Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE WATERPROOF CLOTHING BOARD.

Note.—This Determination, on the 15th October, 1917, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts, the Cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, and Geelong; the Towns of Ballarat East and Warrnambool; and the Boroughs of Eaglehawk, Geelong West, Newtown and Chilwell, and Sebastopol.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of a maker of waterproof articles made of material containing rubber or of oiled cloth, such as coats, cloaks, jackets, capes, leggings, oilskin suits, sou'-westers, or rugs of every description, has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 15th day of October, 1917, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this

- (5) SPECIAL RATES.—Double time shall be the rate for all work done on Sunday, New Year's Day, Foundation Day (26th January), or Briday, Easter Monday, Eight Hours Day (21st April), Christmas Day, or Boxing Day, but if any other day be by Act of Parliament substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so
- (6) PIECE-WORK.—The Board determines under the provisions of Section 144 of the Factories and Shops Acts, that any employer may fix and pay piece-work prices to any person employed at any work for which the Board has fixed a minimum wage provided that any such employer shall base such piece-work prices on the earnings of an average worker working under like conditions, and such piece-work prices shall be fixed so that an average worker can earn not less than the wages rates that are fixed by the Board

Note.—Cotton and all other materials of which articles are composed must be supplied to the worker by the employer free of charge in order that piece-work prices or wages rates payable shall be net.
