PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Arthur Lyulph Stanley, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies, in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

“An Act to amend the Railway Lands Acquisition Acts.”

“An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of One hundred and thirty thousand six hundred and sixteen pounds to the service of the year One thousand nine hundred and sixteen and One thousand nine hundred and seventeen.”

HAWTHORN TRAMWAYS TRUST.

BY-LAW No. 2.

By-law Regulating, Controlling, and Managing Waitle Park.

THE Hawthorn Tramways Trust, pursuant to the Melbourne to Burwood Tramways Act 1915 (No. 2), doth hereby make the following By-laws:—

1. In these By-laws, except where otherwise clearly intended, "The Trust" or "The said Trust" means The Hawthorn Tramways Trust, and any person authorized by the Trust to do the particular matter. "Park" means the land belonging to the said Trust situate at corner of Boundary and Riversdale roads, Surrey Hills, and known as Waitle Park.

2. The park shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, or such later time as the Trust may from time to time determine, and except during those hours no person shall be allowed in the park unless authorized by the Trust.

3. No person shall remove the soil under or about any tree, earth, shrub, fern or other plant, or interfere with, cut, destroy, damage or remove any earth, tree, shrub, plant, flower, fern, or other property of the Trust.

4. No person shall write, paint or cut names, letters or marks, or affix bills on the buildings, seats, trees, rocks, gates, fences or other property of the Trust or otherwise deface the same.

5. No person shall throw or discharge in the park any stone or other missile unless in pursuit of games authorized by the Trust, and in such place or places as may be set apart for such purpose.

6. No person shall light a fire in the park, or leave therein any glass bottles, broken glass, china, paper, or other litter, except in places set apart by the said Trust.

7. No person shall commit any nuisance in the park or shall foul or pollute any water in any creek, well, dam, or reservoir in the park, or take or destroy any fish in any such water.

8. No person shall kill, pursue, worry, ill-treat, or take any bird or animal in any part of the park, or wilfully displace, disturb, injure, destroy, or take any bird's nest or eggs; nor shall any person enter the park with, or use, spread, or set therein any snare, net, engine, instrument, or other means for taking, injuring, or destroying any bird or animal.

9. No person shall bring into the park any dog unless securely held by a chain or cord and effectually restrained from causing annoyance to any person or from pursuing, worrying, or disturbing any animal therein; and all dogs found in the park not so held and restrained may be destroyed.

10. No person shall, without the consent of the Trust, carry, use, or discharge any firearms in the park.

11. No person shall sell, offer, or expose for sale any article or thing within the park without first obtaining the consent of the said Trust.

12. No person shall in any part of the park wilfully obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any other person in the proper use of the park, or wilfully obstruct in the execution of his duty or insult any park-keeper or other servant of the Trust.

13. No person using any water-tap in the said park shall neglect to turn off the same in a proper manner.

14. Any person behaving in a disorderly or indecent manner, or using obscene language, or creating a disturbance in the park shall be liable to be summarily removed therefrom and to be prosecuted for such misbehaviour.

15. No person in a state of intoxication, or who is disorderly, or not decorously dressed, shall enter or remain within the park.

16. No person shall drive, ride, or impel a bicycle or motor car, or travel by any other means whatsoever within the park at a greater speed than six miles per hour.

17. No person shall use a motor car, motor cab, or any other vehicle whatsoever for the purpose of carrying passengers for hire or fee within the park, or ply for hire within the park, without first obtaining the consent of the said Trust.

18. No person shall ride or drive on any portion of the park except on the roads or tracks and on the reserves set apart for such purpose. No person shall break in or exercise any horse within the park.

19. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or seats, or on any structure or erection within the park.

20. No person shall within the park, whether on his own behalf or for any other person, wager or bet, or offer to wager or bet, or promise to pay any wager or bet.

21. No person shall play any unlawful game within the park.

22. No person shall paint or otherwise display any advertisement upon any fence enclosing the park or on any structure, the property of the Trust, within or adjoining the park without permission therefor being first obtained from the Trust.

23. No person shall smoke tobacco or any like substance in any building within the park where by a notice or notices affixed or set up in some conspicuous position the Trust may prohibit smoking in such building.

24. No person shall enter into or upon plots of ground specially enclosed or set apart for plantations, and/or for other purposes in the park, and no assemblies for the purpose of public worship, preaching, or public speaking of any kind or meetings of a like character shall take place in the park without the permission in writing of the Trust first obtained.

25. No person shall play football, cricket or other games of sport without the consent of the Trust. No person shall use any part of the park other than that specially set apart for the playing of such games or sports.

26. No booth, tent, or other structure shall be erected within the park without the consent of the Trust.

27. All stock found in the park, unless duly licensed by the said Trust, will be impounded; and all goats, pigs, and poultry found trespassing in the park may be destroyed, and the owner shall pay compensation for any damage done.

28. Vehicular traffic within the park shall be confined to the roads and on reserves appointed for the purpose.

29. (1) Any person by act or omission guilty of an offence against any of these By-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

(2) Any attempt to commit an offence against any of the provisions of these By-laws shall be an offence against these By-laws, punishable as if the offence had been committed.

(3) Whoever aids, abets, counsels, or procures, or by any act or omission is directly or indirectly concerned in the commission of any offence against these By-laws shall be deemed to have committed such offence and shall be punishable accordingly.

30. Children under the age of ten (10) not being under the control of some competent person may be removed from the park by or under the direction of some person appointed by the Trust.

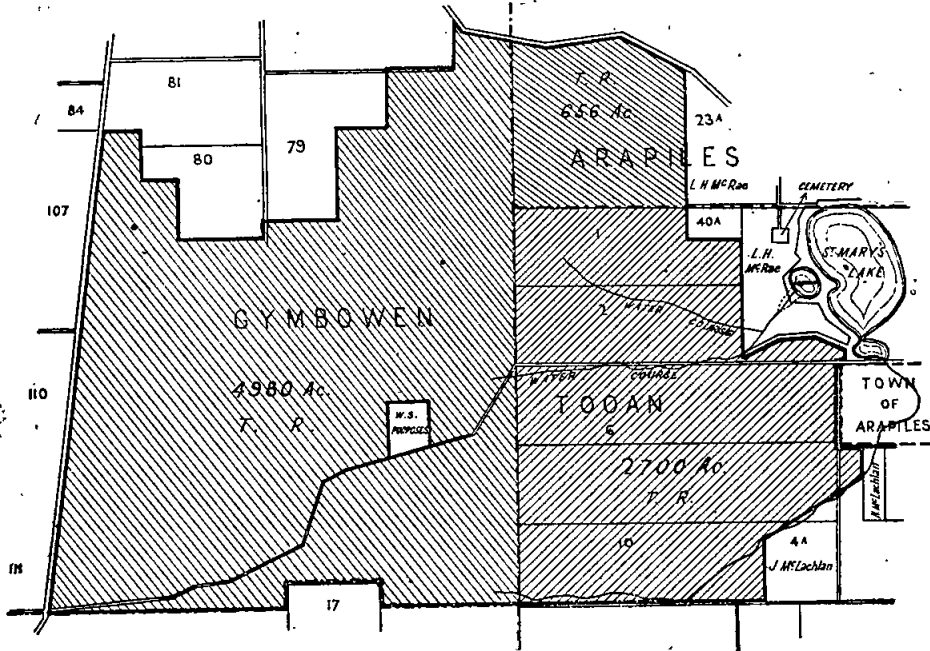

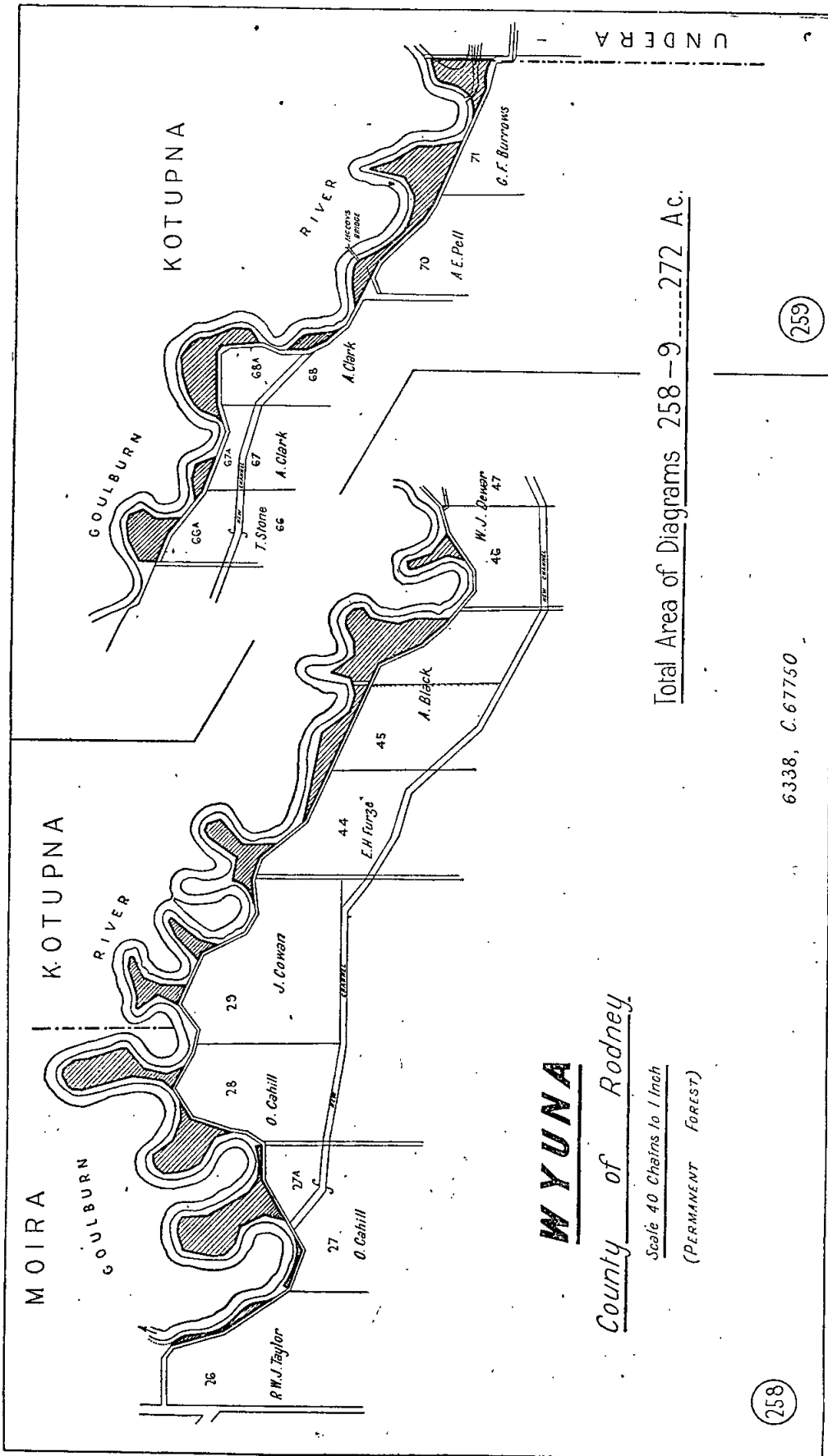

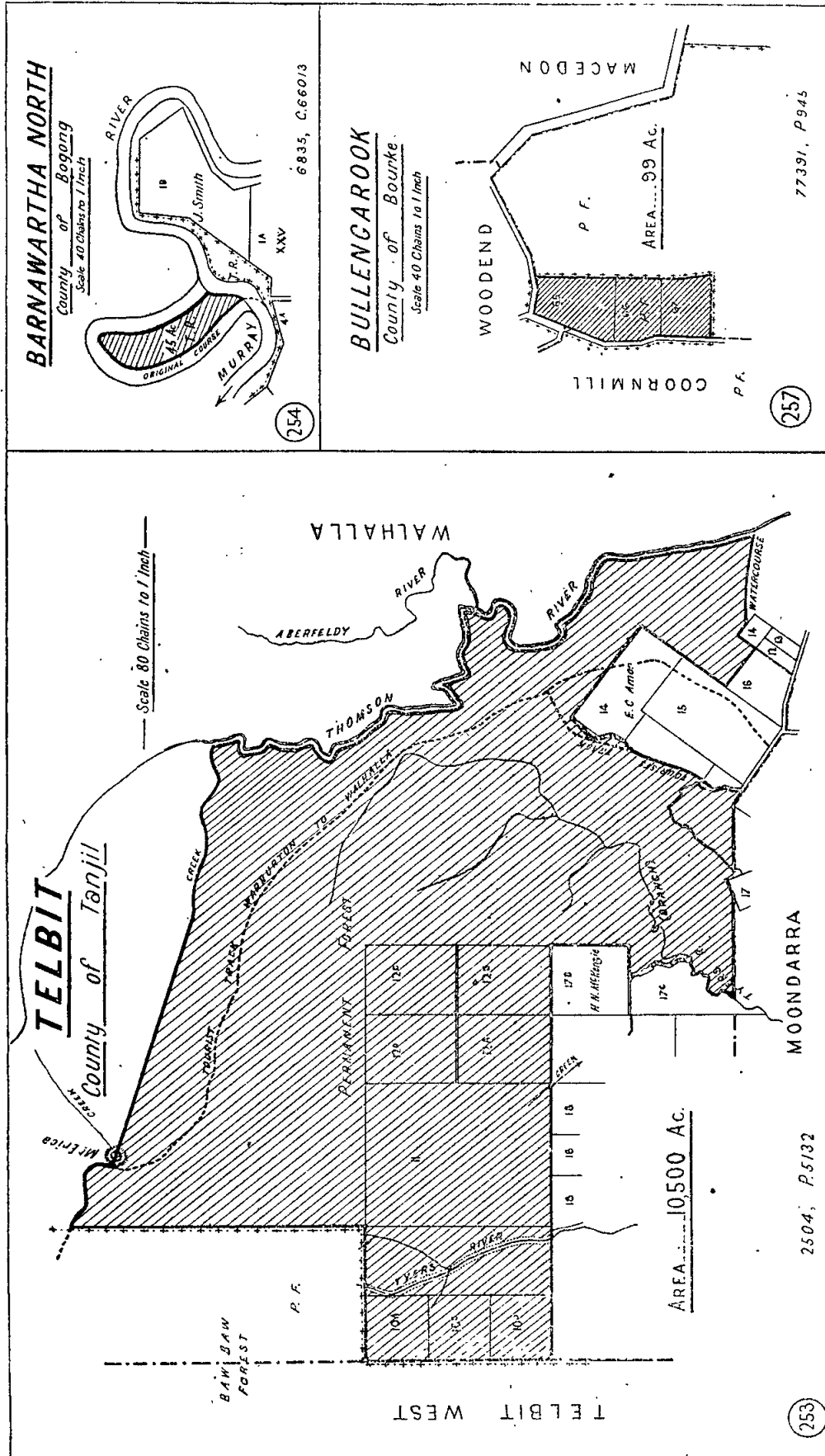

- (d) The forty junior technical scholarships under clause 17(a) above shall be divided proportionately between pupils of State schools grouped for the purpose of the competitive examination as may be determined from time to time by the Director and approved by the Minister;
- (e) The ten junior technical scholarships under clause 17(b) above will be awarded on the competitive examinations mentioned in sub-clauses (a), (b), and (c) of this clause in such proportions as the Director may, from time to time, determine. Candidates must state on their application forms in which course of study they wish to be examined;
- (f) Each candidate must forward with his application a certificate from his head teacher showing that he has, during the year of the competitive examination, followed the full course of study prescribed for Grade VII. or for the first year of the industrial course in district high schools, or for the first year of the course in junior technical schools.

Printed forms of tender, showing estimates of requirements and conditions of contract, may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge of police at any of the above-mentioned places, by whom also any information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per ton of 40 cubic feet for firewood, including delivery at the offices and all charges. Prices should only be quoted for requirements where estimates are shown above.

Tenders, which must be upon the printed form, will be received for either one or more of the above-mentioned places, and tenders for such places may be accepted or rejected separately; but if all lengths of firewood be included in one tender it may be accepted for one length only, if advisable.

Where the kind or kinds of wood is not mentioned in the tender form, tenderers must specify the kind or kinds of firewood they offer to supply.

Telegrams, or tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement, will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for £10, with two approved sureties, for the due performance of the contract, within ten days after the acceptance is notified.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Firewood at _____," as the case may be, and deposited in the Tender-Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by Gazette notices and by letter to accepted tenderers.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT

1. As the exact quantity of firewood which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same at contract rates.
2. All the firewood supplied under these contracts must be spilt out of large timber, and must be perfectly sound, dry, and of the kind or kinds specified in the tender; neither burnt wood, heartwood, small branches, nor outside pieces of bark will be received. The billets must be not less than 4 inches nor more than 6 inches in diameter. The long wood to be not less than 9 inches nor more than 18 inches in diameter. Delivery to be made on the written order of the chief officer of the Department requiring the supply. The ton of firewood consists of 40 cubic feet. If the firewood is obtained from a State forest timber reserve, or ordinary Crown lands, persons cutting or removing same must be provided with a licence or permit from the State Forests Department.
3. Orders will be issued half-yearly (except in cases where the storage is small, when they will be issued quarterly); but the contractor must have 24 hours' notice before purchases are made at his risk.
4. The contractor will be bound to place the firewood in stacks for measurement on such ground as may be pointed out. The stacks are to be 2 feet wide (or 4 feet 6 inches for long wood) by 5 feet high, with space between each stack for measuring; and the billets (or lengths) are all to lie the same way, viz., crossways of the stacks in the form of a cord, and are to be laid as closely and solidly as possible in the stack and to the satisfaction of the officer receiving the supply. In the event of any inconvenience being felt, either through delay in delivery or of stacking the wood, the Department concerned will purchase the same or re-stack that delivered, at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense incurred thereby will be deducted.
5. The officer receiving the supply shall have full power to reject any wood which he may consider not in accordance with the contract, notice of which will be given to the contractor in writing, stating the reason. The contractor may, however, claim a survey; but in that case he must, within 48 hours after objection is made, give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the wood.
6. The board of survey will be composed of persons appointed by the Honorable the Treasurer, and the decision of the board of survey is to be considered as final.
7. If the board of survey shall decide that the supply is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense, if any, will be charged as in clause 4.
8. Accounts for firewood to be rendered to the Department receiving the supply immediately upon completion of the order, which must be attached to the account. Payment will be made at the receipt and pay office of the district, or at the Treasury, Melbourne, as the contractor may desire.
9. In the event of any irregularity on the part of the contractor being repeated, it will be competent for the Government, in case such irregularity should be established to the satisfaction of the Tender Board, to cancel the contract forthwith.
10. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.
11. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract.
12. No subletting will be allowed; all work must be carried out by the contractor. Every person engaged in any business or occupation connected with the preparation of the firewood for sale or connected with the sale or distribution of the firewood tendered for in this schedule shall be paid such wages and employed subject to such conditions as are or may be determined by the Fuel and Fodder Board, or the Country Fuel and Fodder Board, as the case may be, under the Factories and Shops Acts; and a copy of these conditions shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted, in legible Roman characters, on the premises of the contractor. Any infringement of these conditions, in the opinion of the Treasurer, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from any accounts which are or may be due to the contractor, and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement and in all other respects.
13. CITY OF ST. KILDA.

By-law No. 93.

A By-law of the City of St. Kilda made and passed under the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and numbered 93, for further altering By-law No. 78 (Building By-law).

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of St. Kilda, with the approval of the Governor in Council, order as follows:—

1. This By-law shall come into operation on its confirmation by the Governor in Council and immediately after its publication in the *Victoria Government Gazette*.
2. Part II., Section 5 (Outbuildings), Clauses 16 and 17, as amended by By-law No. 85, shall be further amended to read as follows:—

(5) *Outbuildings*.

16. Workshops and outbuildings (except stables) of not more than one and a half squares in area, and not exceeding ten feet in height and not containing a fireplace may be erected on any boundary if the roof and walls thereof are covered with galvanized corrugated sheet iron or other approved fire-resisting material provided that such outbuildings are distant at least ten feet from any building used as a dwellinghouse on the same allotment or any allotment adjoining, save and except that such workshops and outbuildings may not be erected within a distance of eighty feet of the frontage to any road or street being a public highway.

17. Outbuildings comprised within the preceding clause exceeding one and a half squares in area, including roofed structures or erections for storage of timber or other materials shall be subject to all the conditions and limitations in regard to wooden buildings.

3. Part IV. (Excavations, Foundations and Footings), Clause 4:—

In the second line the words "twenty-four" shall be substituted for the words "twenty-one."

4. Part VI. (Construction, Clause 7, Party Walls):—

The following words shall be added:—"Except that in the case of domestic buildings of one story only where not more than two buildings are erected under

one roof the Council may waive this provision where the party wall is carried up at least eight and a half inches in thickness to the underside of the roof covering and such roof covering of iron, slate or other material bedded in cement mortar to the satisfaction of the council provided the top of such party wall shall not be hidden from view until it has been approved by the City Surveyor."

5. Part VI. Clause 25 (Closets and Urinals):—
The following clause to be numbered 25a shall be inserted:—

"25a." No closet or urinal shall be erected within the external walls of any building unless surrounded by walls of nine inches in thickness save with the written permission of the Surveyor.

6. Part VII. (Ventilation, Lighting and Open Spaces), Clause 1:—

In the third line the word "bearer" shall be substituted for the word "joist."

7. Part VII. (Ventilation, Lighting and Open Spaces), Clause 2:—

In the fourth line the words "one hundred" shall be substituted for the word "eighty" to read as follows:—"in the proportion of one hundred square feet for every hundred square feet."

8. Schedule D (Scautlings) shall be further amended to read as follows:—

Schedule D.

Table showing minimum sizes, dimensions and spacing of all timbers used in the domestic class of buildings:—

Stumps—Redgum or jarrah, 4 inches x 4 inches, spaced not more than 4 feet apart, sunk not less than 18 inches below natural surface of ground.

Sole Plates—Redgum or jarrah, 12 inches x 6 inches x 1½ inches.

Bottom Plates and Bearers—4-in. x 3-in. hardwood or jarrah.

Floor Joists—4-in. x 2-in. hardwood, 18-in. centres, supported at least every 5 feet.

Vermin Plates—4-in. x 2-in. hardwood.

Studs—4-in. x 1½-in., 18-in. centres.

Angle Studs—4 inches x 4 inches.

Top Plates—(Wooden buildings), 4 inches x 2 inches.

(Brick buildings), 4 inches x 1½ inches.

Rafters—4-in. x 1½-in., 18-in. centres; or for iron roof, 3-ft. centres.

Purlins—3-in. x 1½-in., 30-in. centres for iron roof.

Ceiling Joists—4-in. x 1½-in., 18-in. centres.

Ceiling Hangers—9-in. x 1½-in. not more than 7 feet apart.

Collar Ties—4-in. x 1½-in.

Ridge—8-in. x 1½-in.

Hips and Valleys—9-in. x 1½-in.

Fascia—¾-in. in thickness.

Flooring Boards—¾-in. T. and G. (flooring boards not to be greater than 6 inches in width).

Weatherboards—1½-in. lap, but where rebated the lap may be ¾ inch.

Washhouses, water-closets, and woodsheds not under main roof—Framing to be not less than 3 inches x 2 inches.

CITY OF ST. KILDA.

BY-LAW No. 95.

A By-law of the City of St. Kilda made and passed under the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and numbered 95, for further altering By-law No. 78 (Building By-law).

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of St. Kilda, with the approval of the Governor in Council, order as follows:—

1. This By-law shall come into operation on its confirmation by the Governor in Council and immediately after its publication in the *Victoria Government Gazette*.

No. 148.—AUGUST 29, 1917.—11196.—4.

2. Immediately preceding Part II (Definitions) shall be inserted Part I (a), Minimum Area and Width of Frontage for Dwellings:—

(1) The minimum area of land upon which any dwellinghouse other than a semi-detached house, hereinafter provided for, may be erected shall be 5,000 sq. feet, and the minimum frontage of such area shall be 35 feet or such other frontage as the council may, by resolution, from time to time determine.

(2) Not more than two houses shall be attached together. The minimum area of land upon which such attached houses may be erected shall be 7,000 sq. feet, and the minimum frontage of such area shall be 55 feet, or such other frontage as the council may, by resolution, from time to time determine.

3. This By-law, numbered 95, shall not apply to any allotment of land owned at the time of the passing of this By-law, separately from any adjoining land, and having less than 35 feet frontage.

Resolution for passing this By-law agreed to by the council at its meeting on the 5th day of June, 1917, and confirmed the 2nd day of July, 1917.

SHIRE OF BET BET.

BY-LAW No. 7.

A By-law of the Shire of Bet Bet, made under sub-section 29 of section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, for prohibiting or regulating the use on any public highway of traction engines or other vehicles having projections on their wheels, and under section 594 of the said Act for regulating the conditions under which traction engines may proceed over any public highway.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Bet Bet order as follows:—

1. *Bars, Spikes, Grips, or other Projections on Wheels.*
—No person shall use or cause or procure any other person to use on any public highway any traction engine or other vehicle having on its wheels any bars, spikes, grips, or other projections.

This prohibition, however, shall not apply to—

- (a) Any traction engine used only for hauling agricultural machinery, or hauling a vehicle containing such machinery only, if the projections on the driving wheels of such engine consist only of bars at least two and three-quarter inches in width and not more than one and one-sixteenth of an inch in thickness, and the space intervening between such bars does not exceed five inches; or

- (b) Any traction engine the driving wheels of which are cylindrical and smooth-soled and having no projections thereon other than diagonal bars of not less than three inches in width, nor more than three-quarters of an inch in thickness and extending the full width of the tyre, and the space intervening between such cross-bars not exceeding three inches, provided in such last-mentioned case—

I. That the owner of such engine has previously obtained from the Council or an officer of the Council duly authorized in that behalf a permit in writing specifying the public highways on which it may be used, and that the engine is being used on one of the highways so specified.

II. That the owner has agreed in writing to pay to the Council the cost of making good any damage done to any roadway, bridge, or culvert by such engine or any vehicle drawn by it.

III. That such engine is not being used (unless with the written consent of the Council or an officer of the Council duly authorized in that behalf) to haul more than two vehicles exclusive of any vehicle solely used for carrying water for such engine.

IV. That the loading of any vehicle drawn by such engine does not exceed nine tons in weight, including the weight of such vehicle.

- V. That the weight carried by any vehicle drawn by such engine (including the weight of such vehicle) does not exceed three hundred-weight for each half-inch of bearing surface of the tyre or felloe of each wheel of such vehicle.

2. *Weight of Engine to be Painted Thereon.*—Every owner of a traction engine shall cause to be painted in legible letters not less than one inch long, on a plate attached to the engine, or on a conspicuous place on the engine, the exact and true weight thereof and the maximum weight of water and fuel necessary for its propulsion.

3. *Person to be in Attendance whilst Engine contains in itself Sufficient Motive Power to Move it.*—So long as the fires of a traction engine are alight, or the traction engine contains in itself sufficient motive power to move it, one person shall remain in attendance whilst it is on any public highway, although it is stationary.

4. *Taking Engine across or along Bridges, Embankments, &c.*—No person shall take any traction engine across or along any bridge, culvert, or embankment so as to meet or pass thereon any other traction engine, or any person with a horse, or a vehicle drawn by a horse.

5. *Engine not to Halt in Certain Parts of Highway.*—No person shall halt (unless through unforeseen circumstances or unless actually engaged in loading or unloading) in any part of a road where the traffic way is narrowed by fences, excavations, embankments, dangerous depressions, or such like, but shall draw off at least twenty feet from the middle of the formation in the case of a made road, or the middle of the surveyed road if unmade.

6. *Engines not to Halt on Bridges or Culverts.*—No person shall permit any traction engine or any vehicle attached to or drawn thereby to stop on any bridge or culvert for the purpose of drawing water, or for any other purpose whatever.

7. *Driving Engines between Sunset and Sunrise.*—No person shall drive any traction engine between sunset and sunrise, unless by written permission of the Council or an officer of the Council duly authorized in that behalf defining the route to be travelled and the extended hours during which such travelling is permissible, such permission to be withdrawable at any time upon written notice to that effect being served on the owner or driver of the engine, or being forwarded to him by registered letter. No person who has received such written permission shall drive any traction engine between sunset and sunrise unless there shall be exhibited on such engine proper and sufficient carriage or other approved lights, one on each side on the front and one in the rear, or when a vehicle or vehicles are being drawn by such engine, then in the rear of the last vehicle.

8. *Wooden Planks to be Carried on Engine, &c.*—No person shall use or cause or procure to be used on any public highway any traction engine unless there is carried on such engine or some vehicle drawn by the same, at least four wooden planks twelve inches in width, four inches in thickness, and at least twelve feet in length, and when crossing any bridge or culvert the driver or the person in charge of such engine shall lay down such planks, and no engine shall be permitted to cross over any bridge or culvert except on such planks.

9. *Skidding of Wheels of Engine.*—The driver of a traction engine shall shut off steam immediately the driving wheels of the engine commence to skid, and he shall not start the engine again until he has taken all necessary and proper means to prevent damage being done to the highway by the skidding of the wheels.

10. *Penalties.*—Any person shall for any wilful act or default contrary to this By-law be liable to the following penalty:—

- (a) For the first offence, a fine not exceeding Three pounds;
- (b) For the second offence, a fine not exceeding Five pounds;
- (c) For any subsequent offence, a fine not exceeding Ten pounds.

11. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the shire of Bet Bet.

SHIRE OF HEIDELBERG.

BY-LAW No. 62.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Council of the Shire of Heidelberg did, at a meeting of the said Council held on the 19th day of June, 1917, pass a resolution agreeing to the adoption of By-law No. 62, for—

1. (a) Regulating and restraining the erection and construction of buildings, erections or hoardings;
- (b) Requiring the pulling down and removal of buildings, erections or hoardings;
- (c) Authorizing the Council to pull down and remove buildings, erections or hoardings erected or constructed contrary to this By-law, or not pulled down or removed as required by or under this By-law, and to sell the materials and apply the proceeds in re-imbursing the expenses of pulling down and removing such buildings, erections or hoardings, and in paying into the municipal fund any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof;
- (d) Appointing fees which may be charged and received by the Council for any act done, or to be done, by any of the officers under such By-law, and for any permit or licence to be issued by the Council;
- (e) Prescribing the minimum area and the minimum depth and width of frontage of land upon which any dwelling house may thereafter be erected;
- (f) Providing that every dwelling house thereafter erected shall have attached thereto, for the exclusive use of the occupiers thereof, a prescribed area of open land;
- (g) Providing, with respect to buildings thereafter erected for:—
 - (i) Regulating or limiting the height of buildings;
 - (ii) Means of escape from buildings in case of fire, and the prevention of fire in buildings;
 - (iii) The ventilation and lighting of buildings;
 - (iv) Exits from and stairways in buildings other than private dwelling houses; and
 - (v) The minimum size of any dwelling rooms or shops for foodstuff;
- (h) Requiring any work or thing to be executed or done of such materials, within such time, or in such manner as may be directed or approved in any particular case by the Council or any officer or person authorized in that behalf by the Council; and
- (i) Leaving any matter or thing to be from time to time determined, applied, dispensed with, or regulated by the Council by resolution, or by any officer authorized in that behalf by the Council, either generally or for any class of cases, or in any particular case.

2. Repealing By-laws Nos. 30, 40, 42 and 59.

And that, at a subsequent meeting, held on the 17th day of July, 1917, the said resolution was confirmed. Further, that the said By-law was duly approved by the Governor in Council on the 31st day of July, 1917.

The said By-law is open for inspection free of charge during office hours at the office of the Council.

6d. Notwithstanding anything contained in any By-law the sum of money received for the endowment of any bed shall be paid into the Endowment Fund under such distinctive sub-heading as the Committee thinks fit and shall be invested and dealt with as part of the Endowment Fund, and the income arising from such investments shall be paid into the Maintenance Fund. 5693
