PROPOSED RESUBDIVISION.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1915* (No. 2686, section 40), the substance and prayer of a petition, in accordance with the 36th and 44th sections of the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor in Council, are published, viz.:—

The petitioners purport to be at least one-fourth of the persons whose names are for the time being on the municipal roll of the shire of Dandenong.

The petitioners state that the representation of the ratepayers in the council under the existing subdivisions is inequitable.

That the North and Centre Ridings, with a valuation of £37,015 and 1,030 ratepayers, returns three councillors for each Riding, whereas the South Riding, with a valuation amounting to £32,467 and 1,058 ratepayers, returns only three councillors.

That to secure a more equitable representation in the council it is desirable that the South Riding be divided into two Ridings.

That the growth of the South Riding during the last five years has been phenomenal, the assessments during that period having increased by 2,077.

The petitioners further state that the present representation allows purely farming interests to dominate population and interests largely suburban, and phases of work and conditions attached to the suburban life of the foreshore population are not met with by the gentlemen whose life is connected with purely farming life and interests.

The petitioners therefore pray that His Excellency in Council may be pleased to resubdivide the South Riding into two Ridings, to be named the South and West Ridings. The North and Centre Ridings to remain as at present.

Tenders must be accompanied by the preliminary deposit, as shown above, in bank notes, or a bank draft in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application.

Security will be required, either in Victorian Government Debentures, Savings Bank Deposit Book, or Bank Deposit Receipt in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board, or cash deposit, as the tenderer may elect.

The security must be completed and contract signed within five days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised or another tender accepted.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

In the event of tenderers withdrawing their tenders before notification of acceptance of same, or failing to take up their accepted tenders within the prescribed period after notification of acceptance, the preliminary deposit will be forfeited, and, in addition, they may be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contracts for Government supplies for a period of twelve months, such disqualification to date from the notification of acceptance of tender. It is also stipulated that if a tenderer be a member of a firm and such firm be interested in the contract, then his tender is to be in the name of the firm and not in that of the individual; and that for breach of this condition the preliminary deposit will be forfeited and the tender declared informal.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedule, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. The supplies are to be the same as sample where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. The supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture. Substantial and effective preference will, however, be given to goods of Commonwealth manufacture, provided the quality is satisfactory and is equal to the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule. Preference will also be given to articles of British manufacture as against those of foreign manufacture. In the event of the tender being accepted for goods of Commonwealth or British manufacture, as the case may be, all such goods supplied shall bear evidence that they are of the particular manufacture tendered for, and, in addition, the Contractor may at any time during the currency of the Contract be called on to furnish a statutory declaration as to the country of origin of the goods supplied.

3. Except where otherwise stated in the schedule, the value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, what ever labour may be required in the packing of stores.

4. All orders for supplies will emanate from the departments requiring the goods. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor.

4A. Under this contract goods may be ordered by any department of the Commonwealth, but it shall be optional on the part of the contractor to supply.

5. Supplies ordered for delivery in Melbourne and Williamstown are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purposes of these contracts, Melbourne district will include a radius of six miles from the General Post Office, and Williamstown district will include the town of Williamstown, Hobson's Bay, and the River Yarra. Supplies for s.s. *John Murray* must be delivered at the Railway Pier, Port Melbourne.

6. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the officers ordering the goods.

7. Orders must receive prompt execution; and in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officer named in clause 6, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

8. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form at the time of the delivery of the goods, and the account shall be accompanied by the receipted delivery orders on which it is based. The prices quoted in the orders cannot be increased.

9. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made,

give notice thereof, in writing, to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.

10. All goods forwarded under these contracts shall, where practicable, be forwarded by rail, and all consignments shall bear the number of the consignment notes under which they are forwarded, and also the name of the contractor or contractors by whom consigned, on a legibly written business label.

11. When the contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail for any Department except the Commonwealth Departments, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the Railways to act as agent for, and charge the freight to, the Stores and Transport Department or such other department as shall be named therein. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be forwarded to consignee in accordance with clause 12. (In the case of the Commonwealth Departments, however, the Commonwealth consignment note only which accompanies the order must be used.) Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under clause 16 of these conditions.

12. Immediately after the consignment of the goods the officer to whom they are forwarded shall be notified by the contractor, on the duplicate consignment note provided for the purpose, that the goods have been sent. On receipt of this document the officer to whom it has been forwarded shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the goods without delay, to the Stores and Transport Office. In the event of loss through failure on the part of the contractor to comply with this condition he will be held responsible, and the amount of the loss incurred for same will be deducted, as in clause 7.

13. Should the order on the contractor specially provide that goods of a fragile character, or such as are liable to suffer loss by leakage, shall be consigned at the risk of the Railways Commissioners under special freight conditions, the contractor shall in such instance provide, in writing, on the consignment note an intimation to that effect, failing which, in the event of loss, he shall bear the whole cost of replacing the goods, the amount being deducted from the contractor's account or the security money.

14. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies rejected or returned, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense deducted as in clause 7.

15. The members of boards of survey will be appointed by the Treasurer of the State for the time being, and the decision of the Board is to be considered as final. If the Board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it, or any like supply that is suitable for the service, will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be charged as in clause 7.

16. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, delay in delivering or replacing them when required, or non-compliance with the terms of clauses 11 and 12 of these conditions respecting the forwarding of consignment notes, &c., will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in clause 7. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and declare forfeit the whole or any portion of the security money; and, in addition, the contractor will be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contract or contracts for a period of twelve months from the date of such disqualification.

17. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government. If it is found during the currency of the contract that the contractor has not conformed to the condition of advertisement—

which stipulates that if a tenderer be a member of a firm, and such firm be interested in the contract, then the tender is to be in the name of the firm, and not in that of the individual—then the Honorable the Treasurer may, on the recommendation of the Tender Board, determine the contract, and forfeit the security money.

18. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or vitiated by the importation of stores for the Government service, or by any contracts or purchases made by the Imperial Commissariat or Agent-General for Victoria, or by any contracts or agreements made for any works or supplies by the Department of Public Works, or State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, or on account of the Federal Government, or for the Railway Department, or for supplies for Technical High or Higher Elementary Schools, or for the Metropolitan Parks and Gardens, or for supplies to the Aborigines, or for connexions and fittings for Diamond Drills and Batteries; or by any article being made at and supplied for the use of any Government establishment, or by the consumption of the surplus stock of any Government establishment.

19. For the purpose of the contracts entered into under these conditions, it is hereby expressly provided that in the event of any alteration in the Tariff affecting any of the items included in these contracts, the Government or the contractor (as the case may be) may give two months' notice, through the Secretary to the Tender Board, of the termination of the contract for the particular item or items so affected to the opposite party, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the first day of the month, and within the period for which the contract is made. The contract for the unaffected items to remain in full force and effect. Any notice to be served under this condition shall be deemed to have been duly served if sent to the contractor in a registered letter at his last-known place of business or abode.

20. If, in the opinion of the Tender Board, the price of any item or items of the contract be materially affected during its currency by any cause as the direct or indirect result of the war or by the proclamation of peace, the Board shall have power to determine the contract for such item or items on receiving from the contractor three full calendar months' notice in writing. 21. Under no circumstances other than those mentioned in clauses 19 and 20 will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited; and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

22. For the purposes of these contracts the word Government shall mean Government of the Commonwealth as regards supplies for the Commonwealth, and Government of the State as regards supplies for the State; and the word Treasurer shall mean Treasurer of the Commonwealth as regards supplies for the Commonwealth, and Treasurer of the State as regards supplies for the State.

23. No subletting will be allowed; all work must be carried out in the factory of the contractor; the terms of employment of any person engaged in the preparation or manufacture of the articles tendered for, and the wages paid to any such person, shall be in accordance with and subject to the terms and conditions specified in the schedules concerned; and a copy of the labour clauses thus indorsed on the schedules affected shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted, in legible Roman characters, in the factory (and in each part of the factory where several rooms are in use) in which goods are prepared or manufactured under this contract. Any infringement of these conditions, in the opinion of the Treasurer, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money; and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement and in all other respects.

A Regulation of the town of Port Melbourne made under section 228 of the *Local Government Act 1915* and numbered 23 for the purpose of the repeal of former Regulations.

1. That the following Regulations heretofore existing in and for the town of Port Melbourne shall be and the same are hereby repealed, that is to say:—

- (a) Regulation No. 15 made under Part 4 of 13th Schedule of the *Local Government Act 1890* for regulating the management and control of the Port Melbourne Library. (Superseded by Regulation No. 19.)
(b) Regulations No. 20 and 21 made under Part 9 of 13th Schedule of the *Local Government Act 1903*, for the purpose of regulating open bathing. (Re-enacted by Regulation No. 24.)

TOWN OF PORT MELBOURNE.
REGULATION No. 24.

A Regulation of the town of Port Melbourne, numbered 24 made under section 1 of Part 9 of the Thirteenth Schedule of the *Local Government Act 1903* in force in the town by virtue of a By-law of the above-named town numbered 85 for Regulating Open Bathing.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915* the Mayor, Councillors and Burgesses of the town of Port Melbourne make the following Regulation, which shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district, that is to say:—

1. All persons over 8 years of age bathing in any waters exposed to the public view shall be clad in a bathing costume, covering the body from neck to knee, so as to secure the observance of decency and any employee of the council, or any police constable, or any person authorized by the council, in writing, under the seal of the council, may require any person contravening this provision to at once resume his ordinary clothes.

2. (a) No person shall dress or undress, or remove any part of his bathing costume in any place open to the public view.

(b) Every person about to bathe, shall proceed from the dressing place direct to the sea by the nearest practicable line, and on leaving the sea, shall return thereto in the same manner.

(c) Except as aforesaid, or when rendering aid in case of accident, no person in bathing costume shall walk, run, exercise, stand, loiter, lie down or sit down upon any part of the beach, or in any place whatever which is exposed to the public view.

(d) No person shall dress or undress for bathing or bathe within 100 yards of the piers used for shipping.

3. (a) No male above the age of 8 years shall trespass upon any part of the beach or any dressing shed, or any enclosure set apart by the council for the exclusive use of females, and so indicated by public notice exhibited thereon, except for the purpose of rendering assistance in case of accident.

(b) No female shall trespass upon any part of the beach, or any dressing shed, or any enclosure set apart by the council for the exclusive use of males, and so indicated by public notice exhibited thereon, except for the purpose of rendering assistance in case of accident.

4. (a) A dressing enclosure or shed shall be used for dressing and undressing only. No person shall play games or loiter therein.

(b) No person shall bring or deposit any filth, papers, rags, glass, *débris* of any sort, or rubbish in any such enclosure or shed.

(c) No person shall damage, disfigure, or write in or upon any such enclosure or shed.

5. In or upon any part of the beach, foreshore, dressing enclosure or waters, used by the public,

(a) No person shall behave in an unseemly, improper, riotous, or noisy manner, to the annoyance of the public;

(b) No person shall blaspheme, or use profane or obscene language, or behave in an indecent manner.

No. 77.—MARCH 29, 1916.—3871.—3.

6. No person shall bathe at or in the near vicinity of any place after being warned by an employee of the council, or by any police constable or any person authorized by the council, in writing, under the seal of the council, that it is dangerous for him or her to bathe at such place.

7. The council may by resolution fix, and from time to time alter, fees for the use of bathing and dressing accommodation and requisites, and for the safe custody of valuables.

8. No person, unless authorized by the council, shall use, displace, play with, injure, or destroy any appliances or signal bells provided by the council or by any volunteer life saving club, except such use or displacement be necessary for the purpose of saving life, or such injury or destruction be caused while being used for such purpose and incidental to such use.

9. The council may, at their discretion, authorize any volunteer life-saving club (whether subsidized or not) (a) to provide and use life-saving appliances and boats; (b) to use any such appliances and boats provided by the council; and (c) to erect, and, as may from time to time be necessary, remove from place to place, danger notices: Provided that, where an employee of the council is in attendance, danger notices shall not be removed except by him or with his approval.

10. Where any life-saving appliances are in use, either by members of the public or by any volunteer life-saving club, for the saving of life, any employee of the council, or any police constable, or any person authorized by the council, may—

(a) If he considers that the work is hampered by too many persons assisting, or for any reason, direct any person to cease assisting.

(b) Direct any person to stand back from the field of operations; and every person so directed shall obey.

11. (a) No person shall deposit any filth, glass, *débris* of any sort or refuse upon any public bathing reserve, or in any waters adjacent thereto, or suffer any filth or refuse to run upon or into any such reserve or waters. No person shall throw, or cause to be thrown, into any dressing enclosure or into any such waters, any dead animal or other offensive matter.

(b) Any employee of the council, or any police constable, or any person authorized by the council, in writing, under seal of the council, may, when in his opinion inconvenience may be caused to the public by the bathing of dogs or horses, order any person in charge of any dog or horse not to send or drive such dog or horse into the water, or permit such dog or horse to enter the water, at any place where the public are bathing; such person shall obey such order.

(c) Any employee of the council, or any police constable, or any person authorized by the council, in writing, under seal of the council, may order any person in charge of any dog or horse to remove such animal from a beach or bathing reserve if such animal's presence on the beach causes inconvenience or danger to the public, and such person shall obey such order.

(d) Subject to the provisions of sub-clauses (b) and (c) of this section, horses may be exercised on the foreshore and bathed in the sea at Port Melbourne, but only before the hour of 9 a.m. and within the following limits, that is to say:—

Between the mouth of the River Yarra and a line bearing south, distant three-quarters of a mile west from the Railway Pier.

(e) Every person riding, leading, or swimming any horses, shall be clothed from neck to knee.

12. (a) The council may in writing, under its seal, authorize any person to carry out the provisions of this Regulation and to prosecute on behalf of the council any person or persons offending under this Regulation.

(b) Any person committing any breach of this Regulation, who refuses to state his name and place of abode to any officer or employee of the council, or any person authorized by the council in writing under seal of the council, or who in the opinion of such employee or any person authorized by the council in writing under seal of the council, states a false name or place of abode, shall be guilty of an offence under this Regulation.

SHIRE OF BAIRNSDALE.

BY-LAW No. 38.

A By-law of the Shire of Bairnsdale, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and numbered 38, for the control and management of Council ferries and boats landings and shelters at or connected therewith.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Bairnsdale order as follows:—

1. No person shall damage destroy deface break or stave in any boat or damage destroy deface or break any landing shelter or other appurtenance of or cordage rope chain or other property at or connected with any ferry within the shire of Bairnsdale and no person shall unmoor remove or use nor leave insecurely moored any boat belonging to or connected with any ferry—nor use any such boat for ferrying himself or any other person or persons or for any other purpose without the consent of the ferryman or of the Council.

2. No person who is intoxicated abusive or suffering from any infectious disease or who is or may so act as to be a nuisance to other persons shall be entitled to ferryage—and no such intoxicated or abusive person and no person so suffering from infectious disease shall enter or remain in or on any boat landing or shelter at or connected with any ferry.

3. No person shall commit any nuisance write or carve on walls fences boats or other appliances at or connected with any ferry nor use any insulting indecent obscene blasphemous or offensive words nor wilfully interfere with the comfort or endanger the safety of the ferryman or of any other person passenger or employee at any ferry—and any person so acting or otherwise infringing the provisions of this By-law may be summarily removed from any ferry boat or any landing shelter or other premises at or connected with any ferry and in addition shall be liable to the penalty herein imposed.

4. No person shall obstruct or impede the ferryman or any other employee at a ferry or on any ferry boat landing or shelter at or connected with any ferry or any approach thereto.

5. No person shall post stick paint write or cause to be so posted stuck painted or written upon any ferry boat landing or shelter at or connected with any ferry any placard bill advertisement or other matter.

6. All persons receiving ferryage or being in or upon any ferry boat landing shelter or the approaches thereto or any appurtenances or premises of or connected with any ferry shall obey the reasonable demands of the ferryman or other employee at such ferry.

Any person who shall offend in any respect against any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence.

This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the shire of Bairnsdale.

SHIRE OF MIRBOO.

BY-LAW No. 1.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1890*, and of any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Mirboo, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors and the Ratepayers of the said shire for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction make the following By-law, that is to say:—

No. 1. All former By-laws, so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law, are hereby repealed.

No. 2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

No. 3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the township of Mirboo North.

No. 4. The occupier of any premises on which there is a closet or privy shall cause the space under the seat of each closet or privy on such premises to be prepared, and shall permit the same to be used for the double-pan service hereinafter provided for, and shall cause the closet or privy to be kept in a fit state for such service.

No. 5. The Council shall cause every closet or privy to be supplied and kept supplied with two pans for the reception of night-soil, and a lid to closely fit same, and shall cause one or the other of such pans to be kept under the seat aforesaid.

No. 6. The occupier aforesaid, or the other person having control or management of the premises, shall cause to be kept in every closet or privy belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in the pan in such closet or privy to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.

No. 7. The Council shall at least once a week cause the pan in use to be closed with a lid and removed, with its contents, from the premises in the day-time, and the other pan to be left in its place.

No. 8. Before leaving any pan in a closet or privy the Council shall cause the same to be cleansed by superheated steam and tar-painted inside, or by some equally efficient means.

No. 9. The occupier aforesaid or other person shall not contract for the removal of night-soil from such premises, except in accordance with this By-law.

No. 10. The Council shall have power in lieu of making a rate to make a charge on each occupier for the pans supplied, and for the removal of night-soil and the other work herein directed, and the amount in default of payment to be recovered in any Court of Petty Sessions.

No. 11. Every closet or privy shall be furnished, to the satisfaction of the Council, with a brick or cement floor of such dimensions as shall be approved of by the Council for the purpose of receiving the pan.

No. 12. If any person or the Council commit a breach of this By-law, he or they shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.
