—Lower Division.

- 19. Prisoners of the first grade may be permitted to dine in association. They will receive the same dietary as the second grade, and, in addition, will be permitted to spend such portion of their earnings as may be sanctioned by the Board in the purchase of extras such as are included in the indulgence list—Regulation 33.
- 20. Subject to the conditions contained in the rules and regulations under the Gaols Act, they will be allowed to receive and write one letter fortnightly, and to have a visit from relatives and friends at intervals of not less than one month.
- 21. They shall attend lectures and other meetings that may be held in the prison, and will be given facilities for changing their library books as often as may be required. They will be granted extended privileges in regard to association and recreation in the discretion of the Inspector-General.

Special Division.

22. Prisoners in the special division will, as far as practicable, be kept apart from other prisoners. They will enjoy all the privileges of the first grade, and will be given access to such weekly journals and newspapers as may be sanctioned by the Board. The Inspector-General may accord them permission to receive and write a letter at any time, and may allow them to receive visits at frequent intervals from relatives and friends likely to take a benevolent interest in them on liberation, and to be of use to them in finding employment, or otherwise.

### Third Grade.

- 23. Prisoners of the third grade will receive the ordinary rations.
- 24. Subject to the conditions contained in the rules and regulations under the Gaols Act, they will be permitted to receive one letter monthly, and to write one letter every two months. A visit will be allowed them at intervals of not less than three months. Books from the library will be issued to them twice weekly. Under proper supervision they may associate outside working hours at such times as may be sanctioned by the Inspector-General, but prisoners reduced to the third grade for misconduct will have their privileges in respect to recreation and association suspended until the higher grade is re-entered.

Discipline.

25. The rules and regulations made under the provisions of the Gaols Act, and all general orders in regard to prisons shall, as far as practicable, and when not inconsistent with these regulations, or with any special regulations which may hereafter be brought into operation, apply to every reformatory.

26. The Superintendent may curtail the privileges of a prisoner in regard to indulgences, recreation, attendance at lectures, visits, and letters, for inattention or want of interest in work, disobedience and conduct not amounting to a definite breach of discipline, provided that full particulars of the circumstances in each case shall be reported to the Inspector-General and the Board.

27. The Superintendent may exercise all or any of the powers conferred on the governor of a gaol, under the provisions of the Gaols Act, for the purpose of dealing with breaches of discipline.

28. Any prisoner guilty of any serious breach of discipline, or of any conduct which makes it inadvisable that he should associate with other prisoners, may be kept in separate confinement until further dealt with.

29. The visiting justice shall have power, in addition to, or in substitution for, any punishment he is empowered to inflict under the Gaols Act, to punish any prisoner for any breach of discipline by imposing a fine, not exceeding 20s., to be deducted from any sum at any time standing to the credit of such prisoner in the account kept in the reformatory.

Employment.

- 30. Every prisoner shall work at some trade or vocation or be employed in some labour—
  - (a) A prisoner of the first grade employed at a trade at which he is proficient, whose conduct is satisfactory, and the products of whose work are sold or disposed of, shall be credited with one-half of the net proceeds remaining after deducting the cost of his maintenance in the prison. Prisoners of the second grade shall be credited in like manner with not more than one-fourth, and prisoners of the third grade with not more than one-eighth of the net proceeds remaining after deducting the cost of their maintenance in the prison.
  - (b) A prisoner of the first grade employed as a skilled artisan or tradesman, whose conduct is good, and the products of whose work are not sold, shall be credited with an amount not exceeding 1s. 6d. per diem, according to the nature and quality and quantity of the work. A prisoner of the first grade employed in the service of the prison, or at gardening or other unskilled labour, or in any trade at which he is not a skilled worker, whose conduct is good, and whose work is satisfactory in quality and quantity, shall be credited with an amount not exceeding 1s. per diem. Prisoners of the second grade shall be credited in like manner with not more than one-half, and prisoners of the third grade with not more than one-fourth of the above rates.

- (c) Provided that, after a prisoner has been in the lower division of the first grade for a period of two years, the amount with which he is to be credited, as herein provided, shall be reduced by one-half, and, after remaining in the lower division of the first grade for four years, shall be reduced by three-fourths.
- 31. For the purposes of these rules and regulations the cost of maintenance of each prisoner in the reformatory shall be fixed at 3s. per diem.
- 32. The Secretary of the Board shall receive, on behalf of the Board, all sums standing to the credit of each prisoner on his release, and shall keep an account thereof, and of the disbursements made by the Board, in accordance with the provisions of the Crimes Act 1915 or any Act amending the same.

# Release on Probation.

- 34. A prisoner shall not be released on probation unless-
  - (1) There is reasonable ground to believe, in the judgment of the Board, that his release will not be detrimental to the welfare of society. The judgment of the Board will be based on the following considerations:—
    - (a) The prisoner's record and character, as established in the reformatory.
    - (b) The nature and character of the crime or crimes committed.
    - (c) His previous record and environment, and his probable surroundings, if released.
    - (d) His powers of self-control, and the probability of his leading a useful and industrious life, and abstaining from crime.
    - (e) All other facts which the Board may be able to obtain bearing on the advisability of release on probation.
  - (2) He shall have been promoted to the special division of the first grade, and shall have shown good conduct for at least six months in that

(3) Shall have assurance of immediate employment; or

(4) Shall have standing to his credit money sufficient to maintain him for six weeks after leaving the reformatory; and

(5) Shall have reasonable prospects, in the opinion of the Board, of earning an honest livelihood.

Provided that the Board may recommend the suspension of any of these conditions except condition (1), in regard to any prisoner who is considered deserving of exceptional treatment.

- 35. Any person who violates the conditions of his probation, and is returned to the reformatory prison, and any person who, having once been released on probation, and is again convicted and dealt with under the Crimes Acts shall, on admission to the reformatory prison, be placed in the third grade. Except under special circumstances, he shall not be eligible for promotion to the second grade until he has served eighteen months in this grade, with a good conduct record, nor be eligible for promotion to the first grade until he has served two years, with a good conduct record, in the second grade, before being eligible for promotion to the first grade.
- 36. Every person released on probation shall be given a certificate with a full statement thereon of the conditions of release, which he is required to observe during the period of his probation.

#### Clothing.

37. The clothing of each grade shall be of such material and pattern as may from time to time be directed by the Inspector-General, with the approval of the Chief Secretary.

#### Miscellaneous.

- 38. The hours of rising, the time for meals, the hours of work and of instruction, the times allowed for reading and exercise, the hours for lights out and bed, the hours to be spent at drill and at school and the arrangements therefor, together with such other internal arrangements as may be necessary, shall be in the discretion of the Inspector-General.

- 1. In these Regulations "Board" means the Indeterminate Sentences Board constituted under the Crimes Act 1915.
  - Inspector-General" means the Inspector-General of Penal Establishments.
- "Superintendent" means the officer for the time being in charge of a reformatory prison, and includes the matron in charge of a reformatory prison for females.

"Inmate" means any person detained in a reformatory prison.

"Reformatory" means any prison or place set apart as a reformatory prison under the provisions of the *Crimes Act* 1915.

# The Board.

2. The Board shall meet from time to time as may be necessary; minutes of each meeting shall be kept by the Secretary, and signed by the Chairman.

3. The Board or two members thereof shall visit each reformatory at least once

in each month, and shall see all the inmates confined therein.

4. The Board shall have free access to every part of the reformatory, and may see any inmate in private, and inspect the diets and examine any book kept in the prison; they shall generally satisfy themselves that the prison is properly conducted, the regulations duly enforced, and that proper attention is given to the health of the inmates and to the sanitary requirements of the prison.

5. The Board shall inquire into and adjudicate on all offences on the part of inmates that may be reported to them, and shall impose such punishments as may be

hereinafter provided, and for that purpose may examine witnesses on oath.

6. The Board shall once at least in each quarter report to the Chief Secretary on the state of each reformatory to which these Regulations apply, and bring under his notice any matters connected therewith which they consider require attention. Such report shall contain a return of all punishments inflicted by their order during the preceding quarter.

# Superintendent.

7. The Superintendent shall furnish the Board with a full record of each inmate admitted to the reformatory, accompanied by a report from the Medical Officer; and shall furnish such other returns as the Board may from time to time require.

8. The Superintendent shall keep a record of the conduct of each inmate, and of the amounts earned, and of the amounts (if any) deducted for payment for food or clothing or the purchase of extras; and the amounts (if any) remitted towards the maintenance of any persons dependent upon the inmate for support, or deducted by way of punishment, and any inmate shall be entitled to a monthly statement of the balance to his credit in his account.

# Medical Officer.

9. The Medical Officer shall medically examine every inmate as soon after admission as practicable, and shall furnish a report of the mental and physical condition of such inmate to the Superintendent.

# TREATMENT OF INMATES.

# Classification.

10. Inmates shall be classified into three grades—the first, or higher grade;

the second, or intermediate grade; and the third, or lower grade.

11. Each inmate on first admission shall be placed in the second grade. Promotions in grade shall be made by the Board, and promotion to the higher grade may be earned by good conduct, including prompt and cheerful obedience to all rules and regulations, loyalty to the government of the prison, faithful and diligent performance of work, and efforts made to acquire skill and rapidity thereat; also attention to and interest shown in any lectures or classes, and reasonable progress in subjects of instruction.

12. Except in such cases as may, in the opinion of the Board, be considered deserving of special remission, good conduct must be shown for at least six months

before an inmate is eligible for promotion to the higher grade.

13. Reduction to a lower grade may follow upon idleness, misconduct, or behaviour which, in the opinion of the Board, is injurious to the discipline of the reformatory or to other inmates, and shall be for such period as to the Board may seem fit.

# PRIVILEGES OF GRADES.

#### Second Grade.

14. Inmates of this grade will take their meals in their cells. They will receive rations except tobacco in accordance with the dietary scales under the gaol regulations, with the addition of a \(\frac{1}{4}\) oz. of ration tea, and 1 oz. of ration sugar, and, on maintaining a good conduct record for three consecutive months, they may be allowed to spend such portion of their earnings as may be determined by the Board on the purchase of such extras as are marked with an asterisk in the indulgence list-Regulation 32.

15. Subject to the conditions contained in the rules and regulations under the Gaols Act inmates will be allowed to receive and write one letter, and to have a visit

from relatives and friends at monthly intervals.

16. While conduct remains satisfactory inmates will be privileged to be present at lectures or addresses that may be given in the prison, to change their library books thrice weekly, and, under proper supervision, to associate for recreation outside working hours at such times as may be sanctioned by the Inspector-General.

# First Grade.

17. Inmates of the first grade will be allowed to dine in association where facilities exist for this purpose. They will receive the same dietary as the second grade, and may be permitted to spend such larger portion of their earnings as the Board may

determine on the purchase of extras included in the indulgence list.

18. Subject to the conditions contained in the rules and regulations under the Gaols Act, they will be allowed to receive and write a letter, and to have a visit at fortnightly intervals, and, on maintaining a good-conduct record for three consecutive months, they may receive and write letters, and have visits from reputable persons, at such other times as may be authorized by the Board.

19. They will be permitted to change their library books as often as may be required, and will be given access to such weekly journals and newspapers as may be sanctioned by the Board. They will attend lectures and other meetings that may be held in the prison, and may be granted extended privileges in regard to association and

recreation in the discretion of the Inspector-General.

# Third Grade.

20. Inmates of the third grade will receive the ordinary rations, but they will

not be given any extras, or be permitted to purchase any indulgences.

21. Subject to the conditions contained in the rules and regulations under the Gaols Act, they will be permitted to receive one letter monthly, and to write one letter every two months. A visit will be allowed them at intervals of not less than two months. Books from the library will be issued to them twice weekly, and, under proper supervision, they may associate outside working hours at such times as may be sanctioned by the Inspector-General, but inmates reduced to the third grade for misconduct will have their privileges in respect to recreation and association suspended until the higher grade is re-entered.

# Discipline.

22. The rules and regulations under the Gaols Act, and all general orders in regard to prisons, shall, as far as practicable, and when not inconsistent with these Regulations, or with any special regulations which may hereafter be brought into operation, apply to every reformatory.

23. The Superintendent may curtail the privileges of an inmate in regard to indulgences, recreation, attendance at lectures, visits, and letters, for inattention or want of interest in work, disobedience, and conduct not amounting to a definite breach of discipline, provided that full particulars of the circumstances in each case shall be

reported to the Inspector-General and the Board.

24. The Superintendent may hear and determine all charges against any inmate for any minor breach of discipline, such as under the rules and regulations under the Gaols Act are directed to be submitted to the governor of a gaol, and may punish such inmate by solitary confinement for any term not exceeding 48 hours, or by close confinement on half rations for any term not exceeding four days, or by separate confinement for any term not exceeding seven days, or by stoppage of privileges in regard to indulgences, recreation, attendance at lectures, visits, and letters for any period not exceeding fourteen days. Provided always that a record of all such punishments shall be kept in a book, and a copy forwarded every month to the Inspector-General and the Board.

25. Any inmate charged with any serious breach of discipline, or with any conduct which makes it inadvisable that he should associate with other inmates, may be kept

in separate confinement until further dealt with by the Board.

26. The Board may hear and determine any charge of idleness, insolence, disobedience of orders, refusal to work, use of indecent, abusive, or improper language, or infringement of any rule or regulation made, or any other charge of misconduct brought against any inmate. The Board may in their discretion punish such inmate by solitary confinement, either continuously or at such intervals as they may see fit, for any period not exceeding fourteen days, or by close confinement on half rations for any period not exceeding 21 days, or by separate confinement for any period not exceeding four weeks, or by reduction to any lower grade for such period, and with such terms of solitary, close, or separate confinement, limited as above, and with deprivation or curtailment of such indulgences and privileges, as the Board may see fit; provided always that the Board may, in addition to or in substitution for any such punishment, impose a fine to be deducted from any sum at any time standing to the credit of such inmate in the account kept in the reformatory.

27. The Board may inquire in a summary way into any charge brought against any inmate of escaping or attempting to escape, insubordination, assault upon or attempt to do any bodily injury to an officer or prisoner, or any wilful and malicious destruction or injury of the prison or of any furniture thereof, or any utensils or implements used therein. And the Board may, in their discretion, punish such inmate by solitary confinement, either continuously or at such intervals as they may see fit, for any period not exceeding three weeks, or by close confinement on half rations for any period not exceeding six weeks, or by separate confinement for any period not exceeding eight weeks, or by reduction to any lower grade for such period, and with such terms of solitary, close, or separate confinement, limited as above, and with deprivation or curtailment of such indulgences and privileges as the Board may see fit; provided always that, in addition to or substitution for any such punishment, the Board may impose a fine, to be deducted from any sum at any time standing to the

credit of such inmate in the account kept in the reformatory prison. 28. Any inmate reduced to the third grade for punishment for misconduct shall, before becoming eligible for the first grade, be required to serve in the second

grade such period as to the Board may seem fit.

# Employment.

29. Every inmate shall work at some trade or vocation, or be employed in some labour-

(a) An inmate of the first grade employed at a trade at which he is proficient, whose conduct is satisfactory, and the products of whose work are sold or disposed of, shall be credited with one-half of the net proceeds remaining after deducting the cost of his maintenance in the prison. Inmates of the second grade shall be credited in like manner with not more than one-fourth, and inmates of the third grade with not more than one eighth of the net proceeds remaining after deducting the cost of their maintenance

in the prison.

(b) An inmate of the first grade employed as a skilled artisan or tradesman, whose conduct is good, and the products of whose work are not sold, shall be credited with an amount not exceeding Is. 6d. per diem, according to the nature and quality and quantity of the work. An inmate of the first grade employed in the service of the prison, or at gardening or other unskilled labour, or in any trade at which he is not a skilled worker, whose conduct is good, and whose work is satisfactory in quality and quantity, shall be credited with an amount not exceeding 1s. per diem. Inmates of the second grade shall be credited in like manner with not more than one-half, and inmates of the third grade with not more than one-fourth of the above rates.

(c) Provided that after an inmate has been in the first grade for a period of twelve months the amount with which he is to be credited, as herein provided, shall be reduced by one-fourth, and, after remaining in the first division for eighteen months, such amount shall be reduced

by one-half.

30. For the purposes of these rules and regulations, the cost of maintenance of each inmate in the reformatory shall be fixed at 3s. per diem.

31. The Secretary of the Board shall receive, on behalf of the Board, all sums standing to the credit of each inmate on his release, and shall keep an account thereof and of the disbursements made by the Board, in accordance with the provisions of the Crimes Act 1915, or any other Act amending the same.

Except under special circumstances he shall not be eligible for promotion to the second grade until he has maintained a good-conduct record for at least six months in this grade.

35. Every person released on probation shall be given a certificate, with a full statement thereon of the conditions of release, which he is required to observe during

the period of his probation.

# SHIRE OF SWAN HILL, BY-LAW NO. 33.

A By-law of the Shire of Swan Hill made under the provisions of the Land Act 1915, and of section 197 of the Local Government Act 1915, and numbered 33, for regulating or prohibiting fallowing on land near a public highway whereby drift sand is likely to accumulate on the highway.

WHEREAS the Municipal District of the Shire of Swan Hill is in whole or in part within the Mallee country as defined in the Land Act 1915: Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers contained in the Land Act 1915 and of the powers contained in section 197 of the Local Government Act 1915 and of every other power enabling them in that behalf, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Swan Hill order as follows:— Hill order as follows :-

1. That no person shall fallow, cause or permit to be fallowed any land within a distance of three chains from a public highway, and from whence by such fallowing drift sand is likely to accumulate on such highway and of which land such person is the owner, occupier, or

lessee.

2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of Swan Hill.

3. Any person offending against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not less than Five pounds nor more than Twenty pounds.
