CITY OF MELBOURNE.

BY-LAW NO. 132, FOR THE REGULATION OF NOXIOUS OR OFFENSIVE TRADES.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1915*, and of every other power enabling it on that behalf and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution, the Council of the City of Melbourne makes the following By-law for the regulation of noxious or offensive trades or businesses or manufactories, viz.:—

Blood boiling.
Blood drying.
Bone boiling.
Bone grinding or bone milling.
Bone manure depôt.
Dealing in bones, hides, horns, hoofs, or skins, whether for storage, drying, preservation, or conversion of such articles.
Fat rendering.
Fat extracting.
Fat melting.
Tallow melting.
Gut cleaning, gut scraping, sausage skin, catgut or fiddle-string manufacture.
Knackery.
Manure manufacture.
Soap manufacture.
Fellmongering.
Tanning.
Wool scouring or wool washing.
Marine store.

And hereby orders and directs that from and after this By-law coming into operation the provisions thereof shall apply to the whole of the city of Melbourne.

GENERAL PROVISIONS.—DEFINITIONS.

In the construction of this By-law unless inconsistent with the context or the subject-matter—

"Noxious or offensive matter" means any matter manufactured, product, residue, garbage, refuse, in whatever state, whether solid, liquid, or gaseous, from which any noxious or offensive effluvia fumes, vapour, gas, dust, or other impurity may be or is liable to be emitted.

"Premises" means lands, buildings, outbuildings, yard or enclosure used or intended to be used for the reception, treatment, disposal, production, manufacture, or storage of any article or material used or intended to be used in one or more of the noxious or offensive trades businesses or manufactories hereinbefore mentioned.

"Council" means the Council of the City of Melbourne.

"Owner" shall have the meaning assigned to the word "owner" in section 3 of the *Health Act 1915*.

"Occupier" means any person or persons in actual occupation of or entitled to occupy and use the premises in connexion with which the word is used.

"Inspector" includes any acting or assistant inspector of the Council.

SECTION I.

Blood Boiling, Blood Drying, Bone Boiling, Bone Grinding or Bone Milling, Fat Rendering, Fat Extracting, Fat Melting, Tallow Melting, Knackery, Manure Manufacture.

1. The following clauses shall apply to persons carrying on any of the above-mentioned trades or businesses.

2. *Interpretation.*—For the purpose of this section of this By-law manure manufacture is the manufacture of manure from or with the assistance of putrescible matter.

3. The owner or occupier shall on the premises cause every floor on which any process of the afore-mentioned trades is carried on to be properly covered with a layer of concrete or other approved durable and impervious materials laid upon a suitable bottom. He shall cause every such floor to have a proper slope towards a channel or gully, and to be effectually drained by adequate drains which shall be properly trapped and protected in compliance with the Regulations of the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works. He shall cause every drain and every apparatus connected therewith to be maintained at all times in good order and efficient action.

4. He shall on the premises cause each wall, post, column, pier, or other upright support of every chamber room or place containing noxious or offensive matter to be constructed of durable, non-absorbent material closely jointed and as far as practicable finished internally with smooth surface and with angles and corners rounded off and out sufficiently to prevent the lodgment of filth.

5. He shall on the premises cause the internal surface of the walls and every floor or pavement where any of the afore-mentioned trades are carried on to be kept

at all times in good order and repair so as to prevent the absorption of any liquid filth or refuse or any noxious or offensive matter.

6. He shall on the premises cause the internal surface of every wall at all times to be kept clean and after being thoroughly cleansed by scraping or other effectual means to be thoroughly washed with hot lime-wash four times at least in every year, that is to say at least once in each of the months of February, May, August, and December, and in addition as often as may be necessary for the keeping of such surfaces clean and wholesome as far as practicable.

7. He shall on the premises cause every boiler, digester, drier, mixer, vat, pan, tank, trough, tub, vessel, receptacle, utensil, apparatus, and appliance provided, used upon or in connexion with such premises to be thoroughly cleansed as often as may be necessary and to be kept, when not in use, at all times, in a thoroughly clean condition, and shall cause all noxious or offensive matter that has been littered, spilled, or splashed on such premises to be collected at least at the close of every working day.

8. He shall on the premises provide apparatus or appliances capable of effectually destroying noxious or offensive vapours, gases, or effluvia arising in any process or from any material residue or other substance which may be kept or stored on them, and shall cause every process in which such vapours, gases, or effluvia are generated to be carried on in such a manner that they shall be effectually destroyed.

9. He shall on the premises cause all materials which are not undergoing treatment to be so stored as to prevent the emission of noxious or offensive vapours, gases, or effluvia.

10. He shall on the premises cause all refuse from digesters or boiling pans and all refuse, residue, or other matters from which noxious or offensive vapours are evolved or liable to be evolved to be properly placed in closed receptacles or otherwise dealt with in such a manner as to prevent any noxious or offensive vapours, gases, or effluvia from escaping.

11. He shall cause all noxious or offensive matter that is taken to the premises or that results from the trade processes at such premises to be brought to or removed from such premises in a vehicle which shall be so constructed that it is air-tight when closed, and while any cart is in use, the trap or other door or means of access to the interior shall not be permitted to remain open longer than is actually necessary to receive or discharge such material. He shall cause every such cart to be thoroughly cleansed and the interior thereof shall thereafter be thoroughly washed out with an approved disinfectant daily.

SECTION IA.

Bone Grinding and Bone Milling.

1. The following additional clauses shall apply to persons carrying on any of the above-mentioned trades or businesses.

2. The owner or occupier shall on the premises cause the bone-grinding plant to be provided with such apparatus as will effectually collect any dust which may arise or be created during the process of grinding or crushing.

3. He shall on the premises cause all bone mills, disintegrators, elevators, screens, &c., to be enclosed within dust-proof structures.

SECTION II.

Gut Cleaning, Gut Scraping, Sausage Skin, Catgut or Fiddle String Manufacture.

1. The following clauses shall apply to persons carrying on any of the above-mentioned trades or businesses.

2. The owner or occupier shall on the premises cause every floor where scraping or cleaning is done to be properly covered with a layer of concrete or other approved durable and impervious material laid upon a suitable bottom. He shall cause every such floor to have a proper slope towards a channel or gully and to be effectually drained by adequate drains which shall be properly trapped and protected in compliance with the Regulations of the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works. He shall cause every drain and every apparatus connected therewith to be maintained at all times in good order and efficient action.

3. He shall on the premises cause each wall, post, column, pier, or other upright support of every chamber, room, or place containing noxious or offensive matter to be constructed of durable, non-absorbent material closely jointed and as far as practicable finished internally with smooth surface and with angles and corners rounded off and out sufficiently to prevent the lodgment of filth.

4. He shall on the premises cause the internal surface of the walls and every floor or pavement where any of the afore-mentioned trades are carried on to be kept at all times in good order and repair so as to prevent the absorption of any liquid filth or refuse or any noxious or offensive matter.

5. He shall cause all putrescible materials to be collected in approved receptacles provided with air-tight lids, which can be closed air-tight and all such receptacles while in use for collecting shall be closed air-tight except when being filled or emptied. He shall cause all materials which are not undergoing treatment to be kept in an approved receptacle closed air-tight until actually required for manufacture.

6. He shall on the premises cause all scraping and cleaning to be done in a separate room from that in which salting or spinning is done and he shall cause that no unclean guts shall remain in the salting or spinning room.

7. He shall on the premises cause all solid wastes to be placed as soon as may be in a metal receptacle capable of being closed air-tight, which shall be kept closed except when being filled or emptied, and shall cause the contents to be removed once in twenty-four hours and so disposed of as not to be a cause of nuisance, and shall cause every such receptacle to be thoroughly cleansed and the interior thereof thereafter to be thoroughly washed out with an approved disinfectant daily.

8. He shall at frequent intervals during every working day cause every floor or pavement upon the premises where his trade is carried on to be thoroughly swept and to be copiously sprinkled or washed with an effective disinfectant powder or solution.

9. He shall on the premises cause all floors, walls, fittings, and utensils to be thoroughly scrubbed clean with hot water at least at the close of every working day.

10. He shall on the premises cause such portions of the buildings or premises as may be indicated by the Council's inspector to be kept thoroughly lime-washed to the satisfaction of the inspector.

11. He shall, on the premises cause skins not to be blown up by the mouth of any person.

SECTION No. III.

Dealing in Bones, Hides, Horns, Hoofs, or Skins, whether for Storage, Drying, Preservation, or Conversion of such Articles.

1. The following clauses shall apply to persons carrying on any of the above-mentioned trades or businesses.

2. The owner or occupier shall on the premises cause, where indicated by the Council's inspector, every floor on which any process of the afore-mentioned trades is carried on to be covered with a layer of concrete or other approved durable and impervious materials laid upon a suitable bottom. He shall cause every such floor to have a proper slope towards a channel or gully and to be effectually drained by adequate drains which shall be properly trapped and protected in compliance with the Regulations of the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works. He shall cause every drain and every apparatus connected therewith to be maintained at all times in good order and efficient action.

3. He shall on the premises cause each wall, post, column, pier, or other upright support of every chamber, room, or place containing noxious or offensive matter to be constructed of durable non-absorbent material closely jointed and as far as practicable finished internally with smooth surface and with angles and corners rounded off and out sufficiently to prevent the lodgment of filth.

4. He shall on the premises cause the internal surface of the walls and every floor or pavement where any of the afore-mentioned trades are carried on to be kept at all times in good order and repair so as to prevent the absorption of any liquid, filth, or refuse, or any noxious or offensive matter.

5. He shall on the premises cause the internal surface of every wall at all times to be kept clean and after being thoroughly cleansed by scraping or other effectual means to be thoroughly washed with hot lime-wash four times at least in every year, that is to say at least once in each of the months of February, May, August, and December, and in addition as often as may be necessary for the keeping of such surfaces clean and wholesome as far as practicable.

6. He shall on the premises cause every floor and pavement and every drain upon his premises to be thoroughly cleansed and shall cause all litter, filth, or refuse or decomposed or noxious matters that may be upon his premises to be collected at the close of every working day and placed in properly constructed non-absorbent vessels or other suitable receptacles furnished with air-tight covers and shall cause the contents thereof to be disposed of to the satisfaction of the Council.

7. He shall store all green bones in suitable metal vessels or other approved impervious receptacles furnished with closely fitting covers, and shall cause the same to be removed from the premises at frequent intervals.

SECTION IV.

Fellmongering, Tanning, Woolscouring, Woolwashing.

1. The following clauses shall apply to persons carrying on any of the above-mentioned trades or businesses.

2. The owner or occupier shall on the premises cause all receptacles used for soaking, or cleansing wool, skins, hides, pelts, butts, or other such materials, or for holding puer, bate, lime, or tan liquor at all times to be maintained watertight and in good repair.

3. He shall on the premises cause all drainage from receptacles used for soaking or cleansing wool, skins, hides, pelts, butts, or other such material, or for holding puer, bate, or tan liquor to be discharged into drains constructed in compliance with the Regulations of the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works.

4. He shall on the premises cause all surfaces immediately adjacent to pits, all ground and every floor on which wet or moist wool, skins, hides, pelts, butts, or other material awaiting, or in process of manufacture, or wet or moist fleshings, roundings, or other refuse matters are, or are liable to be, placed or dropped, and the floor of every building used for sweating, pulling, unhairing, fleshing, rounding, or the like processes to be covered with a layer of concrete or other approved durable and impervious material laid upon a suitable bottom. He shall cause every such floor to have a proper slope to a gully or channel and to be effectually drained by adequate drains which shall be properly trapped and protected in compliance with the Regulations of the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works. He shall cause every drain and every apparatus connected therewith to be maintained at all times in good order and efficient action.

5. He shall cause the water in every receptacle used for the soaking or cleansing of any wool, skins, hides, pelt, butt, or other such material or for holding puer or bate, to be changed as often as may be necessary to prevent so far as practicable the emission of noxious or offensive vapours, gases, or effluvia from the contents of such receptacles.

6. He shall on the premises cause all surfaces to be kept in good order and repair so as to prevent as far as practicable the absorption of liquid filth, or refuse or of any noxious or offensive matter which may fall or be deposited thereon.

7. He shall on the premises, having regard to the nature of the business, cause the internal surface of every wall at all times to be kept clean and after being thoroughly cleansed by scraping or other effectual means, to be thoroughly washed with hot lime-wash as often as may be necessary for keeping such surfaces clean and wholesome as far as practicable.

8. He shall on the premises at least at the close of every working day cause every surface to be thoroughly cleansed and shall cause all filth or refuse which has been deposited or fallen on any surface to be collected in suitable receptacles having closely fitting covers and to be so kept therein so that as far as practicable no noxious or offensive vapours, gases, or effluvia may escape. He shall cause all filth, refuse, spent lime, hair fleshings, roundings, or other such materials to be removed from the premises once in every week at least, after being so treated if necessary, so as to prevent its being or becoming a nuisance, and shall cause every such receptacle when the same is emptied to be immediately and thoroughly cleansed.

9. He shall on the premises cause every beam or board and every table, bench, and implement to be cleansed as often as may be necessary to prevent any accumulation of filth thereon.

10. He shall cause the premises to be maintained free from nuisance at all times.

SECTION V.

Marine Store.

1. The following clauses shall apply to persons carrying on any of the above-mentioned trades or businesses.

2. The owner or occupier shall on the premises cause where indicated by the inspector all floors on which any process of the afore-mentioned trade is carried on to be covered with a layer of concrete or other approved durable and impervious material properly graded for drainage and provided with drains constructed in compliance with the Regulations of the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works. He shall cause all drains and apparatus connected therewith to be maintained at all times in good order and efficient action.

3. He shall, on the premises cause the walls and every floor or pavement to be kept at all times in good order and repair so as to prevent the absorption of any liquid, filth, or refuse or any noxious or offensive matter.

4. He shall on the premises cause all materials not undergoing treatment to be so stored as to prevent the emission of dust or noxious or offensive effluvia.

5. He shall on the premises cause all wastes to be placed in air-tight receptacles and removed at least once in twenty-four hours and shall cause them to be so disposed of as not to be a cause of nuisance.

6. He shall on the premises cause the internal surface of every wall at all times to be kept clean, and after being thoroughly cleansed by scraping or other effectual means to be thoroughly washed with hot lime-wash four times at least in every year, that is to say at least once in each of the months of February, May, August, and December, and in addition as often as may be necessary for the keeping of such surfaces clean and wholesome as far as practicable.

7. He shall cause the premises to be maintained free from nuisance at all times.

SECTION VI.

Soap Manufacture.

1. The following clauses shall apply to persons carrying on the above-mentioned trade or business.

2. The owner or occupier shall on the premises cause where indicated by the inspector all floors on which any process of the afore-mentioned trade is carried on to be covered with a layer of concrete or other approved durable and impervious material properly graded for drainage and provided with drains constructed in compliance with the Regulations of the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works. He shall cause all drains and apparatus connected therewith to be maintained at all times in good order and efficient action.

3. He shall, on the premises cause the walls and every floor or pavement to be kept at all times in good order and repair so as to prevent the absorption of any liquid filth, or refuse or any noxious or offensive matter.

4. He shall on the premises cause the internal surface of every wall to be at all times kept clean and after being thoroughly cleansed by scraping or other effectual means to be thoroughly washed with hot lime-wash as often as may be necessary for the purpose of keeping such surfaces clean and wholesome.

5. He shall on the premises cause every boiler, vat, pan, tank, tub, vessel, or other receptacle containing noxious or offensive matter to be provided with a cover so constructed and placed that when such receptacle is in use the escape of noxious or offensive vapours, gases, or effluvia will be prevented or diminished as far as practicable.

6. He shall on the premises cause every boiler, vat, pan, tank, tub, vessel, receptacle, utensil, or appliance used upon or in connexion with such premises to be thoroughly cleansed as often as may be necessary to prevent any accumulation of filth in or upon such boiler, vat, pan, tank, tub, vessel, receptacle, utensil, or appliance.

7. He shall on the premises cause all materials which are not undergoing treatment to be so stored as to prevent the emission of noxious or offensive vapours, gases, or effluvia.

8. He shall on the premises cause all wastes to be placed in air-tight receptacles and removed at least once in twenty-four hours and shall cause them to be so disposed of as not to be a cause of nuisance.

Penalties.—Every person who shall commit a breach of this By-law shall, for every such breach, be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds, provided nevertheless that the Justices or Court before whom any complaint may be made or any proceedings may be taken in respect of any such breach, may, if they think fit, order the whole or part only (not being less than Five shillings) of the penalty imposed by this By-law to be paid.

This By-law was made and passed by the Council of the City of Melbourne, at the meeting of the said Council, held on the 29th day of October, 1915.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Nagambie Waterworks Trust (the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Act 1915*), do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the power conferred by the said *Water Act 1915*, make the following By-law:—

BY-LAW MAKING A RATE FOR 1916.

The following are the rates which the occupiers or owners of land and tenements within the Urban District of Nagambie Waterworks Trust shall pay for the water supplied by the said Trust:—

For every house or tenement of the annual value of Ten pounds or under according to the municipal valuation an amount of One pound sterling per annum.

For every house or tenement of the annual value of Ten pounds or over according to the municipal valuation an amount of Two shillings (2s.) in the pound sterling of such valuation.

For all water supplied by the Trust (by meter) the sum of Two shillings (2s.) per 1,000 gallons will be charged except in cases of special agreement.

For all water sold from the stand-pipe a charge of Sixpence (6d.) per 100 gallons will be charged and paid for on delivery.

The before-mentioned rates and charges are made for one year, commencing on the first day of January, 1916, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1916, and shall be due and payable on the 1st day of January and the first day of July, 1916.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Nagambie Waterworks Trust may appoint from time to time for the purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect the said rates and charges.

WARRAGUL WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW.

THE Commissioners of the Warragul Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Act 1915*, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, do hereby make the following By-law:—

BY-LAW No. 6.

1. The following are the rates which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the Waterworks District of the Warragul Waterworks Trust shall pay for water supplied by the said Trust, that is to say:—

(a) For every house, building or tenement, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the £1 sterling upon the municipal valuation for the time being of such house, building or tenement shall be paid. Provided that such rate shall not be less than One pound two shillings and sixpence per annum, and provided further that the maximum quantity of water to be used by any ratepayer, owning or occupying one house, building or tenement only, shall be 1,000 gallons for every £1 sterling of such municipal valuation.

(b) For every piece of land occupied or unoccupied upon which there is no house or building erected, a rate of Eighteenpence in the £1 sterling upon the municipal valuation for the time being thereof shall be paid. Provided that such rate shall not be less than Ten shillings and sixpence per annum.

(c) And for every ratepayer owning or occupying two or more houses, buildings or tenements within the Waterworks District to each of which water meters have been and are attached, such maximum quantity to be consumed either wholly at any one or partly at one and partly at any other or others of the said houses, buildings, or tenements (and in all cases to be ascertained and paid for by measure) shall, for that part or the whole of the year as the case may be during which such ratepayer shall own or occupy such two or more houses, buildings or tenements, but no longer period, be 1,000 gallons for every £1 sterling of the total sum of the municipal

valuations of all the said houses, buildings or tenements owned or occupied by him. If such maximum quantities be exceeded the excess shall be paid for by measure at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

- (d) For water supplied by measure a rate of One shilling and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons shall be paid, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 15,000 gallons, this charge to apply also to all consumers outside the water area.

2. The rates herein are made for the year ending on the 31st day of December, 1916, and shall be payable on the 1st day of March, 1916, in one sum.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners shall appoint from time to time for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect and recover such rates.

DANDENONG WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW, FOR 1916.

THE Dandenong Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in execution of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act 1915*, make the following By-law:—

1st. The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1916 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Trust District, and such rates shall be payable in one moiety, and become due on the 1st day of January, 1916.

2nd. On every house and tenement of an annual municipal value of under Eight pounds sterling (£8), the minimum sum of Ten shillings (10s.).

3rd. On every house and tenement of an annual municipal value of Eight pounds sterling (£8) or upwards, the sum of One shilling in the pound (£1) on the amount of the said valuation.

4th. On warehouses and wholesale stores, not being dwellings or used in retail business, the sum of One shilling in the pound (£1) on the amount of municipal valuation, provided that in no case shall a less rate than One pound sterling be paid.

5th. A rate of One shilling in the pound (£1) on the municipal valuation shall be levied on all vacant land fronting such streets as are reticulated.

6th. Water supplied by measure to be used in private dwellings or other premises for domestic or other than domestic use shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons. The minimum quantity to be charged for yearly shall be that which at One shilling per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount which the Trust would be entitled to receive under the current rating upon the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons in addition to a supply for domestic or other purposes beyond such an amount as aforesaid.

7th. The charge for water supplied for manufacturing and other purposes, and to buildings, lands, and institutions not rated, to be subject to special agreement with the Trust.

8th. For water supplied to charitable institutions for gardens or irrigation purposes, Sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

9th. For water supplied for cricket or bowling grounds, the charge shall be subject to arrangement with the Trust.

10th. For water supplied to gardens or nurseries cultivated for trade purposes, One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

11th. For water supplied to private fountains, Twenty shillings each, or as may be decided upon by the Trust, in addition to a charge for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

12th. For water supplied and used solely as a motive power for hydraulic lifts, water blasts, turbines, water wheels, electric and other motors (subject to the supply being refused or discontinued at any time), One shilling per 1,000 gallons, or as may be agreed upon, in addition to the rating upon the assessment of the premises for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

13. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stone, brick work, or plastering.

WHEREAS it is provided under section 7 of the *Money Lenders Act* 1915, No. 2701, that the Governor in Council may make regulations respecting the registration of money lenders (including the prescribing of the conditions for registration and the grounds on which they may be removed from the register) whether individuals, firms, societies, or companies, the form of the register, and the particulars to be entered therein, and the fees to be paid on registration and renewal of registration not exceeding One pound for each registration or renewal, and respecting the inspection of the register and the fees payable therefor: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the said provisions, doth make the following regulations:—

1. Applications for registration or renewal of registration as a money lender under the *Money Lenders Act* 1915, No. 2701, shall be made to the Registrar-General in the form or to the effect of schedule one to these regulations.

2. The application shall be signed in the case of a person or persons by the person or persons desiring to be registered, or by some one duly authorized on his, her, or their behalf. In the case of a corporation the application may be sealed with the common seal of the corporation or may be signed on its behalf by its proper officer.

3. Whenever any such application is received by the Registrar-General, the proper officer shall immediately indorse thereon a number, and every such application shall be numbered successively according to the order of time in which the same is received, and shall immediately be entered according to such number in the register hereinafter provided for.

4. Upon registration the Registrar-General shall issue in respect of the same a certificate in the form or to the effect of schedule two to these regulations.

5. The renewal of any such registration may be made during the last month of the period for which such registration was effective, and any such renewal shall date as from the day of the expiration of the prior registration.

6. Upon such renewal the Registrar-General shall give a certificate of renewal or indorse the date of such renewal on the certificate of registration.

7. Upon the change in the place or places of business of an individual registered as a money lender, or upon the change of any kind in a firm, society, or company so registered, or in its place or places of business, the registration of such money lender shall cease to have effect, and shall entail a fresh registration, which must be made within one calendar month of such change.

8. There shall be kept in the office of the Registrar-General, in the form of schedule three to these regulations, a register in which the names of all registered money lenders shall be entered, together with the other particulars specified in the said schedule.

9. The fee to be paid in respect of each registration, or the renewal thereof, shall be the sum of One pound.

10. A fee of One shilling shall be paid for the inspection of the entry in the register in respect to the record therein of each registered money lender.

11. Any person may, on the payment of a fee of One shilling, obtain a certified copy of any entry in such register.

12. The grounds on which the name of any money lender may be removed from the register shall be the conviction for any offence against the provisions of the *Money Lenders Act 1915*, or for any indictable or infamous offence. Upon proof, to the satisfaction of the Governor in Council, of any such conviction, the registration of such money lender shall, if the Governor in Council so direct, cease to have effect, and his name shall be removed from the register, and a notification of such removal shall be published in the *Government Gazette*.

13. Any registered money lender ceasing to carry on business as a money lender may have his name removed from the register.

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Arthur Lyulph Stanley, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 40 of *Weights and Measures Act 1915* (6 Geo. V. No. 2748) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may at any time if he thinks fit (either with or without a request from the council of any of the boroughs or shires constituting such union) and shall at the request of not less than half of such councils, dissolve the same by a proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas the Councils of the Borough of Maryborough and of the Shire of Tullaroop, two of the councils constituting the *Weights and Measures Union of the Boroughs of Carisbrook, Majoreca, and Maryborough, and the Shire of Tullaroop*, having requested that such union be dissolved: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation dissolve the "Union" of the Boroughs of Carisbrook, Majoreca, and Maryborough, and the Shire of Tullaroop, as aforesaid.

BY-LAW No. 27.

A By-law of the Shire of Warragul, made under section 604 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and numbered 27, for the care, management, and control of public baths in the township of Warragul.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1915*, the President, Councillors, and Rate-payers of the Shire of Warragul order as follows:—

1. The Baths shall be open to the public at such times and at such hours as may be from time to time appointed.
2. No person shall enter the swimming bath before washing himself in the shower bath.

DETERMINATION OF THE SOAP AND SODA BOARD.

IN accordance with the provisions of the *Factories and Shops Act 1915*, the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of a maker of (a) Soap, (b) Washing Soda, has made the following Determination, namely:—

1. That previous Determinations of this Board are hereby amended, and such amendments shall come into force and be operative on and after the 7th day of April, 1916. The Determination and amendments are printed hereunder.

WAGES.

2. The lowest rates of wages payable to the undermentioned persons shall be:—

APPRENTICES AND IMPROVERS.

"Apprentice" means any person under 21 years of age bound by indentures of apprenticeship, or any person over 21 years of age who, with the sanction of the Minister, is bound by indentures of apprenticeship. (Act 2650, Section 3.)

"Improver" means any person (other than an apprentice) who does not receive a piece-work price or a wages rate fixed by any Special Board for persons other than apprentices or improvers and who is not over 21 years of age, or who, being over 21 years of age, holds a licence from the Minister to be paid as an improver. (Act 2650, Section 3.)

4. That—

- (a) the lowest rates which may be paid to an apprentice or an improver; and
- (b) the proportionate number of apprentices and improvers who may be employed by any employer

shall be as shown in the following table:—

SPECIAL RATES FOR SUNDAYS AND PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.

7. That double time shall be the special rate for all work done on—
Sunday, and

that time and a half shall be the special rate for all work done on—

New Year's Day,
The 26th January (Foundation Day),
Good Friday,
Easter Monday,
The 21st April (Eight Hours Day),
Christmas Day,
Boxing Day;

but, if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.

PIECE-WORK.

8. The Board determines, under the provisions of sub-sections (1) and (2) of section 144 of the *Factories and Shops Act* 1915, that any employer may fix and pay piece-work prices to any person employed in the process, trade, or business of a maker of (a) soap, (b) washing soda, provided that such employer shall base such piece-work prices on the earnings of an average worker working under like conditions, and such piece-work prices shall be fixed so that an average worker can earn not less than the wages rate fixed by the Board for such work.
