DETERMINATION OF THE CYCLE TRADE BOARD.

Note.—This Determination on the 29th September, 1917, applied to the Metropolitan District; the Cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, and Geelong; the Towns of Ballarat East and Warrnambool; and the Boroughs of Maryborough, Eaglehawk, Geelong West, Newtown and Chilwell, and Sebastopol.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Special Board appointed "to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of a maker of bicycles, tricycles, or motor cycles, or of a maker of any part or parts (other than tires) of a bicycle, tricycle, or motor cycle," has made the following Determination, namely:—

⁽⁵⁾ Double time shall be the special rate for all work done on Sunday, Good Friday, New Year's Day, 21st April (Eight Hours Day). Christmas Day, and Boxing Day; and time and a half shall be the special rate for all work done on 26th January (Foundation Day), Easter Monday, and King's Birthday; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.

⁽⁶⁾ PIEGE-WORK.—The Board determines under the provisions of section 144 of the Factories and Shops Act 1915 that any 'employer may fix and pay piece-work prices to any person employed in the rim-making department, provided that such employer shall base such piece-work prices on the earnings of an average worker working under like conditions and that such piece-work prices shall be fixed so that an average worker can earn not less than the minimum wage fixed for the said department.

DETERMINATION OF THE SLATERS AND TILERS BOARD.

Note.—This Determination on the 28th September, 1917, applied to the Metropolitan District; the Cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, and Geelong; the Towns of Ballarat East and Warrnambool; and the Boroughs of Castlemaine, Eaglehawk, Geelong West, Newtown and Chilwell, and Sebastopol.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Special Board appointed to determine "the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons wheresoever employed in the process, trade, or business of a slater, roof-tiler, ridger, shingler, or cement tiler (other than a tiler laying verandah or flooring tiles)" has made the following Determination,

(1) That on the 28th September, 1917, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

(3) Time of Beginning and Ending Work-

5 p.m. on five days in the week.
12 noon on the other working day of the week on which the half holiday is locally observed.

(4) OVERTIME.—All work done outside the hours specified as the times of beginning and ending work, or for any work done within such hours in excess of 44 hours in any week, shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half.

(5) Special Rates.—Double time shall be the rate for all work done on Sunday, New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Eight Hours Day (21st April), Christmas Day, and Boxing Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.

(6) PIECE-WORK PRICES.—That the lowest piece-work prices payable to any person engaged in the following kinds of work shall

Two nails, 7s. 6d. per 100 square feet, slater's measurement. Slating, 20" x 10", and larger Ridging extra Ringing extra.
7s. 6d. per 100 square feet, tiler's measurement.
Ridging extra.
10s. per 100 square feet, slater's measurement.
6d. per 100 square feet extra for each story after the first.
On slate roofs, hipping, 3d. per foot.

7. crest, 4d.

On tile roofs hipping, 4d. Tiling .. Stripping and re-covering roofs For buildings of more than one story Fixing Tile Ridging On tile roofs, hipping, 4d. ,,, crest, 5d. ,,
On iron roofs, hipping 4d. ,,

Id. per foot extra for each story after the first. ,, For buildings of more than one story Mitring hips on slate roofs Nailed, 6d. per foot. Screwed, 8d. per foot.

(7) DEFINITION.—Slaters' or tilers' measurement is the net square measurement of the roof with 1 square foot extra for every lineal foot of eaves, hips, valleys, and gutters, and one square foot extra for every 3 lineal feet of gables.
