# DETERMINATION OF THE WOOLLEN TRADE BOARD.\*

Note.—This Determination, on the 18th July, 1917, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts; the Cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, and Geelong; the Towns of Ballarat East and Warrnambool; the Boroughs of Eaglehawk, Geelong West, Newtown and Chilwell, Castlemaine, and Sebastopol; and such portion of the Shire of Bungaree as is within 10 miles of a city or town.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Act 1915, the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business carried on in a woollen mill, has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 18th July, 1917, the previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

(5) SUNDAYS AND PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.—That time and a half shall be special rate for all work done on Sundays, and double time the special rate for all work done on New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Eight Hours Day (21st April), Christmas Day, Boxing Day, but if any day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named public holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.

The Board determines, under the provisions of Section 144 of the Factories and Shops Act 1915, that any employer may fix and pay piece-work prices to any person employed at any work for which the Board has not fixed piece-work prices, but has fixed a minimum wage, provided that such employer shall base such piece-work prices on the earnings of an average worker working under like conditions, and such piece-work prices shall be fixed so that an average worker can earn not less than the wages rate fixed by the Board for such work.

#### STIPULATIONS FOR SUPPLIES OF PROVISIONS.

(Where practicable, all items must be manufactured or prepared within the Commonwealth.) Under all Sub-schedules particular attention is drawn to Clause 1 of the Condition as to quality-

#### BEER AND SPIRITS.

BEER AND SPIRITS.

For brandy, whisky, and for Guinness' porter in case, delivery will be taken at and from the bond.

The contractor will be bound to supply such of the brands named in the tender as the departments may order. In cases where delivery from the bond is taken by the Government, the contractor will be required to hand to the secretary to the Tender Board the bond certificate and the locker's order and a copy of the entry, and pay all charges, including regauging, before delivery is taken.

English ale, brandy, whisky, and Guinness' porter in case must be delivered as imported; if bottled in the State it will not be accepted.

#### BREAD.

Samples of the best ordinarily retailed to the public will be considered as test loaves for first quality for fine wheaten and pure wheaten Meal Bread. Third quality (that issued to prisoners of the Crown) to be made of flour, fine sharps, the produce of prime, strong, thin-skinned, good-coloured wheat, to be perfectly free from coarse pollard or other offal. Pure wheaten Meal Bread of first quality may be substituted, wholly or in part, for fine wheaten Bread at such times and in such quantities as in the opinion of the Medical Superintendent may be deemed necessary, and the contractor will be required to supply such Bread at the contract rate. Reasonable notice, however, of the intention to substitute wheaten Meal Bread must be given to the contractor by the officer ordering the supply. Bread may be baked at any Government establishment without infringing these contracts. At the Gaols, Beechworth, Ballarat, Geelong, Bendigo, Castlemaine, and Sale, if required, thread must be supplied one day old, due notice to be given to the contractor of such requirement.

Under sub-schedules for Bread no subletting will be sllowed;

notice to be given to the contractor of such requirement.

Under sub-schedules for Bread no subletting will be allowed; all work must be carried out by the contractor; every person engaged in the manufacture, preparation, or delivery of the bread tendered for in this sub-schedule shall be paid such wages and shall be employed subject to such conditions as are or may be determined by any Wages Board under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts to which such persons are subject as employees; and a copy of these conditions shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted in legible Roman charactors in the factory or shop (and in each part of the factory or shop where several rooms are in use) in which bread is prepared or manufactured under this contract. Any infringement of these conditions, or any breach of the said determinations, in the opinion of the Treasurer, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds (£30), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money, and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement, and in all other respects. other respects.

In the event of bread being made at any Government establishment in the Melbourne District, during the currency of these contracts, the flour required will be drawn under the flour and maize meal sub-schedule. The maize meal for all the country gaols is included in the sub-schedule for flour and maize meal, Melbourne District, and delivery of same will be required to be made at the Victorian Railways, Spencer-street.

Should a supply of any article which may be reasonably included in a Baker's Price List, and which is not included in the schedule hereunder, be required for the use of attendants and nurses resident at the Hospitals for the Insane or for inmates of any Government institution drawing supplies under sub-schedules for Bread during the currency of the contract, the contractor shall, with the exception of Arasta, Ballarat, and Beechworth, supply any such article at the current list rates at which it is retailed by the contractor to the public.

# GROCERIES, CANDLES, SOAP, TEA, ETC.

Should the supply of any article which may be reasonably included in a Grocer's Price List, and, which is not included in the schedule hereunder, be required for the use of the attendants and nurses resident at the Hospitals for the Insane or for immates of any Government institution drawing supplies under sub-schedules for Groceries during the currency of the contract the contract or shall with the exception of Ararat, Ballarat, and Beechworth, supply such article at the current list rates at which it is retailed by the contractor to the public.

Rice, when ordered in quantities of 56 lbs. and over, must be supplied in the original bags, and must be of the brand ordered. Bags containing same must be branded "Rice—Dressed, Best Java or Korean," as the case may be, and must be stendilled with the manufacturer's or dresser's name, the country

Jressed, Best Java or Korean," as the ease may be, and must be stencilled with the manufacturer's or dresser's name, the country of origin, and the brand of the respective manufacturer or dresser, as a guarantee of origin and quality. Supplies not in conformity with the foregoing conditions will be absolutely rejected.

Candles, except those for prison cells, must be supplied in 1-lb. packets. Candles for prison cells must be delivered in boxes containing from 25 to 50 lbs, per box, the boxes for which must be legibly stencilled on one end, showing the estimated burning time and the gross, tare, and net weight of contents. The soap supplied must be hard throughout, ready for immediate use without waste. Soap for Lunatic Asylums is not included in these contracts. When the quantity admits, tea must be supplied in original and unopened packages, labelled, as landed. Hasisns and currants must, where the quantity admits, be supplied in original boxes labelled 3 crowns.

For s.s. Lady Loch and Albert a certain quantity of Biscuits and Preserved Meat are sometimes required in lieu of fresh meat and fresh bread, and are included to meet such contingency only.

The contracts are not to be considered broken, infringed, or vitiated by purchase of sugar from any Government Institution at any time during the currency of this contract.

Butter and Jams.

### BUTTER AND JAMS.

Butter is to be delivered to the s.s. Lady Lock and Albert, in

Butter is to be delivered to the s.s. Lady Lock and Albert, in 1 lb. pats, in such quantities as may be ordered, and no excess over the quantity ordered will be received.

All Butter supplied, as well as the cases in which it is packed, must bear the impress stamp of the creamery manufacturing the Butter, otherwise it will be rejected. The Butter supplied may be tested at any time by the Government Dairy expert if it is considered by the officer ordering that the supply is not up to standard quality. The cheese must, be fairly matured and packed in boxes for transport.

As regards butter for Ararat, Ballarat, Beechworth, Lara, Sunbury, and Mont Park all supplies delivered from Melbourne must be submitted by the contractor to the Government Dairy Expert in Melbourne for test as to standard quality, and, if found to be satisfactory, shall be forwarded by that officer direct to the Institution ordering, the cost of freight being borne by the contractor in the usual way.

N.B.—Jams.—The weight stamped on the tins in accordance with the regulations under the Commerce Act, as indicating the minimum net quantity that each tin contains, shall for the purpose of this contract be taken as the actual contents when computing the quantity supplied.

When Jam is supplied in jars the jars remain the property of the contractor, and must be removed by the contractor at his own expense when empty.

# MEAT.

MEAT.


When fore and hind-quarters of beef are ordered for Hospitals for the Insane they must be supplied in the proportion of two of the former to one of the latter, and must be delivered as a whole respectively, also extra buttocks separately when ordered. Meat for other institutions must be supplied as ordered. Where hind-quarters or buttocks-are ordered, 9 inches must be cut off from the end of the leg from the hock upwards, i.e., the end of the leg from which the shank has been removed at the abattories; and when fore-quarters form a portion of the supply, 6 inches from the end of the neck and the whole of the shin at the clodbone joint must be removed. The sticking pieces also must be trimmed off, and the point and end of the brisket rendered free from blood and blood stains.

Fore and hind-quarters, for convenience of handling, may be cut into two parts, but each part is to bear evidence of having been cut from the same beast.

Corned beef, rolled or round, as ordered, must be supplied without bone or cartilage and will be received, whether pumped or prepared in the ordinary way by pickling, but in the former case must have been soaked after pumping for at least 48 hours, in a good pickle, and then thoroughly drained before supply. No flank, chuck, sticking piece, shin, leg of beef, or piece under 1 hs. will be received.

Should the local supply of fresh mest become scarce, or the price of same become abnormally high, frozen or chilled meat.

7 Ibs. will be received. Should the local supply of fresh meat become scarce, or the price of same become abnormally high, frozen or chilled meat may, with the consent of the Tender Board on the recommendation of the head of the Department, be supplied.



In cases of emergency, or on such other occasions as in the opinion of the Inspector-General of the Insane may seem advisable, other forms of meat such as rabbits, tinned meats, &c., may be purchased apart from the contract for Hospitals for the Insane, in lieu of the meat mentioned in the schedule, and substituted therefor, provided 24 hours' notice (except in cases of emergency) be given to the contractor of such intention.

The parts to be removed by the contractor are indicated by the shaded portions of the annexed diagram.

As regards supplies for s.s. Lady Lock and Albert, all Meat must be of prime quality, and must be supplied in equal quantities from ribs, sirloin, and thick flanks: mutton to be delivered in sides; all kidney fat to be removed; meat containing an undue proportion of fat will not be accepted. Chnek ribs will not be accepted in lieu of prime ribs. Live sheep to be supplied when required.

Any infringement of these conditions, or any breach of the said determination, in the opinion of the Treasurer, will subject the Contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the Contractor's account or from the security money, and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement, and in all other respects.
