THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Seymour Waterworks Trust, a portion of the Waterworks District of which Trust has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purpose of the *Water Act* 1915, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the By-law following:—

Water supplied by measure shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly, where the water is used for domestic and other than domestic purposes, shall be the quantity which at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the assessed rate for the half-year which would be payable in respect of the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. In cases where water is sold by measure for other than domestic use solely, the charge shall be One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, or such price as may be specially agreed upon, and the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly shall be 27,000 gallons.

7. The foregoing rates are hereby made payable in equal moieties on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1917.

4. For every house or tenement of Twenty-seven pounds annual municipal value and upwards, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.

5. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land of Twenty pounds municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling; over Twenty pounds municipal value, One shilling in the pound per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.

6. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, a charge of Four shillings per thousand gallons shall be made; and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at the price named, would be equal to the rate payable in respect of the property; so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

That a sugar tax of Two shillings and sixpence on every assessment shall be charged, and shall be collected at the same time as the before-mentioned charges.

That the above-named rates and charges shall be payable half-yearly in advance, first payment on the first day of January, 1917, and the second payment on the first day of July, 1917.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Carisbrook Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

Provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure (and except in cases where the Trust has made special arrangements).

8. A minimum of Ten shillings and a maximum of Two pounds to every person using a hose for garden or stable watering during the year.

9. Such rates and charges are hereby made payable yearly in advance, on the first day of January, 1917.

10. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

3. A rate of Ten shillings on each allotment or piece of land vacant or not built upon.

4. For every water trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust, a sum of Two pounds.

5. For water supplied by measure from the works of the Trust, Two shillings and sixpence for every one thousand gallons. Provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure (and except in cases where the Trust has made special arrangements).

6. A minimum of Ten shillings and a maximum of Two pounds for every person using a hose for garden or stable watering during the year.

7. Such rates and charges are hereby made, payable yearly in advance, on the first day of January, 1917.

8. Such person or persons as the Commissioners may from time to time appoint are hereby authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

Provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure (and except in cases where the Trust has made special arrangements).

7. A minimum of Ten shillings and a maximum of Two pounds for every person using a hose for garden or stable watering during the year.

By-law No. 81.

THE following rates and charges are those which the occupiers and owners of land liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1917 in respect of water supplied by the Trust to windmills, pumps, water-holes, dams, or other excavations within Divisions I., II., and III. of the Rural District of the Trust:—

1. Every person who has a water-hole, dam, or excavation which has already been supplied, or can be supplied with water by gravitation from the Trust's channels, shall pay to the Trust the sum of Ten shillings per annum for each such water-hole, dam, or excavation.

2. The occupier or owner of land on which such dam, water-hole, or excavation shall be constructed shall make and keep in a proper state of repair all offtakes, drains, sub-channels, culverts, and pipes as are necessary to fill such water-hole, dam, or excavation without waste of water and without danger to the public, to the satisfaction of the officers of the said Shire of Tungamah Waterworks Trust.

3. Every occupier or owner of land on which any water-hole, dam, or excavation is situated shall upon receiving written notice from the caretaker of the said Shire of Tungamah Waterworks Trust that water is available, proceed within twenty-four hours to fill his water-hole, dam, or excavation, and shall continue without waste until it is filled, and shall cut the water off at the main channel on completion.

4. A register of all water-holes, dams, and excavations shall be kept by the caretaker of the said Shire of Tungamah Waterworks Trust, and the sum of Ten shillings shall be payable to him in respect of each water-hole, dam, or excavation entered in such register, annually, in advance, on the first day of January, 1917.

Notice in writing shall be given annually to each rate-payer in respect of the number of water-holes, dams, or excavations for which he is responsible.

5. Every person having a windmill, pump, or pipe for the purpose of taking water from the Trust's channels, weirs, or water-course shall provide same with a valve, which may be locked and controlled by the said Trust, and shall pay to the said Trust the sum of One pound, annually, in advance, for the use of such windmill, pump, or pipe.

MORTLAKE WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR YEAR 1917.

THE Commissioners of the Mortlake Waterworks Trust do hereby under the provisions of the *Water Act 1915* and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act make the following By-law to deal with the rateable property within the Waterworks District of the Mortlake Waterworks Trust and with the minimum charges and the charges for the sale of water from the works of the Trust.

(1) For every house including not more than $\frac{1}{4}$ acre of land and of annual municipal value of £20 and under the minimum charge shall be Thirty-six shillings.

(2) For every house &c. of annual municipal value of £21 to £60 inclusive a rate of Two shillings and sixpence in the £1 shall be paid and any such properties exceeding £60 annual municipal value shall pay a rate in addition of One shilling in the £1 for every pound over and above £60.

(3) Land adjoining the properties, whose annual value does not exceed £20, shall be charged at the rate of Two shillings for each quarter acre over and above the $\frac{1}{4}$ acre allowed with the house, up to a maximum of Ten shillings.

(4) Unoccupied lands and allotments shall be charged for as follows:—

Not exceeding $\frac{1}{4}$ acre 7s. 6d., not exceeding $\frac{1}{2}$ acre 10s., not exceeding 1 acre 12s. 6d., not exceeding $1\frac{1}{2}$ acres 15s., not exceeding 2 acres 20s., and more than 2 acres, 25s.

(5) The charge for water supplied by the Trust by measurement except in cases of special arrangement with the Trust shall be One shilling and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons.

(6) For water supplied to the Botanic Gardens, Recreation Reserve, Government buildings, Mechanics' Hall, churches, cattle yards and similar properties the charge shall be by measurement or by special arrangement. If charged by measurement the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons provided that the minimum quantity to be charged for shall not be less in each case than the following:—

Churches, Masonic Hall, Temperance Hall, Court House, 25,000 gallons.
Mechanics' Institute, Shire Hall, cattle yards, trucking yards, Botanic Gardens, Recreation Reserve, 35,000 gallons.
Police station and residence, State School, railway station and residence, 80,000 gallons.

(7) The charge for private water troughs shall be for every allotment with or without house up to 2 acres. Two shillings per annum and over 2 acres Five shillings per annum.

(8) For every public water trough the charge shall be Five pounds per annum.

(9) The Trust may in writing intimate to any owner or occupier using water for domestic or other purposes that the water supplied is to be charged for by measure and may by such notice require such owner or occupier to provide and fix a meter within twenty-one days after the sending of such notice and thereupon such owner or occupier shall within the time specified and at his own expense provide and fix a meter.

(10) Provided that where any person desires to have the service-pipe of the Trust extended to his property and is willing to pay the cost of such extension, the Trust shall have power to make a special agreement with him regarding the payment for the water supplied.

(11) Water supplied to market gardeners shall be charged for by measurement only and the minimum charge for same shall be fixed by the Trust.

(12) For a supply of water during the erection of new buildings there shall be a charge of Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brick-work, cement or plastering or if there be no contract, then upon the value or upon the amount charged or paid for such work.

(13) In all cases not herein provided for, the Trust shall make such special provision as may be deemed necessary.

(14) In the event of any dispute which may arise regarding the charge made by the Trust, the Trust shall have the power to decide or to make a special charge.

(15) The before-mentioned rates and charges shall be payable in advance on the 1st day of January 1917 except in the cases of water supplied by measure the charges for which shall be made six-monthly and shall be payable on the 30th May and 30th November in each year.

(16) For water supplied from stand-pipe or hydrant there shall be a charge for every 200 gallons or under the sum of One shilling.

(17) Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may appoint from time to time for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive and collect the said rates and charges.

In the construction of the By-law the word person shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation whether aggregate or sole and the word "Trust" shall mean the "Mortlake Waterworks Trust."

No. 4. For water supplied to public troughs in the streets, except council troughs, a charge of Two pounds (£2) per annum shall be paid.

No. 5. That water supplied to troughs other than public troughs must be paid for by meter or by special agreement, at such rates, upon such terms, and subject to such conditions as the Trust and the persons requiring such supply may agree to adopt.

No. 6. For water supplied by a meter, a charge of One shilling (1s.) per 1,000 gallons shall be made, provided that no person pays less than the preceding Regulations, and One shilling (1s.) per 1,000 gallons for all in excess.

No. 7. The foregoing rates are made payable in equal moieties on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1917.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1917.

The following are the rates and charges which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1917 in respect of water supplied by the said Trust within the Urban District:—

1. For every house and tenement of up to Twelve (12) pounds annual municipal value, the sum of One (1) pound sterling.

2. For every house and tenement of Twelve (12) pounds and over, annual municipal value, a rate of One shilling and ninepence (1s. 9d.) in the pound sterling.

3. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land, a rate of One shilling and ninepence (1s. 9d.) in the pound sterling shall be paid up to One pound maximum.

4. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for when used for domestic and other than domestic purposes shall be the quantity which, at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equivalent to the quantity of water which the owner or occupier would be entitled to receive according to his assessed rate for the year if supplied otherwise than by measure. Where water is used solely for other than domestic purposes it shall be charged for half-yearly, and the minimum quantity to be charged for during each half-year shall be 10,000 gallons.

5. The Trust reserve the right of putting on a meter and supplying water by measure.

6. For the right to use a hose for watering ornamental plots or gardens not exceeding one square chain, Ten shillings shall be charged, and Eight shillings for every additional chain, such right not to be exercised between the hours of Nine p.m. and Six a.m. Any person who transgresses this provision or wastes or misuses the water of the Trust, or interferes with any property vested in or controlled by the Trust, shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

7. For a temporary supply during the erection of a building or repairs, One pound per cent. shall be charged on the cost of the brickwork, stonework, and plastering; or the Trust may cause a meter to be fixed and a charge made by measure; or a special agreement may be made for the supply.

8. For every water-trough, a charge of Twenty (20) shillings shall be made; but on unoccupied lands, if the owner or occupier desires a trough, his rate payment shall be reckoned part of that One pound (£1).

9. For every steam boiler supplied, except by special agreement, a charge of Thirty shillings per each horse-power shall be made.

10. For a supply to livery or carriers' stables, a charge of Five (5) shillings per each stall shall be made.

11. The fee to be paid for a plumber's licence shall be One pound per annum.

12. Provided that where persons within the Waterworks Trust District desire to have the service-pipes of the Trust extended to their properties, and are willing to pay the cost of such extension, the Trust shall have power to make special arrangement with them regarding the payment for water supplied so as to cover their outlay.

13. The rates and charges herein mentioned are hereby made payable half-yearly, in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1917, provided that the charge for a temporary supply shall be paid in advance or as may be agreed upon.

14. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover such rates and charges.

On every house or tenement, whether occupied or not, or allotment of land by which a main passes, the sum equivalent to a rate of Two shillings and sixpence in the £1 per annum, with a minimum charge of £1 sterling.

Such rate is hereby made payable in equal moieties on the 1st January and 1st July, 1917, and such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust shall appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rate.

The charge for water by measure shall be Two shillings and sixpence per one thousand gallons.

The foregoing By-law was made and passed by the Rutherglen Waterworks Trust on the 14th day of November, 1916.

Rockite.—Consisting of a mixture of nitro-glycerine, nitro cotton, nitrate of ammonium, and woodmeal; provided that the proportion of nitro-glycerine does not exceed 11 per cent. of the finished explosive, and the cartridge wrappers are made thoroughly water proof with melted paraffin or other suitable water proofing material.
