#### AMENDMENT OF THE REGULATIONS FOR THE EQUIPMENT OF SHIPS WITH LIFE-SAVING APPLIANCES.

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the *Marine Act 1915* (Act No. 2688), the Marine Board of Victoria, with the consent of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the Regulations following, that is to say:—

1. These Regulations shall be read and construed as one with "The Regulations for the Equipment of Ships with Life-saving Appliances, 1915," made by the Board on the 28th day of May, 1915, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 16th day of June, 1915 (hereinafter referred to as the Principal Regulations), and shall come into operation on the 1st day of January, 1918.

2. Subject to the provisions hereinafter contained, no compass inspected on or after the 1st day of January, 1918, shall be deemed to be an "efficient compass" unless it complies with the following specification:—

- The compass must be of the "liquid" type.
- The magnet must have ample directive force.
- The card must be not less than 4 inches in diameter, must have a clearance from the bowl of at least  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch, and must have a centre of sapphire, hard agate, or other hard stone.
- The pivot must be of suitable hard metal, preferably iridium.
- The liquid must be non-corrosive, and otherwise suitable for the purpose.
- The chamber must be provided with means to allow for the expansion and contraction of the liquid.
- The bowl must be weighted at the bottom and fitted with gimbals, giving fore and aft and thwartship action, and must be placed in a binnacle or box of non-magnetic material.
- The maker's or dealer's name and address must be clearly marked on the compass.

Suitable means of illumination at night must be provided.

3. In every ship to which clause 14 (3) of the Principal Regulations applies, carrying passengers and carrying sixteen or more boats, eight boats must be provided with compasses in accordance with clause 2 hereof; if less than sixteen boats are carried at least one half must be provided with such compasses.

4. In every ship to which clause 14 (3) of the Principal Regulations applies, and not carrying passengers, at least two boats, one on each side of the ship, must be provided with compasses, in accordance with clause 2 hereof.

5. Any compasses which have been previously passed and are still in good condition may be accepted in boats which are not required to be provided with compasses, in accordance with clause 2 hereof; but all new compasses and all compasses fitted in boats for new ships, or in new boats for existing ships, must comply with clause 2 hereof.

6. Every motor boat carried on any ship must be provided with a compass, in accordance with clause 2 hereof.

7. All boats provided with compasses must be marked so as to distinguish them from boats not so equipped.

SHIRE OF ROCHESTER.  
BY-LAW No. 3A.

**I**N pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1915*, and of any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Rochester, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said shire for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law, that is to say:—

1. All former By-laws so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law are hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the township of Rochester.

4. The occupier of every house, building, or premises within the township of Rochester shall provide and keep thereon a covered receptacle or receptacles constructed of non-absorbent material, and shall cause all house refuse, rubbish, or garbage produced or accumulated in and about such house, building, or premises to be from time to time deposited in such receptacle or receptacles.

5. Every such receptacle shall be kept constantly covered (except when such refuse or garbage is being deposited therein or discharged therefrom), and a sufficient quantity of some efficient deodorant shall be from time to time introduced therein when necessary to keep the same in an inoffensive condition.

6. Once a week on such day in each week as may be appointed by the council for the removal of house refuse from such house, building, or premises, such occupier shall cause such receptacle or receptacles to be placed close to the entrance to such house, building, or premises from the streets, lane, or right-of-way on which such house, building, or premises abut, in order that the contents of such receptacle or receptacles may be conveniently removed by the person or persons authorized in that behalf by the council.

7. No person shall place or cause to be placed any such receptacle in or upon any street, lane, or right-of-way.

8. If any person commit a breach of this By-law he shall, for every such breach, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, and not less than Five shillings, or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

**T**HE President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Colac, by virtue of the provisions of the *Health Act 1915*, and every other power enabling them in that behalf, hereby make the following By-law, being By-law No. 74 of the said shire.

1. This By-law may be cited as a By-law to amend By-law No. 69 for regulating earth closets and the emptying and cleansing of cesspans in the township of Cressy, and for fixing a charge for the same.

2. This By-law shall come into force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. Section 10 of By-law No. 69 is hereby repealed.

4. The charge for emptying and cleansing the cesspans to be paid by the occupier of any tenement under the provisions of section 320 of the *Health Act 1915* shall be as follows:—Once a week for each pan, per annum,

£1 15s.; twice a week for each pan, £3 10s.; thrice a week for each pan, £5 5s. Such charges shall be payable half-yearly in advance. Failure to pay the said annual charge shall be a breach of this By-law. Every person who fails to comply with, or is guilty of any breach of the provisions of this By-law, shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding £10.

This By-law was duly made, ordered, and passed by the council of the shire of Colac, this 18th day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and sixteen, and confirmed by the Council on the 15th day of January, One thousand nine hundred and seventeen.

STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION.

BY-LAW No. 701.—GENERAL RATE.—RODNEY IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY DISTRICT.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. The following General Rate is hereby made under the provisions of the Water Acts, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of all lands within the Rodney Irrigation and Water Supply District, except within any Urban Division thereof:—

For the supply of water for the domestic and ordinary use of persons dwelling upon such lands and for watering cattle or other stock:—

No. 2686) it is amongst other things enacted that if the council of any municipality prove to the satisfaction of the Minister that it is desirable that any road should be deviated, and that such deviation can be conveniently made through Crown land or land held by licensees under the Land Act 1915, the Minister may cause such road to be deviated accordingly at the cost of the municipality: And whereas it has been proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that it is desirable to deviate a certain road in the parish of Callignee: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of provisions contained in section 477 of the Act aforesaid, doth hereby declare the new road in the parish of Callignee defined in the following description to be a public highway in lieu of an existing road in the parish named, of which road technical description is also hereunder given (that is to say):—

**REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE ROYAL PARK, IN THE CITY OF MELBOURNE.**

**WE**, William Davidson, Thomas Reynolds James, Robert Wallace Best, George Hawkins Ievers, Joseph Martin Reed, Thomas Frank Morkham, and George Howat, a majority of the trustees for the time being of the Reserve for Public Parks, together known as "The Royal Park" (hereinafter called the Park), in the city of Melbourne, do hereby, in exercise and in pursuance of the powers conferred on us by the Crown grants thereof, and by the *Land Act 1915*, section 182, make the following Regulations in respect thereof:—

**REGULATIONS.**

1. The Park shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge.
2. No person shall climb any of the fences or trees in the Park, stick bills thereon, or interfere with or injure any fences, trees, seats, buildings, water-taps, latrines, or other improvements therein, or damage by cutting or otherwise defacing the same, or lie on the seats, or, without the authority of the trustees, remove any wood, gravel, stone, sand, earth, or other material from the Park.
3. No person shall ride or drive on the grass or on the footways in the Park.
4. No person shall drive into, over, or through the Park any motor or any delivery cart, tradesman's cart, dray, lorry, waggon, van, truck, or barrow, or any vehicle plying for hire or bearing either any name or number, or used for carrying merchandise of any description.
5. No person shall enter the Park for the purpose of breaking in horses or training or exercising horses, or break in, train, or exercise horses within the Park, or jump horses over any of the fences or drive cattle or sheep through the Park.
6. No person shall put in the Park any cattle, horses, sheep, or other animals without the authority, in writing, of the trustees first obtained.
7. No person, except those in the employ of or authorized by the trustees, shall bring into the Park any vehicle, and all vehicles entering therein shall be subject to the direction of the trustees or officer authorized by such trustees.
8. No person shall, without the authority, in writing, of the trustees first obtained, sell or offer for sale in the Park any article of any description, and no person shall bring into the Park any fermented or spirituous liquors.
9. No person shall bring any dog into the Park unless led by a chain or cord, or discharge firearms, or throw stones, or use any projectile whatsoever therein, or molest any of the animals in the Park, nor shall fires be lighted therein without the authority of the trustees first obtained.
10. No person shall bring into the Park any goats, pigs, or poultry, and all goats, pigs, and poultry found therein shall be liable to be destroyed.
11. No person except those in the employ of the trustees shall enter any plots of ground in the Park which may be enclosed for plantations or other purposes.
12. No public meeting or assemblage of people for any purpose shall be held in the Park without the authority, in writing, of the trustees first obtained.
13. No person shall preach or deliver a public harangue within the Park.
14. No person shall take away from the Park any bird's nest.
15. Cricket, football, running, or other athletic sports, games, or pastimes shall not be played or allowed to take place in the Park without the authority, in writing, of the trustees first obtained.
16. No person taking part in sports of any kind (or under any circumstances) shall appear in the Park except in decent costume.
17. No person shall engage in any sport or play or practise cricket, football, golf, or other game, or train for any sport or game in the Park on Sunday.
18. No person shall leave empty bottles or broken glass or crockery, paper, or any other litter in the Park, or use carpets, or dry clothes, or commit any nuisance therein.
19. No person shall enter or remain in the Park who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct, and any person found therein in a state of intoxication or behaving in a disorderly manner, or taking part in a fight or disturbance, or committing any act

of indecency, or appearing in indecent costume, or making use of foul, indecent, threatening, or abusive language to or within the hearing of any other person, shall be liable to be forthwith removed from the Park.

Every person offending against any of these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 182 of the *Land Act 1915*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who so offends and who after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or officer or servant of such trustees, or by any member of the police force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff, officer or servant, or any member of the police force, and taken before some Justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

**MALLEE LANDS AVAILABLE FOR APPLICATION AS SELECTION PURCHASE ALLOTMENTS.**

THE land is situated in the north-west corner of Victoria, and 12 miles west of Nyah.

A By-law of the City of Hawthorn, made under sections 198 and 228 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and numbered 70 for altering By-law numbered 68 and for regulating and restraining the erection and construction of buildings, erections, or hoardings, prescribing the minimum area and the minimum depth and width of frontage of land upon which any dwelling-house may thereafter be erected, providing that every dwelling-house thereafter erected shall have attached thereto for the exclusive use of the occupiers thereof a prescribed area of open land, and providing with respect to buildings thereafter erected for the ventilation and lighting of buildings.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the Mayor Councillors and Citizens of the City of Hawthorn order as follows:—

1. That the By-law of the City of Hawthorn made under sections 198 and 228 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered 68 shall be altered as follows:—

- (a) At the end of clause one of Part II. of the said By-law, the following shall be added:—"Such notice of intention shall contain an accurate description of the land upon which it is intended to commence such building or erection which description may be copied from the title to such land."
- (b) At the end of clause three of Part II. of the said By-law, the following shall be added:—"and no such permit shall be granted or issued in respect of an intended shop or dwelling or shop and dwelling if the Engineer of the said city for the time being certifies in writing that some part of the lowest floor in the intended building would not be at least one foot higher in level than the highest level of any flood water on the said land which at any time previously reached the site of the intended building and the determination of such highest level is hereby left to the Engineer of the said city for the time being and he is hereby appointed by the Council of the said city as the officer authorized in that behalf for the class of cases arising under this clause three."
- (c) In clause (7), (subdivision 7) Part II.—After the words "Building or erection" and before the words "on any land", there shall be inserted the words "within a distance of fifty feet from the building line of the street"; and at the end of clause 7, there shall be added the words "and where any building or erection is erected or constructed of material other than brick, stone or concrete at a distance of fifty feet from the street as permitted by this clause, such building shall comply in every respect with the requirements of this By-law, as regards wooden buildings."
- (d) In clause 8 (b), (subdivision 7) Part II.—After the words "similar outbuildings" and before the words "covering not more" there shall be inserted the words "within a distance of fifty feet from streets mentioned or referred to in Schedule 'B' to this By-law"; and after the words "twelve feet to any street" and before the words "and that before the construction", there shall be inserted the words "included in Schedule 'B' to this By-law".
- (e) In clause (11), (subdivision 7) Part II.—After the words "two buildings" and before the words "erected or constructed" there shall be inserted the words "constructed of brick, stone or concrete and".
- (f) At the end of clause (11), sub-clause (b), (subdivision 7, Part II) there shall be added the words, "save as hereinafter otherwise provided."
- (g) In clause (11) sub-clause (c), (subdivision 7), Part II.—At the end of sub-clause (c) there shall be added the words "but this provision shall not be held to apply to residential shops which may be built up to the boundaries of the allotment, provided the requirements of Part VIII. of this By-law are complied with, and that there is on one side a clear open passage not less than 5 feet in width, between the external wall of the dwelling portion at rear of the shop and boundary of land not in the same occupation."
- (h) In clause (11), sub-clause (d), (subdivision 7), Part II.—The figures "33" shall be substituted for the figures "30" and after the words "a dwelling-house" and before the words "may be built" there shall be inserted the words "constructed of brick stone or concrete", and after the words "allotment and" and before the words "a right-of-way", there shall be inserted the words "a street or".

The tenderer may submit alternative prices for suitable substitutes and submit samples of same.

- (i) In clause (1) (subdivision 11) Part VI.—The words "where permitted by" shall be substituted for the words "in streets other than the streets specified in Schedule 'B' to".
- (j) In clause (1) sub-clause (c) (subdivision 11) Part VI.—The words "providing always that" where they occur after the words "not in the same occupation; but", shall be omitted, and at the end of the said sub-clause (c) the following words shall be added, viz. :—"provided however that a dwelling-house may be built up to the boundary between the allotment and a right-of-way not less than 10 feet wide running at the side of such dwelling-house".
- (k) In clause (1) (subdivision 11) Part VI.—After sub-clause (d) there shall be added a new sub-clause :—" (e) Ferneries, greenhouses, vineries, aviaries and similar outbuildings used in connexion with buildings which comply with the by-laws and regulations of the city including this by-law which do not cover more than two squares in all, unless at a distance of 50 feet from the building line of the street, may be erected in streets other than those mentioned or referred to in Schedule 'B' to this By-law in such positions and of such designs as may be approved by the Surveyor.
- (l) In clause (1), (subdivision 12), Part VI.—After the words "public highway if the roof", and before the words "thereof is covered" there shall be inserted the words "and walls"; and the words "thereof is covered" referred to shall be altered to "thereof are covered".
- (m) At the end of Part VIII. there shall be inserted the following clauses :—

7. *Dwelling-houses.*—From and after the coming into force of this By-law, no building intended to be used as a dwelling-house shall be built or erected so as to front any street or road less than thirty-three (33) feet in width unless the front of such building is kept at a distance of not less than twenty (20) feet from the building line of such street or road. Provided also that in case of a street or road between thirty and thirty-three feet wide where a house is burnt down or in case of such a street being bounded on one side by a public reserve or in any other case where good reason is shown to the Council, the Council may on application in writing, exempt from the foregoing prohibition the land on which such house so burnt down was erected.

8. *Dwelling-houses.*—No dwelling-house shall be erected on any land having a width of less than 40 feet fronting any street or road by a depth of less than 120 feet; provided however that in any case where the depth of the land is less than 120 feet, a dwelling-house may be erected thereon if the width or frontage is increased proportionately so as to give a total superficial area of not less than 4,800 square feet. The provisions of this clause shall only apply to allotments of land subdivided after the coming into operation of this By-law.

9. *Shops.*—A shop with a dwelling room or rooms attached, if built of brick, stone or concrete, may be built on any land having a width of not less than sixteen feet six inches (16 ft. 6 in.) and a depth of not less than 120 feet. Provided that there shall be an open space or yard free from all buildings of not less than 300 square feet.

10. *Semi-detached Houses.*—Not more than two dwelling-houses shall be attached together. In every such case the buildings shall be constructed of brick, stone or concrete, and each pair shall stand on land having a width of not less than 60 feet and a depth of not less than 120 feet, and shall have a clear space of not less than seven feet six inches (7 ft. 6 in.) of such sixty feet along the side of each house of such pair. Save as aforesaid, the erection of any semi-detached dwelling-house is hereby prohibited.

11. No dwelling-house whether attached to a shop or not shall be built or erected unless provision be made for ample light and air space, to the satisfaction of the Building Surveyor.

12. *Open Space.*—Every dwelling-house hereafter erected shall have attached thereto for the exclusive use of the occupiers thereof an area of open land not less than two-fifths of the total area of the allotment on which the same stands, and in no case shall the yard space at the rear of every such dwelling-house, clear of any buildings erected thereon, be less than 500 square feet.

13. For the purpose of this By-law, the following provisions shall apply :—

- (a) Verandahs and outbuildings shall in the calculation of space be included as part of the dwelling-house to which they belong, and
- (b) Where any distance from a boundary to any dwelling-house is provided for, such distance shall be measured to the outer edge of the verandah, if any.
- (n) At the end of clause (1) Part XIV., there shall be added the words "and the provisions of this By-law relating to the distance from side boundaries of allotments at which buildings may be erected shall apply only to buildings erected on land having a frontage of not less than 40 feet subdivided since the first day of January 1914, provided however that no building erected on an allotment as subdivided prior to such date shall be built, constructed or erected on more than one of the side boundaries of such allotment, and in no case shall any such building be erected or constructed unless a brick parapet wall is erected on the boundary of the allotment, and the building in all other respects complies with the regulations as to buildings and erections belonging to the same class".
- (o) In Schedule "B" the letter or sign "(a)" at the beginning of the Schedule shall be omitted.
- (p) In Schedule "B" clause 4, after the words "Riversdale-road", there shall be inserted the words "south side", and after the words "to Burke-road" there shall be added the words "north side from west side of Power-street to Aberdeen-street".
- (q) In Schedule "B", clause 8, for the words "the southern boundary", there shall be substituted the words "Anderson's-road".
- (r) In Schedule "B", clause 11, the words "Weinberg-grove, Burton-avenue, Lavidge-street, Cook-street" where they appear shall be omitted.
- (s) In Schedule "B", clause 12—After the words "Fordholm-road" there shall be added the words "From Riversdale-road to Hawthorn-glen".
- (t) In Schedule "B" clauses 13 and 14, there shall be substituted for the words "to the creek" the words "to Callantina-road".
- (u) In Schedule "B" clause 18, after the words "Harcourt-street" there shall be added the words "from Auburn-road to Cowper-street".
- (v) At the end of Schedule "B" there shall be added the following clause :—" 23. Callantina-road, east of Glenferrie-road".

BY-LAW No. 71.

A By-law of the City of Hawthorn, made under sections 198 and 228 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and numbered 71, for altering By-law numbered 68 and for regulating and restraining the erection and construction of buildings erections or hoardings, prescribing the minimum depth and width of frontage of land upon which any dwelling-house may thereafter be erected in certain specified parts or areas in the municipal district.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the Mayor Councillors and Citizens of the City of Hawthorn order as follows :—

- (a) In clause 8 of Part VIII. after the words "fronting any street or road" there shall be inserted the words "other than the streets or roads mentioned, or hereafter set out in any of the areas mentioned, in Schedule E to this By-law"; and after the words "not less than

4,800 square feet" and before the words "The provisions of this By-law" there shall be inserted the following words:—"and no dwelling-house shall be erected on any land abutting on any of the streets, or included in any of the areas mentioned in Schedule E to this By-law unless the allotment upon which such dwelling-house is to be erected shall have a clear frontage of not less than fifty feet to a street by a depth of not less than 120 feet, provided however that, in the case of an allotment having a greater frontage than 50 feet, the depth may be diminished proportionately; but in no case shall the area of such allotment be less than 6,000 square feet."

- (b) At the end of clause 9 of Part VIII. there shall be added the following words:—"provided however that no factory workshop or other building shall within the areas 'A' and 'B' except the portion bounded by Wallen-road, Power-street, and the River Yarra referred to in Schedule E to this By-law be hereafter built for the purpose of trade and no building already erected within the said area shall be altered or used for such purpose unless the permission of the Council be first obtained."
- (c) In clause 10 of Part VIII. after the words "of such pair" and before the words "save as aforesaid" there shall be inserted the following words:—"provided however that in any case where the depth of the land is less than 120 feet a pair of dwellings may be erected thereon if the width or frontage is increased proportionately so as to give a total superficial area of not less than 7,200 square feet."
- (d) At the end of Part VIII. there shall be inserted the following clause:—

14. No building shall be erected on any land within the city of Hawthorn for the purpose of carrying on any noxious or offensive trade within the meaning of section 286 of the *Health Act 1915*, nor shall any building already in existence be used for such purpose unless the permission of the Council be first obtained.

- (e) At the end of Schedule "D" there shall be inserted the following Schedule:—

SCHEDULE "E."

Streets.—

Barker's-road, south side from Power-street to Glenferrie-road, and from Elphingrove to Burke-road.  
 Power-street, from Burwood-road to River Yarra.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the following part or parts of the municipal district of the Shire of Numurkah, that is to say the townships of Numurkah, Nathalia, Wunghnu, Strathmerton and Picola.

4. Any person who by any wilful act or default offends against any of the provisions of this By-law shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty of not less than 5s. and not more than £5.
