CITY OF CAMBERWELL. BY-LAW No. 40.

A By-law of the City of Camberwell, made under the provisions of section 198 of the Local Government Act 1915, and numbered 40, for regulating, controlling, restricting or preventing the exhibition of advertise-

ments.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1915, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Camberwell order as follows:—

(1) No person shall exhibit any advertisement in any place, in such manner, or by such means, as to affect injuriously the amonities of a public park, or pleasure promenade or disfigure the natural beauty of any land-scape within the municipal district of Camberwell.

(2) No person shall attach, fix or paint on any hoarding, building, fence or tree, within the municipal district of Camberwell any advertisement which in the opinion of the Council is unsightly or objectionable.

(3) Every person guilty of any wilful breach or default contrary to the provisions of this By-law shall be liable on conviction for such offence to a penalty not exceeding £10 (Ten pounds).

(4) This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the city of Camberwell.

The before-mentioned rates and charges are made for one year commencing on the 1st day of January 1917 and ending on the 31st day of December 1917 and shall be due and payable on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July 1917.

4. On every hotel or wineshop of the annual value of £30 or under a minimum rate of £2 per annum.

5. On every hotel or wineshop above the annual value of £30 the sum of 6 per cent. per annum on the valuation provided that the charge shall not in any case be less than £2.

6. On unoccupied lands and lands on which no tene-

6. On unoccupied lands and lands on which no tenements are erected, nor water laid on, the sum of £5 per cent on the annual valuation. Should water be laid on, the charge to be in accordance with rates fixed in this By-law for tenements.

7. On livery, coach, and hotel stables at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for the first stall and 7s. 6d. per annum for each additional stall. In open sheds used for stabling, each six feet to be considered one stall. For horses kept on private premises, Ten shillings per annum for first horse kept and 7s. 6d. for each additional horse kent. tional horse kept.

Cows to be be paid for at the rate of One shilling

Cows to be be paid for at the rate of One shilling per annum each.

Water troughs Ten shillings per annum each.

8. Water supplied by meter to be at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons except to manufacturers, cerated water makers, &c., to whom the charge shall be One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons, provided that not less than 60,000 gallons per annum is consumed, failing which the charge shall be One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

9. Water supplied by meter separate from house connexion for irrigation of gardens, nurseries, cricket grounds, &c., to be charged for at the rate of One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons, provided that the minimum quantity charged for shall be 20,000 gallons per annum.

10. For water supplied to buildings in course of erection, the charge shall be Twenty shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for brickwork, stonework, or plastering, or should the Trust require a meter to be put on the rate shall be One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

11. For water supplied to steam boilers the charge shall be at the rate of Ten shillings per horse-power per annum.

shall be at the rate of Ten shillings per horse-power per anum.

12. The charge for water supplied for mining purposes shall be as per agreement.

13. The rates and charges shall be payable by equal half-yearly instalments, in advance, on the first day of January, and the first day of July, 1917, except in cases where the Trust has made especial agreement regarding the time of payment for water supplied by measure or for mining purposes.

14. Such person or persons as the Chairman and Commissioners of the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect or recover such rates and charges.
