EUROA WATERWORKS TRUST.

REGULATIONS.

THE Commissioners of the Euroa Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1915*, hereby make the following Regulations:—

The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of land and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the water supply district, that is to say:—

1. For every house or tenement, used either wholly or partly as a domicile, of Twenty pounds annual value and under, the minimum amount of rate payable in respect of such house or tenement for the year.

2. For every house or tenement, used either wholly or partly as a domicile, of more than Twenty pounds annual value, the amount payable in respect of such annual value at the rate levied for the year.

3. For every water trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust, the sum of Twenty shillings per annum, except the water for such trough passes through a meter and is charged for with the water supplied by meter.

4. For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, Fifteen shillings per annum for each horse-power of such steam boiler.

5. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement except in case of special agreement with the Trust, One shilling for every thousand gallons.

6. That for a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, repairs, or additions, Twenty shillings per cent. shall be charged on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork and plastering, or in the absence of a contract, Twenty shillings per cent. upon the sum paid for stonework, brickwork, and plastering.

The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure shall be—

(1) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge at One shilling per thousand gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise.

(2) No hose or pipe is to be supplied to any pipes or taps for the purpose of watering the ground or trees or plants or washing-house walls or carriages, or for any similar purpose, unless the water is charged for by meter.

Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to carry or take away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust who shall take or carry away water from any drinking tap, trough, or public or private service pipe shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

No person shall lay any pipe or communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with pipes of the Trust, nor shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of a duly authorized officer of the Trust appointed for the purpose; and any person committing a breach of this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.

The service pipes for conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of the consumers shall in no case exceed the following diameters:—For the domestic supply of premises not exceeding Twenty pounds annual value, $\frac{1}{2}$ -in. diameter; for domestic supply of premises exceeding Twenty pounds annual value,

2-in. diameter; for the supply of water for other than domestic purposes and for all supplies by meter, such diameter as the Trust shall authorize in each case. The Trust may contract with any occupier or owner of any lands or tenements, who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works or who is desirous of being so supplied, for the provision and laying of the service pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundary of such land or tenement abutting upon the street or road in which are the pipes of the Trust.

If any person shall waste water of the Trust by neglecting to repair any service pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service pipe or otherwise as to the Trust may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected.

No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, and any person committing a breach of this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.

No person shall connect any service pipe or branch service pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter.

Overflow pipes to private baths will not be permitted. Water-closets will not be allowed to be supplied direct from the main, but from a cistern only, so constructed that the water cannot flow continuously and that not more than ten gallons can escape at each flush.

No meter shall be affixed unless the dial of the same is capable of registering one million gallons. Save where in these Regulations otherwise specially provided, no tap shall be placed in any garden or yard or to or outside of any dwelling or premises supplied with the water of the Trust unless a water meter is fixed and the water supplied by measure; and any person offending against this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

Not more than one house or tenement shall be supplied from a single water service.

The fee for a plumber's licence shall be paid annually. Such licence shall be at and during the pleasure of the Trust, and the Trust may at any time cancel such licence in the event of the holder thereof being judged by the Trust to be incompetent, or by himself or his employees committing any breach of the Act or of this By-law. Before any such licence shall be granted by the Trust the person applying for the same shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent plumber, and that he is thoroughly conversant with the provisions of the By-laws of the Trust and with the section of the Water Act affecting his work, but the Trust may, if he so sees fit, refuse to grant such licence.

The fee to be paid for a plumber's licence will be One pound.

Any person being dissatisfied with the dial reading of the meter registration of the consumption of water on his premises, shall make complaint, in writing, to the Secretary of the Trust within fourteen days after the date of such reading, and such person shall be entitled, at his own expense, to have the meter tested by the Trust's plumber; and the result of such test shall be binding and conclusive on such person and on the Trust.

If any person supplied with water by the Trust does or causes or permits to be done anything in contravention of these Regulations, or fails to pay his rates or any lawful charge imposed by the Trust when due, or fails to do anything which under any of their Regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

The water supply in the waterworks district of the Trust shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with these Regulations and not otherwise, through pipes and meters laid, placed and being under and in accordance with the said Regulations and not otherwise.

For the construction of these Regulations the word "person" shall be deemed to extend and include a corporation whether aggregate or sole, and the word "Trust" shall mean the Euroa Waterworks Trust.

EUROA WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR YEAR 1917.

THE Commissioners of the Euroa Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1915*, hereby make the following Rating By-law:—

A rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling shall be imposed and levied on all rateable property in the Waterworks District of the Euroa Waterworks Trust supplied otherwise than by meter in all parts where the main pipes of the Trust shall have been extended (the minimum of each house or building to be Thirty shillings), according to the valuation for the time being of such rateable property for the municipal rate of the municipal district in which such rateable property is situate, for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1917, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1917.

Such rate shall be payable in two equal portions or instalments, and the first instalment shall be payable on the 1st day of January, 1917, and the second instalment on the 1st day of July, 1917.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Euroa Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rate.

*Fire Brigades Act 1915.***REGULATIONS FOR THE CONDUCT OF ELECTIONS OF MEMBERS OF THE COUNTRY FIRE BRIGADES BOARD AND LOCAL COMMITTEES OF COUNTRY FIRE DISTRICTS.**

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the second day of October, 1916.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Fire Brigades Act 1915*, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the same, doth hereby revoke the Regulations made on the fourth day of August, 1896, for the conduct of elections of members of the Country Fire Brigades Board and of elections for local committees of country fire districts respectively, and in lieu thereof doth make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

REGULATIONS FOR THE CONDUCT OF ELECTIONS OF MEMBERS OF THE COUNTRY FIRE BRIGADES BOARD.**General.**

1. Periodical elections of members for the Country Fire Brigades Board shall be held in the month of December in the year 1916, on a date to be fixed by the responsible Minister administering the *Fire Brigades Act* (hereinafter styled "the Minister"), and thereafter in the month of December in every second succeeding year, on a date to be fixed by him.

2. Elections to fill any vacancy occasioned by death, resignation, removal, or any cause other than retirement of a member through effluxion of time, shall be held within eight weeks after such vacancy is reported by the Board to the Minister, on a date to be fixed by the Minister.

3. Twenty-eight (28) days at least before any election the Minister shall notify to the bodies entitled to vote the last day upon which nominations of persons proposed for election will be received, and such day shall be some day not less than fourteen (14) days before the election as the Minister may appoint.

4. Forthwith on receipt of the nomination of any candidate the returning officer shall notify such candidate that he has been nominated, and that he will be deemed to have consented thereto unless the returning officer receives from him, on or before a day to be named in the notice, being not more than seven days after the date of nomination, a written withdrawal of such candidate's name.

5. The returning officer, on receipt of any such notice of withdrawal within the specified time, shall omit or erase the name from the voting papers, and if the number of candidates be thereby reduced to the number of persons to be elected, then the returning officer shall forthwith declare the remaining candidate or candidates duly elected.

6. In the event of an equality of votes, the returning officer shall forthwith report the fact to the Minister, who shall have a casting vote. Upon the Minister giving his casting vote the candidate receiving such vote shall be deemed to be duly elected.

7. Clauses 4, 5, 6, and 7, and the following Regulations, shall apply to the conduct of both periodical and extraordinary elections.

Election of Representatives by Municipalities.

8. A list of the municipal councils of the municipalities, the municipal districts of which are within or partly within any country fire district, shall be furnished by the Board to the Minister and published by him in the *Government Gazette* during the month of September in the year 1916, and in the month of September in each second succeeding year thereafter.

The name of any such municipal council omitted from such list may be inserted therein on application to the Minister within seven days from the publication thereof. Such list, with the name or names of any municipalities so added, shall be taken to be the roll of municipalities entitled to vote at the election of municipal representatives on the Country Board.

9. The council of each municipality within, or partly within, a country fire district may nominate for membership in the case of a periodical election two persons, or in the case of a casual vacancy one person.

10. In the nomination of candidates by councils, the proceedings in connexion therewith shall be conducted as nearly as may be as proceedings for the election of the mayor or president are conducted, or in accordance with any by-laws made by the council in that behalf.

11. The names or name of the persons or person nominated by the council of any municipality as aforesaid shall be forwarded to the returning officer so as to reach him not later than Four p.m. on the day appointed for receiving nominations.

12. If on the day appointed for receiving nominations not more than the number of candidates required to fill the vacancies or vacancy in respect of which such nomination is made are nominated, the returning officer shall forthwith declare the persons or person so nominated duly elected.

13. If on the day appointed for receiving nominations candidates in excess of the number of vacancies have been nominated, the returning officer shall make out a list of the names of the persons nominated, and forthwith forward to the council of each municipality entitled to vote a copy of such list.

14. Each of such councils shall, upon receipt of the list of candidates, strike out therefrom the names of the persons other than those for whom the council desires to vote, leaving not more than a sufficient number of names to fill the vacancies or vacancy in question, and shall return such list to the returning officer so as to reach him not later than Four p.m. on the day of the election.

15. The returning officer, upon receipt of such lists as have reached him within the prescribed time, shall proceed to count the votes given for each candidate, and after having ascertained the number of votes given for each, declare elected the candidates or candidate, according to the number of vacancies to be filled, receiving the largest number of votes.

Election of Representatives by the Fire Insurance Companies.

16. A list of all fire insurance companies carrying on business and insuring property within country fire districts shall be furnished by the Country Board to the Minister and published by him in the *Government Gazette* during the month of September in the year 1916, and in the month of September in each second succeeding year thereafter.

The name of any such insurance company omitted from such list may be inserted therein on application to the Minister within seven days from the publication thereof. Such list, with the name or names of any insurance company so added, shall be taken to be the roll of insurance companies entitled to vote at the election of insurance companies' representatives on the Country Board.

17. On or before a day to be specified by the Minister, and notified in the *Government Gazette*, and by circular so far as is reasonably practicable addressed to each fire insurance company, the insurance companies may elect persons to be representative members on the Country Board.

18. The principal officer, representative, or agent in Victoria for the time being managing the fire business of an insurance company carrying on business in country fire districts shall be qualified to vote at any election for the same on behalf of such insurance company.

19. Fourteen days before any election every fire insurance company shall, by its chairman of directors, manager, secretary, or other superior officer, notify to the secretary of the Fire Underwriters' Association of Victoria the name of its principal officer, representative, or agent authorized to vote on behalf of such company.

20. The candidates or candidate for the Board shall be nominated, in writing, by two voters, and such nomination paper shall be lodged at the office of the Fire Underwriters' Association of Victoria not less than seven days prior to the date of the election, addressed to the secretary of such Association, and the secretary of such Association for the time being shall be the returning officer for the purpose of holding and declaring the result of such election, with power to appoint, in writing, a deputy for that purpose should he be unable to preside thereat.

21. Should the number of persons so nominated not exceed the number to be elected, the secretary of such Association or his deputy, shall report to the Minister the names or name of the persons or person so nominated, and the Minister shall thereupon declare such persons or person to be elected to the Board, and shall notify such election in the *Government Gazette*.

22. Should the number of persons nominated exceed the number to be elected, the secretary of such Association or his deputy shall, by advertisement in at least two newspapers published daily in Melbourne, and, as far as reasonably practicable, by circular addressed to each insurance company, fix and notify the day at which a poll will be taken.

23. Such poll shall be taken by such secretary or his deputy, and each candidate may appoint a scrutineer to be present at the taking of such poll and the counting of the votes. The poll shall be taken by ballot at the office of the Fire Underwriters' Association of Victoria, or at such other place as the Minister may from time to time, by notification in the *Government Gazette*, direct, and shall be open from Eleven a.m. to Four p.m.

24. The person voting on behalf of any company at any election for the Country Board shall be entitled to vote in accordance with the following scale:—

If the company in respect of which the vote is cast has, under the 105th section of the *Stamps Act 1890*, returned for the year previous to the election a premium revenue of less than £2,000, one vote for each member to be elected.

If £2,000 but less than £4,000, two votes for each member to be elected.

If £4,000 but less than £6,000, three votes for each member to be elected.

If £6,000 but less than £8,000, four votes for each member to be elected.

If £8,000 and upwards, five votes for each member to be elected.

25. The secretary or his deputy shall forthwith, after the conclusion of the polling and in the presence of the scrutineers (if any), open and count the voting papers, and such secretary or his deputy shall report the result of such poll to the Minister, who shall declare the candidates or candidate having received the largest number of votes to be the representative members or member on the Board for the insurance companies, and shall notify the same in the *Government Gazette*.

Election of Representatives by Registered Fire Brigades.

26. A list of all registered fire brigades within the various country fire districts shall be furnished by the Country Board to the Minister, and published by him in the *Government Gazette* during the month of September in the year 1916, and in the month of September in each second succeeding year thereafter.

The name of any such registered brigade omitted from such list may be inserted therein on application to the Minister within seven days from the publication thereof.

Such list, with the names of any brigades so added, shall be taken to be the roll of brigades entitled to vote at any election of fire brigade representatives on the Country Board.

27. On or before a day to be specified by the Minister, and notified in the *Government Gazette*, and by circular addressed to every registered brigade on the roll of each country fire district, such fire brigades may nominate two persons, or, in the case of an extraordinary vacancy, one person, to be representative members or member on the Country Board.

28. In the nomination of candidates for fire brigades, the proceedings shall be conducted as near as may be to the proceedings taken in the election of captain of the brigade.

29. The names or name of the persons or person so nominated shall be sent forthwith to the returning officer. Should the number of persons so nominated not exceed the number to be elected, the returning officer shall report to the Minister the names or name of the persons or person so nominated, and the Minister shall thereupon declare such persons or person to be elected to the Board, and shall notify such election in the *Government Gazette*.

30. If on the day specified and notified more than the required number of candidates shall have been nominated a list of all the persons so nominated by registered fire brigades shall be prepared and shall be forwarded to the registered fire brigades on the roll of each country fire district, and the secretary or the captain of each fire brigade, after having been duly authorized by a majority of the registered members thereof present at a properly constituted meeting, shall, before a day to be specified at the time of forwarding such list, strike out all the names except those of the candidates or candidate for which such fire brigade desires to vote, and return the list so altered to the returning officer.

31. The returning officer shall, on the receipt of such lists as have reached him within the prescribed time, proceed to count the votes received by him, and shall report the result of such poll to the Minister, who shall declare the candidates or candidate having received the largest number of votes to be the representative members or member on the Board.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CONDUCT OF ELECTIONS FOR LOCAL COMMITTEES OF COUNTRY FIRE DISTRICTS.

Municipal Councils Representative.

1. On or before a day to be specified by the responsible Minister administering the Fire Brigades Act (hereinafter styled "the Minister"), and notified in the *Government Gazette*, and by circular addressed to the councils of each municipal district forming part of each

country fire district, such municipal councils may nominate a person to be a member of the local committee for the country fire district of which such municipality shall form part.

2. In the nomination of candidates by councils the proceedings shall be conducted as near as may be to the proceedings taken in the election of mayor or president of the council; or such proceedings may be conducted in accordance with any by-laws to be hereafter made by any city or other municipality for that purpose.

3. The name of the person so nominated for any country fire district shall be sent forthwith to the returning officer.

If the same person shall be nominated by all such councils who have exercised the right of nomination for any country fire district, such person shall be forthwith declared by the returning officer to be elected as a member of the local committee for the country fire district for which he shall have been so nominated, and such election shall be notified in the *Government Gazette*.

4. If, on the day specified and notified more than the required number of candidates for the local committee of any one or more country fire districts shall have been so nominated, the returning officer shall prepare a list of all persons nominated, and shall forward the same to the council of each municipality forming part of such country fire district; and such council shall, before a day to be specified at the time of forwarding such list, strike out all the names except that of the candidate for whom such council desires to vote, and return such list so altered to the returning officer.

5. The returning officer shall, on receipt of such returned lists, count all the votes received by him, and shall declare the candidate having received the largest number of votes to be a member of the local committee for the country fire district in which such municipalities are comprised.

6. In the event of an equality of votes, the returning officer shall forthwith report the fact to the Minister, who shall have a casting vote. Upon the Minister giving his casting vote, the candidate receiving such vote shall be deemed to be duly elected.

Insurance Companies' Representative.

7. On or before a date to be specified by the Minister, and notified in the *Government Gazette*, and by circular so far as is reasonably practicable, addressed to each fire insurance company, the insurance companies may elect persons to be representative members of the respective local committees.

8. The principal officer, representative, or agent for the time being managing the fire business of an insurance company carrying on business in country fire districts shall be qualified to vote at any election for the same on behalf of such insurance company.

9. Fourteen days before any election every fire insurance company shall, by its chairman of directors, manager, secretary, or other superior officer, notify to the secretary of the Fire Underwriters' Association of Victoria the name of its principal officer, representative, or agent.

10. Candidates shall be nominated, in writing, for the local committees by two voters, and such nomination paper shall be lodged at the office of the Fire Underwriters' Association of Victoria not less than seven days prior to the day of election, addressed to the secretary of such Association, and the present secretary of such Association, or such other person who shall from time to time fill such office shall be the returning officer for the purpose of holding and declaring the result of such election, with power to appoint, in writing, a deputy for that purpose should he be unable to preside thereat.

11. Should only one person be so nominated for any fire district, the secretary of such Association or his deputy shall report to the Minister the name of the person so nominated, and the Minister shall thereupon notify the election of such person in the *Government Gazette*.

12. Should the number of persons nominated exceed the number to be elected in any fire district, the secretary of such association or his deputy shall, by advertisement in at least two newspapers published daily in Melbourne, and, as far as reasonably practicable, by circular addressed to each insurance company, fix and notify the day on which the poll shall be taken.

13. Such poll shall be taken by such secretary or his deputy in the usual manner by ballot, and each candidate may appoint a scrutineer to be present at the taking of such poll and the counting of the votes. The poll shall be taken at the office of the Fire Underwriters' Association of Victoria, or at such other place as the Minister may from time to time, by notification in the *Government Gazette*, direct; and shall be open from Eleven a.m. to Four p.m.

14. The person voting on behalf of each company at any election for local committees shall be entitled to only one vote for each member to be elected.

15. The secretary, or his deputy shall forthwith, after the conclusion of the polling, and in the presence of the scrutineers (if any) open and count the ballot-papers, and such secretary or deputy shall report the result of the poll to the Minister, who shall declare the candidate having received the largest number of votes for each fire district, to be the member of the local committee of the said fire district, and shall notify such election in the *Government Gazette*.

16. In the event of an equality of votes the returning officer shall forthwith report the fact to the Minister, who shall have a casting vote. Upon the Minister giving his casting vote the candidate receiving such vote shall be deemed to be duly elected.

Fire Brigades' Representative.

17. On or before a day to be specified by the Minister, and notified in the *Government Gazette*, and by circular addressed to the fire brigades on the roll of each country fire district, such fire brigades may nominate a person to be a member of the local committee of the country fire district for which such fire brigades shall be on the roll, and the name of the person so nominated shall be sent forthwith to the returning officer.

18. If the same person shall be nominated by all such fire brigades as shall have exercised the right of nomination for any country fire district, such person shall be forthwith declared by the returning officer to be elected as a member of the local committee for the country fire district for which he shall have been nominated, and such election shall be notified in the *Government Gazette*.

19. If on the day specified and notified more than the required number of candidates for the local committee of any country fire district shall have been nominated, the returning officer shall prepare a list of all persons so nominated by fire brigades, and shall forward the same to fire brigades on the roll for such country fire district, and such fire brigades shall, before a day to be specified, at the time of forwarding such list, strike out all the names except that of the candidate for which such fire brigades desire to vote, and return the list so altered to the returning officer.

20. The returning officer shall, on receipt of such returned list, count all the votes received by him, and shall declare the candidate having received the largest number of votes to be a member of the local committee for the country fire district for which such fire brigades are enrolled. And such election shall be notified in the *Government Gazette*.

21. In the event of an equality of votes the returning officer shall forthwith report the fact to the Minister, who shall have a casting vote. Upon the Minister giving his casting vote the candidate receiving such vote shall be deemed to be duly elected.

22. In the nomination of candidates for fire brigades, the proceedings shall be conducted as near as may be to the proceedings taken in the election of captain of the brigade.

Miscellaneous.

23. Such of the insurance companies whose names are published in the *Government Gazette* as entitled to vote at the election of insurance companies' representatives on the Country Board shall be taken to be entitled to vote at any election of insurance companies' representatives on the respective local committees for the districts within which such property so insured is situate.

24. The names of the country fire brigades published in the *Government Gazette* as entitled to vote at the election of fire brigades' representatives on the Country Board shall be taken to be the roll of country fire brigades entitled to vote at any election of fire brigade representatives on the respective local committees of each country fire district in which such brigades are established.

And the Honorable Donald McLeod, His Majesty's Chief Secretary for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions therein accordingly.

Fire Brigades Act 1915.

COUNTRY FIRE BRIGADES BOARD.

REGULATIONS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the second day of October, 1916.

THE Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, under the powers in that behalf conferred upon him by the *Fire Brigades Act 1915*, doth hereby revoke the Regulations made on the first day of December, 1908, and in lieu thereof doth make the following Regulations which shall apply to those parts of the State of Victoria known as the Nine Country Fire Districts as set forth in the Second Schedule of the *Fire Brigades Act 1915*, and by Proclamations made from time to time under the provisions of sections 4 and 5 of the *Fire Brigades Act 1890*—

CLASSIFICATION OF BRIGADES.

1. For the efficient working of fire brigades the Country Fire Brigades Board may register brigades and place them under such classification as it may from time to time determine.

The classification for the present shall be as follows:—

Class A.—A complement of fifteen effective registered members, graded as follows:—Captain, lieutenant, foreman, secretary, and eleven firemen.

Class B.—A complement of twenty effective registered members, graded as follows:—Captain, lieutenant, foreman, apparatus officer, secretary, and fifteen firemen.

Class C.—A complement of twenty-five effective registered members, graded as follows:—Captain, lieutenant, foreman, apparatus officer, secretary, auxiliary station-keeper, and nineteen firemen.

Class D.—A complement of thirty effective registered members, graded as follows:—Captain, lieutenant, foreman, apparatus officer, secretary, auxiliary station-keeper, and twenty-four firemen.

Class E.—Such complement and grades as the Board may from time to time determine for the Ballarat, Ballarat City, Bendigo, Eaglehawk, and Geelong Brigades.

In addition to the complement of registered members as provided for above, brigades may elect reserve members, who will be required to attend fires, practices, and drills, and to render themselves efficient in the use of fire extinguishing apparatus. As vacancies in the ranks of registered members occur the places should be filled, as far as practicable, from the reserve. Reserve members will not be granted uniforms or permitted to have any vote or voice at brigade meetings on questions connected with the management or discipline of the brigade.

REGISTRATION MAY BE SUSPENDED.

2. Whenever any brigade by reason of deaths, resignations, or expulsions shall have reduced its roll to less than a minimum effective strength to be determined by the Board, the registration of the said brigade may be suspended, and any allowances payable thereto or salaries payable to any members thereof may be reduced or forfeited to the Board as the Board may determine. If through dissensions or other cause the efficiency of any brigade is, in the opinion of the Board, impaired registration may be suspended or the brigade may be disbanded by the Board.

NOTICE BEFORE DISBANDMENT.

3. If after one month's notice from the Board any registered brigade remains below the minimum effective strength determined by the Board the Board may cancel the registration of such brigade.

QUALIFICATIONS OF MEMBERSHIP.

4. No person shall in future be registered on the roll of any brigade unless—

- 1st. He is in good health, and sound in body and mind.
- 2nd. He is of good moral character and habits.
- 3rd. He is over the age of 18 years, and not over the age of 40 years. (For exceptions see Regulations 5 and 6.)

MAXIMUM AGE OF NEW MEMBERS.

5. No person who is over the age of 40 years shall be enrolled without the consent of the Board.

RETIRING AGE OF MEMBERS.

6. No member over the age of 55 years shall be allowed to remain on the registered roll of any brigade unless under special circumstances, and with the approval of the Board.

NEW MEMBERS.

7. In each case of persons desiring to join, after a brigade has been registered by the Board, if the candidate complies with the requirements set forth in Clause 4, and the brigade approves of him, the name and particulars of such candidate shall be submitted to the Board in such form as the Board may from time to time direct for approval or otherwise, and no person shall be recognised as a member of any brigade until his name has been approved by the Board and registered on the roll of such brigade by the Board. The Board may require a certificate from the captain of the brigade that due regard has been paid to the distribution of the membership over the area in which property has to be protected. Members shall reside within easy sound of the alarm bell.

PERSONS NOT ELIGIBLE FOR MEMBERSHIP.

8. No person shall, unless with the consent of the Board, be eligible for re-election to any brigade who has been dismissed or struck off the roll of any brigade for misconduct, or for persistent neglect to attend fires or practices, or for want of interest generally in his duty as a fireman, or for any cause, which, in the opinion of the Board, would disqualify him for membership.

TRANSFERS OF MEMBERS.

9. Members may be transferred from one brigade to another, provided the complement of the latter permits of such transfer, on production of a certificate of discharge from their former brigade, and with the approval of the Board.

LEAVE OF ABSENCE AND RESIGNATIONS.

10. Members desirous of obtaining leave of absence must apply for same in writing to their brigade, and in the event of such leave being sought for a longer period than one month, the applications must be forwarded to the Board with the brigade's recommendation.

Members desiring to retire from the membership of their brigade will be required to send in their resignations in writing to the Board through the brigade.

ANNUAL ELECTION OF OFFICERS.

11. Every brigade shall meet during the first week in December in each year, and elect by ballot the complement of officers allotted to it under its classification. All officers elected shall be effective registered members of their respective brigades, and shall hold office for the term of one year from and including the first day of January next ensuing, unless during the year they are removed from office or cease to be members of the brigade. When under the powers conferred on the Chief Officer by section 35 of the *Fire Brigades Act 1915* the Chief Officer suspends any officer of any brigade, he shall within twenty-four hours report such suspension and the reasons for it to the Board, in writing, for its inquiry and decision. The officer suspended shall be entitled to receive a copy of the Chief Officer's report to the Board, and be entitled to be heard at the inquiry. Brigades may make their own rules or resolutions with regard to the date and method of nominating for the positions of officers.

DUTIES OF OFFICERS.

12. The duties of the respective officers of every brigade shall be as follows, viz.:

The Captain.

The captain of the brigade shall see that all apparatus and buildings belonging to the Board or in charge of the brigade are kept in good condition and repair; shall take command of the brigade at fires, practices, drills, and parades; shall see that the members or persons employed do their duty faithfully; and shall enforce the regulations of the Board. He shall have power to suspend any officer, member, or permanent employee for disobedience of orders, or for delinquency in the performance of their duties, and shall forthwith report such suspension to the Board. In the absence of the chief officer or deputy chief officer of the Board the captain shall act as assistant chief officer.

The Lieutenant.

The lieutenant shall aid and assist the captain in the discharge of his duties, and obey promptly all orders he may receive from him, and in his absence shall assume command of the brigade, and be vested with all the powers of the captain.

The Foreman.

The foreman shall act with and be under the direction of the captain and lieutenant, and in their absence perform their duties. Where a station-keeper is not provided he shall take charge of all appliances, and shall be responsible for their cleanliness and the good order of the fire station. In the event of there being any defect he must immediately report same to the captain.

Apparatus Officer.

The apparatus officer shall be subject to the senior officers of the brigade and shall assist the foreman in his duties.

The Secretary.

The secretary of the brigade shall attend all meetings of the brigade, and shall enter in ink the minutes of resolutions and proceedings in a minute-book to be kept for that purpose. He shall perform, to the satisfaction of the Board and of the brigade, all such duties as may be imposed upon him, and shall, subject to the control of the Board, have charge of all books, papers, and other documents of the Board that may be in the custody of the brigade, and he shall be held responsible for all moneys of the Board which may be remitted to the brigade. He shall attend promptly to all communications received from the chief officer or secretary of the Board, and shall use despatch in forwarding reports and returns, &c., and shall keep a copy of all official correspondence. He shall forward to the secretary of the Board reports of fires within seven days of their occurrence. He shall forward a return of the roll of attendances at all fires and practices of his brigade, countersigned by the captain, on the proper forms, within the first week of each quarter to the secretary of the Board. He shall keep a register of the names of all persons who now are or who may hereafter become members of the brigade. He shall promptly send to the secretary of the Board a notification of the election or resignation of a member of the brigade. He shall send to the secretary of the Board a notification of the election of officers within seven days after such election, stating the names of the persons elected, and the offices to which they have been elected. He shall do such other things as the Board or the regulations may require, and shall receive such remuneration as the Board may determine. He shall be under the general direction of the secretary of the Board in all matters relating to office routine and management. He shall be liable to suspension, removal, or dismissal by the Board. Secretaries retiring from office shall furnish to the Board all returns to the end of the term for which they hold office, and shall hand over to their successors all moneys, books, correspondence, or other documents which are the property of the Board.

The following is a list of returns, forms, and reports to be furnished to the Board by secretaries of brigades:—

The following is a list of books and records to be kept by the secretary of each brigade, and such books and records shall be and remain the property of the Board:—

- (a) A book in which shall be entered in ink the names of every registered member of the brigade, together with his age, birthplace, occupation, residence, brigade rank, date of admission, date of leaving, and remarks; reports of fires, with full details; attendances of members at fires, alarms of fire, and monthly practices, and quarterly statements of minor supplies expenditure.

- (b) A book containing the minutes of resolutions and proceedings of the brigade, written in ink.
- (c) A book containing particulars of the horses (if any), and of all apparatus, showing in separate lists particulars of the apparatus belonging to the Board and to the brigade.
- (d) A file of all regulations and general and special circulars issued by the Board, and all inward correspondence; also copies of all outward official correspondence.
- (e) Forms for requisitions for supplies and repairs for the brigade.

All entries made in the brigade books are to be examined by the captain of the brigade, and must be produced at all meetings of the brigade, and whenever required by any officer of the Board.

DUTIES OF MEMBERS.

13. The members of each brigade shall upon an alarm of fire proceed promptly with the appliances to the fire. They shall immediately on arrival report themselves to the senior officer present, and shall perform such duty as may be required of them. They shall remain on duty until relieved by orders, which shall be given only by the officer in command. In brigades where no station-keeper is provided members are required to keep the appliances and buildings in good order without cost to the Board.

DUTIES OF EMPLOYEES.

The Station-keeper.

14. Where the classification of a brigade provides for a permanent station-keeper it shall be his duty to reside at the head station wherever practicable. He shall attend to and be responsible for the cleanliness, good order, and condition of the fire station and out-stations, and the fire-extinguishing appliances belonging to the Board or in charge of the brigade. He shall at all times be under the direction of the senior officer of the brigade present for the time being. He shall receive such remuneration as the Board may determine, and shall be liable to suspension, removal, or dismissal by the Board. Permanent station-keepers must not leave their station except when on duty without the sanction of the captain or officer in charge.

The Watchman.

Where the classification of a brigade provides for a watchman it shall be his duty to keep watch in such buildings or places, and at such hours, as the Board may from time to time direct. He shall devote his time to keeping a strict watch for fires, and be prompt in giving the alarm. He shall perform such other duties as are consistent with the position and as may be required by the Board. He shall when on the station premises be under the direction of the senior officer of the brigade present. He shall receive such remuneration as the Board may determine, and shall be liable to suspension, removal, or dismissal by the Board.

CONDUCT OF MEMBERS.

15. Members of brigades are required, in their intercourse with each other, official or social, to observe a courteous demeanour, and officers or men addressing each other will do so in a respectful manner. While on duty at fires, practices, drills, or parades, the greatest degree of silence compatible with a proper discharge of duty will be required, and members must address officers by their official titles.

Members of brigades are considered to be on duty at all times when in uniform; and at fires, alarms of fire, practices, drills, parades, or brigade meetings, whether in uniform or plain clothes. Any member of a brigade who may be deemed to be guilty of disobedience of orders, insubordination, conduct subversive of discipline, intoxication, abusive or obscene language or other unseemly conduct when on duty, shall within twenty-four hours be reported to the Board, in writing, by the senior officer of the brigade present, who may suspend such member from duty pending an inquiry by the Board. Officers below the rank of captain shall forward their reports in such cases to the captain for transmission to the Board for its decision. In exercise of the powers conferred by section 35 of the *Fire Brigades Act 1915*, the Chief Officer may suspend any member of any brigade, and shall, within twenty-four hours, report such suspension and the reasons for it to the Board, in writing, for its inquiry and decision. The member suspended shall be entitled to receive a copy of the Chief Officer's report to the Board, and be entitled to be heard at the inquiry.

The Board shall have power to deal with members against whom a charge has, in the opinion of the Board, been proven either by reprimanding them, suspending them, or by removing them from office or from the roll of registered members.

DUTIES AT FIRES.

16. At fires the senior officer present shall take command until the arrival of his senior. The brigade's duties are not completed until the fire is properly and effectually extinguished. Members must turn out to fires or alarms of fire in the Board uniform when they can do so without causing undue delay in attending.

ROLL CALL AT FIRES.

17. On returning from a fire or an alarm of fire, the officer in command shall cause the roll to be called, and record the names of members present at such fire or alarm of fire, and a copy of such roll, together with a report of the fire, signed by the officer in command at the fire and the secretary of the brigade shall be forwarded to the secretary of the Board within seven days after the occurrence of the fire. The officer in command may exempt members from returning to the fire station for roll call, and he may call the roll at the place of the fire or alarm of fire.

RECOGNITION OF LONG SERVICE.

18. Officers and members of brigades who shall have efficiently served as registered firemen not less than twelve (12) years in any one or more brigades under the Country Fire Brigades Board, shall be entitled to the Board's long-service badge; and officers and members of brigades who shall have similarly served for not less than ten (10) years shall be entitled, on retirement, to a certificate setting forth the term of such service. Applications for badges and certificates must be made on forms provided by the Board for such purpose, and they must be duly certified to by the applicant and the captain and secretary of the brigade. Service as a reserve member is not to be counted in the periods of service mentioned in this regulation.

The above regulation applies also to honorary medical officers.

Captains with not less than five years' service as captain under the Board, and not less than fifteen years' service in all, shall be entitled to retain and wear their uniforms and to wear an ex-captain's badge. Firemen with not less than twenty-five years' service, including not less than ten years under the Board, shall be entitled to retain and wear their uniforms. Service as a reserve member is not to be counted in the periods of service mentioned in this regulation.

The Board may, however, in its discretion, withhold the above privileges if the applicant shall at any time have been adjudged guilty of any offence against the Board's regulations.

BRIGADES TO REQUISITION FOR APPLIANCES, ETC.

19. Plant and appliances and supplies required by any brigade shall be requisitioned for to the Board. Requisitions shall be sent in only on the authority of a properly constituted meeting of the brigade.

A receipt for all plant and appliances and supplies received shall be forwarded to the secretary of the Board, and particulars of same entered in a book to be kept for that purpose by the secretary of each brigade.

Urgent repairs to plant may be effected by the brigade without requisition, provided the cost does not exceed £2. Where the repairs involve a larger expenditure requisition must be made to the Board.

BRIGADE RULES.

20. Each brigade may have its own rules of internal and general working, which must in all cases be subject to the approval of the Board. All proposed alterations or additions must be submitted to the Board for approval or otherwise. No rule shall be contrary or antagonistic to the Board's regulations. Every officer and member shall conform to the regulations made, or which may hereafter be made, for the management of the various fire brigades, and shall be subject to the duties, conditions, and penalties named therein. All allowances and salaries shall, at the discretion of the Board, be subject to stoppage or absolute forfeiture in the event of wilful violation of the regulations.

PRACTICES.

21. The members of each brigade shall be practised in their duties at engine, reel, or other drill, at least once each calendar month, under the supervision of their officers, and at such other time as the Board, chief officer, or captain may direct. During the winter months or in inclement weather brigades may hold their monthly practice or drill indoors.

A recognised practice shall mean practical work in fire extinction, or other drill, for at least three-quarters of an hour. Brigades are required to see that the fire plugs are at all times kept in good order.

Each brigade may appoint its own dates for practice, and moonlight nights should be selected when practicable.

EFFECTIVE MEMBERS.

22. Every member of a brigade must make himself effective by attending fires and practices. An effective member shall mean one who has, each half-year, attended at least two-thirds each of the fires, or alarms of fire, and also of the recognised monthly practices, except in the case of brigades of Class E, in which, owing to the large number of calls, an attendance of 50 per cent. will be sufficient to render members effective. Any member who has failed to keep himself effective in such attendances, without leave or sufficient excuse, shall be liable to be struck off the register by the Board. Members are expected to attend all brigade meetings, but these meetings must not be counted towards the attendances required for effectiveness.

ALLOWANCE FOR PURCHASE OF MINOR SUPPLIES.

23. An allowance will be provided for every brigade for the purchase of such minor supplies, and for defraying cost of such repairs to plant, as may be required for the ordinary maintenance of the brigade. The total amount of such allowance must not exceed in any one year the amount provided for in the Board's estimates. Such allowance shall be available quarterly, and the vouchers for such expenditure, showing full particulars of the purchases made or repairs effected, duly certified by the captain and secretary of the brigade, and receipted in proper form, must be forwarded to the secretary of the Board for examination, not later than the 21st day in the months of January, April, July, and October in each year. Such expenditure shall be subject to the approval of the Board, who may disallow any or all of it.

ALLOWANCES FOR EXPENSES AT FIRES, PRACTICES, ETC.

24. An allowance, to be determined by the Board, will be granted to every brigade for the purpose of defraying the incidental expenses of the brigade, and for expenses incurred while on duty at fires and recognised practices, and in connexion with the annual demonstrations. Such allowance is not to be regarded as remuneration for services rendered, and must not be divided amongst individual members.

DEMONSTRATIONS AND COMPETITIONS.

25. Brigades shall at no time attend fire brigades competitions or demonstrations outside a radius of 5 miles from the head station without leaving a sufficient number of effective registered members within their respective districts—that is to say, five members of a brigade classed A, seven of a brigade classed B, eight of a brigade classed C, and ten of any class above C. Neither will any of the apparatus (with the exception of a competition reel and appliances) be permitted to be taken to a competition or demonstration without the written consent of the Board. Captains will be held responsible for the carrying out of this regulation.

BRIGADE DISTRICT.

26. The district within which each registered brigade shall be liable to do duty shall be that portion that is within the boundary of the municipal district or township, or portion of township, in which the brigade is established, and on the rateable property of which the Council of the said municipal district is assessed under the Act.

Such municipal district or township, or portion of township, as the case may be, shall be known and designated as the brigade district under the name of the said municipal district or township, or portion of township, as the case may be.

UNIFORMS.

27. The uniforms for registered firemen will be provided by the Board and shall consist of a coat with arm badge, cap, belt, and spanner for brigades of fifteen, twenty, and twenty-five men. Helmets will be supplied to brigades in cases where the Board considers they are required.

Coat.—To be of stout blue cloth, with the exception of the Ballarat, Geelong, and Newtown and Chilwell Brigades, which are to be of stout scarlet cloth. The pattern to be double-breasted, extra long reefer, with turn-down collar, two inside breast pockets, four metal buttons to be sown on each side of coat 6 inches apart, buttons to bear an impressed design of the Southern Cross on a shield surmounted by a helmet and surrounded by the words Country Fire Brigades, Victoria. The coats of all ranks to be of the same quality and pattern. Coats are to be buttoned from the left on to the right breast.

Arm Badge.—Scroll pattern with the name of brigade worked on in red letters, except for the Ballarat, Geelong, and Newtown and Chilwell Brigades, the lettering in these cases being white. The badge is to be worn on left sleeve of coat midway between the shoulder and elbow.

Cap.—Yachting cap pattern, black leather drooping peak, band of black Hercules braid $\frac{1}{4}$ inches wide, with red tracing braid 1-16 inch wide sewn both above and below same, black patent-leather chin strap secured by two small metal buttons with letters C.F.B.B. impressed. The caps of captains and lieutenants will have gold tracing braid in place of red tracing braid. Officers will wear on their caps a metal badge to indicate their rank. White linen covers of approved pattern may be worn on caps in hot weather.

Belt.—Stout black leather belt, 2 inches wide, with spanner, frog, and loops. Brass buckle to be between third and fourth row of coat buttons, belt hooks to be attached to the uniform coat, and the belt must be buckled so that the point of it may be towards the left hip.

Spanner.—Round iron spanner pointed at end.

Helmet.—Stout black leather helmet, with chin strap and brass-rimmed front.

Members must provide their own trousers and cap covers. Trousers should be of dark-blue or black cloth either plain or with scarlet piping, or with scarlet cloth stripes $\frac{1}{4}$ inches wide. Brigades should be uniform as regards pipings or stripes on trousers. All articles of uniform provided by the Board must at all times be kept clean, and captains must inspect same at least twice a year, either at practice or at a monthly meeting, and report on condition of same to the Board. Members must not alter or in any way add to the uniforms without the consent of the Board. Long service badges are to be worn on left breast of uniform coat and long service clasps are to be worn $\frac{1}{2}$ inch below the badge. Members qualified in ambulance work should wear their medals or badges.

No member will be allowed to lend a uniform or any part of it to any person not in the service. Flowers are not to be worn in coats, and tan boots should not be worn. Members must not at any time appear dressed partly in uniform and partly in plain clothes, except in case of emergency at fires. At the chief officer's inspection full uniform must be worn.

The uniform and equipment are the property of the Board, and they are only loaned to members. A receipt for same must be obtained by the secretary of the brigade, who must retain and file it. Members must use reasonable care in keeping uniforms and equipments in good order and must return same to the captain of the brigade or to the chief officer on being requested in writing to do so. If a member fails to comply within seven days of the transmission to him of such request he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5, and shall, in addition to the penalty named, be further liable for and shall pay the cost of any article not returned.

WHEREAS by the Tramways Act 1915 it is provided that tramways may be constructed in any municipal district (except the municipal districts of Fitzroy, Collingwood, Prahran, Kew, Port Melbourne, and St. Kilda), when authorized by an Order of the Governor in Council made in that behalf, upon the application of the council of the municipality in compliance with the provisions of the said Act, and of the rules and regulations to be from time to time made by the Governor in Council: And whereas the Footscray Tramways Trust, in pursuance with the powers vested in it under the provisions of the Footscray Tramways Act 1915 (No. 2816), and under the provisions of the Tramways Act 1915 (No. 2739), has now made application in accordance with the said Acts and the Rules and Regulations made by the Governor in Council thereunder for an Order by the Governor in Council authorizing the construction of certain tramways within the municipal district of the city of Footscray: And whereas the Governor in Council being satisfied that the requirements of the said Acts and of the Rules and Regulations made by the Governor in Council thereunder have been duly complied with by the said Trust, and that notice of the intention of the said Trust to make the said application in which notice the routes proposed to be followed were described, and persons objecting to the same were called on to lodge their objections within the time required by the Regulations, has been duly published as required by the Rules and Regulations made by the Governor in Council, in pursuance of the said Acts in that behalf, and that no objection to the said application has been lodged within the time provided in the said Rules, and being satisfied also that it is expedient and proper that the said application should be granted, has determined to grant the same subject to the restrictions and conditions hereinafter contained: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Acts, doth for the purpose aforesaid make the Order following (that is to say):—

That the Footscray Tramways Trust shall be and is hereby authorized to construct certain tramways in the municipal district of the city of Footscray.

ROUTES.

That the routes of such tramways shall be as follows:—

- A. Commencing at the intersection of Leeds-street and Irving-street; thence along Leeds-street, Hopkins-street, Droop-street, and Ballarat-road to Summerhill-road.
- B. Commencing at the intersection of Barkly-street and Nicholson-street; thence westerly along Barkly-street to Russell-street.
- C. Commencing at the intersection of Irving-street and Leeds-street; thence along Irving-street, Nicholson-street, Buckley-street, Victoria-street, Charles-street, Gamon-street, and Somerville-road to Williamstown-road.
- D. Commencing at the intersection of Nicholson-street and Buckley-street; thence southerly along Nicholson-street and Hyde-street to Francis-street.

GAUGE.

That the gauge of such tramway shall be four feet eight and a half inches (4 ft. 8½ in.), and that the said tramways shall be constructed in the manner set out and described in the working plans and specifications numbered from 1 to 14 inclusive, now deposited in the Public Works Department, and which plans and specifications are indorsed with a memorandum of the Minister of Public Works identifying the said plans and specifications so deposited as the plans and specifications referred to in this Order, and which plans and specifications are to be deemed to be incorporated in this Order, and to be as much part of the same as if they were set out in detail in this Order.

MOTIVE POWER.

That the motive power to be used upon the said tramways shall be electricity.

MAXIMUM SPEED.

That the maximum speed of the progression of the cars upon the said tramways shall not exceed the following, viz.:—

- Along Irving-street, ten (10) miles per hour.
- Along all portions of the tramway laid with a double track, with cars equipped with magnetic brakes, fifteen (15) miles per hour; and with cars equipped with hand brakes, twelve (12) miles per hour.
- Along all portions of the tramway laid with single tracks, with cars equipped with magnetic brakes, twenty (20) miles per hour; and with cars equipped with hand brakes, fifteen (15) miles per hour.
- Along all portions of the tramway on roads fifty (50) feet wide, with cars equipped with magnetic brakes, fifteen (15) miles per hour; and with cars equipped with hand brakes, twelve (12) miles per hour.

TIME OF COMPLETION.

That the tramways shall be completed and open for traffic within a period of two (2) years from the date of the Order in Council authorizing the construction of the said tramways.

TRAFFIC.

That the tramways shall be used for the carriage of passengers and such parcels or packages as they may have in their possession.

NECESSARY PRECAUTIONS FOR SAFETY OF PASSENGERS AND PUBLIC TO BE OBSERVED.

That every precaution necessary to secure the safety of the passengers upon the said tramways, and also to secure the safety of passengers passing along the streets upon the routes of such tramways, shall be taken and ordered by the Footscray Tramways Trust.

STOPPAGES FOR TAKING UP AND SETTING DOWN PASSENGERS.

That for the convenience of the public the cars shall stop for the purpose of taking up and setting down passengers at the intersection of such streets as are indicated by notice-boards or other sufficient devices erected at such intersections to be stopping points, and at such other points upon the routes of the said tramways as may be convenient, and in such manner as not to interfere with or endanger the general traffic of the streets or the safety of the passengers in the cars.

TOLLS AND CHARGES.

That the charges to be made upon the said tramways shall be One penny for each passenger on each of the following sections, or part thereof:—

- (1) From Footscray Railway Station to corner of Droop-street and Ballarat-road;
- (2) From Geelong-road to Gordon-street;
- (3) From corner of Droop-street and Ballarat-road to Summerhill-road;
- Or a through fare over the above sections (by ticket), 1½d.
- (4) From Footscray Railway Station to Commercial-road via Barkly-street;
- (5) From Barkly-place to Eleanor-street;
- (6) From Commercial-road to Russell-street via Barkly-street;
- Or a through fare over the above sections (by ticket), 1½d.
- (7) From Footscray Railway Station to corner of Charles and Gamon streets;
- (8) From corner of Buckley and Victoria streets to corner of Somerville-road and Gamon-street;
- (9) From corner of Charles and Gamon streets to corner of Somerville and Williamstown roads;
- Or a through fare over the above sections (by ticket), 1½d.
- (10) From Footscray Railway Station to Princess-street via Nicholson-street;
- (11) From Railway overhead bridge to Lennox-street;
- (12) From Princess-street to Francis-street via Nicholson and Hyde streets;
- Or a through fare over the above sections (by ticket), 1½d.

That the Trust is empowered to sell the tickets referred to above at eight (8) for One shilling (1s.).

For each child under twelve years of age (other than children under four years of age carried on passenger's lap, who shall be carried free), One penny for any one of the above sections, or for any two continuous sections; provided, however, that for any one or more sections the fare to be charged for two children travelling together under the age of twelve years shall not exceed the fare charged for one adult.

WORKMEN'S TICKETS.

That power is given to the Trust to sell workmen's tickets at One shilling (1s.) per dozen, such tickets to be available for traffic only before 8 a.m. and between the hours of 5 and 6.30 p.m., with the right to travel over any two continuous sections referred to above.

CONTINUOUS SECTIONS.

That power is also given to the Trust to make a charge of Twopence (2d.) for a continuous journey over any three continuous sections of the tramways of the Trust, and for each child under twelve (12) years of age (other than children under four years of age carried on passenger's lap, who shall be carried free), a fare of One penny for any three continuous sections referred to.

With power also to make a charge of Threepence (3d.) for a continuous journey over any four continuous sections of the tramways of the Trust, and for each child under twelve (12) years of age (other than children under four years of age carried on passenger's lap, who shall be carried free), a fare of One penny and a half (1½d.) for any four continuous sections referred to.

SPECIAL TICKETS TO SCHOOL CHILDREN.

That the charge to be made for return tickets to school children under the age of sixteen years over any two sections shall be One penny, and for any four sections Twopence, subject to such conditions as to the days on and the hours between which such return tickets shall be available as the Trust may by regulations determine, also in such regulations to limit the right of travel in respect of such return tickets to a portion only of the car.

MINIMUM OR THROUGH FARES FOR ANY SPECIFIED DISTANCE.

That power is hereby given to the Trust to run cars at minimum or through fares upon the said tramways for any specified distance, provided that the amount of such minimum or through fare shall not exceed the total sum of the sectional fares upon such tramway or such parts of such tramway over which the cars shall be run. Every such car shall have a notice or notices plainly exhibited on the outside of such car indicating its destination and the minimum fare chargeable thereon.

SPECIAL CARS.

That the charge to be made—

- (1) for the hire of a special car, with a seating capacity not exceeding thirty-six persons, 1s. 6d. per car mile between the hours of 6 a.m. and midnight, and 2s. 6d. per car mile after midnight;
- (2) for the hire of a special car, with a seating capacity exceeding thirty-six persons, 2s. 6d. per car mile between 6 a.m. and midnight, and 3s. 6d. per car mile after midnight. The car mileage shall be the mileage run by the car from the time of its leaving the depot until its return thereto. Provided always, however, that a minimum charge of £1 1s. may be made for the hiring of any special car between 6.30 a.m. and midnight, and £2 2s. between midnight and 1 a.m., and the sum of 5s. per hour per car for detention during the journey for which such special car is hired.

FARES IN CASE OF COMBINED TRAM AND RAILWAY PASSENGERS.

Nothing herein contained shall prevent the Trust from entering into any arrangement with the Railways Commissioners to sell through tickets to travel over both tramway and railway, and in that case charging or providing for the payment of fares at a lower rate than those specified in this Order in respect of passengers travelling over both tramway and railway.

TRAMWAY WHERE CROSSING OVER THE BENDIGO LINE AT NICHOLSON-STREET, FOOTSCRAY.

(a) That in respect of the tramway crossing over the Bendigo line at Nicholson-street, the Trust shall defray the whole cost of the tramway crossing over the railway lines, and one-half of the cost of the provision of the interlocked gates, signal box and signals, and of such other interlocking, catch points, and safety appliances as may be in the judgment of the Railways Commissioners be necessary in connexion with such crossing.

(b) That the Trust shall reimburse the Commissioners the cost of the maintenance and upkeep of such crossing, and one-half of the cost of the maintenance and upkeep of the gates, signal box, signals, interlocking, catch points, and other safety appliances.

(c) That the Trust shall reimburse the Commissioners one-half of the cost of the wages and expenses of the signalmen required to operate the gates and signals; less the present cost of operating the gates.

(d) That the tramway shall; so far as regards its use, running and maintenance on or across the railway lines, be under the absolute control of and subject to all such by-laws, regulations, and orders as may from time to time be made by the Commissioners, who shall not, however, be in any way liable in respect of any damage or injury which may in any manner occur to any person or to any property in consequence of the said tramway crossing the railway lines except such damage or injury arise from the negligence or default of the Commissioners, and that the tramway service shall at all times be subordinate to the railway requirements.

(e) That in the event of the regrading, and duplication, or of either, of that portion of the Bendigo line where the tramway crosses it, the Trust shall pay to the Commissioners such sum of money towards the cost of the regrading and duplication, or of either, as may be determined by the Governor in Council, having regard to the benefits which will arise from the abolition of the level crossing; provided that such contribution shall not exceed the capitalized amount of the annual value of the benefits to the Trust occasioned by the abolition of the level crossing; and that, in arriving at the value of such benefits, any expenditure incurred by the Trust in the alteration of road levels as the result of the regrading and duplication, or of either, of the line shall be taken into consideration.

(f) That in view of the intention to adopt electric traction for the purpose of operating the trains on that portion of the Bendigo line, the Trust or the authority which operates or controls the tramway shall bear one-half of the cost of any special work or works in connexion with the electrical plant and equipment of the railways or of the tramway which, in the opinion of the Commissioners, may be necessary in order to provide for the safe working of the railways and tramway traffic over the railway lines on the level, but the Trust or the authority which operates or controls the tramway shall not be entitled to a reimbursement of the cost of any such special work in the event of the subsequent construction of a bridge to carry the vehicular and tramway traffic over or under the railway lines, and in such event the Trust or the authority which operates or controls the tramway shall also bear the cost of any other work or works or alterations which may be necessary to the tramway line in consequence thereof.

TRAMWAY WHERE PASSING UNDER WILLIAMSTOWN RAILWAY LINE AT FOOTSCRAY.

That in respect of the tramway passing under the Nicholson-street railway bridge at Footscray, any wires and other attachments which require to be fixed to the bridge shall be so fixed and subsequently maintained at the expense of the Trust and to the satisfaction of the Commissioners.

ELECTRIC WIRES CROSSING LINES OF RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS TO BE CONSTRUCTED SO AS NOT TO INTERFERE.

Any electric line or lines in connexion with the said tramways which would cross under or over any wire of the Commissioners, or which would, in the opinion of the Commissioners, be in a position likely, if special precautions be not taken, to prejudicially affect the operation of the trains when electrified, or the maintenance of telegraphic or telephonic communication, or the transmission of signals on adjacent wires of the Commissioners, shall, to the satisfaction of and without any expense to the Commissioners, be so placed, constructed, guarded, and maintained as not to be capable, in the opinion of the Commissioners, of injuring or coming into contact with any wire of the Commissioners, or of prejudicially affecting or interfering, either mechanically or electrically, with the proper use of any such wire.

COST OF ALTERATION TO POSTAL WIRES INCIDENTAL TO USE OF ELECTRICITY.

In the event of the Postal Department demanding any special alteration of its wires in consequence of the introduction of a high-tension or other electrical current in connexion with the said tramways, the cost of any special arrangement of or provision for the wires because of such current shall be paid and borne by the Trust.

GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL TO BE SOLE JUDGE OF BREACH OF ORDER.

That the Governor in Council shall be sole judge of the compliance with, or of the breach of, any of the requirements contained in this Order, and for the purpose of enabling the Governor in Council to arrive at a just decision, an inquiry into the facts of each case shall be conducted in the manner provided in clause 25 of the Regulations contained in the Second Schedule, to the *Tramways Act 1915* before an officer to be appointed in that behalf by the Governor in Council as provided in the Regulations in the said Schedule.

If, upon report to the Governor in Council by the referee, made under the said clause 25 of the Regulations in the Second Schedule of the said Act, the Governor in Council shall, as such sole judge, determine that there has been any failure of or non-compliance with, or that any breach of any of the requirements contained in this Order has occurred by way either of commission or omission, then the powers conferred by this Order shall be forfeited, or shall cease and determine, or shall be suspended, as the Governor in Council shall direct; and in the case of the Governor in Council ordering a suspension only of such powers, then the Governor in Council shall, in his adjudication, state for what period such suspension shall take effect.

If in such adjudication the Governor in Council shall determine that the powers conferred by this Order shall be forfeited, or shall wholly cease and determine, then the Footscray Tramways Trust shall forthwith proceed to restore the streets along which the said routes are laid out to their condition previous to the construction of such tramways, unless the Governor in Council otherwise order.

That, in the event of the Trust finding it necessary to provide work of a more substantial or expensive character than that provided for in this Order, the said Trust shall take upon itself all such additional expenditure, and no claim whatever shall be made upon the Government, or upon the Board of Land and Works, for any pecuniary assistance or aid in respect of such expenditure, or to provide funds therefor.

And the Honorable Frederick William Hagelthorn, for and on behalf of His Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions accordingly.

WHEREAS by the *Tramways Act 1915* it is provided that tramways may be constructed in any municipal district (except in the municipal districts of Fitzroy, Collingwood, Prahran, Kew, Port Melbourne, and St. Kilda), when authorized by an Order of the Governor in Council made in that behalf, upon the application of the council of the municipality in compliance with the provisions of the said Act, and of the Rules and Regulations to be from time to time made by the Governor in Council: And whereas the *Tramways Act 1890* was amended by Acts Nos. 2484 and 2541 extending the powers contained in the *Tramways Act 1890* so as to allow of tramways being constructed within the cities of Melbourne and Brunswick and the town of Coburg: And whereas by an Order in Council dated the 31st day of August 1915 under provisions of the *Brunswick and Coburg Tramways Act 1914* No. 2484 and the *Melbourne Brunswick and Coburg Tramways Act 1914* No. 2541, the Melbourne Brunswick and Coburg Tramways Trust was authorized to construct certain tramways within the municipal districts of the cities of Melbourne and

Brunswick and the town of Coburg: And whereas the Melbourne Brunswick and Coburg Tramways Trust in pursuance of the powers vested in it under the provisions of the *Brunswick and Coburg Tramways Act 1914* No. 2484 and the *Melbourne Brunswick and Coburg Tramways Act 1914* No. 2541 and the *Tramways Act 1915* No. 2739 has now made application to have the said Order in Council amended and extended in the manner hereafter referred to and the said Melbourne Brunswick and Coburg Tramways Trust having duly complied with the requirements of the said Acts and the Regulations made thereunder with regard to the publication of its intention to so apply, and the Governor in Council being satisfied that it is expedient and proper that the said application should be granted has determined to grant the same subject to the restrictions and conditions set out in the Order in Council dated the thirty-first day of August, 1915.

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Acts, doth for the purpose aforesaid make the Order following, that is to say:—

That the Melbourne Brunswick and Coburg Tramways Trust shall be and is hereby authorized to amend and extend the sections of the tramways, also the tolls and charges upon said sections of the said tramways as provided in the said Order in Council dated the 31st August 1915 in the manner set out and described in amended sections hereafter referred to and that the said sections and tolls and charges to be made upon the said sections shall be in lieu of the sections set out and described in the said Order in Council dated the 31st August, 1915.

Amended Sections.

That the charges to be made upon the said tramways shall be One penny for each passenger on each of the following sections or part thereof:—

1. From Queensberry-street to Princes-street, *via* Madeline, Elgin, and Lygon streets.
2. From the intersection of Elgin-street and Lygon-street to Weston-street, *via* Lygon-street.
3. From Weston-street to Albion-street, *via* Lygon-street.
4. From Albion-street to the intersection of Sydney-road and Moreland-road, *via* Holmes-street and Moreland-road.
5. From the intersection of Sydney-road and Moreland-road to Bell-street, *via* Sydney-road.
6. From Bell-street to the terminus at Baker's-road, *via* Sydney-road.
7. From the intersection of Moreland-road and Holmes-street to Bell-street, *via* Nicholson-street.

With power to the Trust to enter into arrangements with the Tramway Board or other authority or authorities conferring the right to provide for a penny overlapping section upon the tramways of the Trust and the tramways of the Tramway Board or other authority or authorities, and also to enter into arrangements with the said Tramway Board for the issue by the Trust's conductors of a transfer ticket to passengers to travel over that portion of the said Board's tramways which travel along St. Kilda-road and Swanston-street Melbourne, and Madeline-street Carlton, between the intersection of City-road and St. Kilda-road Melbourne, and the intersection of Queensberry and Madeline streets Carlton, and for the issue by the Board's conductors of a transfer ticket to passengers to travel over that portion of the Trust's tramways which travel along Madeline, Elgin, and Lygon streets from the intersection of Queensberry and Madeline streets to the intersection of Lygon and Princes street Carlton, on payment by passengers on the Trust's tramways of one penny in addition to the ordinary fare chargeable on the said Trust's tramways and on payment of twopence by passengers on the said portion of the Board's tramways respectively.

For each child under twelve years of age (other than children under four years of age carried on passenger's lap, who shall be carried free) one penny for any one of the above sections, or for any two continuous sections, provided, however, that for any one or more sections the fare to be charged for two children travelling together under the age of twelve years, shall not exceed the fare charged for one adult.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF A RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE TOWNSHIP OF YARRAGON.

WE, John Patrick Mahony, George Houston Murray, Michael O'Brien, William Henry Davies, Charles Hollier, Henry Matthews, and Thomas O'Toole, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 25th September, 1906, as a site for Public Recreation in the township of Yarragon, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes,

sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve; nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish; nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. No person shall camp in the Reserve nor erect therein any dwelling, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained.

7. No person shall bring into the Reserve any carriage, cart, or other vehicle without the permission, in writing, of the committee of management.

8. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, may be required to deposit any sum which the committee of management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein,

during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee; and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the committee of management.

9. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 181 of the *Land Act* 1915, be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by any member of the police force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.
