Rules Relating to the Qualification of Candidates to Practise as Barristers and Solicitors.

The twenty-fourth day of August, 1917.

IN pursuance of the authority in this behalf conferred man the Council of I 1. ferred upon the Council of Legal Education by the Legal Profession Practice Act 1915, such Council hereby makes the following rules, that is to say:—

- 1. The rules of the Council specified in the Schedule hereto are hereby repealed but such repeal shall not affect or abridge any right or privilege acquired there-
- 2. After the word "hereof" in paragraph (4) of Rule 5 of the Consoldiated Rules of the Council the word "or" shall be inserted; and to such rule the following paragraph shall be added, namely:
 - agraph shall be added, namely:—

 "(5) If he is a person who has served outside the Commonwealth in the Naval or Military Forces of the Crown during the present war and has within two years prior to such service passed the Junior Public Examination of that University or any examination recognised by the Faculty of Law of such University as equivalent thereto (and has not qualified under any of the preceding paragraphs) he must have obtained from the Faculty a certificate of fitness to be admitted to the examinations in the subjects specified in Rule 7 (a) of such consolidated rules."
- 3. After the word "Latin," in Rule 7, the following words shall be inserted, namely:--
 - "And a candidate who has obtained a certificate of fitness from the Faculty under Rule 5 (5)".
- 4. To the exceptions specified in Rule 9 of the Consolidated Rules the following further exception shall be added, namely:-
 - "(C) Where a candidate is a person who has served outside the Commonwealth in the Naval or Military Forces of the Crown in the present war and has passed any of the subjects of his course at a special examination of the University of Melbourne of candidates for degrees leaving Victoria with such Forces.

 5. For Rule 36 of the Consolidated Rules the following rule shall be substituted, namely:—

 "36. Any person dissatisfied with any decision of the Board shall be at liberty to appeal against such decision to the Judges of the Supreme Court and such appeal shall be heard by three or more of the Judges at such time as they shall appoint and upon the hearing thereof they may dismiss or allow such appeal or make such other order as to them may seem fit."

SHIRE OF EUROA. BY-LAW NO. 13.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the Health Act 1915, and of any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Euroa in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors. and Ratepayers of the said shire, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law, that is to say:—

- 1. All former By-laws so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law are here-
- by repealed.

 2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the Government
- 3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the Euroa Riding of the shire of Euroa.

• 4. The occupier of every house, building, or premises within the Euroa Riding, shall provide and keep thereon a covered receptacle or receptacles constructed of non-absorbent material, and shall cause all house refuse, rubbish, or garbage produced or accumulated in and about such house, building, or premises to he from time to time deposited in such receptacle or receptacles.

5. Every such receptacle shall be kept constantly covered (except when such refuse or garbage is being deposited therein or discharged therefrom) and a sufficient quantity of some efficient deadgrant shall be from time to time introduced therein when necessary to keep the same in an inoffensive condition.

6. Once a week on such day in each week as may be appointed by the Council for the removal of house refuse from such house, building, or premises from the street, lane, or right-of-way on which such house, building, or premises from the street, lane, or right-of-way on which such house, building, or premises from the street, lane, or right-of-way on which such house, building, or premises abut, in order that the contents of such receptacle or receptacles may be conveniently removed by the person or persons authorized in their behalf by the Council.

7. No person shall place or cause to be placed any such receptacle in or upon any street, lane, or right-of-way.

MALLEE LANDS AVAILABLE FOR APPLICATION AS SELECTION PURCHASE ALLOTMENTS.

THE land is situated from 7 to 9 miles north of Underbool Railway Station.

Applications (with uncancelled Victorian duty stamp of 5s., or postal note for same amount affixed) must be made on the usual form, and delivered or forwarded by post to any Local Land Office, or to the Secretary for Lands, Melbourne, on or before Saturday, 29th September, 1917.

The survey fee must be paid within 28 days of demand, and will be £9 per allotment.

The amount of loading (2s. 6d. per acre) is to be collected in instalments, therefore its cash value, about 1s. 11d. per acre only, will be the limit of expenditure for road and water improvements

The half-yearly payment on each allotment, set out in Schedule hereto, includes the amount of loading.

The lease will contain (inter olia) conditions to the effect as follows:—

That substantial and permanent improvements shall be made on the land—if in the first class, to the value of 3s. 4d. per acre before the end of the second year from the date of the lease, another 3s. 4d. per acre before the end of the third and fourth years, and the balance of 10s. per acre before the end of the sixth years of the lease.
