(1) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, a quantity for which the charge of One shilling and sixpence per thousand gallons would be equal to the assessed rate which would be payable for the house or tenement so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.
 (2) If solely for other than domestic purposes, thirty thousand gallons per half-year.

9. The above mentioned rates and charges (except for stand-pipe and hydrant water) shall be payable half-yearly in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1916.

# Victoria.—Act 391.—Second Schedule. ROMAN CATHOLIC CHURCH.—LAND AT BALLAN;—POWER TO DISPOSE.

A STATEMENT of Trusts having been submitted by the head or authorized representative of the denomination known as Roman Catholic under the provisions of the "Act to provide for the Abolition of State Aid to Religion," for allowance by the Governor, the same was allowed by him on the twenty-third day of December, 1915, and the following is the form in which such statement of trusts has been allowed :

Tenders for supply of forage to more than five separate stations in any one district must be accompanied by a preliminary deposit of 10s. for each and every station tendered for except in the case of the Melbourne District, the preliminary deposit for which shall be 125 with each tender, irrespective of the number of stations tendered for. Deposits must be in bank notes, or bank drafts payable to the order of the Secretary to the Tender Board (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application; such deposit will be forfeited in the event of the tenderer, after the time fixed for the closing of tenders, withdrawing or attempting to withdraw his tender, or of the successful tenderer futling to complete the necessary bond within a reasonable time after the acceptance is notified.

As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

That the above order be carried out under the following Rules and Regulations, that is to say:—That all ratepayers of the said riding of the said Shire and occupiers of land abutting the said roads, shall be exempt from such impounding of ten head of cattle or horses, and that in the case of public carriers, the number so exempted be the team of horses or bullocks in actual use actual use.

  3. That the condition precedent to such exemption, be a payment to the Council of the Shire of Philipp Island and Woolamai, such sum and in such manner as the Council is hereby empowered from time to time to fix.

  4. That when the above charge or fee is paid to the herdsman, he shall register such head of cattle or horses in a book to be kept for the purpose, as exempt from the operation of the By-law, and in case of such cattle fasten a chain or strap and a tag on the neck of each beast in token of such exemption, and shall give to the person so registering a receipt for the money paid, and same shall be entered in a book to be kept for that purpose and for the information of the Council.

  5. That any exemption from impounding granted in

That any exemption from impounding granted in accordance with the provisions of this By-law, shall not extend to any stock found wandering within the following portion of the township of Cowes, namely, that area bounded by Westernport Bay on the north, and on the south by the Government road along the south boundaries of allotments 77, 84, 89, 90, 94, 95, and 97, and on the east by the road on the east boundary of allotments 97 and 98, and lots 10 and 20 of section 9 and tot 10 of section 10 of the said township, and on the west by the road on the west boundary of allotments 77, 78, and 79.
- Any stock found within such area on the roads, although registered, will be impounded by the herdsman.
- 6. The Council will not be responsible nor liable for loss, for theft, for death, nor for any injury nor damage to, nor straying of any such cattle or horses grazing under the aforesaid permit, nor for the supply of a sufficiency of grass or water, and the permit or licence to graze will be applied for and obtained under these conditions.
- 7. Each animal for which application is made to register shall be the bona fide property of the applicant and the applicant shall make a declaration to that effect in the form of a schedule attached hereto.

- 8. Calves and foals at foot under the age of six months, the progeny of the registered cows or mares, may run with their mothers free of charge, up to that limit of age.
- $9.\ \mathrm{No}$  entire horse or bull shall be exempted without the special consent of the Council.
- 10. A muster of all stock so registered shall take place on a day of which due notice shall be given by posters and by letter posted to each owner, at the close of each quarter of the year, and owners desiring exemption for the ensuing quarter are required to present their stock for such registration at such musterings.
- 11. A herdsman will be appointed by the Council who shall keep an entry of all stock impounded by him and present a return of same to the Council, every quarter on a day preceding the quarterly muster and registration, together with the books in which such entries are made.
- 12. The Council or herdsman will not be responsible for any damage arising from the impounding of such ex-empted stock by any person owning lands adjoining or abutting such roads, or owning land in any situation whatever.
- 13. No pigs, goats nor sheep are to be allowed to wander or graze on such roads and all travelling stock must move thereover at the rate of 2 miles per hour for sheep and at the rate of not less than 6 miles in each day between succet and sunrise.
- 14. No person shall be allowed to remove from the herdsman's charge any stock registered as above without giving due notice of the same beforehand to the herdsman, upon receipt of which the owner so removing same will be entitled without further charge to substitute for each head so removed one or another head of stock for the unexpired portion of the registered period.

The Council shall have the exclusive right to cause all stock suspected of contagious disease or stock proved or reported tence breakers or jumpers or dangerous to the public, to be removed from such roads, and in the event of any registered stock dying the owner shall cause same to be removed or destroyed on receiving notice to do so, failing which the herdsman or inspector of nuisances shall cause same to be removed or destroyed at the owner's risk and expense in case of a disease, and in case of stock proving a nuisance as fence breakers, &c., the herdsman will impound same.
