RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE WALPEUP PUBLIC CEMETERY.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act 1915*, the Trustees of the Walpeup Public Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations (that is to say):—

1. These Rules and Regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*, and from and after such publication all rules and regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.

2. All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders are given.

3. Any person desiring ground for a private grave shall apply to the Trustees therefor, who, if the application is approved and the prescribed fees are paid, will issue a burial right (Schedule B), which shall give the holder and his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right on obtaining the permission of the Trustees, as hereafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.

4. Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or other erection shall apply to the Trustees for permission to do so, and submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the Trustees.

5. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a Coroner, Justice of the Peace, or Registrar of Deaths has been delivered to the Secretary (gatekeeper or sexton).

6. Application for an order for interment shall be made at least eight working hours before the time fixed for the burial.

7. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below the ordinary level of the ground, and a layer of earth at least six inches thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

8. The hours for burials shall be—On week days, September to April inclusive, 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.; May to August inclusive, 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. No interment shall be allowed on Sunday except when it is certified in writing by the Officer of Health of the district, or by a Police Magistrate, or Justice of the Peace that for sanitary reasons it is necessary that the burial take place on that day; and on payment of the special fee as provided.

9. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the Coroner, Justice of the Peace, or Registrar of Deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

10. The Trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but any person having paid the fee for a private grave and requiring a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same subject to the approval

of the Trustees, but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented.

11. No private grave shall be re-opened or any interment permitted therein without the consent in writing of the person entitled to give the same.

12. No person employed by the Trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall he be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment or for which he has special authority from the Trustees.

13. The cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from 7 a.m. to sunset daily throughout the year.

14. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower, or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery, unless with the previous authority of the Trustees.

15. No smoking shall be allowed nor any firearms discharged within the cemetery.

16. No dogs shall be allowed in the cemetery.

- (b) Repeal any of the provisions of any previous Order in Council relating to such Waterworks Trust:

And whereas by a certain Order in Council bearing date the 23rd day of May, 1892, a Waterworks Trust, known as the Carisbrook Waterworks Trust, was duly constituted, to carry out certain waterworks for supplying a certain waterworks district, the extent and boundaries whereof were in and by the said Order in Council duly defined and limited: And whereas by clause 2 of the said Order in Council, bearing date as aforesaid, it was ordered that the Municipal Council of the Borough of Carisbrook for the time being and one other Commissioner should be the Waterworks Trust for the said Waterworks District: And whereas it is deemed necessary to repeal the aforesaid clause: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the now in part rectified Act, doth order:—

That the said clause 2 of the said Order in Council, bearing date as aforesaid, shall be and the same is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof it is hereby ordered and provided that the Municipal Councillors of the Borough Riding of the Shire of Tullaroop for the time being and three other persons shall, as from the date hereof, be the Commissioners of the said Carisbrook Waterworks Trust.

REGULATIONS AS TO INDETERMINATE SENTENCES.

WHEREAS by section 541 of the *Crimes Act 1915* (6 Geo. V. No. 2637), it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time, by Order published in the *Government Gazette*, make, alter, and repeal Regulations for the purposes set forth therein : Now therefore the Governor in Council doth by this Order make the following Regulations :—

REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE DISCIPLINE AND MANAGEMENT OF THE TREE-PLANTING CAMP FOR " REFORMATORY " PRISONERS AT FRENCH ISLAND.

1. In these Regulations " Board " means the Indeterminate Sentences Board constituted under the *Crimes Act 1915*.

2. " Inspector-General " means the Inspector-General of Penal Establishments.

3. " Tree-planting Camp " or " Camp " means the area and buildings thereon at French Island set apart as and proclaimed a Reformatory Prison under the provisions of the *Crimes Act 1915*.

4. The ordinary Rules and Regulations made under the provisions of the *Gaols Act 1915* and the Regulations made under the provisions as to indeterminate sentences of the *Crimes Act 1915* and of the *Indeterminate Sentences Act 1915*, and all general orders shall, as far as practicable and where not inconsistent with the following special Regulations, apply to the Officers and prisoners engaged at the Tree-planting Camp.

5. *Officer-in-Charge*.—The Officer-in-Charge of the Camp shall, in addition to his other duties, be responsible for the good order, discipline, and proper working of the Camp and for the safe custody of the prisoners.

(2) He shall have and exercise the same powers and responsibilities as the Governor of a gaol ;

(3) Shall keep or cause to be kept such books and records as may be directed or required by the Board or the Inspector-General ;

(4) Shall make such arrangements, subject to the approval of the Inspector-General, for carrying out the work of the Camp and for the maintenance and security of the prisoners, the enforcement of discipline and the general management as may appear to him necessary or desirable ;

(5) Shall make an inspection of the Camp daily, and shall pay such visits to the tents, cubicles, and working places as may appear to him necessary or desirable. He or any officer acting under his instructions, shall be empowered to enter any tent, cubicle, or place within the boundaries of the camp for the purpose of search, inquiry, or for other good reason.

6. *Warders*.—The routine shall be as arranged by the Officer-in-Charge and approved by the Inspector-General.

7. Warders shall be expected to interest themselves in promoting the smooth working of the Camp, to encourage the prisoners to be industrious and painstaking, and to see that the instructions of the Officer representing the Forests Department, in regard to the work of tree-planting, are strictly carried out.

8. *Rations of Officers.*—The Officer-in-Charge and each Warder will be entitled to draw the following allowances while employed at the Camp :—

Milk, 1 pint, will be allowed when available.

When fresh milk is not available preserved milk will be allowed.

9. *Prisoners.*—A prisoner shall not go outside the boundaries of the Camp without the special permission and authority of the Officer-in-Charge.

10. A prisoner shall occupy such tent or cubicle as may be assigned to him, and must keep the same in the highest state of cleanliness. He must not enter the tent or cubicle of another prisoner without the authority of the Officer-in-Charge.

11. A prisoner must scrupulously observe all orders given him for the cleanliness and tidiness of his person, his tent, or cubicle, and utensils and the Camp generally.

12. A prisoner shall perform all duties required of him in connexion with the work of tree-planting, such as clearing timber, burning-off, digging, planting, &c., and when engaged at such work shall strictly attend to and carry out the instructions of the Officer representing the Forests Department. He shall perform such other duties as vegetable-growing, gardening, fencing, tilling, cleaning, cooking, fatigue, &c., as may be required of him by the Officer-in-Charge.

13. *Earnings.*—Prisoners employed at the Tree-planting Camp shall be credited for every day at work with pay at the following rates :—

If in the Special Grade, 2s.

If in the First Grade, 1s. 9d.

If in the Second Grade, 1s. 6d.

Provided always that conduct is good and work is satisfactory in quality and quantity. Provided also that with the approval of the Board a prisoner employed at his trade or in work requiring special skill may be credited with an amount not exceeding 6d. a day in addition to these amounts. When practicable earnings shall be credited at piece-work rates to be fixed by the Board.

14. A prisoner whose conduct is considered to be injurious to the discipline and smooth working of the Camp may be reduced in grade by the Board, and may be returned to the Reformatory prison at Pentridge. In such a case the cost of his removal including all charges incurred shall be deducted from the amount standing to his credit on account of his earnings.

15. For a minor breach of the Regulations the Officer-in-Charge may stop the indulgences of a prisoner and require him to have his meals in his tent or cubicle.

16. The Board, on the recommendation of the Conservator of Forests, may order the removal from forest work on the island of any prisoner who, after a fair trial, is found to be idle or inefficient or generally unfit for the performance of such work.

17. For disorderly and riotous conduct, assaults, escapes, attempted escapes, and other serious misconduct a prisoner may be dealt with by the Visiting Justice and returned to Pentridge, and on completing the punishment imposed upon him shall be detained in the Reformatory prison at Pentridge. The cost of his removal, including all charges incurred, shall be deducted from the amount standing to his credit on account of his earnings.

18. A prisoner who for misconduct has been returned from the Tree-planting Camp to Pentridge will not again be eligible for re-employment at the Camp.

REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS by the 6th section of the Act of the Parliament of Victoria numbered 2610, intituled *An Act to Consolidate the Laws relating to the Aboriginal Natives of Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to make Regulations and orders for any of the purposes therein specified and at any time to rescind or alter such Regulations—

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth make the following Regulations and orders, in which the word "Board" has the meaning attached to it by the Act, and the words "Prescribed Station" in such Regulations mean "any place now or hereafter to be prescribed by the Governor in Council as the place where any aboriginal or tribe of aboriginals shall reside."

Places of Residence.

1. Provision is made by the Board for the residence of aboriginals at the following places :—

Coranderrk,
Lake Tyers,
Lake Condah.

Contracts and Certificates.

2. No contract with any aboriginal for any service or employment for a longer period than three months shall be of any validity as against such aboriginal, or as an exemption from the penalty imposed by section 12 of the Act, unless such contract is approved by the Board, or the aboriginal at the making and during the continuance thereof holds a subsisting certificate, issued as hereinafter provided; but this Regulation shall in no way affect the validity of any such contract as against the person entering into it with the aboriginal.

3. Any person desiring the approval of the Board to any such contract shall apply therefor by transmitting to the local guardian or other authorized agent of the Board in or nearest to the district in which the applicant resides, an application signed by him in the subjoined form (hereinafter referred to as the contract) :—

Contract submitted for the approval of the Board for the Protection of the Aborigines.

Particulars of Contract.

Name, residence, and occupation of employer.

Name of aboriginal.

Nature of work or service to be performed.

Date from which service under the contract is to commence or has commenced.

Money payment as wages or otherwise, and the time or times when payable under the contract.

Rations (if any) to be given in addition to money payment (if any), and quantity and quality of rations agreed to be supplied.

Name and address to which the applicant desires communications in reference to this application to be posted.

Date of application.

Signature of Applicant.

4. The local guardian or other authorized agent of the Board, after making such inquiries as the Board may think necessary, shall forward the contract, with his opinion thereon, to the Board.

5. The Board, if satisfied of the propriety of approval, will cause their approval signed by the Secretary, to be indorsed on the contract, and will return the same to the local guardian or committee, and post a copy thereof, with such approval indorsed to the address mentioned in the contract.

6. The Board may modify any such contract at the time of approving the same by directing all or any part of the money payment payable to the aboriginal to be made to some local guardian or other person specified in that behalf instead of to the aboriginal himself, and shall in such case indorse such direction in manner hereinbefore provided with respect to their approval; and after the time at which the approved contract so modified would in course of post have reached the address given in the contract, the contractor shall not be entitled to credit under the contract for any payment so directed, to be made unless made as directed.

7. Any money received in pursuance of any such direction shall be applied at the discretion of the receiver for the benefit of the aboriginal or of any member of his family, subject to any express direction given by the Board, and shall in every case be accounted for to the Board as hereinafter directed, or upon application by the Secretary at any time.

8. The Board may, at their discretion, grant to any aboriginal able and willing to earn a living by his own exertions a certificate in the subjoined form, signed by the Secretary, which certificate shall not remain in force for more than six months from its date or the date of its last renewal; and any such unexpired certificate may be renewed for six months by the indorsement of the date of renewal and signature of any member of the Board, local guardian, or member of a local committee, who, in the exercise of his discretion, shall think fit to renew the same.

Certificate under the Aborigines Act 1915.

This certificate was issued on the day of , 19 , to an aboriginal named , aged about , height about , and known or distinguishable by the following peculiarities [state if any], he having represented himself as able and willing to earn a living by his own exertions.

The effect of this certificate, while in force, is as follows:—

It authorizes him to enter into a binding contract of service for any time during which this certificate remains in force.

It permits a European to harbor him without incurring any penalty.

It does not authorize any person to sell or give him any intoxicating drink or affect the penalty for so doing, or confer any other exemption from penalties under the said Act.

From the wages earned the sum of shillings and pence per week shall be remitted to for the maintenance of his wife and children.

This certificate will not remain in force after the day of 19 , unless renewed in the meantime by the date of renewal, and signature of some member of the Board for the Protection of Aborigines, local guardian, or member of local committee being written thereon; and it will not remain in force after six months from the date of the last renewal.

Earnings and Moneys Received.

9. When a number of aboriginals are located on a reserve, and cultivate fields and gardens, or raise and keep live stock, or otherwise by their labours produce marketable goods, the Board may from time to time order the sale of any produce or live stock or goods, and out of the net proceeds of sale pay to the aboriginals who have laboured on the reserve such sums as the Board may deem right, having regard to the kind and amount of labour performed by each.

10. Every able-bodied aboriginal, half-caste, and other person resident on one of the Board's stations shall do a reasonable amount of work, as directed by the Manager; and whilst so engaged shall be remunerated at a rate to be arranged by the Manager and approved by the Board. Anyone persistently refusing to work when required to do so by the Manager shall be reported to the Board and may have all supplies for himself and his family withdrawn until he resumes work, and be liable to be removed from the station.

11. Every local committee, local guardian, or other person intrusted by the Board with the distribution of any stores or materials, or the application of any moneys received from the Board, or from the employer of any aboriginal, shall furnish the Board with a monthly statement in detail of all stores and materials received and distributed, and of all moneys received and disbursed, and showing the balances on hand of stores or materials, and of moneys unexpended up to and inclusive of the last day of each calendar month.

Custody of Children.

12. The Governor in Council may for the better care, custody, and education of any aboriginal or half-caste child order that such child be transferred to the care of the Department for Neglected Children or the Department for Reformatory Schools.

13. Every aboriginal under the age of fourteen years resident anywhere in Victoria shall, when so required by the Board or the person in charge of the nearest station, attend any school at or near such station at such times as is directed.

14. Every aboriginal male under fourteen years of age, and all unmarried aboriginal females under the age of eighteen years, shall, when so required by the person in charge of any station, reside, and take their meals, and sleep, in any building set apart for such purposes.

Conduct of Business.

15. The Board shall meet for the despatch of business at such times and places as they appoint, and shall deal with all matters brought before them relating to aboriginals. Three members of the Board shall form a quorum.

16. Every question shall be decided by a majority of votes of the members voting on that question. In the event of an equality of votes, the Chairman for the time being shall have a second or casting vote.

17. A Vice-Chairman shall be elected by the Board as early as practicable after the first day of July in each year. Due notice of the meeting for such election shall be given to each member of the Board.

18. The Vice-Chairman, or any three members, may, in writing, direct the Secretary to convene a special meeting of the Board on any day and hour to deal with special business. Notice of such business shall be given to each member of the Board.

19. Any member of the Board may resign his office, by letter addressed to the Chief Secretary.

20. It shall be the duty of the Secretary to prepare the business paper for each meeting of the Board; to take and record the minutes of proceedings of same; to conduct all correspondence, and to keep all such books of account, vouchers, reports, documents, plans, and charts as the Board shall direct or require; to give such instructions to officers and persons appointed under the Aborigines Act as the Board directs, or as the Regulations prescribe; and, generally, to fulfil zealously, and to the best of his ability, all duties, and obey all directions imposed on or given to him by the Board.

Duties of Board.

21. It shall be the duty of the Board—

- (a) with the consent of the Minister, to apportion, distribute, and apply as may seem most fitting, any moneys voted by Parliament, and any other funds in its possession or control, for the relief of aboriginals;
- (b) to distribute blankets, clothing, and relief to aboriginals at the discretion of the Board;
- (c) to provide for the custody, maintenance, and education of the children of aboriginals;
- (d) to manage and regulate the use of reserves;
- (e) to exercise a general supervision and care over all matters affecting the interests and welfare of aboriginals, and to protect them against injustice, imposition, and fraud.

22. (1) It shall not be lawful for any person other than an aboriginal, or an officer under the Board, or a person acting under the Board's direction, or under the authority of the Regulations, to enter or remain upon or be within the limits of a reserve upon which aboriginals are residing, for any purpose whatsoever.

(2) The Board may remove from a reserve any aboriginal who is guilty of any misconduct, or who, in the opinion of the Board, should be earning a living away from such reserve.

(3) Any building erected on a reserve shall be vested in and become the property of the Board, also all cattle, horses, pigs, sheep, machinery, and property thereon purchased or acquired for the benefit of aboriginals. No stock shall be permitted to remain on a reserve without the sanction of the Board.

Local Guardians.

23. The duties of guardians shall be to issue to aboriginals orders on the storekeeper for the supply of rations, to visit the settlement at least once in two weeks, to exercise general supervision over and to attend to the welfare of the aboriginals, and to institute proceedings for offences under the Act or Regulations as may be directed by the Board.

Management of Stations.

24. All stations shall be under the control of Managers appointed by the Board.

25. The duties of Managers shall be—

- (a) To have the general management and control of all persons on the stations under their charge, buildings, stock, and other property; to supervise the good order and conduct of the stations; and to devote all their energies to the moral and social welfare of the aboriginals resident on such stations.
- (b) To report in a prescribed form, at the end of each month, for the information of the Board, as to the general condition of the stations—i.e., the number of aboriginals located thereon, and the daily average for the month, distinguishing in all cases the sexes and the full-bloods from the half-castes; the number of children attending the school; the nature and extent of the work done during the month, and what work is in contemplation; the number of births and deaths during the month; information as to the general health of the aboriginals; and any other matters of interest.
- (c) To discourage any further introduction of half-castes, which shall be allowed only on the conditions set out in the Act and these Regulations.
- (d) To keep a diary of all occurrences at the stations under their charge, together with the usual statistics, and submit the same when required for inspection by members of the Board or officer authorized by them.
- (e) To exercise supervision of the aboriginals at the stations; to restrain them from leaving the stations and visiting public houses; and to endeavour to see that they do not squander their earnings.
- (f) To be accountable for all rations, clothing, medical comforts, &c., and their distribution as authorized by the Board.
- (g) To keep accounts of all money and supplies received and disposed of, and to furnish to the Board monthly abstracts of the same.
- (h) To forward all moneys received from the sale of wool or produce, &c., to the Board immediately after the end of each month, accompanied by a statement showing the various items.
- (i) To submit requisitions for supplies of rations, clothing, and stores.
- (j) To submit to the Board applications by aboriginals at the stations who desire to occupy blocks of land to be cultivated by them to earn a livelihood thereon for themselves and their families, and to report fully as to the locality and suitability of the land applied for, and the character of the applicant.
- (k) To assist in and supervise the erection of and repairs to buildings, fencing, &c., and the cultivation of the land, and do their best to make the aboriginals as comfortable and contented as practicable; also to take an interest in their work and recreations.

26. (a) Managers shall be personally liable for any expenditure incurred without authority from the Board. They shall take stock of all Government property on the station on the 30th June of each year, and furnish a return thereof for the Board's information. They shall also take stock, monthly, of rations and other stores on hand, and furnish a return showing clearly the quantities received and used during the month, and the quantities on hand.

(b) Application for leave by Managers or other officers must be submitted to the Board.

(c) All correspondence must be promptly attended to, and recorded for inspection.

27. The matron shall have an oversight of all the women, with special charge of girls and young children; shall daily visit the dwellings of married and unmarried women, and give instructions in cooking, washing, sewing, and other domestic duties, and shall be responsible to the Manager for the cleanliness of the women and children, together with the buildings they occupy.

Rations and Clothing.

28. Rations according to the undermentioned scale will be issued to Managers and other officers on the Board's stations, viz. :—

Flour	8 lb.	per week
Tea	$\frac{1}{4}$ lb.	..
Sugar (white)	2 lb.	..
Meat	7 lb.	..
Potatoes	7 lb.	..
Soap	1 lb.	..
Butter or	}	1 lb.	..
Jam		2 lb.	..

Where butter can be made or potatoes grown on the stations, they must be taken from the station supply.

29. (a) Rations consisting of 8 lb. of flour, 2 lb. sugar, and $\frac{1}{4}$ lb. tea per week will be allowed to all aboriginals. Children under ten years of age shall be allowed half these quantities. On the Board's stations, and at reserves where specially authorized, meat up to 7 lb. per week, $\frac{1}{8}$ lb. tobacco, rice, oatmeal, salt, and soap are to be issued as required.

(b) In cases of special urgency, rations not exceeding a week's supply may be issued, but the particulars must be at once reported to the Board.

(c) A quarterly return of all rations issued shall be furnished to the Board, giving particulars of the names, ages, sex, and caste of the recipients, and the reason for the issue.

(d) A supply of medicines and such medical comforts as rice, sago, arrowroot, oatmeal, and maizena shall be kept in stock at the Board's stations, and issued to any aboriginals who may be sick or otherwise in need of the same, but the circumstances of such issue must appear on the quarterly returns of rations issued.

30. Clothing will be supplied to aboriginals throughout the State as may be considered necessary.

31. All supplies must be obtained upon requisition under contracts taken by the Tender Board. The Regulations under the *Public Service Act 1915*, relating to the "Mode of Obtaining Supplies," "Receipt, Custody, and Issue of Stores," &c., shall be observed as far as possible.

In all cases where articles are not obtainable under contract, local offers, in writing, should accompany requisitions.

Half-castes.

32. On the recommendation of the Manager of a prescribed station, the Board may, in cases of illness, infirmity, or other necessitous circumstances, issue a licence, signed by the Secretary of the Board, to any half-caste or child of half-caste to reside for a period of three months upon any prescribed station; and the Board may renew such licence for a like period as often as it thinks fit, and may at any time cancel such licence.

33. Any half-caste or child of half-castes who may be permitted under a licence to reside at a prescribed station shall be under the control of the Manager of such station, and shall strictly adhere to the Regulations of the Board for the management of such stations.

34. Any half-caste or child of half-castes may, with the approval of the Board, be dismissed and removed from any prescribed station for misconduct on the advice of the Manager of such station.
35. Any half-caste who may be permitted to reside on any prescribed station shall receive the following supply of rations weekly :—7 lbs. of bread or 8 lbs. of flour, 2 lbs. of sugar, $\frac{1}{4}$ lb. of tea, 7 lbs. of meat when obtainable, and rice, oatmeal, salt, and soap in such quantities as the Manager of the station may think necessary.
- Children under ten years of age shall receive half of the above supply of rations.
36. Any half-caste or child of half-castes who may be permitted to reside on any prescribed station shall be supplied with such clothing, blankets, medical attendance, and comforts as may be granted by special permission of the Board.
37. Every able-bodied half-caste and aboriginal residing on a prescribed station shall do a reasonable amount of work, and any one persistently refusing to do so when required shall have his supplies stopped until he resumes work.
38. If any aboriginal or half-caste having his supplies so stopped use the supplies of any aboriginal or half-caste child, or in any way deprive any aboriginal or half-caste child thereof, he shall be reported to the Board.
39. The granting of railway passes to aboriginals and half-castes shall be limited to urgent and needful cases only, and travelling discouraged and prevented as much as possible.
40. Before any half-caste can receive any assistance from the Board to select or acquire Crown lands or private property, or to improve the same, the Board must be satisfied that he is sober, honest, and industrious; and if living on a prescribed station, he must produce a certificate to that effect from the Manager of such station, or from a respectable house-holder if not living on a prescribed station.
41. The Board may license or apprentice, in a lawful manner, to any trade or occupation any male or female half-caste child over fourteen years of age to any person or persons of approved respectability.
42. Girls shall not be apprenticed or sent to service to single gentlemen, or hotel or boardinghouse-keepers.
43. Half-castes licensed to service and apprentices shall be provided with female protection and sleeping accommodation to be approved of by officers authorized by the Board to inspect them.
44. All persons to whom boys or girls are licensed or apprenticed shall properly feed and lodge them, and also provide them with medicines and medical attendance when necessary, and also see that their persons, clothing, &c., are kept clean and healthy.
45. One-half of the wages of every half-caste child licensed to service and of every apprentice shall be paid quarterly, viz. :—On the 1st January, April, July, and October—and sent by the employer to the Secretary of the Board, who shall have such money placed to such child's credit in a savings bank, and paid to such child at the end of his or her service or apprenticeship, and the other half shall be paid to the child at the end of each quarter's service or apprenticeship.
46. Apprentices and half-castes licensed to service shall be allowed, when practicable, to attend divine service and Sunday school, and their moral training shall be duly cared for by their employer.
47. If within three months after the execution of any indenture the employer shall not be satisfied with the apprentice, the child may be returned to the Board, and the indenture shall be cancelled.
48. In the event of any change of residence by any employer, written intimation thereof shall be given by him at once to the Secretary of the Board.
49. Every employer shall forward to the Secretary as often as the Board requires written reports on the conduct of any child in his service or apprenticed to him, and shall allow such child to write to the Board at such times as he deems necessary.
50. In the event of any child becoming seriously ill, dying, absconding, leaving, or meeting with an accident, information shall at once be given by the employer to the Secretary of the Board, and in the event of a child absconding, information shall also at once be given by the employer to the local police, who shall take immediate steps to recover and return the child.

51. The Board shall provide a printed form of application for the use of those who desire to obtain children as apprentices or servants, and such form shall be filled up with the following particulars:—

Form of Application.

- (a) Name, address, profession, or occupation of applicant.
- (b) Whether married or single.
- (c) Religious denomination and family of applicant.
- (d) Ages of male members of family.
- (e) Particulars of sleeping accommodation.
- (f) Name of child applied for.
- (g) Description of work to be performed or trade to be learned by child.
- (h) Reference to two reliable persons (one if possible a minister of religion) as to the respectability of the applicant.

52. The following shall be the form of indenture:—

53. Any member or officer of the Board may from time to time, for the purpose of inspection and report, visit those receiving assistance under Regulation 40, or those licensed out to service or apprenticed, or those in any way under the control of the Board.

54. Any aboriginal who has been removed from any station or reserve under the provisions of Regulation 22 (2), and who is found entering or remaining upon any station or reserve without the express permission of the Board, shall be guilty of an offence.

55. Any aboriginal resident on any of the Board's stations or reserves knowingly harboring any expelled aboriginal shall be guilty of an offence.

56. All quadroon, octoroon, and half-caste lads on the Board's stations and reserves of or above the age of eighteen (18) years shall leave same on a notification from the Board, and shall not again be allowed upon a station or reserve, except for a brief visit to relatives, at the discretion of Managers of stations. In all cases such visits shall not extend beyond ten (10) days, and a report shall forthwith be made of permission so granted.

WHEREAS by the resolution set out below and dated the sixteenth day of August One thousand nine hundred and sixteen the Country Roads Board incorporated under the *Country Roads Act 1915* (Act No. 2635) being of opinion that the highways in the State of Victoria set out or described in the Schedule to the same were of sufficient importance to be main roads and acting under the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the said Act declared such highways to be main roads within the meaning and for the purposes of the Act aforesaid And whereas the said Act amongst other things provides that the Governor in Council might by Order published in the *Government Gazette* confirm such resolution whereupon any roads mentioned in such resolution should be main roads And whereas it is deemed desirable to confirm the resolution so made and passed by the said Country Roads Board Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof doth hereby confirm such resolution and declare upon the publication of this Order in the *Government Gazette* the roads mentioned in the Schedule to such resolution of the Country Roads Board main roads within the meaning and for the purposes of the *Country Roads Act 1915*.

And the Honorable W. Hutchinson, for and on behalf of His Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

RESOLUTION OF THE COUNTRY ROADS BOARD ABOVE REFERRED TO.

The Country Roads Board incorporated by the *Country Roads Act 1915* (Act No. 2635), at a meeting now holden, being of opinion that the highways within the State of Victoria set out or described in the Schedule hereunder written, are of sufficient importance to be main roads, acting under the powers conferred upon it by the said Act doth by this resolution hereby declare such highways to be main roads within the meaning and for the purposes of the said *Country Roads Act 1915*.

SCHEDULE.

Shire of Bet Bet.

1. *Betley-road*.—Commencing at the intersection of the southern boundary of section 43 of the township of Dunolly and the south-eastern boundary of the borough of Dunolly; thence south-easterly crossing the Burnt Creek near the south-western angle of allotment 15, section 46, parish of Dunolly, and continuing south-easterly through the village of Bromley to the north-western angle of allotment 29, section 3, of parish aforesaid; thence further south-easterly to and including the bridge over the Bet Bet Creek at Betley on the south-eastern boundary of the shire.

Borough of Hamilton.

5. *Hamilton-Warrnambool Road*.—NOTE.—The route of the portion of this road between the borough of Hamilton and the shire of Dundas is already set out in the description of road routes in the shire of Dundas.

WHEREAS the Country Roads Board constituted under the *Country Roads Act 1915* (Act No. 2635) has represented to His Excellency the Governor in Council that it appears to it desirable that the deviation hereinafter referred to from the existing Anglesea-road in the shire of Barrarbool (declared to be a main road under the said Act which declaration was confirmed by the Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette* of the first day of April, One thousand nine hundred and fourteen on page 1546) should be made by the said Board And whereas the said Board in accordance with the requirements of section 19 of the said cited Act has caused to be prepared maps marked "E" to "J" respectively plan and estimate showing the points between which and on and through what land the said deviation is proposed to be made and the cost of acquiring the land and constructing the said deviation And whereas on an inspection of the said maps and plan and a consideration of the said estimate His Excellency the Governor in Council is satisfied that there are funds legally available for acquiring the land and constructing the said deviation Now therefore be it known by this present Order that His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria with the advice of the Executive Council thereof doth hereby approve of the said road being made, that is to say:—

"E." That piece of land being part of Crown portion 22d, parish of Jan Juc: Commencing at the north-western angle of the said Crown portion; and thence bearing south 0 deg. 13 min. west along the western boundary thereof for a distance of 1,109 links; thence bearing north 28 deg. 8 min. east for a distance of 1,258 links to the northern boundary of said Crown portion; thence westerly along that boundary for a distance of 593 links to the point of commencement.

"F." That piece of land being part of Crown portion 24A, parish of Jan Juc: Commencing at a point on the eastern boundary of said Crown portion 399 links south from the north-eastern angle thereof; and thence bearing south 53 deg. 25 min. west for a distance of 3,022 links; thence bearing south 14 deg. 48 min. west for a distance of 1,252 links to the southern boundary of said Crown portion; thence easterly along that boundary for a distance of 103.5 links; thence north 14 deg. 48 min. east for a distance of 1,190 links; thence bearing north 53 deg. 25 min. east for a distance of 2,912 links to the eastern boundary; thence northerly along that boundary for a distance of 125 links to the point of commencement.

"G." That piece of land being part of Crown portions 25 and 32, parish of Jan Juc: Commencing at a point 989.5 links east from the south-western angle of Crown allotment 24A, and bounded as follows:—Bearing south 14 deg. 55 min. west for a distance of 4,999 links; thence bearing south for a distance of 1,739.5 links; thence bearing north 38 deg. 0 min. east for a distance of 487 links; thence bearing north for a distance of 1,316 links; thence bearing north 14 deg. 55 min. east for a distance of 5,040 links to the southern boundary of Crown allotment 24A; thence westerly along that boundary for a distance of 310.5 links to the point of commencement.

"H." That piece of land being part of Crown portion 26B, parish of Jan Juc: Commencing at a point on the eastern boundary of said portion 2,084 links south from the north-eastern angle; and thence bearing south 36 deg. 9 min. west for a distance of 349 links; thence bearing south 73 deg. 55 min. west for a distance of 2,093 links; thence easterly for a distance of 2,217 links; thence northerly for a distance of 884 links to the point of commencement.

"I." That piece of land being part of Crown portion 69A, parish of Jan Juc: Commencing at the bend or angle on the eastern side of a 3-chain road surveyed through the said Crown portion, and near the centre of western boundary

thereof, and bounded as follows:—Bearing north 57 deg. 32 min. east along the south-western side of the said 3-chain road for a distance of 841 links; thence bearing south 35 deg. 3 min. west for a distance of 383.5 links; thence bearing south 4 deg. 13 min. west for a distance of 552 links to the north-eastern side of the aforesaid 3-chain road; thence bearing north 47 deg. 21 min. west along the road for a distance of 610 links to the point of commencement.

"J." PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Arthur Lyulph Stanley, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 59 of the *Country Roads Act* 1915 it is among other things provided that the provisions of Part XXII. of the *Local Government Act* 1915 should so far as applicable be incorporated in the first cited Act as to main roads and should be construed together therewith: And whereas by section 568 of the said *Local Government Act* 1915 it is enacted that the Governor in Council may by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* declare that the provisions of Division 2 of Part XXII. of the said Act shall apply and be of full force and effect in any municipal district from and after a date to be specified in such Proclamation not being within six months from the date of such Proclamation: And whereas it is deemed expedient to declare that the provisions of the said Division 2 of the said Part XXII. of the said *Local Government Act* 1915 should as to main roads within the municipal districts named in the schedule hereto apply to and be of full force and effect in such municipal districts as from the thirty-first day of March 1917: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State under the herein-before recited powers and all other powers enabling me in that behalf do by this my Proclamation declare that the provision of Division 2 of Part XXII. of the *Local Government Act* 1915 shall as to main roads therein apply to and be of full force and effect in the municipal districts named in the schedule hereto as on and from the 31st day of March 1917 a date not being within six months from the date of these presents.

Where the kind or kinds of wood is not mentioned in the tender form, tenderers must specify the kind or kinds of firewood they offer to supply.

Telegrams, or tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement, will not be entertained. The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for £10, with two approved sureties, for the due performance of the contract, within ten days after the acceptance is notified.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Firewood at _____," as the case may be, and deposited in the Tender-Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender. The decision of the Government will be made known by Gazette notice and by letter to accepted tenderers.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. As the exact quantity of firewood which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same at contract rates.
2. All the firewood supplied under these contracts must be split out of large timber, and must be perfectly sound, dry, and of the kind or kinds specified in the tender; neither burnt wood, heartwood, small branches, nor outside pieces of bark will be received. The billets must be not less than 4 inches nor more than 6 inches in diameter. The long wood to be not less than 9 inches nor more than 18 inches in diameter. Delivery to be made on the written order of the chief officer of the Department requiring the supply. The ton of firewood consists of 40 cubic feet. If the firewood is obtained from a State forest timber reserve, or ordinary Crown lands, persons cutting or removing same must be provided with a licence or permit from the State Forests Department.
3. Orders will be issued half-yearly (except in cases where the storage is small, when they will be issued quarterly); but the contractor must have 24 hours' notice before purchases are made at his risk.
4. The contractor will be bound to place the firewood in stacks for measurement on such ground as may be pointed out. The stacks are to be 2 feet wide (or 4 feet 6 inches for long wood) by 5 feet high, with space between each stack for measuring; and the billets (or lengths) are all to lie the same way, viz., crossways of the stacks in the form of a cord, and are to be laid as closely and solidly as possible in the stack and to the satisfaction of the officer receiving the supply. In the event of any inconvenience being felt, either through delay in delivery or of stacking the wood, the Department concerned will purchase the same or re-stack that delivered, at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense incurred thereby will be deducted.
5. The officer receiving the supply shall have full power to reject any wood which he may consider not in accordance with the contract, notice of which will be given to the contractor in writing, stating the reason. The contractor may, however, claim a survey; but in that case he must, within 48 hours after objection is made, give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the wood.
6. The board of survey will be composed of persons appointed by the Honorable the Treasurer, and the decision of the board of survey is to be considered as final.
7. If the board of survey shall decide that the supply is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense, if any, will be charged as in clause 4.
8. Accounts for firewood to be rendered to the Department receiving the supply immediately upon completion of the order, which must be attached to the account. Payment will be made at the receipt and pay office of the district, or at the Treasury, Melbourne, as the contractor may desire.
9. In the event of any irregularity on the part of the contractor being repeated, it will be competent for the Government, in case such irregularity should be established to the satisfaction of the Tender Board, to cancel the contract forthwith.
10. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.
11. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract.
12. No subletting will be allowed; all work must be carried out by the contractor. Every person engaged in any business or occupation connected with the preparation of the firewood for sale or connected with the sale or distribution of the firewood tendered for in this schedule shall be paid such wages and employed subject to such conditions as are or may be determined by the Fuel and Fodder Board, or the Country Fuel and Fodder Board, as the case may be, under the Factories and Shops Acts; and a copy of these conditions shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted, in legible Roman characters, on the premises of the contractor. Any infringement of these conditions, in the opinion of the Treasurer, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from any accounts which are or may be due to the contractor, and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement and in all other respects.

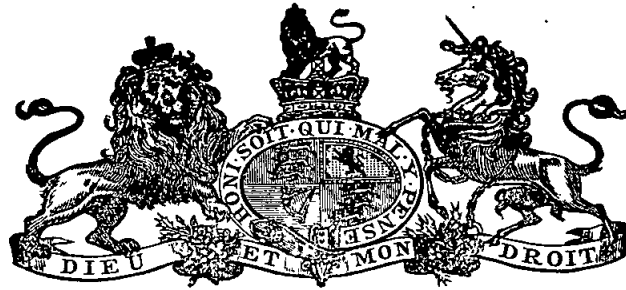

DETERMINATION OF THE STARCH BOARD.

IN accordance with the provisions of the *Factories and Shops Act 1915*, the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of a maker of Starch, has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That previous Determinations of this Board are hereby amended, and such amendments shall come into force on and after the 29th day of September, 1916. The Determination and amendments are printed hereunder.

(2) That the lowest prices or rates of payment payable to the following persons shall be:—

APPRENTICES AND IMPROVERS.

"Apprentice" means any person under twenty-one years of age bound by indentures of apprenticeship, or any person over twenty-one years of age who, with the sanction of the Minister, is bound by indentures of apprenticeship. (Act 2386, Section 5.)

"Improver" means any person (other than an apprentice) who does not receive a piece-work price or a wages rate fixed by any Special Board for persons other than apprentices or improvers, and who is not over twenty-one years of age, or who being over twenty-one years of age holds a licence from the Minister to be paid as an improver. (Act 2386, Section 5.)

(4) That—

(a) the lowest rates which may be paid to an apprentice or an improver; and

(b) the proportionate number of apprentices and improvers who may be employed in any factory or place

shall be as shown in the following table:—

but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rates shall only be payable for work done on the day substituted
