MURDER OF WILLIAM PATRICK HAINES AT HEIDELBERG.

£250 REWARD, AND FREE PARDON TO AN ACCOMPLICE.

WHEREAS at Eleven a.m. on Tuesday, the 29th day of February ultimo, the dead body of William Patrick Haines, a chauffeur, was found covered by a rug in a stationary motor car at the intersection of Bulleen-road and Thompson-road, Heidelberg, with two bullet wounds, one in the head and one in the neck.

Notice is hereby given that a reward of Two hundred and fifty pounds (£250) will be paid by the Government for such information as will lead to the arrest and conviction of the person or persons who committed the crime, and that His Excellency the Governor will extend His Majesty's Free Pardon to any person implicated in the offence who will give such information as will lead to the arrest and conviction of the offender or offenders, provided such informant did not actually commit the murder.

The Medical Act 1915.—Part II.—Dentists.

DENTAL BOARD OF VICTORIA.

REGULATIONS, RELATING TO ELECTIONS.

WHEREAS under section 43 of the *Medical Act 1915* the Dental Board of Victoria may, with the consent and approval of the Governor in Council, make regulations prescribing the mode in which elections of members of the Dental Board by dentists shall be conducted, and generally for carrying the Act into effect: Now therefore the Dental Board of Victoria does, with the approval of the Governor in Council, make the following Regulations relating to such elections, viz. :—

REGULATIONS.

1. *Appointment of Returning Officer.*—The Board shall from time to time appoint (and may reinove) some fit and proper person who is registered under the *Medical Act 1915, Part II.*, or under the *Medical Act 1890, Part II.*, or under the *Dentists Acts 1887, 1898, or 1910*, and not being a member of the Board, to be the Returning Officer, and to conduct the election of members of the Board in accordance with the provisions hereinafter made in that behalf.

2. *Expense of Elections.*—The Board shall pay to the Returning Officer for his own use, out of the moneys accrued or accruing under the *Medical Act 1915, Part II.*, or under the *Medical Act 1890, Part II.*, or under the *Dentists Acts 1887, 1898, or 1910*, a fee of £2 2s. for each and every election conducted by such Returning Officer, together with a sum of money sufficient to recoup him all expenses incurred for the purpose of holding and conducting such election.

3. *Election of Members.*—In the month of February in every year in which the vacancies on the Board are filled by election by the dentists, the Returning Officer shall proceed to the election of as many persons who are eligible to be members of the Board as there are vacancies to be filled by election (not being extraordinary vacancies) occurring in each such year.

4. *Extraordinary Vacancies, how Filled.*—If any member who has been elected by the dentists to be a member of the Board die, or by notice under his hand delivered to the President or Registrar, resign his office as member, or become incapable of being a member, or be declared ousted from such office by the Supreme Court, or be absent from four consecutive ordinary meetings of the Board without leave obtained from the Board in that behalf, then in every such case the office of such member shall become vacant, and such vacancy shall be an extraordinary vacancy, and shall be notified to the Returning Officer by the Board, and the Returning Officer shall, upon receiving such notification, proceed to the election of a person eligible under the Act to fill such extraordinary vacancy.

5. *Returning Officer to give Notice of Day of Election and Day of Nomination—Time and Place, when and where Nominations will be Received.*—At every election for a member or members to serve on the Board the

Returning Officer shall give twenty-one days' notice by advertisement in such paper or papers as may be approved by the Board, of his intention to proceed on a certain day, to be named in such advertisement, to hold an election of a fit and proper person or fit and proper persons (as the case may be) to serve as a member or members on such Board; and he shall also in such advertisement name a day, being not less than fifteen days nor more than eighteen days prior to the day named for holding such election, on or before which all candidates for election must be nominated as hereinafter provided; and he shall also, in such advertisement, name the time and place, when and where such nominations will be received, and shall sign such notice and affix the date it is given thereto.

6. *Who may Nominate, and how.*—Any person registered under the Medical Act 1915, Part II., or under the Medical Act 1890, Part II., or under the Dentists Act 1887, 1893, or 1910, desirous of nominating any other person as a candidate, shall fill up a nomination paper in the form of the First Schedule hereto, stating therein the Christian name and surname of such candidate, together with the other particulars required by such Schedule, and such nomination paper shall be signed by not less than five persons duly qualified to vote at such election or elections, and the person therein named as a candidate shall signify his acceptance of such nomination by notification, in writing, to the Registrar of the Board.

7. If the number of duly nominated candidates be reduced by death to the number or less than the number to be elected, the Returning Officer shall declare the remaining candidates duly elected. If the Returning Officer is satisfied of the death of a duly nominated candidate before the voting-papers are printed, he shall omit the name of such candidate from the voting-papers, or if any of such papers have been printed but not issued, he shall erase or cross out therefrom the name of the deceased candidate.

8. *When Returning Officer may Declare Members Selected without a Poll—When a Poll shall be Taken.*—The Returning Officer shall, in the event of there not being a greater number of persons nominated than are required to fill the vacancies created, make a return to the Registrar of the Board, and declare such person or persons to have been duly elected member or members of the Board; but if the number of persons nominated is greater than the number of persons required to fill such vacancies, a poll shall be taken. For this purpose the Registrar shall prepare a Roll of Registered Dentists in alphabetical order of surnames, and shall prefix to each name on the roll a number, beginning at the first name with the number one and continuing the numbers in regular arithmetical series to the last name on the roll; and the Returning Officer shall cause voting-papers, each with a counterfoil attached, to be printed in the form given in the Second Schedule hereto, and shall sign or initial each of such papers on the face thereof, and shall write on the counterfoil and also on the back, near the lower edge of each of the voting-papers so signed or initialled, the number corresponding with the number prefixed to the voter's name on the roll, and shall cause one of such voting-papers (with counterfoil attached) to be enclosed in an envelope not fastened, with the name and address of the Returning Officer printed or written thereon, and shall post such voting-paper and envelopes under a fastened cover to the address of each and every registered dentist. The voter shall enclose such voting-paper in the addressed envelope, and shall post the same so that it shall be received by the Returning Officer in course of post before Ten o'clock of the morning of the day fixed for holding such election.

9. *Voting-Papers may become Invalid—Voting-Paper to be Posted to Address of Returning Officer.*—If any voter shall suffer to remain not struck out upon any voting-paper a greater or less number of names than the number of members to be elected, the vote given on and by such paper shall be void and of no effect, and shall not be counted by the Returning Officer. Provided that the fact that a name not struck out is that of a candidate who is dead shall not invalidate the voting-paper.

10. *Appointment of Scrutineers.*—Each candidate shall be entitled to appoint, in writing, one scrutiner, to be present when the Returning Officer shall open the envelopes containing the voting-papers on the day of holding the election.

11. *Returning Officer to Ascertain Number of Voters for each Candidate in Presence of Registrar and Scrutineers—Candidates Declared Duly Elected—Casting Vote of Returning Officer.*—The Returning Officer shall, in the presence of the Registrar, or, in his absence, in the presence of any person appointed on that behalf by the Board, and of any scrutineers appointed by any candidates on the day named in such advertisement for holding any election, proceed to open the envelopes with his printed or written address thereon, and which have been returned to him, and to take out the voting-papers therein contained, and without unfolding such

voting-paper or allowing it to be inspected he shall inspect and allow the scrutineers to inspect the number on the counterfoil; and if the vote is allowed by the Returning Officer he shall tear off the counterfoil without seeing or allowing the scrutineers to see the names of the candidates on the voting-paper, and shall insert the voting-papers in a separate ballot-box; and when all such voting-papers have been so inserted he shall proceed to inspect the same, and also to allow the scrutineers to inspect them, but subject to the proviso that he shall not allow the scrutineers to see the number on the back of the voting-paper; and if he is satisfied that each vote is properly given, he shall proceed to ascertain the number of such votes given for each candidate; and as soon as conveniently may be after the day of holding such election the Returning Officer shall give public notice, by advertisement, of the number of votes given to each candidate, and shall declare the candidates, not exceeding the number of vacancies to be filled up, who have received the greatest number of votes to be duly elected as members of the Dental Board of Victoria, and if two or more candidates shall have received an equal number of votes, the Returning Officer shall in each case have the casting vote.

All previous Regulations relating to the elections of members of the Board are hereby cancelled.

Health Acts.

REGULATIONS FOR THE PREVENTION OR MITIGATION OF CEREBRO-SPINAL MENINGITIS.

THE Governor in Council of the State of Victoria having, by an Order, dated the 29th day of February, 1916, directed that the provisions contained in section 173 of the Health Act 1915, as amended by the Health Act 1915 (No. 2), No. 2810, be put into force in Victoria, the Board of Public Health doth hereby make the following Regulations for the prevention or mitigation of the dangerous infectious disease known as Cerebro-Spinal Meningitis, that is to say—

(1) *Short Title.*—These regulations may be cited as the "Meningitis Regulation 1916."

(2) *Interpretation.*—"Board" means the Board of Public Health.

"Council" means the council of any municipality, including the cities of Melbourne and Geelong.

"Patient" means a person who is suffering from cerebro-spinal meningitis.

(3) On receipt of notification of a case of cerebro-spinal meningitis the council shall isolate the premises wherein the patient resides, together with the occupants of such premises, and shall cause inquiries to be made into the whole circumstances of the case, including the general sanitary environment of the premises. The premises and its occupants shall be kept in isolation for such period as the Officer of Health deems necessary.

(4) Any contact who has occupied any room at the same time as the patient and within seven days of his isolation shall report himself to the Officer of Health of the municipal district in which such contact resides, and shall submit to medical examination at such times and places as the Officer of Health specifies.

(5) Every contact shall submit to and carry out such treatment as the Officer of Health specifies and for such period as he directs.

(6) The council shall isolate any contact who develops symptoms of cerebro-spinal meningitis, or nasal catarrh, sore throat, or influenza, and such contact shall be kept in isolation for such period as the Officer of Health considers necessary.

(7) The council shall isolate every carrier, and such carrier shall submit to and carry out such treatment as the Officer of Health specifies, and every carrier shall be kept in isolation until the Officer of Health is satisfied that he has ceased to be liable to convey infection.

(8) The council shall cause any premises which any patient has occupied or been employed in to be disinfectated to the satisfaction of the Officer of Health.

(9) No person who has recovered from an attack of cerebro-spinal meningitis shall be released from isolation until the Officer of Health is satisfied that he has ceased to be liable to convey infection.

(10) The council shall in every case of cerebro-spinal meningitis furnish a report to the Board as soon as possible after the notification of the case is received, and such report shall include particulars as to source of infection, movements of the patient for two weeks prior to the onset of the illness, place of employment, measures taken to prevent the spread of the disease, and all other matters that will aid the Board in taking action to safeguard the public welfare.

(11) Every Council and its officers are hereby authorized, required and directed to superintend and see to the execution of these regulations and to provide for the supply of medicines and other substances for the prevention or cure and for affording to persons afflicted by or threatened with cerebro-spinal meningitis, such medical or other aid as may be required.

(12) Any person who fails to comply with any of the foregoing regulations, or is guilty of any neglect or disobedience thereof, is, by section 388 of the Health Act 1915, thereby guilty of an offence against that Act, and is liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, and to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Twenty shillings for each day during which such offence is continued, besides any cost or expenses which may be incurred in remedying his default.

BOROUGH OF DUNOLLY.

BY-LAW UNDER THE WATER ACT 1915.

ACTING under the powers conferred by the Water Act 1915, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Dunolly hereby make the following By-law for the purpose of levying a Water Rate within the Water Supply District of Dunolly as duly defined upon the occupiers or owners of any tenements (other than land on which there is no building) situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down; also for the purpose of determining the charges to be made for the sale of water within such district.

By-law No. 51.

All former regulations so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law are hereby repealed as from the 31st December, 1915.

The following are the rates which the occupiers and owners of tenements liable to be rated shall pay in each year, by equal half-yearly instalments, in respect of water supplied by the Council within the aforesaid district:—

*NOTE.—The letters A.M.V. shall in each case be taken to mean Annual Municipal Valuation.

3. For Government buildings, other than the Railway buildings, and all church, charitable, and other properties not rated, and on any vacant allotments that are rated, requiring to be supplied with water, such may be supplied by entering into a special agreement with the Council.

4. Water troughs, with ball tap, connected with hotels and erected on the public highway, £1 per annum.

5. Steam boilers, exceeding two horse-power (excepting for flour mills), £3 per annum.

6. Steam boilers, used only in the manufacture of sausage meat, at the rate of £1 10s. per annum.

7. Water from the stand-pipe, for every load of 400 gallons or less, 3d. per load.

8. Flour mills requiring water for milling purposes, a charge of 3d. per 1,000 gallons supplied by meter.

9. Victorian Railways, requiring water, a charge of 1s. per 1,000 gallons supplied by meter.

10. On all tenements (other than land on which there is no building) situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down, and which tenement is not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipe, a charge of 5s. per annum.

11. Every garden in connexion with a building having an area of more than two square chains in extent, including footpaths, for any area over the two square chains water may be supplied by entering into a special agreement with the Council.

12. Only iron receptacles that are watertight and fitted with a ball tap in working order will be permitted to be erected on the footwalks for livery and other purposes.

13. All meters that may be required shall be provided and fixed in position at the expense of the occupiers or owners of the property.

14. No meter shall be affixed unless the dial of same is capable of registering one million gallons.

15. The Council reserves to itself the right, if at any time it finds it necessary or expedient to restrict the supply of water for garden purposes; and further, at all times prohibits the use of water for the growing of crops or using land for marketing purposes, other than the two square chains allowed, excepting by agreement.

16. Any person receiving water from the Council who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to carry or take any such water or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

17. Any person who, not having agreed to be supplied by the Council, who shall take or carry away water from any tap, trough, or private or public service pipe shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

18. No person shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Council without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Council, nor shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the direction of a duly authorized officer of the Council appointed for the purpose, and any person committing a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.

19. The service pipes for conveying water from the pipes of the Council into the premises of consumers shall be of such size as the Council may in each case approve, but in no case shall they exceed the following diameters:—For the domestic supply of premises, $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch diameter, and for all supplies by measurement, such diameter as the Council shall authorize in each case.

20. If any person shall waste water of the Council by neglecting to repair any service pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Council into or upon the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the Council that such service pipe requires repairing, the Council may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service pipe or otherwise as the Council may deem fit until the necessary repairs shall have been effected.

21. No person supplied with water by the Council shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, and any person committing a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.

22. No person shall connect any service pipe or branch service pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same where a meter is in use without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter.

23. Any person requiring to be supplied with water shall give notice to the Council and receive its sanction before opening the ground or interfering with the main.

24. Before such sanction shall be given, the person giving such notice shall satisfy the Council that the person to be employed to carry out the work is a competent workman, and such work shall be done under the supervision and according to the directions of the officer of the Council appointed for that purpose.

25. The entire cost of laying on the service from the main shall be borne by the person requiring the water, excepting where carried to the opposite side of the road to the main, when the length to within four feet of the footwalk will be provided by the Council; also the stop-cocks in every case.

26. The Water Inspector or any other officer of the Council appointed under its seal for such purpose shall have power to enter upon the premises or buildings whether within or without such buildings for the purpose of inspecting all water mains and services at any time when he has reasonable cause to believe that any breach of this By-law is allowed or is taking place.

27. The rate shall be payable half-yearly in advance, namely, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July in the year 1916; and the charges for the supply of water shall also be payable in like manner, or as may be demanded, in the case of the service being by meter.

28. Such person or persons as the Council may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

TRAMWAYS WITHIN THE CITIES OF CAMBERWELL, HAWTHORN, AND MALVERN, AND THE TOWN OF KEW.

BURKE-ROAD TRAMWAY.

WHEREAS by the *Tramways Act 1915* it is provided that tramways may be constructed in any municipal district (except in the municipal districts of Fitzroy, Collingwood, Prahran, Kew, Port Melbourne, and Saint Kilda), when authorized by an Order of the Governor in Council made in that behalf, upon the application of the Council of the municipality, in compliance with the provisions of the said Act and of the Rules and Regulations to be from time to time made by the Governor in Council: And whereas the provisions of the *Tramways Act 1915* were extended by the *Kew (Burke-road) Tramway Act 1915*, No. 2731, so as to provide for the construction, operation, and management by the Prahran and Malvern Tramways Trust of a certain tramway in the municipal district of Kew: And whereas the Prahran and Malvern Tramways Trust, in pursuance with the powers vested in it under the provisions of the Prahran and Malvern Tramways Trust Acts, and under the provisions of the *Tramways Act 1915*, No. 2739, and the *Kew (Burke-road) Tramway Act 1915*, No. 2731, has now made application, by and with the consents of the Councils of the cities of Camberwell, Hawthorn, Malvern, and the town of Kew, to construct a tramway along Burke-road within the municipal districts of Camberwell, Hawthorn, Malvern, and Kew, and the said Prahran and Malvern Tramways Trust, having duly complied with the requirements of the said Acts, and the Regulations made thereunder with regard to the publication of its intention to so apply, and no objection having been lodged thereto within the time provided by such Rules, the Governor in Council, being satisfied that it is expedient and proper that the said application should be granted, has determined to grant the same, subject to all the restrictions and conditions hereafter contained.

Now therefore the Governor in Council, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Acts, doth for the purpose aforesaid make the Order following (that is to say):—

That the Prahran and Malvern Tramways Trust shall be and is hereby authorized to construct a tramway along Burke-road within the municipal districts of Camberwell, Hawthorn, Malvern, and Kew.

Route.

That the route of such tramway shall be as follows:— Commencing at the intersection of Cotham-road and Burke-road, Kew; thence southerly along Burke-road to Malvern-road, Malvern.

Gauge.

That the gauge of such tramway shall be four feet eight and one-half inches (4 ft. 8½ in.), and that the said tramway shall be constructed in the manner set out and described in the working plans and specifications, numbered from 1 to 11 inclusive, now deposited in the Public Works Department, and which plans and specifications are indorsed with a memorandum of the Minister of Public Works identifying the said plans and specifications so deposited as the plans and specifications referred to in this Order, and which plans and specifications, except in so far as the same may be varied by these presents, are to be deemed to be incorporated in this Order, and to be as much part of the same as if they were set out in detail in this Order.

Motive Power.

That the motive power to be used upon the said tramway shall be electricity.

Maximum Speed.

That the maximum speed of the progression of the cars upon the said tramway, with hand brake equipments on the cars, shall be at the rate of 15 miles per hour, and with magnetic air, or other approved power brakes and life guards, the maximum speed shall be at the rate of 20 miles per hour.

Time of Completion.

That the tramway shall be completed and open for traffic within a period of two years from the date of the Order in Council authorizing the construction of the tramway.

Traffic.

That the tramway shall be used for the carriage of passengers and such parcels or packages as they may have in their possession.

Necessary Precautions for Safety of Passengers and Public to be Observed.

That every precaution necessary to secure the safety of the passengers upon the said tramway, and also to secure the safety of passengers passing along the streets upon the route of such tramway, shall be taken and ordered by the Prahran and Malvern Tramways Trust.

That all cars shall be stopped before entering the curves at the intersections of Burke, Cotham, and White Horse roads and Burke and Malvern roads, and the conductor shall proceed to the curves so as to obtain a full view of the thoroughfare into which the car is about to enter, and shall signal the driver to proceed only when he (the conductor) shall have satisfied himself that the road is clear.

Provision Firing Precedence of Cars of the Prahran and Malvern Tramways Trust and the Hawthorn Tramways Trust Crossing Roadway.

That whichever car of the Prahran and Malvern Tramways Trust, or of the Hawthorn Tramways Trust, shall arrive first at the crossing at the intersection of Burke, Riversdale, and Camberwell roads, such car shall take precedence in crossing the roadway. Provided always that all cars of the Prahran and Malvern Tramways Trust and of the Hawthorn Tramways Trust shall be stopped before proceeding over the said crossing, and the conductor shall walk in advance of his car so as to obtain a full view of the thoroughfare into which the car is about to enter, and shall signal the driver to proceed only when he (the conductor) shall have satisfied himself that the road is clear.

Stoppages for Taking Up and Setting Down Passengers.

That for the convenience of the public the cars shall stop for the purpose of taking up and setting down passengers at the intersection of such streets as are indicated by notice boards or other sufficient devices erected at such intersections to be stopping points, and at such other points upon the route of the tramway as may be convenient, and in such manner as not to interfere with or endanger the general traffic of the streets or the safety of the passengers in the cars.

Tolls and Charges.

That the charge to be made upon the said tramway shall be One penny for each passenger on each of the following sections or part thereof:—

- (a) Between White Horse-road and Camberwell Railway Station, and *vice versa*.
- (b) Between Barker's-road and Riversdale-road, and *vice versa*.
- (c) Between Camberwell Railway Station and Anderson-road, and *vice versa*.
- (d) Between St. Helen's-road and Malvern-road, and *vice versa*.

With power to the Trust to enter into arrangements with the Councils of the cities of Camberwell, Hawthorn, and Malvern and the town of Kew, or other authority or authorities conferring the right to provide for a penny overlapping section upon the tramways of the Trust and the tramways of the Councils of the cities of Camberwell, Hawthorn, and Malvern, and the town of Kew, or any other authority or authorities.

For each child under twelve years of age (other than children under four years of age carried on passenger's lap, who shall be carried free), One penny for any one of the above sections, or for any two continuous sections; provided, however, that for any one or more sections the fare to be charged for two children travelling together under the age of twelve years shall not exceed the fare charged for one adult.

Continuous Sections.

That power is also given to the Trust to enter into arrangements with any Trust, Council, or other authority or authorities conferring the right to charge for a through continuous trip over the tramways of the Trust and the tramways of any such Trust, Council, and the tramways of any other authority or authorities, an entire fare of Twopence (2d.) for any three continuous sections, of which one is on the tramways of the Trust and two are on the tramways of such Trust, Council, or any other authority or authorities, or *vice versa*, and for each child under twelve (12) years of age (other than children under four (4) years of age carried on passenger's lap, who shall be carried free), a fare of One penny for any three sections referred to.

That power is also given to the Trust to enter into arrangements with any Trust, Council, or other authority or authorities, conferring the right to charge for a through continuous trip over the tramways of the Trust

and the tramways of any such Trust, Council, and the tramways of any other authority or authorities, an entire fare of Threepence (3d.) for any four continuous sections, of which one is on the tramways of the Trust and three are on the tramways of such Trust, Council, or any other authority or authorities, or *vice versa*, and for each child under twelve (12) years of age (other than children under four years of age carried on passenger's lap, who shall be carried free), a fare of Twopence (2d.) for any four sections referred to.

Combined Fares over Lines in Cities of Camberwell, Caulfield, Hawthorn, Malvern, and St. Kilda.

Nothing in this Order or in any previous Order or Orders granted to the Trust or to any municipality and assigned to the Trust shall preclude the Trust charging an entire fare of Fivepence (5d.) for a through continuous trip over the lines of the Trust from the corner of Burke and Cotham roads, Kew, to the terminus of the St. Kilda tramway at the St. Kilda Esplanade, and to charging an entire fare of Threepence (3d.) for such continuous trip for each child over twelve years of age (other than children under four years of age carried on passenger's lap, who shall be carried free).

That power is also given to the Trust to enter into arrangements with the Hawthorn Tramways Trust conferring the right to charge an entire fare of not less than Sixpence (6d.) and not exceeding Serenpence (7d.) for a through continuous trip over the tramways of the Trust and the tramways of the Hawthorn Tramways Trust from the terminus of the Hawthorn Tramways Trust line at the corner of Boundary and Norwood roads, Camberwell, along Norwood and Camberwell roads and the lines of the Trust to the terminus of St. Kilda tramway at the St. Kilda Esplanade, or *vice versa*; and to further entering into arrangements with the said Trust conferring the right to charge an entire fare of not less than Threepence (3d.) and not exceeding Fourpence (4d.) for such continuous trip for each child under twelve years of age (other than children under four years of age carried on passenger's lap, who shall be carried free).

Special Tickets to School Children.

That the charge to be made for return tickets to school children under the age of eighteen years over any two sections shall be One penny, for any four sections Twopence, and for any six sections Threepence, subject to such conditions as to the days on and the hours between which such return tickets shall be available as the Trust may by regulations determine, also in such regulations to limit the right of travel in respect of such return tickets to a portion only of the car.

Minimum or Through Fares for any Specified Distance.

That power is hereby given to the Trust to run cars at minimum or through fares upon the said tramway for any specified distance, provided that the amount of such minimum or through fare shall not exceed the total sum of the sectional fares upon such tramway or such parts of such tramway over which the cars shall be run. Every such car shall have a notice or notices plainly exhibited on the outside of such car indicating its destination and the minimum fare chargeable thereon.

Special Cars.

That the charge to be made—

- (1) For the hire of a special car, with a seating capacity not exceeding thirty-six persons, 1s. 6d. per car mile between the hours of 6 a.m. and midnight, and 2s. 6d. per car mile after midnight.
- (2) For the hire of a special car, with a seating capacity exceeding thirty-six persons, 2s. 6d. per car mile between 6 a.m. and midnight, and 3s. 6d. per car mile after midnight. The car mileage shall be the mileage run by the car from the time of its leaving the depot until its return thereto. Provided always, however, that a minimum charge of £1 1s. may be made for the hiring of any special car between 6.30 a.m. and midnight, and £2 2s. between midnight and 1 a.m., and the sum of 5s. per hour per car for detention during the journey for which such special car is hired.

Fares in Case of Combined Tram and Railway Passengers.

Nothing herein contained shall prevent the Trust from entering into any arrangement with the Railways Commissioners to sell through tickets to travel over both tramway and railway, and in that case charging or providing for the payment of fares at a lower rate than those specified in this Order in respect of passengers travelling over both tramway and railway.

Tramway over the Glen Iris Line of Railway at Burke-road, Gardiner.

(a) That in respect of the tramway crossing over the Glen Iris railway line at Burke-road, the Trust shall defray the whole cost of the tramway crossing over the railway line, and one-half of the cost of the interlocked gates, signal box, and signals, and of such other interlocking, catch points, and safety appliances as may be necessary in connexion with such crossing;

(b) That the Trust shall reimburse the Commissioners the cost of the maintenance and upkeep of such crossing, and one-half of the cost of the maintenance and upkeep of the gates, signal box, signals, interlocking, catch points, and other safety appliances;

(c) That the Trust shall reimburse the Commissioners one-half of the cost of the wages and expenses of the signalmen required to operate the gates and signals, less the cost (£38 per annum) incurred by the Commissioners as the remuneration of the gatekeeper of the crossing.

(d) That the tramway shall, so far as regards its use, running, and maintenance on or across the railway lines, be under the absolute control of and subject to all such By-laws, Regulations, and Orders as may from time to time be made by the Commissioners, who shall not, however, be in any way liable in respect of any damage or injury which may in any manner occur to any person or to any property in consequence of the said tramway crossing the railway line, except such damage or injury arise from the negligence or default of the Commissioners, and the tramway service shall at all times be subordinate to the railway requirements;

(e) That in the event of the regrading of the line between Gardiner and Glen Iris the Trust shall pay to the Commissioners such sum of money towards the cost of regrading as may be determined by the Governor in Council, having regard to the benefits which will arise from the abolition of the level crossing; provided that such contribution shall not exceed the capitalized amount of the annual value of the benefits to the Trust occasioned by the abolition of the level crossing; and that, in arriving at the value of such benefits, any expenditure incurred by the Trust in the alteration of road levels as the result of the regrading of the line shall be taken into consideration.

(f) That in the event of the adoption of electric traction for the purpose of operating the trains on the Glen Iris railway line, the Trust or the authority which operates or controls the tramway shall bear one-half of the cost of any special work or works in connexion with the electrical plant and equipment of the railways or of the tramway which, in the opinion of the Commissioners, may be necessary in order to provide for the safe working of the railways and tramway traffic over the railway line on the level, but the Trust or the authority which operates or controls the tramway shall not be entitled to a reimbursement of the cost of any such special work in the event of the subsequent construction of a bridge to carry the vehicular and tramway traffic over or under the railway line, and in such event the Trust or the authority which operates or controls the tramway shall also bear the cost of any other work or works or alterations which may be necessary to the tramway line in consequence thereof.

Tramway over the Camberwell Line of Railway at Burke-road, Camberwell.

That in the event of the tramway crossing the Camberwell railway at Burke-road on the level prior to the construction of the bridge which it is intended to place over the railway lines—

(a) The Trust shall defray the whole cost of the tramway crossing over the railway lines, and also the whole cost of catch points or any other safety appliances that may be necessary in connexion with such crossing.

(b) The Trust shall reimburse the Commissioners the cost of the maintenance and upkeep of such crossing, catch points, and other safety appliances;

(c) The tramway shall, so far as regards its use, running, and maintenance on or across the railway lines, be under the absolute control of and subject to all such By-laws, Regulations, and Orders as may from time to time be made by the Commissioners, who shall not, however, be in any way liable in respect of any damage or injury which may in any manner occur to any person or to any property in consequence of the said tramway crossing the railway line, except such damage or injury arise from negligence or default of the Commissioners, and the tramway service shall at all times be subordinate to the railway requirements; and

- (d) The Trust shall bear the whole cost of any alterations which may be necessary in connexion with the tramway when the bridge is built and the roadway is carried across the railway overhead.

Cost of Alteration to Postal Wires Incidental to Use of Electricity.

In the event of the Postal Department demanding any special alteration of its wires in consequence of the introduction of a high tension or other electrical current in connexion with the tramway, the cost of any special arrangement of, or provision for the wires because of such current, shall be paid and borne by the Trust.

Electric Wires Crossing Lines of Railways Commissioners to be Constructed so as not to interfere.

Any electric line or lines in connexion with the said tramway which would cross under or over any wire of the Commissioners, or which would, in the opinion of the Commissioners, be in a position likely, if special precautions be not taken, to prejudicially affect the operation of the trains when electrified, or the maintenance of telegraphic or telephonic communication, or the transmission of signals on adjacent wires of the Commissioners, shall, to the satisfaction of and without any expense to the Commissioners, be so placed, constructed, guarded, and maintained as not to be capable, in the opinion of the Commissioners, of injuring or coming into contact with any wire of the Commissioners, or of prejudicially affecting or interfering, either mechanically or electrically with the proper use of any such wire.

Governor in Council to be Sole Judge of Breach of Order.

That the Governor in Council shall be sole judge of the compliance with or of the breach of any of the requirements contained in this Order, and for the purpose of enabling the Governor in Council to arrive at a just decision, an inquiry into the facts of each case shall be conducted in the manner provided in clause 25 of the Regulations contained in the Second Schedule to the *Tramways Act 1915*, before an officer to be appointed in that behalf by the Governor in Council, as provided in the Regulations in the said Schedule.

If upon report to the Governor in Council by the referee, made under the said clause 25 of the Regulations in the Second Schedule of the said Act, the Governor in Council shall, as such sole judge, determine that there has been any failure of or non-compliance with, or that any breach of any of the requirements contained in this Order has occurred by way either of commission or omission, then the powers conferred by this Order shall be forfeited, or shall cease and determine, or shall be suspended, as the Governor in Council shall direct; and in the case of the Governor in Council ordering a suspension only of such powers, then the Governor in Council shall, in his adjudication, state for what period such suspension shall take effect.

If in such adjudication the Governor in Council shall determine that the powers conferred by this Order shall be forfeited, or shall wholly cease and determine, then the Prahran and Malvern Tramways Trust shall forthwith proceed to restore the streets along which the said route is laid out to their condition previous to the construction of such tramway, unless the Governor in Council otherwise order.

That in the event of the Prahran and Malvern Tramways Trust finding it necessary to provide work of a more substantial or expensive character than that provided for in this Order, the said Trust shall take upon itself all such additional expenditure, and no claim whatever shall be made upon the Government, or upon the Board of Land and Works, for any pecuniary assistance or aid in respect of such expenditure, or to provide funds therefor.

And the Honorable William Addison Adamson, His Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedule, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. The supplies are to be the same as sample where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. The supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture. Substantial and effective preference will, however, be given to goods of Commonwealth manufacture, provided the quality is satisfactory and is equal to the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule. Preference will also be given to articles of British manufacture as against those of foreign manufacture. In the event of the tender being accepted for goods of Commonwealth or British manufacture, as the case may be, all such goods supplied shall bear evidence that they are of the particular manufacture tendered for, and, in addition, the Contractor may at any time during the currency of the Contract be called on to furnish a statutory declaration as to the country of origin of the goods supplied.

3. Except where otherwise stated in the schedule, the value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores.

4. All orders for supplies will emanate from the departments requiring the goods. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor.

4A. Under this contract goods may be ordered by any department of the Commonwealth, but it shall be optional on the part of the contractor to supply.

5. Supplies ordered for delivery in Melbourne and Williamstown are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purposes of these contracts, Melbourne district will include a radius of six miles from the General Post Office, and Williamstown district will include the town of Williamstown, Hobson's Bay, and the River Yarra. Supplies for s.s. *John Murray* must be delivered at the Railway Pier, Port Melbourne.

6. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the officers ordering the goods.

7. Orders must receive prompt execution; and in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officer named in clause 6, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

8. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form at the time of the delivery of the goods, and the account shall be accompanied by the receipted delivery orders on which it is based. The prices quoted in the orders cannot be increased.

9. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer, authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof, in writing, to the officer rejecting

10. All goods forwarded under these contracts shall, where practicable, be forwarded by rail, and all consignments shall bear the number of the consignment notes under which they are forwarded, and also the name of the contractor or contractors by whom consigned, on a legibly written business label.

11. When the contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail for any Department except the Commonwealth Departments, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the Railways to act as agent for, and charge the freight to, the Stores and Transport Department or such other department as shall be named therein. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be forwarded to consignee in accordance with clause 12. (In the case of the Commonwealth Departments, however, the Commonwealth consignment note only which accompanies the order must be used.) Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under clause 16 of these conditions.

12. Immediately after the consignment of the goods the officer to whom they are forwarded shall be notified by the contractor, on the duplicate consignment note provided for the purpose, that the goods have been sent. On receipt of this document the officer to whom it has been forwarded shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the goods without delay, to the Stores and Transport Office. In the event of loss through failure on the part of the contractor to comply with this condition he will be held responsible, and the amount of the loss incurred for same will be deducted, as in clause 7.

13. 16. which stipulates that if a tenderer be a member of a firm, and such firm be interested in the contract, then the tender is to be in the name of the firm, and not in that of the individual—then the Honorable the Treasurer may, on the recommendation of the Tender Board, determine the contract, and forfeit the security money.

18.
