PURSUANT to the provisions of The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1915, and in accordance with the recommendation of the Speaker, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, has, by an Order made on the 4th day of July, 1917, directed that the following clause be added to the Regulations, approved by the Governor in Council on the 4th June, 1913, fixing the rates of pay of Senior and Junior Doorkeepers of the Legislative Assembly:

On reaching the maximum of 60s, per week Junior On reaching the maximum of 60s, per week Junior Doorkeepers may receive two further increments of 3s, per week each for good and efficient service at intervals of two years. A Junior Doorkeeper in receipt of either of such increments for a period of one year shall on promotion to the position of Senior Doorkeeper be entitled to the rate of pay next in amount higher than the rate he was receiving before promotion.

8. Every collector shall each day from the time that he commences to use or accompany any truck, handcart, cart, barrow, or vehicle for the purpose of carrying on his business as a collector or until such time as he shall cease to so use or accompany such truck, hand-cart, cart, barrow, or vehicle wear continuously upon his left arm a badge made of tin or other sheet metal, in size anot less than 3 inches long and 3 inches wide, such badge to be painted black, upon which badge there shall be painted in white letters, in size not less than 1 inch in length and \(\frac{1}{2}\) of of inch of Petty Sessions at which such licence was granted. And in the case of collector's licensed within the city of Melbourne and its suburbs the badge to be so worn shall also have the letter A painted in white upon it if the collector be licensed at any Court of Petty Sessions sithin the Central Division, or the letter B painted in white upon it if the collector be licensed at any Court of Petty Sessions

WE, Albert John Knight, David Richard Bilton, John R. Bryant, William Arthur Smith, Arthur Knight, and James Reuben Wight, a majority of the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for a Race-course, Recreation, and Public Park, in the parish of Craigie, known as "Victoria Park" (hereinafter called the Park), having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the Land Act 1915:—

REGULATIONS.

- 1. The Park shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Park may be set apart for cricket or football matches, files, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling (1s.) may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Park.
- 2. No person shall enter or remain in the Park who may offend against decency as regards dress, language,

- 3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Park, nor, without permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management, shall fires be lighted therein.
- 4. No person shall climb or jump over gates or fences in or around the Park, stick bills thereon or cut names on or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats or trees in the Park, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
- 5. No person shall put in the Park any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the money received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Park, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Worker.
- 6. No person shall bring into the Park any dog, unless led by a string or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 7. No person shall camp in the Park, nor erect therein any dwelling, nor any booth or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 8. No person shall perform in any band of music, or take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Park without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 9. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Park.
- 10. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any sport or game within the Park on Sundays.
- 11. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Park without the permission, in writing of the Committee of Management, and every person infringing this regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the Park.
- 12. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection or enclosure on the occasion of any fête, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds (£10), by way of guarantee that such care shall be taken of such way of guarance that such care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection or enclosure, and such Com-mittee of Management in its absolute discretion may make good any damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

Every person offending against any of these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the Land Act 1915, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the police force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the police force and taken before some justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR A RACE-COURSE AND OTHER PURPOSES OF PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE PARISH OF GLENBURNIE, KNOWN AS THE KILMORE PACE COURSE GLENBURNIE, RACE-COURSE.

WE, Patrick O'Neill, Richard Fennelly, Thomas Hunt, Patrick Skehan, James Proudfoot, John Morrissey, Charles Joseph Morrissey, Colin McNab, and Patrick Andrew Harrington, the duly appointed trustees of the Reserve for a race-course and other purposes of public recreation in the parish of Glenburnie, known as the Kilmore Race-course, do hereby, in exercise and in pursuance of the powers conferred on us by the Crown grant thereof, and by the Land Act 1915, section 182, make the following Regulations in respect of the said Reserve:— Reserve :-

 - For the admission of every person to the first divi-sion, a sum not exceeding Ten shillings.

 - For the admission of every person to the second division, a sum not exceeding Three shillings.

 For the admission to the second division of every person with truck or barrow, cart, or other vehicle engaged in trade, a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings.
 - For the admission to the second division of every horse not being a horse entered for any race, a sum not exceeding One shilling.
 - For the admission to the second division of every vehicle drawn by one horse, a sum not exceed-ing Two shillings and sixpence.
 - For the admission to the second division of every vehicle drawn by more than one horse, for each horse a sum not exceeding Two shillings and six-
 - For the admission of every horse to the training ground for training or exercise for every twelve months, a sum not exceeding Two pounds.

months, a sum not exceeding Two pounds.

Provided that the trustees or committee or stewards of the Kilmore Turf Club, may exempt any member of a racing club wholly or partially from the payment of all or any such charges or fees; and that the moneys so received and all rents shall, after deducting necessary expenses, be applied in the permanent improvement of the Reserve or in the erection, maintenance, or repair of buildings and fences, or the planting of trees or shrubs in the Reserve and in prizes for any race, or in such other manner in or upon the Reserve as shall be necessary or expedient for the purposes of rendering the same more convenient and useful for racing and recreation purposes. recreation purposes.

17. No person shall injure, destroy, or damage any building, fence, or erection, or any other property, tree, shrub, or plant erected, being or growing on the Reserve, or plough, harrow, remove, or otherwise damage any portion of the grass or the surface soil of the Reserve.

- 18. No person shall, after the first day of April, 1917, carry on the trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker upon any portion of the Reserve unless and until he shall comply with the following conditions:—
 - (a) That he be registered annually or for each or for any race meeting as a bookmaker by the trustees or the committee or stewards of the Kilmore Turf Club, or those authorized by such trustees, committee, or stewards.
 - (b) That during the time he shall be in or upon the Reserve carrying on his trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker he shall wear a ticket or badge, to be supplied by the trustees or the committee or stewards aforesaid, or by those authorized by such trustees, committee, or stewards, which ticket or badge shall be visible to the public, and shall have his name legibly printed thereon.
- 19. The fee for registration of every such person as a bookmaker under the foregoing Regulations shall be -(a) if registered, annually the sum of Two pounds two shillings; and (b) if registered for any single race meeting, the sum of One pound one shilling for each and every such race meeting.
- 20. The trustees shall have power to lock all gates during wet weather and from sunset to sunrise, to preclude the admission of any cattle, horse, or vehicle to
- 21. Notwithstanding anything contained in these Regulations, the second division shall be open and free to pedestrians at all times. except on such days in any one year as the Reserve may be required by the trustees for holding race meetings, sports, or other amusements.

Every person offending against any of these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 182 of the Land Act 1915, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds; and every person who so offends and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or officer or servant of such trustees, or by any member of the police force, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff, officer, or servant or member of the police force and taken before some justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF A RESERVE FOR PUBLIC GARDEN AT MAJORCA.

E, Albert John Knight, David Richard Bilton, John R. Bryant, William Arthur Smith, Arthur Knight, and James Reuben Wight, a majority of the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 28th February, 1876, as a site for a Public Garden at Majorca (hereinafter called the Garden), having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of toils, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the Land Act 1915:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Garden shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Garden may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or

- holiday amusements. on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling (1s.) may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Garden.
- 2. No person shall enter or remain in the Garden who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
- 3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Garden, nor, without permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management, shall fires be lighted therein.
- 4. No person shall climb or jump over gates or fences in or around the Garden, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Garden, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
- 5. No person shall put in the Garden any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the money received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Garden, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
- 6. No person shall bring into the Garden any dog, unless led by a string or cord. without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first ob-
- 7. No person shall camp in the Garden, nor erect therein any dwelling, or any booth, or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the per-mission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 8. No person shall perform in any band of music, or take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Garden without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 9. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths, or on any structure or erection in the Garden.
- 10. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any sport or game within the Garden on Sundays.
- 11. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Garden, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the Garden.
- shall be liable to expulsion from the Garden.

 12. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasion of any fete, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds (£10), by way of guarantee that such care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee of Management, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee. by the Committee.

Every person offending against any of these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the Land Act 1915, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the police force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the relice force and taken before some justice, and shall be police force and taken before some justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).
