SHIRE OF LOWAN.

BY-LAW No. 19.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health
Act 1915* and of any other power thereunto enabling
them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Lowan,
in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors,
and Ratepayers of the said shire, for the purpose of
carrying the said Act into execution within their juris-
diction, make the following By-law, that is to say:—

1. All former By-laws so far as they relate to the
matters and things provided for in this By-law are
hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall come into full force and opera-
tion on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health
and immediately after its publication in the *Govern-
ment Gazette*.

3. Every occupier of premises within the township of
Nhill in the shire of Lowan shall provide or cause to
be provided and kept therein a ratproof waterproof and
flyproof receptacle made of some non-absorbent material
with a proper movable cover; the contents of such
receptacle shall be not less than 5 nor more than 12
imperial gallons.

4. Every such occupier shall—

- (a) cause all refuse or garbage receptacles in use
on his premises and the covers thereof to be
kept as clean as possible;
- (b) cause such receptacles to be sufficiently dis-
infected with some efficient disinfectant and
deodorant whenever necessary;
- (c) cause such receptacles to be maintained in good
order and condition;
- (d) cause all refuse and garbage arising from or
upon such premises from time to time to be
deposited in such receptacles;
- (e) cause such receptacles to be continuously
covered save when refuse or garbage is being
deposited therein or discharged therefrom;
and
- (f) cause such receptacles to be placed in the yard
of such premises close to the entrance from
the street, lane or right-of-way on which such
premises abut once a week on such day in
each week as may from time to time be
appointed by the Council for the removal of
refuse or garbage.

5. No person shall place or cause to be placed any
receptacle in or upon any street, lane or right-of-way.

6. No person shall place or cause to be placed or
deposited any refuse garbage or garden refuse in or
upon any street, lane or right-of-way.

7. This By-law shall apply to and have operation
throughout the whole of the township of Nhill.

8. Every person who shall by any act or default be
guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of this
By-law shall be liable to a penalty, not exceeding £5
and not less than Five shillings for every such breach,
and if any breach be a continuing act or default to a
penalty not exceeding Two pounds nor less than Five
shillings for each and every day during which such
breach shall be committed or continued.

TALBOT WATER SUPPLY RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1917.

THE President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Talbot, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act* 1915, do hereby make the following By-law for the purpose of levying a water rate for the year 1917 upon all lands and tenements liable to be rated within that portion of the municipality of the Shire of Talbot which has been proclaimed a Water Supply District, also for the purpose of determining the charges to be made for the sale of water within such District.

The following are the rates which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1917 in respect of water supplied within the aforesaid District:—

1. For every house or tenement of Twenty pounds municipal value and under the sum of One pound (£1).
2. For every house or tenement of above Twenty pounds (£20) annual municipal value a rate of One shilling in the pound.
3. For every hotel a rate of Six pounds per cent. upon the value of such property.
4. Government departments railways and other properties supplied by meter a charge of Two shillings (2s.) per thousand (1,000) gallons shall be made.
5. Government offices supplied with water by special arrangement with the Council the following charges shall be made:—

Post office Two shillings per thousand (1,000) gallons, minimum 20,000 gallons per annum.
Police Station Two shillings per thousand (1,000) gallons, minimum 30,000 gallons per annum.
State School Two shillings per thousand (1,000) gallons, minimum 15,000 gallons per annum.

6. The charge to be made for loads of water from stand-pipes shall be One shilling for each load of 400 gallons or less.

7. For every water-trough connected with hotels Ten shillings (10s.) per annum, the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be 10,000 gallons.

8. For every factory mill tenement where steam machinery is attached and working the rate shall be Two shillings in the pound on the annual municipal value of each property or the water may be supplied and charged for by measure at Sixpence (6d.) per 10,000 gallons for each inch of the diameter of the engine cylinder.

9. For market gardens where water is supplied by meter the charge shall be Twopence (2d.) per 1,000 gallons; and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 210,000 gallons per acre and 105,000 gallons per half acre.

10. For water supplied to market gardens and orchards a charge of Twopence (2d.) per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 210,000 gallons per acre where supplied from open race.

11. For water supplied to syphon pumps a charge of Ten shillings (10s.) per annum shall be made.

12. For the water supplied to mining companies dredges &c., a charge of One penny per 1,000 gallons shall be made and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 120,000 gallons per week.

The before-mentioned rates shall be payable half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January, 1917, and the 1st day of July, 1917, and the charges for water shall be payable half-yearly, or as may be demanded.

Such person or persons as may from time to time be appointed for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

SUNBURY WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1917.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Sunbury Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1915*, make the following By-law:—

By-law for the making of a rate for the year 1917 on all rateable property within the Waterworks District of Sunbury Waterworks Trust, also dealing with the sale of water by measure from the works of the Trust:—

1. A rate of One shilling and ninepence in the £1 sterling shall be paid on the annual value of all rateable property fronting streets on which a main pipe has been laid, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the Shire of Bulla, the minimum amount to be paid in respect of any tenement to be not less than Twenty-five shillings.

2. For all unoccupied allotments facing the mains a minimum sum of Ten shillings shall be paid.

3. For water supplied by measure for domestic and other than domestic purposes, a charge of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons shall be paid, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which would be equal to the assessed rate payable for the premises so supplied, and where water is used for other than domestic purposes solely, the charge shall be One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 30,000, and shall be paid for in advance, or as the Trust may deem necessary.

4. For any public water-trough supplied by the Trust the sum of Thirty shillings per annum shall be charged, unless supplied by meter.

5. For water supplied from the stand-pipe or hydrant, for each load of 200 gallons or under, the sum of One shilling, and for each load in excess of 200 gallons, *pro rata* on the above scale.

6. The foregoing rates are hereby made payable, in advance, on the 30th April, 1917, and such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and recover the said rates.

PUBLIC PARKS, GARDENS, AND OTHER RESERVES.

Regulations in connexion with the Vote of Five thousand five hundred pounds (£5,500) for fencing and improving public parks, gardens, and other reserves under the control of borough councils, trustees, committees of management, &c.

A SUM of Four thousand pounds (£4,000) shall be distributed in such manner and on such terms and conditions as the Minister of Lands shall approve, and the remainder (£1,500) shall be dealt with as follows:—

1. A sum not exceeding Five shillings (5s.) may be paid to the treasurer of the managing body of any public park, garden, or other reserve, having a claim on the vote for every One pound (£1) expended by such body on fencing, preparation of land, and planting, forming of roads and paths, and such other works as the Minister of Lands may approve, in such park, garden, or other reserve, between 1st January, 1916, and 31st December, 1916, out of the funds locally contributed, provided such claim be received by the Secretary for Lands on or before the 1st day of May, 1917. Every statement of particulars of claim on the vote must be made on Form A, and be accompanied by a declaration in the Form B.
2. The term "locally contributed" shall mean and include all moneys voted by the managing body of any public park, garden, or other reserve from its own funds for the fencing and planting of such park, garden, or other reserve, also all moneys voluntarily contributed for the same purpose, between the 1st January, 1916, and 31st December, 1916; but it shall not mean or include any sums advanced by any bank, nor any subsidy paid by Government between the above-mentioned dates, nor the balance of any subsidy paid by the Government at any period prior to the 1st January, 1916.
3. The subsidy or the balance thereof last paid to the managing body of any public park, garden, or other reserve shall be deducted from the return of expenditure for the year 1916 (*vide* Form A), and a sum equal to one-fourth of the balance then remaining, if made of local contributions as above interpreted, shall be paid as subsidy; provided that if the claims are in excess of the sum of One thousand five hundred pounds (£1,500) they shall be reduced *pro rata*.
4. In every case in which a claim is sent in, an officer of the Department may be instructed to make an inspection of the books kept by the managing body, and of the vouchers for the several items of expenditure; and if such inspection be refused the claim shall be disallowed.

5. The foregoing shall not apply to parks, gardens, and other reserves within the limits of the city of Melbourne (except the Royal Park), or to the Edinburgh Gardens, Fitzroy, or to the Darling Gardens, Collingwood, or to Albert Park, South Melbourne, and St. Kilda, or to the Richmond Park and Barkly Gardens, Richmond, or to the Botanical Gardens, Geelong.




