Factories and Shops Acts.

## REGULATION OF CHEMISTS' SHOPS IN THE BOROUGH OF WANGARATTA.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the  
seventh day of August, 1917.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor of Victoria.

Sir A. J. Peacock | Mr. Hagelthorn.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition certified by the municipal clerk of the municipal district of the Borough of Wangaratta, as signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers (exclusive of hawkers and peddlers) of the particular class or kind to be affected, do hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

- (1) The Regulation made on the twentieth day of June, 1912, directing that all chemists' shops (being shops of a class or kind mentioned in the Fourth Schedule to the *Factories and Shops Act 1905*, No. 1975) within the municipal district of the Borough of Wangaratta shall be closed during the whole of each year on the evenings of Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday from the hour of Eight o'clock, and on the evening of Saturday from the hour of half-past Ten o'clock, and on the afternoons of Sunday and Wednesday from the hour of Two o'clock in each and every week, and directing that such shops may re-open on the evenings of Sunday and Wednesday in each and every week from the hour of Six

o'clock until the hour of Eight o'clock, shall, from and after the date hereof, be and the same is hereby repealed.

- (2) All chemists' shops (being shops of a class or kind mentioned in the Fourth Schedule to the *Factories and Shops Act 1915*, No. 2650) within the municipal district of the Borough of Wangaratta shall be closed in each and every week during the whole of each year—

- (a) on the evenings of Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday, from the hour of Six o'clock;  
(b) on the evening of Saturday, from half-past Nine o'clock;  
(c) on the afternoon of Wednesday, from the hour of One o'clock.

And the Honorable Sir Alexander James Peacock, His Majesty's Minister of Labour for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein according.
