CHAPTER II.—APPOINTMENT AND PROMOTIONS IN THE GENERAL DIVISION.

Registration and Examination of Applicants.

After Regulation No. 7 read:—

Applicants for employment as Attendant on the staff of the Lunacy Department who have enlisted in any Expeditionary Force raised for naval or military service with His Majesty's Navy or Army during the war in which His Majesty is at present engaged and have served abroad with such Force, may, on their return, have their names recorded in the Register of Applicants and may be appointed on the staff in preference to all other applicants and without being required to pass the Educational Test Examination provided by Regulation No. 7. Military Discharges must be produced in every case.

The appointment of Attendants appointed under this Regulation may be confirmed if the term of probation prescribed by section 72 of the *Public Service Act No. 2713* has been satisfactorily served, without the requirements of Regulation No. 8 having reference to passing the First Nursing Examination having been complied with, and the Attendants will be eligible for increments to their salaries as provided by Chapter III. of the Regulations without having passed the Departmental Nursing Examination as required by Regulation No. 11. They will, however, be expected to attend the various courses of lectures and to pass the various Nursing Examinations before being eligible for promotion to the higher grades.

BOATS' DISENGAGING GEARS.

THE following Instructions to Surveyors, which have been received from the Board of Trade, have been adopted by the Marine Board and are published for the information of all whom they may concern:—

NOTE.—The disengaging gears in the boats of existing ships will not be subjected to the tests prescribed until the 1st January, 1918, unless a surveyor has special reason to believe that the gear fitted in the boats of any particular ship is unreliable and dangerous.

INSTRUCTIONS TO SURVEYORS.

Boats' Disengaging Gears.

1. When inspecting a ship's boats, the surveyors are to see that all the requirements of the Life-Saving Appliances Rules, regarding means for speedily detaching the boats from the falls, are complied with.

The following two clauses are extracts from General Rule 13 of the Life-Saving Appliances Rules, 1914:—

(2) The davits, falls, blocks, and all other gear required for lowering the boats, shall be of sufficient strength to the satisfaction of the Board of Trade; and in the case of foreign-going passenger steamers launched on or after the 1st March, 1913, they shall be of such strength that the boats can be lowered safely with the full complement of persons and equipment, the ship being assumed to have a list of 15 degrees.

(5) Means shall be provided for speedily, but not necessarily simultaneously or automatically, detaching the boats from the falls; the boats placed under davits shall be attached to the falls and kept ready for service; the points of attachment of the boats to the falls shall be sufficiently away from the ends of the boats to insure their being easily swung clear of the davits; the boats' chocks shall be of such construction and arrangement as shall be satisfactory to the Board of Trade.

II. *Disengaging gears are not required for compliance with the Rules.*—It is not necessary for compliance with the Rules, that boats shall be fitted with disengaging gears when proper means are provided for detaching each fall by hand.

In order to provide for speedily detaching the falls by hand when the boat is waterborne, all lower fall blocks are to be fitted with a suitable ring or long link for attachment to the sling hooks fitted in the boat, unless some approved form of disengaging gear is adopted.

The sling hooks are to look towards the midship part of the boat.

The eye on the block and the ring or link are to conform to the standard of strength indicated in Section III. (10) of these Instructions.

III. *General conditions of approval of disengaging gears.*—If disengaging gears are fitted they must comply with the following conditions and receive the Board's approval before being used as part of the statutory equipment of a ship.

- (1) All disengaging gears must be so arranged as to insure simultaneous release of both ends of the boat.
- (2) The means of effecting release must be placed aft so as to be under the personal control of the coxswain in charge of the boat.
- (3) The gear may be of a type affording release before the boat is waterborne, as well as when the boat is wholly or partially waterborne; or alternatively, it may be of a type affording release only when the boat is wholly or partially waterborne. In either case it must be safe, speedy, and reliable in action.
- (4) The action should be such that the hook offers no resistance to release should there be a towing strain on the falls.
- (5) The hooks must be suitable for instant unhooking by hand.
- (6) The gear and mechanism for effecting release must be such and so arranged as to insure the safety of the boat independently of any "safety pins."
- (7) The means for effecting release may be by hauling on, or letting go, a line, or by a lever. If release is effected by a pull upon a line the latter must be properly cased in.

Rods or other connexions between hooks must also be cased in whenever this is necessary for safety or for the efficient action of the gear and the protection of persons from injury.

The fairleads must be properly arranged to prevent the lines, which should be fitted with chains where necessary for efficiency, from jamming or nipping, and must be strongly attached to permanent parts of the boat.

- (8) Such parts of the gear as would otherwise be likely to set fast by rust or corrosion must be made of non-corrodible metal.
- (9) No part of the gear taking the weight of the boat is to be made of cast metal.
- (10) The scantlings and proportions of all parts taking the weight of the boat should be such as to provide a factor of safety of at least four with a dead working load equivalent to the total weight of boat, equipment and full complement of persons.

IV. *Existing disengaging gears:—*

1. All disengaging gears at present fitted in passenger ships should be carefully examined and one or two sets of each type in the ship should be tested for strength and efficiency. If possible this should be done at the next annual survey after the issue of these Instructions; but if this is not practicable the surveyor should arrange with the owners for the examination and tests to be carried out as soon as possible thereafter, and within a definite period which should be fixed in each case.

2. After the above tests have been made and reported upon it is intended that similar action shall be taken with regard to the disengaging gears in non-passenger vessels; but in the meantime they need not be subjected to tests unless an application for the same is made by a ship-owner, or the surveyors have reason to doubt their efficiency.

3. Tests should be carried out as follows:—

The largest boat in which each type of disengaging gear is fitted should be selected and the gear should first be tested for strength. In the case of foreign-going steamers launched before 1st March, 1913, this is to be done by loading the boat with weights up to the greatest load which the davits and the lowering gear are fit to carry; if possible, the weights should be equivalent to the equipment and full complement of persons at 165 lbs. per person. In the case of foreign-going steamers launched on or after the 1st March, 1913, the full test load is to be applied. The davits, hooks, bolts, locking gear and all parts that bear the weight of the boat should be carefully examined for deflection and defects. The strength test should be made with the davits turned inboard and the loaded boat should afterwards be lowered and the efficiency of the disengaging gear tested.

A complete report of the tests should be forwarded to the Principal Ship Surveyor, stating the dimensions of the boat, its total weight as tested, and the pattern number of the gear or other particulars for identification. An engineer as well as a ship surveyor should, whenever possible, be present at the strength test, and a nautical surveyor at the efficiency tests.

4. The continued acceptance of the gear will depend upon the results of the tests and upon the fulfilment of the conditions specified in Section III. of these Instructions.

V. *New sets of disengaging gear:—*

1. All new sets of disengaging gear, including those of types approved before the date of these Instructions, must comply with the conditions specified in Section III., whether they are fitted in new or in old boats. A sample gear of each size submitted should be subjected to a proof test equivalent to the total weight, including equipment and full complement of persons, of the largest boat for which it is claimed the gear is suitable.

The test should be continued to the point of fracture in order to determine the approximate factor of safety.

2. Lowering and disengaging tests with a loaded boat are also to be carried out in the presence, when practicable, or three surveyors, a ship, an engineer, and a nautical surveyor. The trials should include tests made under the following conditions:—

- (a) Boat fully waterborne.
- (b) Boat partially waterborne, one end being out of the water.
- (c) In the case of gear which can be released before the boat is waterborne, additional tests with the keel of the boat just clear of the water.
- (d) The efficiency of the hooks and gear should also be tested by well jerking the boat in the tests (b) and (c).

3. The acceptance of the gear will depend upon the results of the tests and upon the fulfilment of the conditions specified in Section III.

4. New sets of gear manufactured in accordance with a certificate of approval issued after the date of these Instructions (* * *) will not be required to be tested in the manner specified in paragraph 2 of this section before acceptance unless the surveyor has reason to doubt the efficiency of a particular set of gear. Surveyors should, however, satisfy themselves that such gears comply in all respects with the specification attached to the certificate, and one or two sets of each size should occasionally be tested to the proof load in the manner indicated in paragraph 1 of this section.

REGULATIONS FOR COMPUTATION BY MEASUREMENT OF WEIGHT OF LOAD CARRIED ON VEHICLES ON MAIN ROADS.*

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twelfth day of June, 1917.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor of Victoria,
Sir A. J. Peacock | Mr. McLeod.

UNDER the powers conferred by section Five hundred and seventy of the *Local Government Act 1915* to make Regulations for declaring the weight by measurement of any specified description or class of goods carried in any vehicle on any main road within the meaning of the *Country Roads Act 1915* to which the Governor in Council (incidental to the incorporation by section Fifty-nine of the latter Act of Part XXII. of the *Local Government Act 1915*) has by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* declared or to which he may hereafter so declare that the provisions of Division 2 of Part XXII. of the said *Local Government Act* are to apply, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice

of the Executive Council thereof doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Computation of Vehicle's Load by Measurement Regulations 1917" and shall apply to the several descriptions or classes of goods specified in the Schedule hereto loaded on vehicles used on a main road under the *Country Roads Act 1915* within any municipal district to which the Governor in Council acting by virtue of that Act has by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declared or to which he may hereafter so declare that the provisions of Division 2 of Part XXII. of the *Local Government Act 1915* are to apply.

2. For the purpose of computing on any vehicle to which these Regulations apply the weight thereon of goods of a description or class specified in the first column of the Schedule hereto the measurements or quantities set opposite the description or class of goods in question in the appropriate column shall respectively be and be taken and are hereby declared to constitute one ton of that particular description or class of goods.

Friendly Societies Acts Amendment Act 1915 (No. 2602).
REGULATIONS ALTERED.

PURSUANT to the provisions of section 12 of the *Friendly Societies Acts Amendment Act 1915* (No. 2602), His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby order that the Regulations under the said Acts, dated the 16th day of November, 1915, be altered as follows:—

1. For the words "*Friendly Societies Acts Amendment Act 1915*" wherever they occur there shall be substituted the words "*Friendly Societies Act 1915* (No. 2)."

2. For Regulation No. 6 there shall be substituted the following:—

No contract for reinsurance of liability as aforesaid shall be binding on the Treasurer of Victoria until the first payment of a series of periodical payments thereunder (hereinafter called "premiums") has been actually made by the society or branch concerned or until provision has been made for such payment in accordance with the conditions set forth hereunder the amounts of such periodical payments being fixed in accordance with the Act and notified to the society by the reinsurance agent.

3. For Regulation No. 7 there shall be substituted the following:—

Every contract entered into by a society or branch with the Treasurer of Victoria for reinsurance of liability as aforesaid shall take effect as from the date of enlistment of the member of the society or branch to whom it relates unless such liability has been reinsured with a company in accordance with section 4 of the Act in which case the contract with the Treasurer of Victoria shall take effect as from the date of termination of the contract with such company. Premiums shall be payable annually as from such date of enlistment or of termination of contract.

Provided that the reinsurance agent may arrange with a society or branch that for the purpose of fixing the dates as from which premiums under contracts for reinsurance as aforesaid are payable instead of the actual date of enlistment or of termination of the contract with a company as aforesaid being taken as the date as from which the contract with the Treasurer of Victoria in respect to each member takes effect a single date of enlistment or of termination of contract shall be taken for any group of members that may be agreed on such single date to be the average or as near an approximation thereto as can be obtained from the particulars furnished by the society or branch of the dates of enlistment or of termination of contracts as the case may be of all the members contained in the group.

Provided further that on the death or discharge of a member of a society or branch as aforesaid the reinsurance agent shall for the purpose of estimating the amount due by or to the society or branch in respect of such member on account of premiums treat the contract for reinsurance as aforesaid with the Treasurer as having commenced on the actual date of enlistment or of termination of contract with a company as aforesaid and not on the average date of a group in which the member is included in accordance with an arrangement of the nature referred to in the preceding paragraph.

4. For Regulation No. 9 there shall be substituted the following:—

In regard to payment of premiums by a society or branch during the continuance of the war the following procedure shall be observed:—

The society or branch shall as from the respective dates as from which the contracts for reinsurance of liability as aforesaid take effect pay to the Treasurer of Victoria during the continuance of the war at such times as may be agreed on but not at greater intervals than one year an amount equal to the sum disbursed by it since the date of the preceding payment to the Treasurer in discharge of such of its liabilities as have been included in contracts for reinsurance as aforesaid.

The said amount shall be applied by the Treasurer towards payment of the premiums payable by the society or branch in respect of contracts for reinsurance of liability as aforesaid.

Immediately after receiving the said amount the Treasurer shall reimburse to the society or branch the amount of the said disbursements.

If the amount of the first payment made by a society or branch to the Treasurer and applied by him towards payment of premiums payable by the society or branch in respect of contracts for reinsurance of liability as aforesaid is less than the amount of the premiums payable by the society or branch in respect of such contracts to the date of such payment or if the amount of the payment similarly made and applied during any succeeding period of twelve months is less than the amount of the premiums as aforesaid payable in respect of the same period of twelve months the society or branch shall guarantee payment of the balance of the amount of the premiums payable by it under contracts for reinsurance of liability as aforesaid by lodging with the Treasurer a signed transfer of Commonwealth or Victorian Government Stock or approved debentures or other securities or any combination of these such stock and/or debentures and/or securities being of sufficient amount to provide the said balance. The society or branch shall during the period during which such Stock debentures or securities are held by the Treasurer draw any interest that it would have received had it retained possession thereof. If a lodgment required by this Regulation is not made by a society or branch within a period fixed by the Treasurer all contracts for reinsurance of liability into which it has entered with the Treasurer as aforesaid shall lapse and the Treasurer shall be relieved of all liability thereunder and such contracts may be revived there- after only with the approval of the Treasurer.

Provided that where a contract has been entered into with the Treasurer for reinsurance of liability as aforesaid relating to a member of a society or branch and such member dies or is discharged before he is entitled to any benefits under the rules of the society or branch the contract for reinsurance shall be deemed not to have taken effect and no premium shall be payable thereunder.

(1) All shops, (except shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat, hairdressers' shops, and shops of the classes or kinds mentioned in the Fourth Schedule to the Factories and Shops Act 1915) within the Township of Mitiamo, within the municipal district of the Shire of East Loddon, shall be excepted from the provisions of section 77 of the Factories and Shops Act 1915.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR A PUBLIC PARK, KNOWN AS "CALEMBEEN PARK," IN THE BOROUGH OF CRESWICK.*

THE Council of the Borough of Creswick, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 30th May, 1916, as a site for a public park, known as "Calembeen Park," in the Borough of Creswick, having framed the following regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the Land Act 1915:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Park shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Park who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Park, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Park, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Park, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish; nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

5. No person shall put in the Park any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Park, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. No person shall bring into the Park any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

7. No person shall camp in the Park nor erect therein any dwelling, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person shall perform in any band of music, or take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Park without permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

9. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Park.

10. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Park, and every person infringing this regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the Park.

11. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Park on Sundays.

12. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fetes, sports, or holiday amusements, may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding £10, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

13. No person except labourers and workmen employed in the Park shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against any of these regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the Land Act 1915, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against such regulations and who after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the police force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the police force, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

ORDER DECLARING PUBLIC HIGHWAY.
