### PROCLAMATION

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

"An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of Six hundred and seventy-two, thousand and sixty-one pounds to the service of the year One thousand nine hundred and sixteen and One thousand nine hundred and seventeen."  
"An Act to amend the Friendly Societies Acts."

*Marine Act 1915.*AMENDMENT OF REGULATIONS RELATING TO  
THE EXAMINATION OF ENGINEERS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the *Marine Act 1915*, the Marine Board of Victoria, with the consent of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following regulations, that is to say—

1. (a) These regulations may be cited as the "Marine Engineer Regulations 1916," and shall be read and construed as one with "The Regulations for the Examination of Engineers" made by the Board on the 11th day of July, 1902, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 29th day of July, 1902 (as the same have from time to time been amended), hereinafter referred to as the "Principal Regulations," and shall come into operation on the 1st day of April, 1917.

(b) The Regulations mentioned in the Schedule hereto, to the extent to which the same are thereby expressed to be repealed, are from the coming into operation of these present regulations hereby repealed.

2. *Testimonials: Sea Service.*—For paragraph 5 of the Principal Regulations there shall be substituted the following, namely:—

5. *Testimonials: Sea Service.*—Testimonials as to service at sea must testify to the applicant's sobriety, experience, ability, and general good conduct, and should cover the whole of the applicant's sea service; no application will be accepted in any case where the applicant does not produce satisfactory testimonials for at least the last eighteen months' service at sea preceding the date of application to be examined. They must be signed by the Master and Chief Engineer (or in the case of testimonials to Chief Engineers, by the Master and Superintending Engineer), and must clearly state whether the applicant was on regular watch and in regular charge of a watch on the main engines or boilers. It is desirable that testimonials of candidates should be indorsed by the Superintending Engineer. No time spent in clerical work will be allowed to count.

3. *Failure.*—To paragraph 13 of the Principal Regulations there shall be added the following, namely:—

Failure in a number of elementary questions involving fundamental principles, or in questions ignorance of which might lead an engineer to do something actually unsafe in the management of any part of a ship's machinery, will be regarded as failure in practical knowledge.

4. *Second Class Engineer.*—For paragraph 23 of the Principal Regulations there shall be substituted the following, namely:—

23. *Second Class Engineer.*—A candidate for a Second Class Engineer's Certificate must not be less than 21 years of age.

(a) He must have served as an apprentice engineer for four years at least, and prove that during the period of his apprenticeship he has been employed in the manner set forth in paragraph (28A) of the Principal Regulations.

Journeyman's time will be considered as equivalent to apprenticeship.

Every applicant must produce testimonials of ability as a practical engineer to the satisfaction of the Board.

If the candidate has served as an apprentice engineer or as journeyman, under the conditions above prescribed, for less than four years, he will be required to make up the deficiency or to complete this period of four years by service as engineer at sea on regular watch on the main engines or boilers (1) of a foreign-going steam-ship of not less than 66 nominal horse-power, or (2) of a home-trade steam-ship of not less than 66 nominal horse-power, such service to be counted as equivalent in the case of (1) to two-thirds, and in the case of (2) to four-ninths, of service as apprentice engineer or as journeyman.

If the candidate has not served at all as apprentice engineer or as journeyman, he will be required to have served at sea, in lieu thereof, as engineer on regular watch on the main engines or boilers, six years in a foreign-going steam-ship of not less than 66 nominal horse-power, or nine years in a home-trade steam-ship of not less than 66 nominal horse-power.

(b) In addition to the apprenticeship as above described, or the alternative sea service, the applicant must have served eighteen months at sea as engineer on regular watch on the main engines or boilers of a foreign-going steam-ship of not less than 66 nominal horse-power, or twenty-seven months in a home-trade steam-ship of not less than 66 nominal horse-power.

(See also paragraphs 35, 36, 38, and 39 of the Principal Regulations.)

(c) He must write a legible hand, and have a good knowledge of arithmetic up to and including vulgar and decimal fractions and square root. He must also be able to apply these rules to questions relating to safety valves, coal consumption, consumption of stores, capacities of tanks, bunkers, &c., and other similar problems; and be able to calculate the suitable working pressure for a steam boiler of given dimensions, and the stress per square inch on crank and tunnel shafts and other parts of the machinery when the necessary data are furnished.

(d) He must be able to pass a creditable examination as to the various designs of paddle and screw engines in general use, including turbines; as to the details of the different working parts, external and internal, and the use of each part.

(e) He must have a satisfactory knowledge of the methods of construction of engines and boilers as used in the workshop, and of the attention required by the different parts of the machinery on board ship.

(f) He must be able to give a satisfactory description of boilers, and the methods of staying them, together with the use and management of the different valves, cocks, pipes, and connexions.

(g) He must understand the precautions necessary to be taken when raising steam in boilers and when opening stop valves to admit steam to pipes, &c.

(h) He must understand how to make good the results of ordinary wear and tear to the machinery, how to correct defects from accident, decay, &c., and how a temporary or permanent repair could be effected in case of derangement or total breakdown.

(i) He must understand the use of the water gauge, pressure gauge, barometer, thermometer, and salinometer, and the principles on which they are constructed.

(j) He must be able to state the causes, effects, and usual remedies for incrustation and corrosion.

(k) He must be able to explain the methods of testing and altering the setting of the slide valves, and methods of testing the fairness of shafts and adjusting them.

(l) He must understand the construction and working of evaporators, feed filters, and feed heaters.

(m) He must understand the construction and working of centrifugal, bucket, and plunger pumps, and the principles on which they act.

(n) He must understand the construction and working of steering engines, electric light engines and dynamos, electric motors, refrigerating machinery, hydraulic machinery, and such internal combustion engines as are used to drive ships' launches, emergency and auxiliary machinery on board ship.

(o) He must possess a creditable knowledge of the prominent facts relating to combustion, heat, and steam.

(p) He must be able to take off and calculate indicator diagrams and understand the distribution of the steam in the cylinder as shown thereby.

(q) He must be able to make a dimensioned working sketch or drawing of some simple part of the machinery.

5. *First Class Engineer.*—For paragraph 24 of the Principal Regulations there shall be substituted the following, namely:—

24. *First Class Engineer.*—A candidate for a First Class Engineer's Certificate must be not less than 22½ years of age.

A more extended knowledge of the subjects named in paragraph 23 will be required, and, in addition to the qualifications specified for a Second Class Engineer,

(a) He must—

(1) have served at sea for 18 months, with a Second Class Certificate of Competency or Service, on regular watch on the main engines or boilers of a foreign-going steam-ship of not less than 99 nominal horse-power, as senior engineer in charge of the whole watch (see paragraph 30 of the Principal Regulations); or

- (2) have served at sea for 2 years and 3 months, with a Second Class Certificate of Competency or Service as first engineer of a home-trade steam-ship of not less than 99 nominal horse-power; or 3 years with a Second Class Certificate of Competency or Service as second engineer of a home-trade steam-ship of not less than 99 nominal horse-power; or
- (3) have served 3 years and 9 months with a Second Class Certificate of Competency or Service as third or fourth engineer of a home-trade steam-ship of not less than 99 nominal horse-power, and during the entire period have been the senior engineer in charge of the whole of a watch on the main engines and boilers (*see also* paragraphs 35, 36, 38, and 39 of the Principal Regulations); or
- (4) possess, or be entitled to, a First Class Certificate of Service.
- (b) His knowledge of arithmetic must include the mensuration of superficies and solids and the extraction of square and cube roots, and the application of these rules to questions relating to the power, duty, and economy of engines and boilers, and to the stresses in rods, shafts, and levers of the engine. He should also be able to calculate the effect of the application of the lever, pulley, inclined plane, and other mechanical powers.
- (c) He will be required to make an intelligible hand sketch, or a working drawing, of one or more of the principal parts of a steam-engine or boiler, and to mark upon it all the necessary dimensions in figures, so that the sketch or drawing could be worked from. (Appendix D.)
- (d) He must be able to take off and calculate indicator diagrams, and to recognise and know how to correct defects in the distribution of the steam as shown thereby.
- (e) He must be able to calculate safety-valve pressures and the strength of the boiler shell and riveting, and of the furnaces, flat surfaces, and stays.
- (f) He must be able to state the general proportions borne by the principal parts of the machinery to each other, and to calculate the direct stress, the torsional stress, and the bending stress in round bars, and the direct stress and the bending stress in rectangular bars with given loads.
- (g) He must be able to explain the method of testing and altering the setting of the slide valves, and to sketch approximately the difference any alteration in the slide valve will make in the indicator diagram.
- (h) He must be conversant with surface condensation, superheating, and the working of steam expansively.
- (i) He must understand the construction and working of, and be able to maintain in working condition, the auxiliary machinery which is placed under his charge, viz., refrigerating machinery, electric light engines and dynamos, electric motors, hydraulic machinery, the various descriptions of steering engines, and internal combustion engines as used in launches and for auxiliary and emergency machinery on board ship, &c.
- (j) He must know how to provide against defects and breakdowns of the machinery, and be able to direct and carry out any ordinary repairs that may be required either to the engines or the boilers.

#### 6. Workshop Service—

- (1) To paragraph (28A) of the Principal Regulations there shall be added the following, namely:—

This paragraph applies only to works at which the making and/or repairing of steam-engines, boilers, &c., forms part of the regular business for which the works exist. Service at works where the repairing of steam-engines, boilers, &c., is merely incidental to the running of plant, however large, which is used for the production of power for other machinery, &c., should be dealt with under paragraph 29, each case being considered on its merits.

- (2) To paragraph 28 of the Principal Regulations there shall be added the following, namely:—

Workshop service in India is in no case to be taken as equivalent to more than four-fifths of the same period of service in the United Kingdom.

#### 7. Qualifying Service Defined.—For paragraph 30 of the Principal Regulations there shall be substituted the following, namely:—

30. *Qualifying Service Defined.*—In the case of candidates for First Class Certificates qualifying service means, as a rule, service on regular watch on the main engines or boilers as senior engineer in charge of the whole watch. When, however, three or four engineers are on watch at the same time, the service of the two seniors may be allowed to count, and when not less than six engineers are on watch together, that of the three seniors, provided a certificate from the Superintending Engineer is produced stating the number of engineers on watch, the rank held by the applicant, and that he was in full charge of a watch on a definite section of the main engines or boilers. During the whole of the period claimed, candidates must have been in possession of Second Class Certificates.

In the case of candidates for Second Class Certificates qualifying service means service as engineer on regular watch on the main engines or boilers. In no case will time spent in clerical work be allowed to count.

All candidates, including those for First Class who have not been in charge of the whole of a watch, but qualify as herein provided as the second or third senior of the watch, and have been in charge of a section of the machinery only, will be required to have served at sea on regular watch on both the main engines and the boilers, not less than six months being spent on each.

#### 8. River and Bay Service.—For paragraph 35 of the Principal Regulations there shall be substituted the following, namely:—

35. *River and Bay Service.*—Service as engineer on regular watch on a river and bay steam-ship of not less than 66 nominal horse-power may be accepted under the following conditions:—

- The service will only count half as much as sea service, i.e., every two months of river and bay service is only equivalent to one month's foreign-going sea service.
- Candidates for Second Class Certificates must prove, in addition to the river and bay service, at least three months' qualifying service at sea in a foreign-going steam-ship of not less than 66 nominal horse-power, or four and a half months' similar service in the home trade.
- Candidates for First Class Certificates must prove, in addition to river and bay service in vessels of not less than 99 nominal horse-power, at least six months' qualifying service at sea, with a Second Class Engineer's Certificate, in foreign-going vessels of not less than 99 nominal horse-power, or nine months' similar service in the home trade.

#### 9. Service in Dredgers, Fishing Boats, Tugs, and Pilot Vessels.—To paragraph 38 of the Principal Regulations there shall be added the following, namely:—

Where an engineer is employed on a fishing or other vessel, and is required to do stoking or other work not usually performed by an engineer in the Mercantile Marine, such service cannot be accepted as qualifying.

The Examiner of Engineers will in all cases satisfy himself that service on fishing boats, when claimed as qualifying for a certificate as engineer, is of a similar nature to that performed by engineers in the Mercantile Marine.

#### 10. Elementary Questions.—For paragraph 50 of the Principal Regulations there shall be substituted the following, namely:—

50. *Elementary Questions.*—All applicants presenting themselves for examination for First and Second Class Certificates of Competency will be required to give written answers to ten elementary questions, which will not necessarily be taken from "Elementary Questions for the First Examinations of Engineers for Certificates of Competency and of Masters and Mates for Certificates in Steam," forming Appendix C to the Principal Regulations, but may be new questions somewhat similar in form and covering much the same ground.

## 11. Technical Schools.—

(1) Time spent after the age of 15 at a technical day school (recognised by the Board as suitable) where there is an engineering laboratory, may be taken into account and accepted as equivalent to artisan service, at the ratio of three years in the technical school to two in artisan service, provided that the applicant has taken the full engineering course and can produce the Principal's Certificate for regular attendance at all the approved classes and for satisfactory progress; and provided also that the remaining portion of the time has been spent in works where steam-engines, boilers, &c., are made or repaired, in accordance with the scale of values indicated above.

(2) A candidate for either a Second Class or a First Class Certificate who, within two years from the date of application to be examined, has attended an approved course comprising general mathematical and scientific instruction at a technical school recognised by the Board as suitable for the training of marine engineers, will be allowed to count time so spent as equivalent to sea service in the ratio of three months at the technical school to two months at sea. Time so spent cannot be accepted as equivalent to more than one-sixth of the total sea service required for either certificate, but a candidate who has been allowed to count such time on examination for a Second Class Certificate will not be debarred from counting similar subsequent time on examination for a First Class Certificate.

(3) Each candidate who claims remission of sea service on account of attendance at a recognised marine technical school must produce his class notebooks when he makes application to be examined. These books will be forwarded to the Examiner of Engineers, in order that he may satisfy himself that the candidate has followed the approved course of instruction, and that the remission of sea service claimed may be allowed accordingly.

Application for examination of candidates claiming remission of sea service should be made at least a week before they desire to sit.

Health Acts.

REGULATIONS FOR SECURING THE CLEANLINESS AND FREEDOM FROM CONTAMINATION OF ARTICLES OF FOOD, ETC.

**THE** Board of Public Health of the State of Victoria, by virtue of the power conferred by the Health Acts and of every other power enabling the said Board in this behalf, doth hereby make the following Regulations for carrying out the provisions of the Health Acts, and for securing the cleanliness, freedom from contamination, and adulteration of any article of food or drug or other article, substance, or compound, and for securing the cleanliness of receptacles, places, and vehicles used for the manufacture, preparation, storage, packing, carriage, or delivery of any article of food or drug or other article, substance or compound:—

## PERSONAL CLEANLINESS.

1. Every person engaged in the manufacture, preparation, packing, storage, carriage, or delivery of any food for sale shall, when so engaged, keep and maintain his clothing and body clean.

## SPITTING, SMOKING, AND CHEWING TOBACCO.

2. No person shall spit, and no person shall smoke or chew tobacco while engaged in the manufacture, preparation, packing, storage, carriage, or delivery of any food for sale, and no person shall spit, or smoke or chew tobacco in any place used for the manufacture or preparation of such food: Provided that this Regulation shall not apply to the packing, storing, carriage, or delivery of any food which is enclosed in a hermetically sealed container.

## INFECTIOUS DISEASE.

3. No person who is suffering from any contagious or infectious disease (including venereal disease) shall manufacture, prepare, pack, store, carry, deliver, hawk, or handle in any way any food or drug intended for human consumption or use by any other person.

## TEA PACKING.

4. No person shall engage in the process known as repacking tea by means of stamping with the feet, whether in boots or overalls; all such repacking shall be done by means of clean iron weights, or wood blocks, or other approved method, and the tea shall be protected from contamination during the process.

## PROTECTION OF FOOD IN VEHICLES.

5. (a) No person shall carry for sale or delivery on the footboard or any part of the exterior of any vehicle, any bread, meat, milk, or any other article of food not in a sealed package, unless it is contained in a box or a receptacle, or appliance so constructed as to prevent such article of food from becoming contaminated by dust or flies.

(b) No person shall transport through any street or road or place any article of food for sale, or intended for sale or delivery, unless the same is protected from flies and, as far as practicable, from dust.

## FOOD NOT TO BE RETURNED.

6. No person shall receive for sale any bread or meat which has been previously delivered at any house or to any person.

## WRAPPING OF FOODS.

7. No person shall pack any food so that it can come into contact with paper or other material which is not clean, or with any writing or printing on any paper or other material.

## PROTECTION FROM FLIES AND DUST.

8. Every person who sells, or exposes for sale, or stores for sale, or has in his possession for sale or delivery, or who exposes for human consumption on any counter or in any bar, restaurant, hotel, or other premises, any article of food, shall protect such article of food from flies, and, as far as practicable, from dust, by storage in covered receptacles or by means of metal or glass or other suitable covers; or by protecting all open windows, ventilators, and apertures by means of fly-proof wire gauze or other similar and effective material, and by providing automatically closing doors made of the same or a similar and effective material.

## PROTECTION FROM RATS AND VERMIN.

9. (a) Every person engaged in the manufacture, preparation, packing, storage, carriage, or delivery for sale of any article of food, shall by the provision of suitable and effective means at all times protect such article of food and all ingredients used in the manufacture of such article of food from rats, mice, cockroaches, flies, spiders, bugs, moths, and all other vermin, and from any unwholesome substance, odour, or smell.

(b) Every person who uses any room or compartment, premises, or place for the manufacture, preparation, packing, storage, carriage, or delivery for sale of any article of food, shall keep or cause to be kept every such room, compartment, premises, or place free from rats, mice, cockroaches, flies, spiders, bugs, moths, and all other vermin.

## PREMISES TO BE CLEAN AND PROPERLY CONSTRUCTED.

10. Every person who uses any room, compartment, premises, or place for the manufacture, preparation, packing, storage, carriage, or delivery for sale of any article of food, shall keep such room, compartment, premises, or place clean, and shall cause the floors to be constructed of, and the walls to be lined with, some impervious material, and kept in good repair.

## FOWLHOUSES, STABLES, CESSPOOLS, ETC.

11. No person shall permit any fowl-house, stable, cesspool, privy, pan closet, or urinal to be in or about, or within a distance of 12 feet from, any room or compartment or premises or place for the manufacture, preparation, packing, storage, carriage, or delivery for sale of any article of food. In the case of a water closet, this distance shall not be less than 10 feet, unless an effective air-lock or cross ventilation be provided.

## SLEEPING ROOMS, ANIMALS, CONTAMINATION.

12. No person shall manufacture, prepare, pack, store, carry, or deliver for sale, or offer or expose for sale, any article of food in any place which is at any time used as a sleeping compartment, or in which any animal is allowed to be, or in which anything is kept or any work is carried on which would be likely to contaminate such article of food, or injuriously affect its wholesomeness or cleanliness.

## VEHICLES AND APPLIANCES TO BE CLEAN.

13. Every person engaged in the manufacture, preparation, packing, storage, carriage, or delivery for sale of any food or drug, shall keep or cause to be kept clean all vehicles, receptacles, articles, utensils, tools of trade, benches, fittings, machinery, or other appliances used for such manufacture, preparation, packing, storage, carriage, delivery, or sale.

## VEHICLES AND APPLIANCES—LIMITED USE.

14. No person shall use any vehicle, receptacle, article, utensil, tool of trade, bench, fitting, machinery, or other appliance used for the manufacture, preparation, packing, storage, carriage, or delivery for sale of any article of food for any other purpose, or which has been used for any other purpose, which would be likely to contaminate or injuriously affect the wholesomeness or cleanliness of such article of food.

## MANURE BAGS PROHIBITED.

15. No person shall enclose, or carry, or store or consign wheat, oats, maize, potatoes, onions, fruit, or any other article of food for sale in any bag or sack or similar receptacle which has at any time contained, or has been used for the conveyance of, bone-dust or superphosphate or any other manure or mixture of manures.

## OYSTERS AND SHELL-FISH.

16. Where water under pressure is available or can reasonably be made available, no person shall open or dip oysters or shell-fish for sale in water unless such water be clean and running.

## DRINKING VESSELS AND TABLE-WARE.

17. (a) Every person who serves food, liquors, refreshments, or causes or allows the same to be served in any licensed premises, or restaurant, or bar, or counter, or refreshment stall, or booth, or dining-room, or tea-room, or other place where drinking vessels, or plates, or other vessels, or spoons, or forks, or knives are used in common, shall cause every such drinking vessel, or plate, or other vessel, or spoon, or fork, or knife to be thoroughly cleansed immediately after use, and to be kept clean until again required for use.

(b) In all premises where clean water under pressure is available, or where it can reasonably be made available, the owner or occupier shall cause the cleansing of such drinking vessels, or plates, or other vessels, or spoons, or forks, or knives to be completed by means of clean running water.

## BUTCHERS' SHOPS.

18. (1) For the purpose of these Regulations, "butcher's shop" means any building, store, shop, counter, stand, or place wherein or whereon meat is deposited for purposes of sale for human consumption.

(2) No person shall expose or offer for sale any meat otherwise than in a butcher's shop constructed and arranged according to the following specifications:—

(a) The windows shall be of glass or closely-fitting fly-proof wire gauze, and every doorway shall be provided with a light swing frame, closely fitting, and self-closing, and covered with fly-proof wire gauze of a maximum mesh of one-sixteenth part of an inch; and every ventilative or other opening shall be covered with similar gauze.

(b) Every external door of every butcher's shop shall be kept closed, except when in use for the purpose of ingress thereto or egress therefrom.

(c) Ventilation openings other than by the street door and window (protected by gauze as aforesaid), shall be provided either in the back or side wall; such means of ventilation shall be always in operation, and shall have an effective area equal to not less than 2 per cent. of the floor space of the said shop.

(d) Every butcher's shop where water under pressure is available, or where it can reasonably be made available, shall be provided with a lavatory basin, protected by a screen, with water laid on thereto.

## PREMISES VEHICLES, STORAGE, APPARATUS, CLOTHING, WRAPPING, ETC.

19. Every butcher shall cause the following regulations to be carried out:—

(a) No person shall keep, or suffer to remain, any bones or waste matters of any kind for longer than eight hours in any room, or on any floor, in or on which any process of preparation of meat or of fat for sale for human food is, or usually is, carried on.

(b) All waste matters shall be removed from every butcher's shop daily, and no scrap meat, fat, offal, bones, or other waste matters from any butcher's shop shall be cast, deposited, or be

allowed to remain in any manure heap or pit, or upon any part of the premises attached to any butcher's shop other than in a suitable covered receptacle provided for the purpose.

- (c) No copper or other cooking apparatus used in connexion with the sale or cooking of meat shall be used for laundry work.
- (d) No person shall place or allow to stand upon any public footpath or pavement any meat or any package or other vessel or utensil used for the carriage of meat.
- (e) No vessel or utensil, the substance, construction, or condition of which is likely to contaminate meat, shall be used for the preparation, storage, or sale of meat.
- (f) All meat, unless in the actual process of conveyance, shall be stored out of the direct rays of the sun.
- (g) No meat shall be placed, hung, exposed, or protruded, either wholly or in part, beyond the line of the glass or gauze of the window or door of any butcher's shop.
- (h) All meat for transit by rail shall be consigned in cases or in packages so constructed as to exclude dust and protect from flies.
- (i) Every vehicle used for delivering meat to retail customers shall be so constructed with due regard to ventilation as to prevent access of flies and dust to the interior, and shall at all times be kept closed, except when in use for loading and unloading.
- (j) Every vehicle used for the transport of meat shall be kept constantly clean and in good repair. Every such vehicle shall be thoroughly scraped and washed, or otherwise cleansed, and, if straw be used in it, furnished with clean straw; and every such vehicle shall be thoroughly cleansed at the conclusion of each day on which such vehicle has been used.
- (k) All persons who are engaged in the wholesale or retail storage or delivery of meat, whether in any shop or not, shall at all times when they are so employed wear overalls and aprons, made of washable material, which shall completely cover their clothes. Such overalls and aprons shall at all times be kept thoroughly clean.
- (l) All persons engaged in the transport and delivery of carcass meat to butchers' shops or elsewhere shall at all times when they are so employed wear caps, which shall be constantly covered with a detachable covering made of washable material, and they shall wear overalls made of washable material, which shall completely cover their clothes. Such covering and overalls shall be kept thoroughly clean.
- (m) Baskets or trays used in the carrying or conveyance of meat shall be thoroughly cleansed daily.
- (n) Clean towels shall be provided for the use of operatives.

#### MILK CANS CLEAN AND IN GOOD REPAIR.

20. (a) No person shall use or allow to be used any milk can or vessel for the preparation, storage, carriage, measuring, or delivery of milk or cream, unless such milk can or vessel is kept in a clean and wholesome condition, and in such a state of repair as to prevent leakage, and as to be free from dents and rough or torn edges or surface such as would interfere with the easy and thorough cleansing of such milk can or vessel, and it shall be provided with a properly fitting lid so as to prevent leakage.

(b) No person shall stop any hole or crack in any milk can, or pack or stop any improperly fitting lid, with paper or soap or rags or other temporary stopping of a like nature, nor shall any person use any such milk can or lid for the preparation, storage, carriage, or delivery of milk or cream.

#### MILK VESSELS AND MEASURES—HANDLES.

21. No person shall use vessels for containing or conveying milk which have not an opening wide enough to allow every internal part thereof to be seen and to permit the hand entering for cleansing purposes, or any measures without suitable handles, so as to obviate touching of the milk by the hands.

#### MILK VESSELS—MATERIAL.

22. No person shall use vessels or measures of copper, brass, or zinc for containing or conveying milk unless they are coated internally with tin; or use rusty vessels or vessels containing lead, or with cracked or broken enamel, or vessels of clay or similar material with cracked or damaged glazing, or any vessels in such a condition that they could give off particles to the milk or influence its composition.

#### NAME AND ADDRESS ON MILK CAN.

23. No person shall use any milk can or other vessel for transport of milk from the place of production to the retail or wholesale vendor unless such milk can or other vessel is distinctly and permanently inscribed with the name and address of the producer or consignor of the milk.

#### SEALING OF MILK CANS.

24. (a) Every person who consigns or sends milk in a wholesale quantity to a milk vendor for sale shall, prior to despatch, cause the lid or cover to be securely affixed to the can or other receptacle containing such milk by means of a cord or wire and a leaden seal.

(b) Every such seal shall be legibly impressed with not less than two distinctive capital letters which shall be the initials of the name of the consignor, sender, or producer of the milk, and the lid or cover shall be affixed to the can or receptacle in such a manner that the cord or wire or seal shall be broken by the act of removing or opening such lid or cover.

#### STORED MILK—LIMITATION.

25. No person shall store, carry, deliver, sell, or expose for sale, or cause or allow to be stored, carried, delivered, sold, or exposed for sale for human consumption any milk which has been kept or stored in any premises or in any cooling or freezing chamber or store for a longer period of time than seventy-two hours from the time of the natural production of such milk from the cow.

#### WATER IN MILK VEHICLE PROHIBITED.

26. No person shall carry or convey water, or any other substance capable of being used for adulterating milk, in any vehicle in which milk is conveyed or carried for sale, or in any can or other receptacle used in the sale of such milk.

#### ICE-CREAM AND ICES.

27. (a) No person shall manufacture, store, or deposit any ice-cream or ices for sale, nor suffer them to be manufactured, stored, or deposited in any open shed or unenclosed space.

(b) No person shall manufacture, store, or deposit ice-cream or ices for sale, nor suffer them to be manufactured, stored, or deposited for sale, in any dwelling-room, or in any room communicating directly with a privy or water-closet, or stable, or with an apartment used for sleeping, or in any room having an opening communicating directly with any drain or sewer.

(c) No person engaged in the manufacture or sale of ice-cream or of ices, shall suffer his hands or any part of his person to come in contact with any ice-cream or ices for sale.

(d) No person shall manufacture, store, or deposit any ice-cream or ices for sale in any vessel which is not clean; and every person engaged in the manufacture or sale of ice-cream or ices shall at all times maintain all vessels and utensils used for containing, or coming into contact with ice-cream or ices in a condition of cleanliness, and shall at all times protect the contents thereof from contamination.

(e) No person shall sell any ice-cream or ices which, after having been once frozen, have run down or melted, and which have been again frozen.

#### REGULATIONS TO BE DISPLAYED.

28. A copy of these Regulations shall be conspicuously displayed in every place where food is manufactured, prepared, packed, or stored for sale, and shall be constantly maintained there in a clean, visible, and legible condition by the proprietor, manager, or person in charge thereof.

#### PENALTIES.

29. Any person contravening any of these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

#### APPLICATION OF REGULATIONS.

30. These Regulations shall apply to all vehicles and receptacles used for transport, hawking, or sale on any street or any place.

#### REPEAL.

31. All Regulations heretofore made by the Board of Public Health are, so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for herein, hereby repealed.

These Regulations shall take effect from the first day of January, 1917.

## WINCHELSEA WATERWORKS TRUST.

## RATING BY-LAW FOR YEAR 1917.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Winchelsea Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by such Act, make the following By-law, viz.:—

## BY-LAW No. 5.

The following are the rates and charges which occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1917 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Waterworks District thereof:—

1. For every house and tenement up to £16 annual municipal value and under the sum of £2 (Two pounds) per annum.
2. For every house and tenement of £17 annual municipal value and upwards an amount of Two shillings and sixpence in the £1 upon the municipal value of such property.
3. Houses unoccupied for a period of not less than six calendar months commencing on the first day of January or the first day of July, shall be charged two-third rates.
4. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land unsupplied or supplied with water from the works of the Trust of Six pounds annual municipal value and under, the sum of Fifteen shillings sterling per annum.
5. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land unsupplied or supplied with water from the works of the Trust of Seven pounds annual municipal value and upwards, an amount of Two shillings and sixpence in the £1 upon the annual municipal value of such property.
6. Water supplied to cricket, tennis, or bowling clubs and to Government Departments, mechanics' institutes, churches, show grounds, and similar properties shall be charged for by measurement at 1s. 6d. (One shilling and sixpence) per 1,000 gallons.
7. For water supplied from stand-pipe, or hydrant, there shall be a charge for every 200 gallons or under, the sum of Sixpence.
8. For a supply during the erection of new buildings, there shall be a charge of Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of the contract for stonework, brickwork, or plastering, or, if there be no contract then upon the value of the amount charged or paid for such stonework, brickwork or plastering.
9. Except hereinbefore otherwise provided, the minimum quantity of water to be charged for where water is supplied by the Trust by measurement shall be the quantity which, at One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, equals the amount of the assessed rates which would be payable for the premises so supplied and for such minimum quantity of water there shall be a charge of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, and for water in excess of such minimum there shall be a charge of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, or such price as may be specially agreed upon.
10. The fee to be paid for a plumber's licence shall be £1, renewals 5s.

That the before-mentioned rates and charges shall be payable half-yearly in advance, or in other cases as directed by the secretary and shall be payable in two equal instalments. The first payment shall be made on the first day of January 1917 for half-year ending 30th June 1917 and the second payment shall be made on the first day of July 1917 for the half-year ending 31st December 1917.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Winchelsea Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect and recover the said rates and charges.

In the construction of the By-law the word "Person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole, and the word "Trust" shall mean the Winchelsea Waterworks Trust.

The foregoing By-law No. 5 was made by the Commissioners of the Winchelsea Waterworks Trust on the 6th day of October 1916 and confirmed on the 3rd day of November 1916, and the seal of the said Trust was affixed in the presence of—

## SHIRE OF RIPON.

## BY-LAW No 19, MAKING AND LEVYING A RATE FOR WATER SUPPLY PURPOSES.

THE President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Ripon do hereby, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Act 1915, make the By-law following for the Water Supply District of the Ripon Shire Council:—

## Part I.

1. A rate for the year hereinafter mentioned is hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of all lands and tenements which are rateable property within the meaning of the Local Government Act 1915 within the Water Supply District of the Ripon Shire Council according to the valuation for the time being of such land and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipal district of the said shire within which such lands and tenements are respectively situated for the supply of water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure, and such rate shall consist of the rates and charges hereinafter specified.

## Part II.—The Beaufort Water Supply.

2. The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied from the Beaufort Water Supply otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes, that is to say:—

- (a) On every house or tenement (including vacant allotments supplied with water) save as hereinafter provided, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound on the net annual value of such house or tenement, but in no case, save as hereinafter provided, shall such rate be less than the minimum sum of Twenty shillings, and in addition to such rate there shall be payable a further sum of Five shillings for each garden upon a tenement and a further sum of Five shillings for each horse kept or usually watered on such tenement.
- (b) On every piece of land not having a building thereon, and to which water-pipes are not laid, but having a frontage to any street or road along which there is any main pipe laid for the supply of water from the Beaufort Water Supply, provided such pipe or some portion thereof is laid in the street or road opposite the frontage of such land or opposite some portion of such frontage, the minimum sum of Ten shillings. Nothing in this subsection contained shall be deemed to apply to land adjoining and used in connexion with any other tenement.

3. "The Beaufort Water Supply" means and includes the reservoirs (with their respective systems of reticulation) known as Jackson's Reservoir and the Gold-fields Reservoir situate to the north and south respectively of the township of Beaufort and the springs and races which feed such reservoirs.

## Part III.—The Joint Water Supply.

4. The rates and charges hereinafter mentioned are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied from the joint water supply otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes, that is to say:—

On every house or tenement being rateable property within the municipal district of the Council, and which is supplied by the council with water from the joint water supply, the sum of Twenty shillings per annum.

5. "The joint water supply" means the race running from the springs at Mt. Cole to Jackson's Reservoir.

## Part IV.—The Waterloo Supply.

6. The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied from the Waterloo supply otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes, that is to say:—

On every house or tenement being rateable property within the municipal district of the Council, and having a frontage to any street or road along which there is any pipe laid for the supply of water from the Waterloo supply, provided such pipe or some portion thereof is laid in the street or road opposite the frontage of such house or tenement or opposite some portion of such frontage, the sum of One pound per annum.

7. "The Waterloo Supply" means "The Waterloo Reservoir" (with reticulation therefrom) situated on or near the boundaries of the parishes of Raglan and Beaufort, and being about 5 miles in a northerly direction from the township of Beaufort.

## Part V.

8. Such rate as aforesaid is made, and shall be levied for the year beginning on the 1st day of October, 1916, and ending on the 30th day of September, 1917, and shall be payable at the office of the said President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Ripon, at the Shire Hall, Beaufort, immediately after the expiration of one month from the publication in the *Victoria Government Gazette* of the notice required by the Water Act.

9. Such person or persons as the said President, Councillors, and Ratepayers may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, sue for, and recover the said rate.

The foregoing By-law was made and passed by the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Ripon, and the common seal thereof was hereunto affixed this 13th day of November, 1916, in the presence of—

## YEA WATERWORKS TRUST.

## RATING BY-LAW FOR 1917.

THE Commissioners of the Yea Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Act 1915*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, make the following Rating By-law:—

1. For every house or tenement of Twenty pounds annual municipal valuation or under, the sum of Thirty shillings.

2. For every house or tenement of annual municipal valuation exceeding Twenty pounds, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound.

3. For every unoccupied allotment of land and for every allotment of land upon which no house or tenement has been erected, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling of the annual municipal value of such allotment.

4. For every water trough, a charge of Fifteen shillings.

5. For every steam boiler, a charge of Fifteen shillings for every horse-power of such boiler.

6. For stand-pipe or hydrant water, for each load of two hundred gallons or under, a charge of One shilling and sixpence, to be paid on delivery.

7. For water supplied by the Trust by measure (other than stand-pipe or hydrant water), except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, a charge of One shilling and sixpence for every thousand gallons.

8. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by measurement (other than stand-pipe or hydrant water) shall be:—

(1) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, a quantity for which the charge of One shilling and sixpence per thousand gallons would be equal to the assessed rate which would be payable for the house or tenement so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(2) If solely for other than domestic purposes, thirty thousand gallons per half-year.

9. The above-mentioned rates and charges (except for stand-pipe and hydrant water) shall be payable half-yearly in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1917.

10. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Yea Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect and recover the said rate and charges.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Colac Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Act 1915*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by such Act, make the following By-law, viz.:—

## By-law No. 9.

The following are the rates and charges which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1917 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said Urban District:—

1. For every house and tenement of £13 annual municipal value and under, the sum of £1 2s. 6d. (One pound two shillings and sixpence).

2. For every house and tenement of £14 annual municipal value and upwards, an amount of One shilling and eightpence in the £1 upon the annual municipal value of such property.

3. Houses unoccupied for a period of not less than six calendar months, commencing on the first day of January or the first day of July, shall be charged two-third rates.

4. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land unsupplied with water from the works of the Trust of Six pounds annual municipal value and under, the sum of Ten shillings sterling.

5. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land unsupplied with water from the works of the Trust of Seven pounds annual municipal value and upwards, an amount of One shilling and eightpence in the £1 upon the annual municipal value of such property.

6. Private water troughs will be charged for at the rate of 20s. per annum where the valuation of the property on which such trough is situated does not exceed £20. Such trough charge of 20s. will mean to include the rate of valuation. Where the valuation of the property exceeds £20, the trough to be exempt from rating purposes, except where, in the opinion of the Trust, a meter shall be necessary.

7. Water supplied to cricket, bowling, or tennis clubs, and to Government Departments, mechanics' institutes, churches, show grounds, cattle yards, and similar properties shall be charged for by measurement at 6d. (sixpence) per 1,000 gallons, provided that the minimum quantity to be charged for shall not be less than 45,000 gallons per annum.

8. For water supplied from standpipes or hydrant, there shall be a charge for every 200 gallons or under of the sum of One shilling.

9. For a supply during the erection of new buildings, there shall be a charge of Ten shillings per cent., on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, or plastering, or, if there be no contract, then upon the value or of the amount charged or paid for such stonework, brickwork, or plastering.

10. Except hereinbefore otherwise provided, the minimum quantity of water to be charged for where water is supplied by the Trust by measurement shall be the quantity which, at One shilling and eightpence per 1,000 gallons, equals the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied, and for such minimum quantity of water there shall be a charge of One shilling and eightpence per 1,000 gallons; and for water in excess of such minimum there shall be a charge of Eightpence per 1,000 gallons, or such price as may be specially agreed upon.

11. Water supplied to market gardeners shall be charged for by measurement only.

12. For water supplied to botanic gardens, the charge shall be Twopence per 1,000 gallons, and the supply must be taken through a meter.

13. The fee to be paid for a plumber's licence shall be £1; renewals, 5s.

14. Provided that where persons within the Waterworks Trust District desire to have the service-pipe of the Trust extended to their properties, and are willing to pay the cost of such extension, the Trust shall have power to make a special agreement with them regarding the payment of water supply so as to cover their outlay.

That the before-mentioned rates and charges shall be payable half-yearly in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1917, excepting the charge for water supplied by measurement, which shall be paid quarterly.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Colac Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

In the construction of the By-law the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole, and the word "Trust" shall mean the Colac Waterworks Trust.

#### KYABRAM WATERWORKS TRUST.

##### BY-LAW FOR 1917.

**T**HE Commissioners of the Kyabram Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Act 1915, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following By-law:—

The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1917 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Water Supply District:—

1. For every house or tenement, used either wholly or partly as a domicile, of under Sixteen pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound sterling, provided that such rate shall not be in any case less than One pound per annum.

2. For any house or tenement, used either wholly or partly as a domicile, of the annual municipal value of Sixteen pounds and upwards, a rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound sterling.

3. The rate to be paid in respect of unoccupied allotments of land shall be Five shillings for each allotment not exceeding one-quarter of an acre; Ten shillings if more than a quarter of an acre, but not exceeding half-an-acre; Fifteen shillings if more than half-an-acre, but not exceeding three-quarters of an acre; with a maximum charge of One pound sterling for any parcel of land within the Urban District.

4. Where any horses or cows are wholly or partially kept on, or at any land or tenement not supplied by the Trust with water by measurement, there shall be payable for every such animal (exceeding one in number) wholly or partially kept as aforesaid (in addition to the assessment rate) a special rate of Five shillings per head per annum.

5. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special arrangement with the Trust) One shilling and threepence for every 1,000 gallons.

6. The foregoing rates are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July 1917.

#### PYRAMID HILL WATERWORKS TRUST.

##### RATING BY-LAW No. 12.

**T**HE Commissioners of the Pyramid Hill Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Act 1915, and of all powers enabling them in this behalf, do hereby make the following By-law:—

*By-law No. 12, determining the Rate payable for the Year 1917, for Water supplied within the Boundaries of the Pyramid Hill Waterworks Trust District.*

1. A rate of 3s. (Three shillings) in the pound sterling on the municipal value of all rateable property situated within the Waterworks District of the Pyramid Hill Waterworks Trust is hereby made for the year 1917.

2. The maximum rate on any one property used as a domicile or tenement shall be Ten pounds (£10).

3. The minimum rate on any tenement used as a domicile shall be Two pounds five shillings (£2 5s.).

4. On all unoccupied allotments or pieces of land within the Waterworks District and not rated under the foregoing clause, a minimum rate of 10s. (Ten shillings) shall be charged.

5. No person shall be allowed to irrigate from the Trust's water mains, lucerne, sorghum, or other fodder crop without a permit from the secretary of the Trust, who shall subject to the approval of the Trust, issue the same, the fee for such permit shall be Fifty shillings (£2 10s.) for each one-eighth (1/8) or part of one-eighth (1/8) of an acre to be irrigated. The service-pipe for the supplying of such water shall not exceed 2 inch in diameter. Any person committing a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

6. A minimum rate of Five shillings (5s.) and a maximum rate of £2 (Two pounds) sterling shall be charged any person, as the Commissioners may determine, for using water for garden watering during the year in addition to the assessed rate payable for the premises on which such water is used.

7. The Trust will not in any case be held liable to supply, nor will allow any water to be taken under clauses 5 and 6, until all consumers are supplied for domestic purposes.

8. The rates and charges herein mentioned are hereby made payable on the first day of March, 1917.

9. Such person or persons as the Commissioners may appoint from time to time is or are hereby authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rate.

#### BOROUGH OF HORSHAM WATERWORKS TRUST.

##### RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1917.

**T**HE Commissioners of the Borough of Horsham Waterworks Trust do hereby make the following By-law, in pursuance of the provisions of the Water Act 1915:—

1. That the water rate for the year 1917 on all lands and tenements within the Borough of Horsham Waterworks Trust District shall be One shilling and threepence in the £1 on the municipal valuation of the Borough of Horsham for the year 1917, with a minimum of One pound, upon all lands and tenements valued at or under Thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence (£13 6s. 8d.), except such as are entitled to the provisions of section 259 of the above-mentioned Act.

2. For water supplied by the Trust for domestic and other than domestic purposes by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of lands and tenements within the Trust District shall be the quantity for which the charge at One shilling per thousand gallons, would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by the Trust by measure in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged at the rate of Sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

3. For water supplied by measurement for other than domestic purposes solely, a charge of Ninepence for every thousand gallons shall be made (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust and for water supplied for railway purposes, which shall be at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons), provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than the amount payable under the assessed rate as specified in clause 1 hereof.

4. All rates and charges shall be due and payable, in advance, at the offices of the Trust, on the 1st day of January, 1917.

5. Such officers as the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose are hereby authorized to demand, receive, and recover the said rates and charges.

No. 2644) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make and rescind Regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying the said Act into effect: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby rescind clause 3, Regulation XXIX.—Sloyd Classes in Country Schools—of the Regulations under the *Education Act 1915*, as set out hereunder, to take effect as from the 1st January, 1917.

3. Payment will be made to the teacher at the rate of One pound (£1) per annum for each pupil in average attendance at the classes, the minimum payment being Ten pounds, and the maximum Twenty pounds per annum. This payment will be liable to reduction should the report under clause 4 be adverse.

**W**HEREAS by section 68 of the *Education Act* 1915 (6 Geo. V. No. 2644), it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make and rescind regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying the said Act into effect: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby rescind Regulation XXXV.—District High Schools—of the Regulations under the *Education Act* 1915, and make the following in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

## REGULATION XXXV.

## DISTRICT HIGH SCHOOLS.

*Establishment of District High Schools.*

1. District high schools shall be of two types—high schools, and agricultural high schools.

2. A district high school may be established by the Minister of Public Instruction upon the following conditions:—

- (a) At least 75 pupils shall furnish a written undertaking to complete one of the courses mentioned in clause 21 below, and, of these pupils, at least 50 shall have satisfactorily completed the work of Grade VIII. of the elementary school course, or have reached an equivalent standard of education.
- (b) An area of land which, in the opinion of the Minister is sufficient and suitable as a site for a high school and, in the case of an agricultural high school, an additional area of not less than 40 acres for a school farm, must be provided, and the title vested in the Minister. The area of 40 acres must be situated in a position convenient to the agricultural high school.
- (c) A local contribution of a sum of money to be approved by the Minister must be guaranteed.

*Advisory Councils.*

3. (a) For each district high school, the Governor in Council may appoint an advisory council.
- (b) The approval of the Minister must be obtained before any arrangements are made for the appointment of an advisory council. Except as provided below or otherwise directed by the Minister, the advisory council shall consist of not fewer than five nor more than nine members.
- (c) The council shall include:—
  - i. Three members, who shall be nominated by the parents and guardians of pupils attending the school;
  - ii. One member of the municipal council of the district in which the school is situated;
  - iii. The district inspector of schools;
  - iv. Four members who should represent the leading interests of the district.

When the council consists of less than nine members all the above divisions must be represented.

4. No person shall be appointed a member of an advisory council for more than three years, but any person appointed a member shall on ceasing to be a member be eligible for re-appointment. All members of councils shall retire on 30th June, 1917.

5. Whenever during the triennial period for which an advisory council is appointed a vacancy occurs through death, resignation, forfeiture of seat or other cause, the council may nominate some suitable person to fill such vacancy. If the nomination is approved by the Minister, such person shall hold office until the triennial period has expired for which the council was appointed.

5A. The Governor in Council may at any time remove any member of the council and fill up any vacancy however occurring in the office of any member of the council.

6. Three members of the council shall form a quorum.

7. Advisory councils shall meet at least six times in each year, and any member absent without reasonable excuse from three consecutive meetings to which he has been duly summoned by letter at least three days in advance, shall thereby forfeit his seat on the council.

8. The Minister may, whenever it be deemed advisable, appoint as members of the advisory council of a district high school the members of the council of any technical school with which the Director may decide to associate the district high school.

9. It shall be the duty of the head master to summon the advisory council to its first meeting within a reasonable time after appointment for the purpose of electing officers and arranging for the carrying out of the duties of the council.

10. Except as otherwise approved by the Minister the duties of the advisory council for a district high school shall be—

- (a) To exercise a general oversight over the buildings and grounds, and to report to the Minister the condition thereof when necessary.
- (b) To promote measures for the beautifying and improvement of the school grounds, the establishment and maintenance of the school gardens and agricultural plots, the decoration and equipment of the school rooms, and the formation of a school library and museum.
- (c) To take measures to foster and promote local interest in the school, and to extend its usefulness to the community.
- (d) To advise the Minister in all matters pertaining to the school, more especially in any suggested developments in the course of study, and in efforts made to secure suitable employment for exit pupils, so as to bring the school closely into touch with the industrial and other special interests of the district.
- (e) To arrange, in conjunction with the head master, for suitable board and lodging at reasonable rates for the accommodation of resident pupils, and to exercise general supervision over such pupils.
- (f) To expend the allowance granted to the school, and in the case of agricultural high schools the maintenance allowance for the farm, and to exercise such supervision as the Minister may authorize over the farm operations.
- (g) The advisory council of any agricultural high school may nominate qualified pupils for free instruction in the agricultural course in that school, provided that the number of pupils so nominated in any year shall not exceed ten per cent. of the total number of pupils paying full fees enrolled in that year.

- (h) Advisory councils of district high schools shall have all the powers assigned by Regulations XIX., XX., and XXV. to school committees in elementary schools as regards—

- i. School entertainments;
- ii. Religious instruction;
- iii. Use of school buildings;
- iv. Works that may be done under the direction of school committees;
- v. Relations to teachers.

11. Advisory councils are authorized to incur expenditure on the high school buildings and grounds in accordance with instructions issued by the Minister to an amount not exceeding £20 in each year. Payments will be made by the Education Department upon presentation of claims setting forth clearly the character of the work done, and certified by the chairman or the secretary of the council.

12. The accounts for each advisory council will be made up to the 30th June in each year, when all unexpended balances will lapse.

*Qualifications for admission, fees, and holidays.*

13. The qualifications for enrolment shall be as follows:—

- (a) Pupils must have passed the Qualifying Examination, or an approved equivalent examination, or a satisfactory entrance examination.
- (b) They must furnish a written undertaking to complete one of the courses mentioned in Clause 21 below.
- (c) They must furnish satisfactory evidence that they are of good general health, and are likely to profit by a further course of study.

14. During their course in a district high school, pupils shall be required to attend lessons regularly and punctually, and to make satisfactory progress in the subjects prescribed for their course.

15. The fees to be paid by the pupils over the age of fourteen years shall be £6 per annum, payable for each term in advance.

16. (a) The Minister may remit the fees in the case of a pupil whose parents are not in a position to pay them, provided that such pupil shows special aptitude and promise as certified to by an inspector of schools, or by the head master of the district high school which the pupil is attending.

(b) If he considers the circumstances warrant it the Minister may make grants in aid of school requisites up to £2 per annum, or of travelling expenses up to £5 per annum, or of maintenance up to £26 per annum, to any pupil in a district high school, but no grant in aid of maintenance shall be made in respect of any pupil who has not obtained the Merit Certificate or an approved equivalent, and as a general rule except where it is necessary for the pupil to reside apart from his parents. In every case of a grant under this clause the parents or guardians of the pupil concerned must show by statutory declaration their income during the previous year.

Applications for grants under this clause must be made on the prescribed form before the end of February in each year. As a rule, no grant shall be made except in necessitous cases where pupils show special aptitude and promise.

17. The school year shall be divided into three terms, and shall be of forty-two weeks, beginning on the first Tuesday in February, except in cases specially approved by the Director.

18. No pupil shall be enrolled after the expiration of four weeks from the commencement of the first term unless with the special sanction of the Director. Pupils may, however, be transferred from one district high school to another, or from a higher elementary school, higher elementary classes, or a central school to a district high school, or *vice versa*, under the same conditions as regards transfer notes as are provided in the case of pupils attending elementary schools.

19. Subject to the approval of the inspectors of secondary schools at their visits to the school, the classification of pupils, whether at their entrance or at any subsequent period of their attendance at a district high school, shall be determined by the head master of such school.

*Courses of Study in District High Schools.*

20. The district high schools will provide a course of study, extending over at least four years, and such further course as the Director may from time to time prescribe.

21. Unless otherwise approved by the Director, the course of study in high schools shall be—

*First Stage—First and Second Years.*

Industrial course, or common course, as set out in the Instructions appended to this Regulation.

*Second Stage—Third and Fourth Years.*

Intermediate course. One of the courses prescribed for the School Intermediate Examination of the University of Melbourne, or other course approved by the Director.

*Third Stage—Fifth and Sixth Years.*

*School Leaving Certificate Course—*

Such courses for the school leaving examination of the University of Melbourne, or such alternative courses as may be approved by the Director.

22. Pupils who complete the second stage of any of the courses mentioned in Clause 21 above may be awarded the School Intermediate Certificate of the University of Melbourne on compliance with the conditions set out in Regulation I. of the University.

*Staffing.*

23. The staffing of district high schools, and the appointment of teachers, are determined by the Public Service Commissioner.

24. Headmasters shall assign to assistant teachers duties and responsibilities in accordance with the salary and status of the positions held by such teachers.

25. Headmasters shall keep such records, and furnish such returns and reports, as may from time to time be required.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1915* (6 Geo. V. No. 2686, sections 472 and 473) it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Moorabbin has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been reserved, used, or acquired by the said Council for the purpose of making a street within the said shire, be so declared to be a public highway: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this notice declare the land reserved, used, or acquired for the street hereinafter named and described, and situate within the Shire of Moorabbin aforesaid, to be a Public Highway within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

**SHIRE OF CORIO.****By-Law No. 12.**

A By-law of the Shire of Corio made under section 198 of the *Local Government Act 1915* and numbered 12 for:—

Regulating and restraining the erection and construction of buildings.

Requiring the pulling down and removal of buildings.

Authorizing the council to pull down and remove buildings erected or constructed contrary to this By-law or not pulled down or removed as required by or under such By-law and to sell the materials and apply the proceeds in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down and removing such buildings and in paying into the Municipal Fund any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof.

Appointing fees which may be charged and received by the council for any act done or to be done by any of its officers under such By-law and for any permit or licence to be issued by the council.

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915* the President Councillors and Ratepayers of the Shire of Corio order as follows:—

1. That this By-law shall come into operation on its approval by the Governor in Council and immediately after its publication in the *Victorian Government Gazette*.

2. No person shall build any building or any addition to any building contrary to the provisions of this By-law.

3. No person shall build any building without first obtaining written permission from the council so to do and without first submitting to the council the secretary or engineer the plans and specifications of the proposed building.

4. No person shall make any alteration or addition to any building (except that of necessary repairs not affecting its construction or any external or party walls) without first obtaining the written permission of the council so to do.

5. No person shall commence any building or any alteration or addition to any building without first having paid to the council such fees as are provided therefor by this By-law.

6. Every dwelling house or any addition thereto shall be at a minimum distance of 15 feet from the building line of the street or road the building is to front such front to be determined by the council and 5 feet from any street or road at the side of such building and 5 feet from any other building not in the same occupation and 5 feet from the land of any adjoining owner or (subject to clause 9 hereof) where the land is the property of the same owner 5 feet from the dividing fence line of the adjoining tenement but this section of this By-law shall not prevent the erection (with the written consent of the council) of a shop or a shop and dwelling house combined abutting on the building line in any street.

7. No person shall build any portico or verandah over the footway of any street without first obtaining the consent of the council in writing and such portico or verandah shall be of such shape figure and dimensions and materials as the council may approve but the lowest part of such portico or verandah shall in no case be of less height than 8 feet above the level of the outer edge of the footway; no opening shall be made in the roof of any such portico or verandah for the purpose of affording light unless such opening be properly framed and glazed with rough rolled plate glass protected underneath with fine mesh wire netting or armoured glass to the satisfaction of the engineer.

8. (a) Subject to sub-clause (c) and (d) of this clause every dwelling house shall cover an area of 600 superficial feet at least exclusive of verandah and all detached outbuildings or where two or more attached dwelling houses are erected each dwelling house shall cover an area of 1,000 superficial feet at least exclusive of verandah and all detached outbuildings.

(b) The site or curtilage of every dwelling house shall have a superficial area of at least 5,000 feet and a frontage of not less than 50 lineal feet to a street or road and except in the cases of corner sites the dwelling house and outbuildings erected thereon shall cover not more than one-fourth of the superficial area of such site.

(c) Every dwelling house and outbuildings to be built upon any site or curtilage included in any subdivision of land made with the approval of the council prior to the coming into operation of this By-law and not possessing the minimum superficial area or frontage provided for in sub-clause (b) of this clause shall except in the cases of corner sites cover not more than one-fourth of the superficial area of such site or curtilage.

(d) Every dwelling house and outbuildings to be built upon any corner site or curtilage fronting or adjoining two streets or roads shall cover not more than one-third of the superficial area of such site or curtilage.

9. Two or more buildings or dwelling houses may be erected on one block of land belonging to the same owner provided they be separated from each other by a wall of brick or stone at least nine inches in thickness and carried up to at least one foot above the roof covering or gutter adjoining the same and projecting at least one inch beyond the face of the woodwork or spouting.

10. Every habitable room in every dwelling house hereafter built or re-built except rooms wholly or partly in the roof shall be in every part at least 10 feet in height from the floor to the ceiling other than rooms under a skillion roof which shall at the least be 8 feet in height from the floor to the ceiling.

11. Every habitable room in every dwelling house hereafter built or re-built wholly or partly in the roof shall be at least nine feet in height from the floor to the ceiling throughout not less than one half of the area of such room.

12. The interiors of the walls and ceilings of every dwelling house shall be finished in wood lath and plaster or approved fire-resisting material.

13. No person shall bring or cause or permit to be brought any building either in whole or in part on to or upon any land within the area to which this By-law extends either from outside such area or from any part of such area to any other part thereof unless such building when completed shall comply with all the provisions of this By-law and unless six (6) days' notice in writing of the intention to so bring or cause to be brought such building or part thereof be first given to the council secretary or engineer.

14. If any building shall hereafter be partly or wholly built contrary to the provisions of this By-law the council the secretary or engineer may give to the owner or builder or leave upon the site of such building fourteen (14) days' notice in writing to bring such building into conformity with the said provisions or to pull down or to remove such building and if default shall be made in complying with such notice and notwithstanding the imposition or recovery of any penalty it shall be lawful for the said council to enter upon such building and on the site thereof with a sufficient number of workmen and to pull down the said building or any part or parts thereof and to do any other act that may be necessary for the purpose and to remove the materials thereof to some convenient place and if the council in its discretion thinks fit to sell the same in such a manner as it thinks fit and all expenses incurred by the council in pulling down the said building or any part thereof or of removing the materials thereof and selling the same and in doing such other work as aforesaid shall be paid to the council by such owner or builder and all fees or penalties or expenses due by the owner or builder thereof may be deducted and retained by the council out of the proceeds of such sale and the council shall restore any surplus arising from such sale to such owner or builder or other person proving himself to be legally entitled thereto.

15. Fees payable under this By-law shall be as under:—

- (a) For the inspection or superintendence of all new buildings or old buildings re-erected or re-instated after being partially destroyed taken down or demolished or buildings removed into the area to which this By-law extends or from one part of such area to another part thereof the sum of One pound.
- (b) For the inspection or superintendence of each alteration or addition to the existing buildings the sum of Ten shillings.
- (c) For every permit to build any portico or verandah the sum of Ten shillings.

16. The following words or expressions wherever used in this By-law shall have the meanings hereby assigned to them respectively so far as such meanings are not excluded by context that is to say:—

"Council" shall mean the Council of the Shire of Corio.

"Secretary" shall mean the secretary or acting secretary for the time being of the Shire of Corio.

"Engineer" shall mean the engineer or acting engineer for the time being of the Shire of Corio.

"Dwelling house" shall mean a building used or constructed or adapted or intended to be used for human habitation whether the building or portion thereof may be or is used for some other purpose.

"Outbuilding" shall include every building detached or otherwise used as accessory to or in connexion with a dwelling house.

"Street or Road" shall mean and include "street" and "road" and "private street" and "private road" as respectively defined in section 3 of the *Local Government Act 1915*.

"Area"—Applied to a building shall mean the superficial area of a horizontal section thereof made at the point of its greatest surface exclusive of external walls.

"Build" shall mean and include erect build or construct or cause or permit or suffer to be erected build or constructed.

"Built" shall mean and include erected built or constructed.

"Building" shall mean and include erection structure and every structure of whatever kind and every part of such structure.

"Addition" shall mean and include any increase in the habitable enclosed or covered area height or cubic contents of any building.

All words importing the singular shall include the plural and the plural the singular.

17. Any person who shall by any wilful act or default be guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each such offence and in the case of the continuance of such offence to a further penalty not exceeding Two pounds per day for each and every day such offence is continued after written notice of the offence from the Secretary or Engineer.

18. This By-law shall not apply to any fence greenhouse fernery aviary or to temporary offices and sheds used by builders during the construction of any building at or about the site of such building for a period not exceeding twelve months.

19. Provided always that notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained the council may under special circumstances and for special causes and at a meeting of which due notice of the business has been given to each councillor declare that the provisions of this By-law either in whole or in part shall not apply to any particular building.

20. This By-law shall apply to and have operation only throughout the following part or parts of the municipal district namely:—That portion of the Moorpanyal Riding of the Shire of Corio bounded as follows:—Commencing at the shire boundary on the Moorabool River at the west end of Church-street; thence by Church-street to Vine-street; thence by Vine-street to the Ballarat-road; thence by the Ballarat-road to the Anakie-road; thence by the Anakie-road to Separation-street; thence by Separation-street to Corio Bay; thence by the shire boundary to the commencing point.

## DETERMINATION OF THE HAIRDRESSERS BOARD.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Act, the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons wheresoever employed in the business of a Hairdresser, or Barber, or Wig Maker, or other Workers of Hair, has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That the previous Determination of this Board is hereby amended, and such amendments shall come into force and be operative on and after the 24th December, 1916. The Determination and amendments are printed hereunder.

### WAGES.

(2) That the lowest rates which may be paid to the following persons shall be:—

Chairworkers (male or female) in men's hairdressing saloons ..	60s.	per week of 52 hours
All other males ..	70s.	" " "
All other females ..	37s. 6d.	" 48 "

### APPRENTICES AND IMPROVERS.

"Apprentice" means any person under twenty-one years of age bound by indentures of apprenticeship, or any person over twenty-one years of age who, with the sanction of the Minister, is bound by indentures of apprenticeship. (Act 2650, Section 3.)

NOTE.—The Hairdressers Board has prescribed a form of apprenticeship agreement. Section 187 requires that the indentures must be in that form.

"Improver" means any person (other than an apprentice) who does not receive a piece-work price or a wages rate fixed by any Special Board for persons other than apprentices or improvers, and who is not over twenty-one years of age, or who, being over twenty-one years of age, holds a licence from the Minister to be paid as an improver. (Act 2650, Section 3.)
