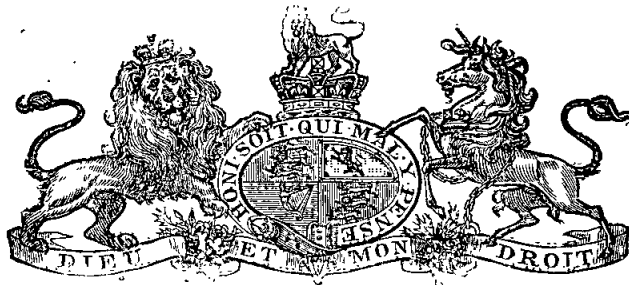

Factories and Shops Act 1915.

DETERMINATION OF THE CLOTHING BOARD.

IN accordance with the provisions of the *Factories and Shops Act 1915* the Special Board appointed to determine the Lowest Price or Rate which may be paid to any person for wholly or partly preparing or manufacturing, either inside or outside a factory or work-room, the following articles of Men's and Boys' Clothing or Wearing Apparel, namely, Coats (including Overcoats and Cloaks of every description), Vests, Trousers, Jackets, and Knickerbockers, except indiarubber waterproof garments, has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That previous Determinations of this Board are hereby amended, and such amendments shall come into force and be operative on and after the 31st day of March, 1916.

The Determination and amendments are printed hereunder—

(2) That the lowest rates of wages payable to the following persons shall be:—

JUVENILE WORKERS.

(3) That the lowest rates of wages for females under 21 years of age (not being apprentices or improvers) employed as ticket sewers shall be:—

During—	Per week of 48 hours.
1st year	7s. 6d.
2nd year—	
1st 6 months	10s.
2nd 6 months	12s. 6d.
3rd year	20s.

CASUAL LABOUR.

(4) That casual employes, i.e., employes engaged at pressing or order cutting for 24 hours or less in any week shall be paid at the rate of time and a third.

APPRENTICES AND IMPROVERS.

"Apprentice" means any person under twenty-one years of age bound by indentures of apprenticeship or any person over twenty-one years of age who, with the sanction of the Minister, is bound by indentures of apprenticeship. (Act 2650, Section 3.)

"Improver" means any person (other than an apprentice) who does not receive a piece-work price or a wages rate fixed by any Special Board for persons other than apprentices or improvers, and who is not over twenty-one years of age, or who being over twenty-one years of age holds a licence from the Minister to be paid as an improver. (Act 2650, Section 3.)

(5) That the wages and number of apprentices or improvers who may be employed in any factory or place shall be—

(6) That the time of beginning and ending work within any factory or shop or place shall be—

Time of Beginning.	Time of Ending.
7.30 a.m. ..	6 p.m. on five days of the week.
7.30 a.m. ..	1 p.m. on the other working day of the week on which the half-holiday is usually observed.

OVERTIME.

- (7) That the following rates shall be paid for work done during the times specified hereunder, viz:—
Outside the hours fixed in Clause 6, and
Within the hours fixed in Clause 6, in excess of 48 hours in any week. } Time and a half.

SPECIAL RATES.

- (8) That double time shall be the special rate for all work done on—

Sunday,
26th January (Foundation Day),
Good Friday,
Easter Monday,
21st April (Eight Hours Day),
3rd June (King's Birthday),
Christmas Day,
Boxing Day,
New Year's Day,

but, if any other day be by Act of Parliament or proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.

The lowest price or rate of payment to any person for wholly preparing or manufacturing any article of Ready-made Clothing of the description referred to in the following Schedules of Prices or Rates, or for doing work of the kind specified in connexion with the preparation or manufacture of any such article shall be the price or rate fixed by such Schedules in respect of such article or work, as the case may be, subject to such extras or reductions as is by the said Schedules provided.

The rates provided in this Determination shall be exclusive of all linings, interlinings, trimmings, sewings, and all other materials used in manufacturing garments. Out-door worker to be paid both making and machining price for each garment.

COATS AND VESTS.—Items included in the starting price of each garment :—Three (3) outside pockets, excepting Eton Coats, one (1) pocket; single-stitched edges; edges pockets, and buttons with stays where necessary; pocket tacks done by machine; seam pressing; interlining through forparts; all linings except sleeve linings bagged; sleeve linings to be felled. DEFINITIONS.

In this Determination the following terms shall have the meanings hereby assigned to them (that is to say :—

- “Order garments” shall mean “bespoke garments” made to individual measure.
- “First class” shall mean all faced cloths, meltons, corkscrews, dress twills, frescoes, fancy vestings, silks, velvets, Hooper’s white elastic, and white cashmere.
- “Secoud class” shall mean indigo and black worsteds, tweeds, sergerettes, serges, vicunas, bedford cords, flannel, alpaca, and similar materials.
- “Third class” shall mean moleskin, corduroy, drill, linen, and similar material.
- “Hand made” shall mean that the garments shall be made wholly by hand.
- “Extras” shall mean any work that is not specified in starting price.
- “Extras by machine” shall mean parts of extras usually done by machine on machine-made garments.
- “Machining” shall mean machining only, parts having been tacked or otherwise prepared for machining.
- “Made by machine” shall mean where work is done wholly by machinist without tacking.
- “Full price” shall mean where machinist or maker machines and makes garments throughout.
- “Fitting-up” shall mean cutting facings, collars, welts, bands, straps, and all fittings and linings.
- “Deductions” shall mean parts of garments usually done by special hands which can be deducted from full price.
- “Lined” shall mean coats lined, back and foreparts, or foreparts only with bogies and sleeve linings.
- “Making” shall mean tacking, adjusting, and preparing all parts for machinist.
- “Ready-made clothing” shall mean articles generally known as “Slop” or “Stock” garments cut to sizes, but shall not include garments cut to measure.
- “M” shall mean men’s sizes, 3 to 8½.
- “Y” shall mean youths’ sizes, 13 to 2½.
- “B” shall mean boys’ sizes, up to 12.
- “K.B.” shall mean juvenile garments worn with knickerbockers, sizes 00 to 12.
- “D.B.” shall mean double breasted.
- “S.B.” shall mean single breasted.
- Cutters in the Order trade are persons employed marking or cutting out garments.
- Cutters in the Ready-made trade are persons employed folding or marking material and cutting out garments.
- Pressers are persons employed pressing off finished garments.
- Tailors are persons employed making or machining garments.
- Examiners are persons employed examining or passing work.
- Brushers are persons employed cleaning, brushing, or sorting.
- Folders are persons employed folding and packing or forwarding work.
- A seam presser is a person employed underpressing or seam pressing (except pressing off) garments other than those she is “making.”
- Trimmers are persons employed cutting out linings or trimmings.
- “Underpressing” means all pressing except pressing off.
- “Unlined” shall mean coats without linings throughout—three patch pockets.
- Buttonhole makers or finishers are persons employed solely making or finishing buttonholes by hand.
- All sewings and trimmings to be provided by the employer free of charge to the operator.
- All extras not specified to be calculated at the rate per hour fixed as the minimum wage for the respective branch of the trade at which the employé is engaged.
- The foregoing definitions refer to both Order and Ready-made clothing wherever applicable.
