BY-LAW No. 15.

By-law of the Shire of Mortlake made under section 314 of the Health Act 1915, and numbered fifteen, providing for the disposal and removal of refuse from pre-

I N pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Act 1915, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Mortlake do hereby order as follows:—

- (1) Every occupier of premises situated within the boundaries of the township of Mortlake shall cause to be provided and kept therein a covered non-absorbent receptacle of such size and in such form as may be approved of from time to time by the Council of the said Shire or its inspector.
- (2) Every such occupier shall cause all refuse garbage and rubbish from the houses and yards of such premises to be forthwith and without delay placed in such receptacle which receptacle shall be constantly kept covered and shall at all times be kept in an inoffensive condition and as clean and free from odour as far as practicable and shall from time to time be sufficiently disinfected by placing therein a sufficient quantity of some efficient decorant.
- (3) Every such occupier shall cause such receptacle to be placed within ten feet at least inside the gateway or doorway of his premises on the days from time to time appointed by the Council for removing and emptying the same as next hereinafter provided.
- (4) At least once a week or so much more frequently as the Council may from time to time direct the contents of the said receptacle shall be removed by the scavenger or employee of the Council and shall be rendered inoffensive and the said receptacle shall then be replaced by such scavenger or employee.
- (5) If any such occupier or other person shall be guilty of any breach of this By-law he shall be liable to a penalty of not less than One pound nor more than Five pounds.

This By-law shall apply to and have operation within the boundaries of the township of Mortlake.

- 2. All previous by-laws relating to and requiring the registration of persons carrying on the trade of cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, are hereby repealed.
- 3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the Shire of Newham and Woodend.
- 4. Every person carrying on the trade of cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, shall hereafter, on or before the first day of February in each year, register himself with the Council in the manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the secretary of the shire an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall with every such application pay a fee of the following amount, namely, if the persons to be registered keep cows and the number of such cows is ber of such cows is-
  - 1. Not more than five, a fee of Two shillings and
- 2. More than five, a fee of Sixpence for each cow. If the person registered does not keep cows, a fee of Ten shillings.

EGULATIONS approved by the Governor in Council, Sth November, 1910, are hereby rescinded, and the following Regulations are substituted therefor:—

- 1. Examination of candidates for certificates as surveyors will be held in Melbourne in the months of March and September of each year, and at such other times as may be deemed advisable.
  - 2. A candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board-
  - (a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examina-tion, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for the examination, due notice of which will be given in the Government Gazette.
  - (b) An examination fee of £2 2s., which must be paid on or before the date of examination.

#### PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no certificate will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of 21 years.

4. A candidate shall produce satisfactory evidence as to

- 4. A candidate shall produce satisfactory evidence as to character.
  5. (a) A candidate shall have served under articles, or other similar agreement, with some qualified surveyor or surveyors, for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field; and shall produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

  Note.—Applies only to candidates whose articles or other similar agreements were entered into prior to 1st March, 1910.
  (b) Or he shall have passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Roard, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed under articles or other similar agreement with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.
  (c) Or shall have passed the examination for the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, and have been professionally employed under articles or other similar agreement in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

  (d) Or shall have passed the examination for the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at the Melbourne University on examination in which a representative of the Surveyors Board acted as co-examiner, and shall have been at some time professionally employed in the field for a period of eighteen months on work satisfactory to the Board.

Candidates producing satisfactory evidence of having passed the matriculation or senior examination at a University, or of having completed a course of the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, may be exempted from working out papers in elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algebra, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers. Articles of indenture or other similar agreement for the tuition of surveying by a qualified surveyor shall be forwarded to the secretary for registration within three months of the date of commencement of service thereunder. Applications for registration shall be accompanied by evidence of the pupil having passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto. The fee for each registration shall be Five shillings. Transfers of articles or agreements shall be registered within three months of such transfers.

16. On and after March, 1913 (except as hereinafter provided), no candidate shall be eligible for examination unless he shall have passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause; provided that, subject to his passing a special examination prescribed by the Board which shall include English, arithmetic, geometry, and algebra, a candidate who has not passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause may be admitted to examination if—

- (a) He failed at an examination held prior to March, 1913;
- (b) He produces certificates of six years' satisfactory field service.

LICENCES TO SURVEY.

17. The Board may issue a licence to any person to whom it has issued a certificate of competency, or who holds a certificate of competency issued by any reciprocating Board of Examiners for land surveyors in Australasia subsequent to lat January, 1896, and who is still entitled to practise as a land surveyor in the State or Colony where he obtained his certificate, or to any surveyor holding a certificate of competency issued by the Department of Land and Survey prior to lat January, 1896, or who holds a licence to practise as surveyor under the Transfer of Land Act issued by the Surveyor-General prior to lat January, 1896. Each application shall be accompanied by the fee (£1 ls.), the declaration as prescribed by the Land Surveyors Act 1895, and satisfactory evidence as to character.

THE GEELONG WATERWORKS AND SEWERAGE TRUST.

#### BY-LAW NO. 40.

A By-law for the making and levying of rates for the year commencing the 1st day of July, 1917.

THE Geelong Waterworks and Sewerage Trust (hereinafter called the "Trust"), in pursuance of and

such Trust by the Water Acts and of any other powers
and authorities in anywise enabling the said Trust in

- 1. The following rates are hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the said area, and suplied with water for domestic purposes other than by measure:
  - (1) On any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) the annual valuation whereof does not exceed £16—Twenty shillings per annum.
  - (2) On any such tenement the annual valuation whereof exceeds £16—Six pounds five shillings per centum on the amount of the annual valuation.
    - (3) On lands on which there is no building—Six pounds five shillings per centum on the amount of the annual valuation.

2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the 1st day of July, 1917, and ending with the 30th day of June, 1918, and shall be payable in two equal instalments, on the 15th day of September, 1917, and the 1st day of January, 1918.

3. Such persons as the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates.

4. For making and levying such rates within the said area, the valuation for the time being for all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal districts of which such lands and tenein the municipal districts of which such lands and tenements are situate shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for all the purposes for such rate be determined by a police magistrate.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR A CRICKET GROUND AND RECREATION IN THE TOWNSHIP OF SALE

E, William Manston Futcher, Langton Ffolliott Crofton Staveley, William Arthur McLachlan, Leslie Cyril Treloar, and Thomas Victor Trood, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Cricket Ground and Recreation Reserve, in the township of Sale, having framed the following regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and deceney therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the Land Act 1915:—

#### REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding thirty in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sun not exceeding Two shillings may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who was offend accipated deceaved.

may offend against decency as regards dress, language,

or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted

therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve; nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish; nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. No person shall Bring into the Reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

7. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any dwelling, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained ment first obtained

8. No person shall perform in any band of music, or take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

9. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.

No person shall publicly bet or carry on the trade outsiness or calling of a bookmaker except in or on such portions of the Reserve as may be set apart for that purpose and then only when he shall have complied with the following condition, namely, that during the time he shall be in or upon the reserve betting or carrying on his trade business or calling of a bookmaker he shall wear a ticket to be supplied by the Committee of Management of the Reserve or those authorized by such Committee which ticket shall be visible to the public and shall have his name thereon.

11. No person shall play, practice, or engage in any

ment of the Reserve or those authorized by such Committee which ticket shall be visible to the public and shall have his name thereon.

11. No person shall play, practice, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays.

12. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of moneys deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

Provided that as to poultry yards already in existence this clause shall not operate until the expiration of six months from the date of the confirmation of this By-law.
- 2. No person shall keep more than 50 fowls (exclusive of chickens) or more than 10 ducks or more than 10 geese on or in any land or place. Provided that the Council may from time to time for such period of time as it may think fit consent in writing to the keeping of more than 50 fowls (exclusive of chickens) or more than 10 ducks or more than 10 geese on or in any land or place in any case where in the opinion of the Council such keeping shall not be likely to be a nuisance or offensive or injurious to health.
- 3. No person shall allow any fowls ducks or geese to wander in any street road or public place.
- 4. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

3. The owner of any land upon which has been deposited any refuse or rubbish shall, after 48 hours' notice, given in writing by the Town Inspector or other officer of the Council appointed in that behalf as aforesaid, forthwith clear away and remove the refuse or rubbish so deposited.

4. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

5. Any person who shall be guilty of any wilful breach of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for such offence to a penalty not exceeding £5 and not less than 5s.

THE President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Colae, by virtue of the provisions of the Local Government Act 1915, hereby make the following By-law, being By-law No. 76 of the said shire:—

By-law, being By-law No. 76 of the said shire:—

1. This By-law may be cited as a By-law for regulating and restraining the erection and construction of buildings, crections, or hoardings, for prescribing the minimum area and the minimum depth and width of frontage of land upon which any dwelling house may be creeted, and for conferring other powers in connexion with the foregoing.

2. This By-law shall come into operation on the day after its publication in the Government Gazette.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation within the township of Colac.

- 4. No person shall erect, build, or construct, or make any alteration or addition to, or cause to be erected, built, or constructed, or made any alteration or addition to any building or erection contrary to the provisions of this By-law.
- 5. No person shall erect, build, or construct, or make any alteration or addition to, or cause to be creeted, built, constructed, or made, any alteration or addition to any building or creetion without first submitting to the Council a written statement of such intention, specifying the nature of the work to be done, accompanied by a block plan, drawn to scale showing the boundaries and dimensions of the land with the position of the building thereon, such plan and particulars to be retained by the Council.
- 6. No building with walls of wood or any similar inflammable material or of galvanized iron shall be constructed at a less distance from the street frontage than 30 feet on any allotment—
  - (a) Fronting Murray-street, between Queen and
  - Corangamite streets.

    (b) Fronting Manners-Sutton-street, between Corangamite and Hart and Grant streets respectively.
  - (c) Fronting Gellibrand-street, between Murray and Rae streets.
- Rae streets.

  7. From and after the coming into force of this Bylaw, no building which is intended to be used or which shall be used as a dwelling house shall be built or creeted on any allotment of land unless the same has a frontage to a street or road of not less than 55 feet with a superficial area of not less than 6,000 feet, and in no case shall the depth of such allotment be less than 100 feet. Provided that in any case where land has been subdivided into allotments prior to this By-law coming into force and there remains between two building allotments belonging to other owners, or between an allotment already built on and any adjoining allotment belonging to another owner, or between any building allotment and the corner of a street or road in existence at the time this By-law came into force, an allotment of land which does not comply with the foregoing provisions, the Council may, on application being made in writing by the owner, exempt such allotment from the provisions of this clause of the By-law.

  8. (a) No building which is intended to be used or
- 8. (a) No building which is intended to be used or which shall be used as a dwelling house, and no addition to any building, shall be built, constructed, or erected within a distance of 15 feet, measured horizontally, from the building line of the street or road the building is intended to or shall front, or nearer than 20 feet to the back boundary line of the allotment.
- (b) No building which is intended to be used or which shall be used as a dwelling house, and no addition to any building which is intended to be used or which shall be used as a dwelling house, shall be built, constructed, or erected within a distance of 6 feet (measured horizontally) of land (other than a street, road, or right-of-way at the side of a building allotment) not in the same occupation or possession or within 12 feet of another building or erection.
- 9. No land upon which any dwelling house has been erected shall, after the coming into force of this By-law, be reduced below the minimum area and frontage herein prescribed.
- 10. No stables, cow sheds, or other similar buildings shall be erected within 15 feet of any street without the consent, in writing, of the Council first obtained. No such building shall be erected except to the rear of any dwelling house on the same allotment.
- 11. No fowl house or building for the use of poultry, or dog kennels for more than one dog, shall be erected at a less distance than 25 feet from any building used as or intended for a dwelling. No building of the description referred to in this clause shall be crected except to the rear of any dwelling house on the same allotment.
- 12. No privy closet or urinal shall be erected at a less distance than 20 feet from the door or window of any dwelling house.
- 13. No building or erection, the outer walls or roof of which shall consist either wholly or partially of canvas, calico, or similar inflammable material, shall be constructed, erected, or placed in any position within the township of Colac, other than sleeping apartments for the use of the family, without the consent, in writing, of the Council having been first obtained.
- 14. No person shall construct, erect, or place any hoarding for advertisement or other purpose within 15 feet of any street or public highway without the consent, in writing, of the Council having been first obtained.

15. No person shall deposit any building materials on any roadway without the consent, in writing, of the Shire Engineer being first obtained.

16. It shall be lawful for the Council of the said Municipality to pull down and remove any buildings, erections, or hoardings erected, placed, or constructed contrary to the provisions of this By-law, and to sell the materials and apply the proceeds in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down and removing such buildings, erections, or hoardings and in paying into the Municipal Fund any penalties due by the owner thereof, the surplus (if any) arising from such sale to be payable to the owner or builder, or to such person legally entitled thereto on demand.

17. This By-law shall not apply to any fence, green-

17. This By-law shall not apply to any fence, green-house, fernery, aviary, or to outbuildings which are on an area of not less than 5 acres used for agricultural or

an area of not less than 5 acres used for agricultural or similar purposes only.

18. Any person who shall be guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty of not less than One pound and not exceeding Twenty pounds. And if such offence be a continuing one, to a further penalty not exceeding One pound per day for each day such offence is continued.

19. Any matter or thing arising under this By-law may be from time to time determined, applied, dispensed with, or regulated by the Council by resolution, either generally or for any class of cases or in any particular case.

5. All persons walking along the footways shall, in

5. All persons walking along the footways shall, in passing each other, keep on their respective right-hand side of the footway.

6. The driver of any vehicle shall give way, if he conveniently can, to any other vehicle during the taking up or setting down of any person into or from such other vehicle.

No procession of persons, or of vehicles, or both, for other than funeral purposes, shall parade or pass through any of the streets unless the previous consent, in writing, of the President of the Shire, or in his absence the Shire Secretary, and only by the route specified in such consent, nor unless and until the recipient of such consent shall have given, at least, twenty-four hours' notice, with particulars of such consent and route, to the officer in charge of the local police.

Any person guilty of any breach of the provisions of the foregoing By-law shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

2. No person shall erect, build, or construct, or cause, or permit to be erected, built, or constructed any building, or any addition to any building, contrary to the provisions of this By-law.

3. No person shall erect, build, or construct, or cause, or permit to be erected, built, or constructed, any building or erection without first obtaining written permission from the Council so to do, and without first submitting to the Council, its Secretary or Engineer, the plans and specifications of the proposed building or erection.

4. No person shall make any alteration or addition to any building or erection within the areas to which this By-law extends (except that of necessary repairs not affecting its construction, or any external or party walls) without first obtaining the written permission of the Council so to do

walls) without first obtaining the written permission of the Council so to do.

5. No person shall commence any building, or any alteration, or addition to any building without first having paid to the Council such fees as are provided therefor by this By-law.

6. No person shall build, or cause, or permit to be built any building, or any addition to any building which is intended to be used, or which shall, or may be used, as a dwelling house, within a distance of 15 feet from the building lines of the street or road the building is to front, and 5 feet from any street or road at the side of such building, and 5 feet from any other building not in building lines of the street or road the building is to front, and 5 feet from any street or road at the side of such building, and 5 feet from any other building not in the same occupation, and 5 feet from the land of any adjoining owner, or, where the land is the property of the same owner, 5 feet from the dividing fence line of the adjoining tenement, but this section of this By-law shall not prevent the crection (with the consent of the Council) of a shop, or a shop and dwelling house combined, abutting on the building line in any street within the areas to which this By-law extends.

7. No person shall 'erect, or cause, or permit to be erected any portico or verandah over the footway of any street within the areas to which this By-law extends without first obtaining the consent of the Council in writing, and such portice or verandah shall be of such shape, figure, and dimensions, and materials as the Council may approve, but the lowest part of such portico or verandah shall in no case be of less height than 8 feet above the level of the outer edge of the footway; no opening shall be made in the roof of any such portico or verandah for the purpose of affording light unless such opening be properly framed and glazed with rough rolled plate glass, protected underneath with fine mesh wire netting or armoured glass, to the satisfaction of the Engineer.

8. No person shall build, or cause, or permit to be

wire netting or armoured glass, to the satisfaction of the Engineer.

8. No person shall build, or cause, or permit to be built any building in any of the streets or roads, or parts of streets or roads, within the areas to which this By-law extends unless the said building shall cover an area of 600 superficial feet at least, exclusive of verandah and all detached outbuildings, or where two or more attached dwelling houses are erected, unless each dwelling house shall cover an area of 1,000 superficial feet at least, exclusive of verandah and all detached outbuildings outbuildings.

9. Two or more buildings or dwelling houses may be erected in one block of land belonging to the same owner, and shall then be separated from each other by a wall of brick or stone at least \$\frac{1}{2}\$ inches in thickness, and carried up to at least 1 foot above the roof covering or gutter adjoining the same, and projecting at least 1 inch beyond the face of the woodwork or spouting.

10. Every habitable room in every dwelling house hereafter built or rebuilt, except rooms wholly or partly in the roof, shall be in every part at least 10 ft. 6 in. in height from the floor to the ceiling, other than rooms under a skillion roof, which shall be at least 8 ft. 6 in in height from the floor to the ceiling.

11. Every habitable room in every dwelling house hereafter built or rebuilt wholly or partly in the roof shall be at least 9 feet in height from the floor to the ceiling throughout not less than one-half of the area of such room.

such room.

12. The interiors of the walls and ceilings of every building which is intended to be used, or shall, or may be used as a dwelling house, shall be finished in wood,

12. The interiors of the walls and ceilings of every building which is intended to be used, or shall, or may be used as a dwelling house, shall be finished in wood, lath and plaster, or approved fire-resisting material.

13. No person shall bring, or cause, or permit to be brought any building or erection, either in whole or in part, on to or upon any land within the areas to which this By-law extends either from outside such areas or from any other part of such areas unless such building or erection, when completed, shall comply with all the provisions of this By-law, and unless six (6) days' notice, in writing, of the intention so to bring, or cause to be brought, such building or erection, or part thereof, be first given to the Council, its Secretary, or Engineer.

14. If any building or erection, shall hereafter be partly or wholly erected, built, or constructed contrary to the provisions of this By-law the Council may give to the owner or builder, or leave upon the site of such building or erection, fourteen (14) days' notice, in writing, to bring such building or erection into conformity with the said provisions, or to pull down, or to remove such building or erection, and if default shall be made in complying with such notice, and notwithstanding the imposition or recovery of any penalty it shall be lawful for the said Council to enter upon such building or erection, and on the site thereof, with a sufficient number of workmen, and to pull down the said building or erection, or any part or parts thereof, and to do any other act that may be necessary for the purpose, and to remove the materials thereof to some convenient place; and if the Council in its discretion thinks fit to sell the same in such a manner as it thinks fit, and all expenses incurred by the Council in pulling down the said building or erection, or any part thereof, or of removing the materials thereof, and selling the same, and in doing such other acts as aforesaid, and all fees or penalties due by the owner or builder thereof may be ded

proving himself to be legally entitled thereto.

15. Fees payable under this By-law shall be as

(a) For the inspection or superintendence of all new buildings, or old buildings re-erected or reinstated after being partially destroyed, taken down, or demolished, or buildings removed into the areas to which this By-law extends, or from one part of such areas to another part thereof, the sum of One pound.

(b) For the inspection or superintendence of each alteration or addition to existing buildings, the sum of Ten shillings.

(c) For every permit to build, erect, or construct any portice or verandah, the sum of Ten shillings.

16. The following words or expressions wherever used in this By-law shall have the meanings hereby assigned to them respectively, so far as such meanings are not excluded by context, that is to say.—

Any person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20 for each such offence, and in the case of a continuance of such offence to a further penalty not exceeding £2 per day for each and every day such offence is continued after written notice of the offence from the Council but its Shire Segretary.

18. This By-law shall not apply to any fence, greenhouse, fernery, aviary, or to temporary offices and sheds used by builders during the construction of any building at or about the site of such building for a period not exceeding twelve months.
