Health Act 1915.

TOWNSHIP OF ST. ARNAUD.

BY-LAW NO. 61.—GARBAGE SERVICE.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1915* and of any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Borough of St. Arnaud in the name and on behalf of the Mayor, Councillors and Burgesses of the said borough, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law that is to say:

(1) All former by-laws so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law are hereby repealed.

(2) This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

(3) This By-law shall apply to and have operation within the township boundary of the borough of St. Arnaud.

(4) The occupier of every house, building, or premises within the township boundary shall provide and keep thereon a covered receptacle or receptacles constructed of non-absorbent material and shall cause all house refuse, rubbish or garbage produced or accumulated in and about such house, building, or premises to be from time to time deposited in such receptacle or receptacles.

(5) Every such receptacle shall be kept constantly covered (except when such refuse or garbage is being deposited therein or discharged therefrom) and a sufficient quantity of some efficient deodorant shall be from time to time introduced therein when necessary to keep the same in an inoffensive condition.

(6) Once a week on such day in each week as may be appointed by the Council for the removal of house refuse from such house, building, or premises, such occupier shall cause such receptacle or receptacles to be placed close to the entrance of such house, building, or premises from the street, lane, or right-of-way on which such house, building, or premises abut, in order that the contents of such receptacle or receptacles may be conveniently removed by the person or persons authorized in that behalf by the Council. And all rubbish or refuse shall be carted to the Council's depot and there dealt with as directed by the Council's inspector.

(7) No person shall place or cause to be placed any such receptacle or receptacles in or upon any street, lane, or right-of-way.

(8) If any person commit a breach of this By-law he shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10) and not less than Five shillings, or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Arthur Lyulph Stanley, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation as hereunder set forth, certain Crown lands were proclaimed a township: And whereas it is expedient to rescind (in part) the said Proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of provisions contained in section 19 of the *Land Act* 1915, do hereby order as follows, viz.:—

The Proclamation bearing date the 13th February, 1894, by which certain Crown lands were proclaimed as townships, is hereby rescinded so far as it relates to the portion of the township of Tyntynder (now Nyah), hereinafter described:—

County of Tatchera, parish of Tyntynder North: Commencing at the south-west angle of the existing site and bounded by lines bearing respectively north 8,000 links and east 4,000 links; thence by the Swan Hill road bearing south 6,278 links, by a line, allotment 1 of section B, and a line bearing east 2,400 links, by allotment B bearing south 1,722 links, and by a line bearing west 6,400 links to the point of commencement.—(N.161, T.244(4) (94.C.86411).

TOWN OF BRIGHTON.

BY-LAW No. 72.

A By-law of the Town of Brighton, made under section 198 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and numbered 72, for—

- (a) Prescribing the minimum area and the minimum depth and width of frontage of land upon which any dwelling house may thereafter be erected;
- (b) Providing that every dwelling house thereafter erected shall have attached thereto, for the exclusive use of the occupiers thereof, a prescribed area of open land;
- (c) Leaving any matter or thing to be from time to time determined, applied, dispensed with, or regulated by the council, by resolution, or by an officer authorized in that behalf by the council, either generally or for any class of cases, or in any particular case.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Brighton order as follows:—

1. This By-law shall have force and effect throughout the whole municipality.
2. This By-law shall come into operation on its approval by the Governor in Council, and immediately after its publication in the *Victoria Government Gazette*.

3. No dwelling house, which term under this By-law shall include all outbuildings, shall be erected except on land having a frontage of not less than 50 feet to a street or road and an average depth of not less than 130 feet. Provided, however, that in any case where the depth of the land is less than 130 feet a dwelling house may be erected thereon if the width or frontage is increased proportionately so as to give a total superficial area of not less than 6,500 square feet; but in no case whatever shall the depth of the land be less than 110 feet. Not more than one dwelling house shall be erected on any such land, but the council may, in its absolute discretion, permit the erection of two dwelling houses attached together, provided each house shall itself stand on land having a minimum area of 4,550 square feet, a width of not less than 35 feet, an average depth of at least 110 feet, and a clear space of not less than 10 feet along the side of each house. Provided further that when any allotment of land smaller in area than that hereinbefore prescribed was, in the opinion of the council, owned by any person prior to the coming into operation of this By-law, and not part of an allotment of which a portion has been alienated or excised since the coming into operation of this By-law, and in the opinion of the council further land cannot be obtained to increase the area of such land, or such allotment is shown on any plan of subdivision heretofore approved by the council, the council, on application in writing, may, by resolution carried by a majority of the whole of the number of the members of the council, at a meeting of which due notice has been given, permit a dwelling house, which shall comply with the Building Regulations of the town, to be erected upon such land.

4. Every dwelling house hereafter erected shall have attached thereto, for the exclusive use of the occupiers thereof, an area of open land not less than one-half of the total area of the allotment on which such dwelling house stands.

5. No shop shall be built except on land having a frontage of not less than 16 feet 6 inches to a street or road an average depth of not less than 130 feet back access from a right-of-way 10 feet in width at the least, and a total area of not less than 2,145 square feet. Provided that in every case where dwelling rooms are attached to a shop there shall be an open space or yard free from all buildings of not less than 650 square feet for the exclusive use of the occupiers of such shop and dwelling room. Provided further that when any allotment of land smaller in area than that hereinbefore prescribed was, in the opinion of the council, owned by any person prior to the coming into operation of this By-law, and not part of an allotment of which a portion has been alienated or excised since the coming into operation of this By-law, and in the opinion of the council further land cannot be obtained to increase the area of such land or such allotment is shown on any plan of subdivision heretofore approved by the council, the council, on application in writing, may, by resolution carried by a majority of the whole of the number of the members of the council at a meeting, of which due notice has been given, permit a shop, which shall comply with Building Regulations of the town, to be erected upon such land.

6. No land upon which any dwelling house has been erected shall thereafter be reduced in area below the minimum area prescribed by this By-law.

7. Provided always that notwithstanding anything hereinbefore provided to the contrary, the council may, on application in writing, setting forth the grounds of the application, under special circumstances, and for special causes, and at a meeting of which due notice has been given to each councillor, declare that the provisions of this By-law either in whole or in part shall not apply to any particular area of land.

8. Every person who shall, by any wilful act or default be guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of this By-law, shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20 for each such offence, and if such offence be a continuing one not exceeding £2 per day for each day such offence is continued after written notice of the offence is given by the council or its town clerk to the person offending.
