BY-LAW NO. 61.—GARBAGE SERVICE.

In pursuance of the powers contained in the Health Act 1915 and of any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Borough of St. Arnaud in the name and on behalf of the Mayor, Councillors and Burgesses of the said borough, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law that is to say:

(1) All former by-laws so tar as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law are hereby repealed.

(2) This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health and immediately after its publication in the Government Garcette.

(3) This By-law shall apply to and have operation within the township boundary of the borough of St. Arnaud.

(3) This By-law shall apply to and have operation within the township boundary of the borough of St. Arnaud.

(4) The occupier of every house, building, or premises within the township boundary shall provale and keep thereon a covered receptacle or receptacles constructed of non-absorbent material and shall cause all house refuse, rubbish or garbage produced or accumulated in and about such house, building, or premises to be from time to time deposited in such receptacle or receptacles.

(5) Every such receptacle shall be kept constantly sovered (except when such refuse or garbage is being deposited therein or discharged therefrom) and a sufficient quantity of some efficient deodorant shall be from time to time introduced therein when necessary tockeep the same in an inoffensive condition.

(6) Once a week on such day in each week as may be appointed by the Council for the removal of house refuse, from such house, building, or premises, such occupier shall cause such receptacle or receptacles to be placed close to the entrance of such house, building, or premises from the street, lane, or right-of-way on which such house, building, or premises abut, in order that the contents of such receptacle or receptacles may be conveniently removed by the person or persons authorized in that behalf by the Council's depôt and there dealt with as directed by the Council's depôt and there dealt with as directed by the Council's inspector.

(5) No person shall place or cause to be placed any such receptacle or receptacles in or upon any street, lane, or right-of-way.

(8) If any person commit a breach of this By-law he shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10) and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

 - (b) Providing that every dwelling house thereafter erected shall have attached thereto, for the exclusive use of the occupiers thereof, a prescribed area of open land;
 - (c) Leaving any matter or thing to be from time to time determined, applied, dispensed with, or regulated by the council, by resolution, or by an officer authorized in that behalf by the council, either generally or for any class of cases, or in any particular case.

I N pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1915, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Brighton order as follows:—

- 1. This By-law shall have force and effect throughout the whole municipality.
- This By-law shall come into operation on its ap-roval by the Governor in Council, and immediately fter its publication in the Victoria Government

3. No dwelling house, which term under this By-law shall include all outbuildings, shall be erected except on land having a frontage of not less than 50 feet to a street or road and an average depth of not less than 130 feet.
