HAWTHORN TRAMWAYS TRUST.

BY-LAW No. 2.

By-law Regulating, Controlling, and Managing Wattle Park.

THE Hawthorn Tramways Trust, pursuant to the Melbourne to Burwood Tramways Act 1915 (No. 2), doth hereby make the following By-laws:—

- 1. In these By-laws, except where otherwise clearly intended, "The Trust" or "The said Trust" means The Hawthorn Tramways Trust, and any person authorized by the Trust to do the particular matter. "Park" means the land belonging to the said Trust situate at corner of Boundary and Riversdale roads, Surrey Hills, and known as Wattle Park.
- 2. The park shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, or such later time as the Trust may from time to time determine, and except during those hours no person shall be allowed in the park unless authorized by the Trust.
- 3. No person shall remove the soil under or about any tree, earth, shrub, fern or other plant, or interfere with, cut, destroy, damage or remove any earth, tree, shrub, plant, flower, fern, or other property of the Trust.
- 4. No person shall write, paint or cut names, letters or marks, or affix bills on the buildings, seats, trees, rocks, gates, fences or other property of the Trust or otherwise deface the same.
- 5. No person shall throw or discharge in the park any stone or other missile unless in pursuit of games authorized by the Trust, and in such place or places as may be set apart for such purpose.
- 6. No person shall light a fire in the park, or leave therein any glass bottles, broken glass, china, paper, or other litter, except in places set apart by the said Trust.
- 7. No person shall commit any nuisance in the park or shall foul or pollute any water in any creek, well, dam, or reservoir in the park, or take or destroy any fish in any such water.
- fish in any such water.

 8. No person shall kill, pursue, worry, ill-treat, or take any bird or animal in any part of the park, or wilfully displace, disturb, injure, destroy, or take any bird's nest or eggs; nor shall any person enter the park with, or use, spread, or set therein any snare, net, engine, instrument, or other means for taking, injuring, or destroying any bird or animal.
- 9. No person shall bring into the park any dog unless securely held by a chain or cord and effectually restrained from causing annoyance to any person or from pursuing, worrying, or disturbing any animal therein; and all dogs found in the park not so held and restrained may be destroyed.
- 10. No person shall, without the consent of the Trust, carry, use, or discharge any firearms in the park.
- 11. No person shall sell, offer, or expose for sale any article or thing within the park without first obtaining the consent of the said Trust.
- 12. No person shall in any part of the park wilfully obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any other person in the proper use of the park, or wilfully obstruct in the execution of his duty or insult any park keeper or other servant of the Trust.
- 13. No person using any water-tap in the said park shall neglect to turn off the same in a proper manner.

- 14. Any person behaving in a disorderly or indecent manner, or using obscene language, or creating a disturbance in the park shall be liable to be summarily removed therefrom and to be prosecuted for such misbehaviour.
- 15: No person in a state of intoxication, or who is disorderly, or not decorously dressed, shall enter or remain within the park.
- 16. No person shall drive, ride, or impel a bicycle or motor car, or travel by any other means whatsoever within the park at a greater speed than six miles per hour.
- 17. No person shall use a motor car, motor cab, or any other vehicle whatsoever for the purpose of carrying passengers for hire or fee within the park, or ply for hire within the park, without first obtaining the consent of the said Trust.
- 18. No person shall ride or drive on any portion of the park except on the roads or tracks and on the reserves set apart for such purpose. No person shall break in or exercise any horse within the park.
- 19/No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or seats, or on any structure or erection within the park.
- 20. No person shall within the park, whether on his own behalf or for any other person, wager or bet, or offer to wager or bet, or promise to pay any wager or bet.
- 21. No person shall play any unlawful game within the park.
- 22. No person shall paint or otherwise display any advertisement upon any fence enclosing the park or on any structure, the property of the Trust, within or adjoining the park without permission therefor being first obtained from the Trust.
- 23. No person shall smoke tobacco or any like substance in any building within the park where by a notice or notices affixed or set up in some conspicuous position the Trust may prohibit smoking in such building.
- 24. No person shall enter into or upon plots of ground specially enclosed or set apart for plantations, and/or for other purposes in the park, and no assemblies for the purpose of public worship, preaching, or public speaking of any kind or meetings of a like character shall take place in the park without the permission in writing of the Trust first obtained.
- 25. No person shall play football, cricket or other games of sport without the consent of the Trust. No person shall use any part of the park other than that specially set apart for the playing of such games or aports
- 26. No booth, tent, or other structure shall be erected within the park without the consent of the Trust.
- 27. All stock found in the park, unless duly licensed by the said Trust, will be impounded; and all goats, pigs, and poultry found trespassing in the park may be destroyed; and the owner shall pay compensation for any damage done.
- 28. Vehicular traffic within the park shall be confined to the roads and on reserves appointed for the purpose.
- 29. (1) Any person by act or omission guilty of an offence against any of these By-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.
- (2) Any attempt to commit an offence against any of the provisions of these By-laws shall be an offence against these By-laws, punishable as if the offence had been committed.
- (3) Whoever aids, abets, counsels, or procures, or by any act or omission is directly or indirectly concerned in the commission of any offence against these By-laws shall be deemed to have committed such offence and shall be punishable accordingly.
- 30. Children under the age of ten (10) not being under the control of some compotent person may be removed from the park by or under the direction of some person appointed by the Trust.







PROPOSED ADDITIONS TO FOREST RESERVES.—DIAGRAMS TO ACCOMPANY SCHEDULE No. 23.




PROPOSED ADDITIONS TO FOREST RESERVES .- DIAGRAMS TO ACCOMPANY SCHEDULE No. 23-continued.

NDER the powers conferred by the Water Acts, and all other powers enabling me in that behalf, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby proclaim that as on and from the first day of September, 1917, that portion of the Waterworks District of the Loddon United Waterworks Trust included within the following boundaries shall be and become an "Urban District" for the purposes of the said Acts, and shall be known as Mitiamo Urban District:—

Commencing at the north-west angle of allotment 25a, parish of Hayanmi, county of Bendigo; thence northerly by a line in continuation of the western boundary of that allotment to the south-west side of the 3-chain road from Kerang; thence by a line bearing east to a point in allotment 1a, parish of Mitiamo, in line with the eastern boundary of allotment 63 of that parish; thence southerly by a line to the north-east angle of that allotment; thence southerly by the said eastern boundary of allotment 63 for a distance of 5 chains; thence by a line bearing west for a distance of 16 chains; thence by a line bearing south to the north-east side of the 3-chain road from Kerang; thence

north-westerly by that road to the western boundary of the parish of Mitiamo; thence north-erly by that boundary to the north-east angle of allotment 24A, parish of Hayanmi; thence west-erly by a road to the point of commencement.

All of which boundaries are as shown on a plan deposited in the office of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, Treasury Gardens, Melbourne.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this twenty-first day of August, in the year of our Lord One thou-sand nine hundred and seventeen, and in the eighth year of His Majesty's reign.

SHIRE OF BET BET.

BY-LAW No. 7.

A By-law of the Shire of Bet Bet, made under sub-section 29 of section 197 of the Local Government Act 1903, for prohibiting or regulating the use on any public highway of traction engines or other vehicles having projections on their wheels, and under section 994 of the said Act for regulating the conditions under which traction engines may proceed over any public highway.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1903, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Bet Bet order as follows: BY-LAW No. 7.

1. Bars, Spikes, Grips, or other Projections on Wheels.

—No person shall use or cause or procure any other person to use on any public highway any traction engine or other vehicle having on its wheels any bars, spikes, grips, or other projections.

This prohibition, however, shall not apply to—

(a) Any traction engine used only for hauling agricultural machinery, or hauling a vehicle containing such machinery only, if the projections on the driving wheels of such engine consist only of bars at least two and three-quarter inches in width and not more than one and one-sixteenth of an inch in thickness, and the space intervening between such bars does not exceed five inches; or

(b) Any traction engine the driving wheels of which are cylindrical and smooth-soled and having no projections thereon other than diagonal bars of not less than three inches in width, nor more than three-quarters of an inch in thickness and extending the full width of the tyre, and the space intervening between such crossbars not exceeding three inches, provided in such last-mentioned case—
