- (c) Pay to the said apprentice (during such time as he/she shall observe and perform the terms of this indenture) wages at the rate following (that is to say):—

- (e) On completion of the term herein named hand over to the said apprentice a copy of this agreement with a certificate thereon to the effect that the said term has been served. Provided that this shall be conditional on the said apprentice serving the said term and observing and fulfilling the covenants herein.

And that the said _____ apprentice and parent or guardian covenant with the said employer that he/she the said apprentice during the said term (unless the employer shall remove his/her business to some place beyond the radius of three miles from his/her present place of business in which case the apprentice may if he/she so elect claim to have his/her indenture assigned to some other employer within the radius if any there be or if there be none such to be released from this agreement) will—

- (a) Well faithfully and honestly serve the said employer as an apprentice in his/her trade or business aforesaid
- (b) Willingly obey the lawful orders and commands of the said employer or of such of his/her representatives as he/she the said apprentice shall be placed under in the said business

- (c) Not do or commit nor suffer to be done or committed any waste damage or other injury to the property or goods of the said employer or any firm or company of which he/she may be a member or lend them to any person without the consent of the said employer
- (d) Not unlawfully absent himself/herself from the service of the said employer during business hours
- (e) Not by word or action induce other apprentices to disobedience nor to habitually neglect his/her duties or fail to perform the same.

And it is hereby specially agreed by all the parties to this indenture that in case any of the covenants hereof are broken by any party hereto the Secretary for Labour or any police magistrate of Victoria shall have power to cancel and make an end of this indenture of apprenticeship if he is satisfied that any covenant or covenants have been broken and that it is desirable to do so.

It is hereby further agreed—

- (1) That the said apprentice shall not be paid for any time he/she shall be absent from his/her said duties through his/her own wilful default and neglect or through illness or through absenting himself/herself from his/her said employer's service without leave.
- (2) That the said apprentice shall not be entitled to a higher rate of pay until he/she has actually worked for a period of twelve months at the next preceding rate.
- (3) That in computing the period of twelve months all time worked as overtime shall be allowed as a set off against any absence during the said period.

HEATHERTON SANATORIUM BOARD.

By-Laws.—PART I. (FOR THE REGULATION OF THE BOARD'S PROCEEDINGS).

STANDING ORDERS.

Order of Business.

THE order of business at all ordinary meetings of the Board shall be as follows:—

- (a) The confirmation of minutes of previous meetings, and no discussion shall be allowed thereon, except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings; and, when confirmed, such minutes shall be signed by the chairman of the meeting.
- (b) Consideration of received correspondence, and passing accounts.
- (c) The consideration and adoption of committee's and officers' reports upon their presentation duly numbered and signed by the chairman of the committee or the officer making such report.
- (d) Orders of the day, including all matters arising out of instructions or directions at former meetings of the Board, and the consideration of any business the chairman may deem it desirable to bring forward.
- (e) The consideration of motions, of which notice shall have been given in writing at a previous meeting of the Board, such notices to be taken in the order in which they were given.
- (f) The reception of notices of motion.
- (g) Any other business that, in the opinion of the chairman, may properly be brought before the Board.

Proceeding with Motions.

2. No motion of which notice has been given shall be proceeded with, but shall lapse, unless the member in whose name it stands, or some other member authorized by him in writing, be present to proceed with the same when called upon, or a motion for its postponement be carried.

Resolutions—How Rescinded.

3. No motion, the effect of which if carried would be to rescind any previous resolution of the Board, shall be entertained for three months from which such previous resolution was passed; and no motion for rescinding any resolution whatever of the Board shall, if lost, be again entertained during the same period.

By-laws.

4. No By-law shall be finally passed or adopted until at least the next ordinary committee meeting subsequent to that at which it was proposed.

Chairman to Decide Points of Order.

5. The presiding chairman's ruling or decision shall be final on all questions and points of order and practice, and he shall state or give his ruling or decision when called upon to do so, without comment or argument, unless he shall otherwise think fit. Any member, upon being requested so to do by the chairman, shall immediately resume his seat.

Motions and Amendments.

6. The mover of any motion or amendment, or when he desires to address the chairman, shall rise and address the chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall resume his seat until the member raising the point shall have been heard and the question of order disposed of by the chairman, whose decision shall be final; then he, the original speaker, shall proceed with the subject.

The mover of either an original motion or an amendment must state the nature of the same, and have it seconded before any discussion can be allowed thereon, and must hand in the same, in writing, to the secretary, who shall add thereto the name of the seconder, and afterwards the result thereof, i.e., "carried," "lost," or "lapsed," as the case may be, and shall carefully preserve such manuscript among the Board's papers; and no motion when seconded shall be withdrawn without the consent of the seconder and leave of the Board.

Seconding Motions.

7. Any member merely seconding a motion without remark shall not be deemed to have spoken to the motion.

Priority in Speaking.

8. If two or more members rise at the same time to speak, the chairman alone shall decide who is entitled to priority.

Speaking Twice on the Same Subject.

9. No member shall speak twice on the same question, except by way of explanation or in reply on any original motion or amendment of which he was the mover; and immediately after the reply the amendment or the original motion, as the case may be, shall be at once put to the vote.

Amendments—How Allowed.

10. One amendment only shall be discussed at one time; but, if lost, one other can be moved before the original motion is put to the vote. In the event, however, of an amendment being carried, the original motion shall be deemed to be rejected, and the amendment so carried shall take the place of such original motion, and on it one amendment can be moved, and no more.

Questions—How to be Put.

11. The chairman for the time being shall, in taking the determination of the Board, put the question, first in the affirmative, and then in the negative, and if a division be called for, shall take the votes by a show of hands.

Disorderly Conduct.

12. No member shall digress from the subject under discussion, introduce irrelevant matters, or impute motives, or make any personal reflections in regard to any other member, or be allowed to continue a statement relative to any previous action or words of another member, after the veracity of such statement shall have been denied by the member referred to.

Any member making use of an expression capable of being offensively applied to any other member shall, immediately upon being required by the chairman for the time being so to do, withdraw such expression, and make an apology satisfactory to the Board before he can be allowed to take further part in the proceedings.

Meetings of the Board.

13. The members of the Board shall meet at half-past Three p.m. on the second Friday in each month, at the Town Hall, Melbourne, and seven days' notice of each meeting shall be given by the secretary.

The members of the Board shall pay a visit of inspection to the institution once in every four weeks, or at such other time as the chairman shall direct.

PART II. (DEFINING THE DUTIES OF THE BOARD'S OFFICERS.)

Duties of the Secretary.

The secretary shall—

- (1) Have the superintendence and control of the sanatorium and grounds, and shall be responsible for the due and efficient performance of the duties allotted to the male staff.
- (2) Convene and attend the meetings of the Board, and act as secretary thereto, and furnish all information in his power on any subject under discussion, and be responsible for the correct record of all proceedings thereat.
- (3) Be the recognised official channel of communication between the Board and officials, nursing staff, and servants.
- (4) Keep all books and accounts in the manner and style prescribed by the Board, and be responsible for their safety and custody.
- (5) Conduct the correspondence and all other clerical business of the sanatorium, and shall file all letters received, and keep copies of all letters despatched on the business of the sanatorium.
- (6) Receive all moneys paid and enter in the cash book, and pay same into the Board's banking account.
- (7) Be supplied with sums not exceeding £10 at a time to meet petty expenses, and shall keep a petty cash book showing how and when such money has been disbursed.
- (8) Furnish reports in such form and at such periods as the Board may prescribe.
- (9) Order supplies of any kind as required, and see that all such supplies are of the quality and description ordered, and be responsible for the due issue thereof.
- (10) Carefully examine all tradesmen's bills, make up accounts, and initial them as correct, and present them to the Board.
- (11) See that all the property of the sanatorium is carefully kept, preserved, and economically used, and that all stores are issued under a proper system.
- (12) Promptly report to the Board any defect or deficiency in any of the buildings, drainage, water supply, furniture, &c.
- (13) After consultation with the matron, engage, suspend, and dismiss all nurses and servants, and shall report all engagements, suspensions, and dismissals at the next meeting of the Board thereafter.

- (14) Keep a "discipline book," wherein shall be recorded any gross misconduct of any servant of the sanatorium, or any infraction of any important regulation or rule, or any neglect of duty by any person whatsoever; and he shall lay the same on the table at each meeting of the Board, and shall call attention to all fresh entries therein.
- (15) Take steps to see that all rules affecting any person shall be brought under the notice of the person concerned.
- (16) Receive, take charge, and be responsible for any property taken from patients on admission, and shall enter an inventory in a book kept for that purpose.
- (17) Upon receiving notice that a patient is in a critical state, communicate with the friends in the speediest way possible, and, should a patient desire the presence of a spiritual adviser, steps shall be taken at once to comply with the patient's wishes.
- (18) Visit the wards and all other buildings as occasion may require, and at uncertain times, so as to insure complete supervision throughout the whole establishment.
- (19) Prepare annually a report on the work of the sanatorium up to and including 30th June.
- (20) Generally attend to all secretarial work.
- (21) Obtain a guarantee policy in some recognised society for the sum of £500.

Duties of the Medical Officer.

The medical officer shall—

- (1) Attend daily at an hour to be fixed by the Board, and whenever an emergency arises.
- (2) Give the matron such directions as he may consider necessary as regards treatment and dieting of patients and the keeping of clinical records.
- (3) Furnish such reports as may be required by the Board.
- (4) Cause all medicines required for patients to be properly dispensed.

Duties of the Matron.

The matron shall—

- (1) Reside at the sanatorium, and have full control over all the nursing and domestic staff, and be responsible for their efficiency.
- (2) Select persons to fill the positions of nurses and probationers, and shall submit their names to the secretary for approval by the Board.
- (3) Select persons to fill the positions of domestic servants, and submit their names to the secretary for approval.
- (4) Apportion the duties of nurses and probationers, and shall be responsible for the proper and efficient performance of such duties, and also the duties imposed by the medical officer.
- (5) Apportion the duties of the domestic servants, and be responsible for their efficient performance.
- (6) Instruct the nurses and probationers in all branches of nursing and in the hygienic disciplining of patients, and shall be responsible for their practical training in the preparation of invalid dietary.
- (7) Wear a distinctive dress, and shall see that nurses and probationers shall wear the style of dress prescribed by the Board.
- (8) Employ nurses and probationers when not attending on patients in doing such other work as she may consider appropriate.
- (9) Not permit any nurse or probationer to absent herself from duty unless she is satisfied that such absence is not detrimental to the interests of the sanatorium or the patients.
- (10) Visit the wards frequently during the day and occasionally at night, and take steps to maintain good order and hygienic cleanliness in wards and all other buildings under her supervision.
- (11) Be responsible for the proper serving of meals in the dining rooms and wards, and when any cause of complaint arises she shall report same as soon as may be convenient to the secretary.
- (12) Attend strictly to and carry out the directions of the medical officer, and be responsible for their due performance by the nursing and domestic staff.
- (13) Prevent by every means in her power the introduction of liquors and improper provisions to the patients.
- (14) Take such steps as may be necessary to insure that every patient on arrival shall have a bath, and that the clothing is fumigated, packed, marked, and stored, and that any valuables are handed over to the secretary for safe custody.

- (15) Cause the rules to be brought under the notice of those interested or concerned.
- (16) Keep a stock book recording receipt and issue of all stores.
- (17) Be responsible for the proper care of furniture, kitchen and dining ware, and appliances.
- (18) Be responsible for the proper care of bedding and stores, and shall give the necessary directions for maintaining linen, clothing, and other articles in a state of good repair, and shall see that all articles are legibly marked.
- (19) Take steps to have all washing checked on forwarding to the laundry, and re-checked on return. If laundry work is not done satisfactorily, a report giving full particulars shall be sent to the secretary.
- (20) Whenever any patient requires the presence of a spiritual adviser, inform the secretary, and, in his absence, shall take the necessary steps to have the request complied with.
- (21) Take such steps as may be necessary to insure that, on the discharge or death of a patient, the bed linen shall be replaced with clean articles.
- (22) Whenever a patient is in a critical state, inform the secretary, and, in his absence, communicate with the relatives by the speediest means available.
- (23) On the death of a patient, immediately inform the medical officer of such occurrence, and also the secretary, and, in the absence of the latter, communicate with the relatives by the speediest means available.
- (24) Treat the patients with kindness, and be responsible for similar qualities on the part of the nursing staff, and take the necessary steps to prevent or reprove any neglect or unkindness.
- (25) Guard, as far as possible, against irregularities of conduct on the part of the nurses, such as late hours, absence without leave, levity, &c., and she shall, by the maintenance of a wholesome discipline, endeavour to impress her subordinates with a high sense of the responsibilities devolving upon them.
- (26) Shall arrange for the annual holidays of the nurses, and shall see that they do not exceed their leave.
- (27) Shall take care that no fee or reward be accepted by a nurse from patients or their friends.
- (28) Shall see that strict economy is observed in the management of the wards, particularly in the use of fuel, and that all unnecessary lights are dispensed with.
- (29) Be entitled to three (3) weeks' leave annually.

WHEREAS the carrying of manure and other offensive matter through the streets and public places in the city, without being properly covered, is a nuisance, and contrary to the good rule and government of the said city, and it is desirable and necessary to prevent and suppress the practice:

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the mayor, councillors, and citizens of the City of Hawthorn order as follows:—

- (1) No person having the charge of any vehicle shall carry in or upon such vehicle in any of the streets of this city any offensive matter (including manure) unless the same is completely covered by a tarpaulin, or other suitable waterproof covering.
- (2) This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Hawthorn.
- (3) Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10 nor less than £5.

SHIRE OF PRESTON.

BY-LAW No. 20, FOR REGULATING AND RESTRAINING THE ERECTION AND CONSTRUCTION OF BUILDINGS, ERECTIONS, ETC.

By-Law No. 20.

A BY-LAW of the Shire of Preston (herein referred to as the "Municipality") made under section 198 of the *Local Government Act 1915* and Part 5 of the Thirteenth Schedule to such Act with the approval of the Governor in Council and numbered 20 for the carrying out of certain of the purposes provided for in the said section, viz.:—

(a) Regulating and restraining the erection and construction of buildings and erections.

(b) For requiring and pulling down and removal of buildings and erections.

(c) Authorizing the Council to pull down and remove buildings or erections erected or constructed contrary to this By-law, or not pulled down or removed as required by or under this By-law, and to sell the materials and apply the proceeds in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down and removing such buildings and erections and paying into the municipal fund any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof.

(d) For regulating and restraining the erection or re-erection of removed buildings.

(e) For appointing any fees to be charged and received by the Council of the municipality for any act done or to be done by any of its officers under this By-law, and for any permit or licence to be issued by the Council, and

(f) Prescribing the minimum area and the minimum depth and width of frontage of land upon which any dwelling-house may thereafter be erected.

(g) Providing that every dwelling house thereafter erected shall have attached thereto, for the exclusive use of the occupiers thereof, a prescribed area of open land.

(h) Providing with respect to buildings thereafter erected for:—

- (1) Regulating or limiting the heights of buildings;
- (2) Means of escape from buildings in case of fire and the prevention of fire in buildings;
- (3) The ventilation and lighting of buildings;
- (4) Exits from the stairways in buildings other than private dwelling houses; and
- (5) The minimum size of any dwelling rooms or shops for foodstuff.

(i) Requiring any work or thing to be executed or done of such materials, within such time, or in such manner as may be directed or approved in any particular case by the Council, or any officer or person authorized in that behalf by the Council; and

(j) Leaving any matter or thing to be from time to time determined, applied, dispensed with, or regulated by the Council by resolution, or by any officer authorized in that behalf by the Council, either generally or for any class of cases, or in any particular case.

(k) For other purposes in connexion with the foregoing.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, and the Thirteenth Schedule thereto, the Council of the municipality doth order as follows:—

Commencement.

1. This By-law shall come into operation on the Thirtieth day after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

Minimum Area.—Land Less than Minimum Area.

2. The minimum area of land upon which any dwelling-house, hereinafter provided for, may be erected, shall be 5,000 square feet, and the minimum frontage of such area shall be 40 feet, or such other frontage as the Council may by resolution from time to time determine. Provided that where any allotment of land smaller in area than that hereinbefore prescribed was, in the opinion of the Council, owned by any person prior to the coming into operation of this By-law, and in the opinion of the Council further land cannot be obtained to increase the area of such land, the Council on application in writing may, by resolution carried by a majority of the whole of the number of the members of the Council at a meeting of which seven clear days' notice has been given, permit a dwelling-house to be erected upon such land.

Open Space to be Attached to Dwelling.

3. Every dwelling-house hereafter erected within the Municipal District of the Shire of Preston shall have attached thereto for the exclusive use of the occupiers thereof an area of open land which shall not be less than a two-fifths proportion of the total allotment or area of land whereon the said dwelling-house is erected.

Minimum Area not Applicable to Specified Parts of Municipal District.

4. Clause 2 of this By-law shall not apply to the specified part or parts of the Municipal District of the Shire of Preston set forth and described in the Second Schedule hereto.

No Person to Build Contrary to By-law.

5. No person shall erect, build or construct, remove, or make any alteration or addition to or cause to be erected, built or constructed, removed or made any alteration or addition to any building or erection contrary to the provisions of this By-law.

Fees.

6. No person shall commence, or cause to be commenced, any building or erection, or any alteration or addition to any building or erection, or remove or cause to be removed any building or erection without first having paid to the Council the prescribed fees in accordance with the scale set out in the Schedule hereto, the decision of the surveyor as to the area of a new building or the value of an addition shall be final and conclusive.

Plans.

7. No person shall erect, build or construct, remove, or make any alteration or addition to or cause to be erected, built or constructed, or removed, or made any alteration or addition to any building or erection without first obtaining written permission from the Council so to do, or without first submitting to the Council or its surveyor the plans and specifications of the proposed building or erection, alteration or addition, together with such further particulars in writing regarding same as shall be necessary to enable the Council or its surveyor to determine if all the provisions of this By-law applicable thereto are being complied with. A copy or tracing of the plan showing ground plan of building and boundaries of land and position of building thereon shall be left with the Council for its own use. A written permission, obtained pursuant to this clause, shall expire after twelve months from its grant unless extended by resolution of the Council.

Grading of Land Before Building.

8. Before proceeding to the erection of any such building or erection, the site, being the land whereon the same is to be erected, shall be graded and levelled off to the satisfaction of the surveyor, so that no water can gather, accumulate or lie thereon.

No Building, Etc., to be Removed Without Permission of Council.—Procedure.

9. No building or erection shall be removed or transported either in whole or in part into any part of the municipality of Preston or from any part of the municipality to another part thereof unless the owner or person carrying out the removal first obtain written permission from the Council so to do, and shall in applying for such permission give to the Council or its surveyor not less than ten clear days' notice in writing of his desire to remove and re-erect such building, and shall accompanying such notice supply the following particulars:—

(a) The situation of the building which it is proposed to remove.

(b) The situation and the plan of the land upon which it is proposed to re-erect or place such building, showing the proposed position thereon, and a tracing copy of such plan to be retained by the Council.

(c) A plan giving the dimensions of the building and proposed alterations or additions thereto, and a tracing copy of such plan to be retained by the Council.

(d) A specification giving particulars of the construction of the existing building and of the alterations and additions (if any) which it is intended to make when the building is re-erected.

(e) Satisfactory evidence that such house has not been condemned as dilapidated, insanitary, or unfit for human habitation.

(f) Such further particulars in writing regarding the same as shall be sufficient to enable the Council or its surveyor to determine if all the provisions of this By-law of the municipality applicable thereto are or will be complied with.

Position of Dwellings in Relation to Allotments.

10. No building, which is intended to be used or which shall be used as a dwelling-house, and no addition to any building, shall be built, constructed, or erected within a distance of fifteen feet measured horizontally from the building line of the street or road the building is intended to or shall front, or nearer than twenty feet to the back boundary line of the allotment on which it stands.

Space to be Provided at Sides of Wooden Buildings.

11. Except as hereinafter provided no building with an external wall of wood which is intended to be used or which shall be used as a dwelling house, and no addition with an external wall of wood to any building which is intended to be used or shall be used as a dwelling house shall be built, constructed or erected.

(a) Within a distance of four feet measured horizontally of any street, road, lane, or right-of-way at the side of any such building.

(b) Within a distance of four feet measured horizontally of land not in the same occupation or possession.

(c) Within a distance of eight feet measured horizontally of another building or erection with an external wall of wood,

Provided always that any such building or addition may abut on the building line of any street, road, lane, or right-of-way at the side of such building or be less than the prescribed distance therefrom or from land not in the same possession or occupation, or from a building or erection with an external wall of wood, used or intended to be used wholly or partially as a dwelling, provided that the wall or walls which abut on or face within the prescribed distance of such street, road, lane, right-of-way land not in the same possession or occupation or building or erection as the case may be shall be of concrete of approved thickness, or of brick or stone at least 6½ inches in thickness projecting in all cases at least 1 inch beyond the woodwork, front and back, and at least one foot through the roof covering or gutter adjoining the same.

Materials for Roofs.

12. The roof of every building or erection shall be covered on the outside with incombustible coverings.

Stables, Etc.

13. Stables, outhouses and outbuildings shall be subject to the like conditions as are hereinbefore imposed in regard to dwelling houses by the last two preceding clauses except that Clause 11 (a) shall not apply to them as it relates to distance from any lane or right-of-way.

14. No person shall erect, build, or construct, or cause to be erected, built or constructed, any building or erection to be used as a dwelling house only within the Shire of Preston, unless the whole of the said building or erection of whatever material constructed shall cover an area of five hundred square feet at least in cases where the building or erection consists of less than four rooms and six hundred square feet at least in cases where the building or erection consists of four or more rooms.

Rooms, Height of Walls.

15 (a) The main rooms in every building hereafter built or re-built shall be in every part not less than eleven feet from floor to ceiling.

(b) Provided that in case of buildings of more than one storey hereafter built or re-built living rooms wholly or partially in the roof may be less than ten feet in height from floor to ceiling throughout not more than two-thirds of the area.

Area.

(c) No main rooms shall have less floor area than one hundred square feet.

Windows.

(d) Every main room in a dwelling house shall have one or more windows opening directly into the external air with a total superficies of glass clear of such frames free from obstruction to light equal to at least one-tenth of the floor area of the room and so constructed that a substantial part of the windows equal to at least one-twentieth of the floor area can be opened for ventilation. The requirements of this sub-clause may under special circumstances be modified by the Council or the surveyor subject to review by the Council, but in such cases other approved provision for lighting or ventilation may be made.

(e) The provisions of this clause in reference to the height, lighting and ventilation of main rooms in dwellings shall as far as applicable be extended to all shops save that the windows need not be constructed so as to open if other approved provision for ventilation be made.

Materials, Etc., Interior of Walls.

16 (a) The interiors of all walls and ceilings of every building which is intended to be used or shall or may be used as a dwelling house shall be constructed of lath and plaster or approved wood or fire-resisting materials.

Foundations.

(b) The foundations or footings of buildings other than wood shall not be less in width than nine inches wider than the walls standing thereon and shall not be less in depth than an average of eighteen inches below the natural surface of the ground.

(c) Bricks used in any buildings shall be good, hard, and well burnt, and if old shall be thoroughly cleaned before being used.

(d) All timbers used in any building shall be of good sound material free from rot, large and loose knots, shakes, or any imperfections, whereby the strength of the timber may be impaired.

(e) The following conditions shall apply as to spacings and scantlings of timber:—

(1) Stumps shall be not less than four inches by four inches red gum, jarrah, or other approved timber spaced to four feet centres and fixed on six inch by six inch by one and a half inch sole plates.

(2) Studs and ceiling joists shall be not less than four inches by one and a half inches spaced not more than eighteen inches centre to centre.

(3) Rafters shall be not less than four inches by one and a half inches spaced three feet centre to centre in the case of iron roofs and eighteen inches centre to centre in the case of slate tiles or other similar roofs securely braced with purlins and collar ties.

(4) Floor joists shall not be less than four inches by two inches spaced eighteen inches apart centre to centre on four inch by three inch bearers spaced not more than six feet apart.

Floors.

(f) Floors to be fixed level, and in all buildings the under surface of all joists to be in no part less than nine inches above the surface of the ground.

Space Under Floors.

(g) The space under the ground floor of every building shall have a sufficiency of openings through all walls under the floor to thoroughly ventilate the same.

Vermin Plates.

(h) Vermin plates shall be not less than four inches by one and a half inches, and to be provided in all walls.

Damp Courses.

(i) Every wall of brick or stone shall have an approved damp course or courses of asphalt or other impervious material above the surface of the ground below the lowest floor, and in cases where it is not desirable to place the same throughout the building at one uniform level the said damp-proof course must be laid in horizontal layers connected at the end by a vertical course of the same materials.

Chimneys.

(j) Chimneys must be of concrete of approved thickness or of brick or stone at least nine inches in thickness at the back of the fireplace projecting through the roof to the height of at least the highest point of the roof.

(k) The surveyor shall have the power to condemn and to order the removal or to remove at the expense of the owner any material which in his opinion is not suitable for the purpose for which it is intended to use same, and no person shall use any material so condemned for any building, alteration, or addition.

Frontage to Streets Preserved.

17. No building shall be erected in such a position that it shall lie between another building or any part thereof and a street unless such other building has a direct and unobstructive access to some other street of at least thirty-three feet wide.

No Shop to be Erected Except in Specified Area Without Consent of Council.

18. Without the consent in writing of the Council first had and obtained, no shop shall be erected in the Municipality of Preston, except within the areas numbered 1, 2, and 3 in the Second Schedule hereto. Any such shop which may hereafter be erected may be erected and built up to and along the building line of the street or road which the same shall front, provided, however, that no shop shall be erected in any part of the municipality unless the walls thereof are constructed of concrete of approved thickness, or of brick or stone at least eight and a half inches in thickness, but dwelling rooms attached to shops may, subject to the provision of this By-law, be of wood.

Shop with Dwellings.

19. Shops having a dwelling house or living compartments erected above the ground floor shall only be built on land having a frontage of not less than eighteen feet by a depth of one hundred and twenty feet, and shall have a yard or open space of five hundred square feet at the least, apart from passages under three feet in width, exclusive of any building thereon, provided that where any allotment of land smaller in area than hereinbefore prescribed was in the opinion of the Council owned by any person prior to the coming into operation of this By-law, and in the opinion of the Council further land cannot be obtained to increase the area of such land the Council may on application in writing, by resolution carried by a majority of the whole of the number of the members of the Council at a meeting, of which seven clear days' notice has been given, permit a shop to be erected on such land.

Porticoes and Verandahs.

20. (a) No person shall erect, or cause or permit to be erected, any portico or verandah over the footway of any street in the municipality without first obtaining the consent of the Council in writing, and such portico or verandah shall be of the shape, figure and dimension and materials as set forth in the plan and specification for the time being adopted by resolution of the Council, but the lowest parts of such portico or verandah shall in no case be of less than nine feet above the level of the outer edge of the footway, provision to be made that no verandah post be permitted on footpaths, and that all verandahs be supported by cantilever supports.

Openings in Verandah Roofs.

(b) No opening shall be made in the roof of any such verandah for the purpose of affording light unless such opening be properly framed and glazed to the satisfaction of the surveyor with approved glass, protected underneath with a fine mesh wire-netting, or armoured glass.

Privies and Closets, Etc.

21. No privy, closet, or urinal, which is not connected with the underground system and approved by the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works, shall be erected at a less distance than fifteen feet from the door or window of any dwelling house, and no such privy, closet, or urinal shall be erected at a less distance than fifteen feet from any street unless that in case there is a right-of-way abutting on such allotment the privy, closet, or urinal may be erected on the boundary between such allotment and the right-of-way. Every closet, privy, or urinal shall be effectively screened from public view.

Drainage.

22. Proper provision shall be made and maintained for effectively removing stormwater and sanitary drainage from every building; the materials and construction of such drains shall be such as shall be approved.

Computing Distances.

23. For the purpose of computing distances from any building the furthest outside edge of the verandah eaves or any other projection shall be taken as the point from which measurements are to be taken.

Minimum Number of Rooms.

24. No dwelling house shall consist of less than three main rooms and no buildings or rooms thereof shall be occupied for living purposes until at least three main rooms shall have been completed according to the plans and specifications submitted to and approved by the Council.

Inspecting Buildings.

25. The surveyor, and the Council's inspector at all reasonable times during the progress and after the completion of any buildings or addition or alteration to any building affected by this By-law may enter and inspect such building or alteration.

Tents.

26. No tent shall be erected or used on any block or allotment of land as a permanent dwelling or to take the place of a permanent dwelling.

Buildings Proposed to be Removed.

27. No house or other building or erection that has been condemned as unfit or unsafe for human occupation or habitation shall be transported either in whole or in part into any part of the municipality or from any part of the municipality to another part thereof.

Buildings in which there have been Infectious or Contagious Diseases.

28. No building or erection in which any case of infectious or contagious disease has occurred during the preceding three months shall be removed or re-erected

within the municipality unless the same has been thoroughly fumigated and disinfected to the satisfaction of some duly qualified medical practitioner approved by the Council or of the Health Officer of the Council.

Removed Building to Comply with By-laws.

29. Every building or erection intended to be or adapted to be used as a dwelling house which shall be removed and re-erected within the municipality shall when completed, comply with all the provisions of this By-law in the same manner as if it were a building or erection originally built, constructed, or erected in the part of the municipality to which it is removed and re-erected; such building shall be properly framed and all timber and material which in the opinion of the surveyor is unsound or defective shall be removed and replaced with sound material.

Removed Building not to be Occupied except it is Certified by Surveyor.

30. No removed building shall be occupied until the surveyor shall have certified in writing that all provisions of this By-law have been observed and complied with in respect of such building.

Alteration Position of Building.

31. Nothing herein contained shall prevent the alteration of the position of any building within the boundaries of the land on which the same stands, provided that in its altered position it shall comply with this By-law, and that in the progress of such removal the building be not taken on to any street, road, or public place.

Surveyor may Compel Owner of Removed Building or Dilapidated to Comply with Requirements.

32. If the surveyor shall certify in writing to the Council that any building or erection has been removed or transported, either in whole or in part, into any part of the municipality, or from part of the municipality to another part thereof, or erected or occupied contrary to any of the provisions of this By-law, or that any removed building, erection, or structure is in such a dilapidated, ruinous, or unsafe condition as to be dangerous to the public safety, the owner of such building, erection, or structure, upon receiving from the Council or any officer thereof a notice in writing requiring such owner to alter, repair, remove, or pull down such building, erection or structure within such time as is limited by such notice, shall comply with such notice within the time therein limited.

Buildings not in Compliance with By-law.

33. If any building or erection shall be wholly or partially built or erected, added to or altered contrary to the provisions of this By-law, the Council or any officer thereof, or other authorized agent, may give to the owner or leave upon the site of such building fourteen days' notice in writing to bring such building or erection into conformity with the said provisions, or requiring the pulling down or removal of such building or erection.

Procedure in the Event of Default.

34. If default shall be made in complying with any notice mentioned in the last two preceding clauses, then notwithstanding the imposition or recovery of any penalty it shall be lawful for the said Council by its surveyor, officer or other authorized agent to enter upon any building, structure, or erection, and on the site thereof with a sufficient number of workmen, and for that purpose to break any fence surrounding the land on which such structure or erection is situated, and to pull down and remove the said building, structure, or erection, or any parts thereof, and to do any other act that may be necessary for the purpose and to remove the materials thereof to some convenient place, and if the Council in its discretion thinks fit to sell the same in such manner as it thinks fit, and all the expenses incurred by the Council, its officer, surveyor or other authorized agent in pulling down and removing the said building, structure, or erection, or any part thereof, or of removing the materials thereof and selling the same, and in doing other acts as aforesaid, and all fees and penalties due by the owner thereof may be deducted and retained by the Council out of the proceeds of such sale, and the Council shall restore the surplus (if any) arising from such sale to such owner.

Greenhouses, Etc., are Exempt.

35. This By-law shall not apply to any fence, greenhouse, fernery, aviary, or to outbuildings, which outbuildings are on an area of not less than five acres, used for agricultural or similar purposes only, or to temporary and removable offices and sheds used by builders during the construction of any building at or about the site of such building for a period not exceeding twelve months.

Re-erectations.

36. Any building which shall be re-erected or commenced, to be erected wholly or partially, shall be subject to this By-law to the same extent as if it were a new building.

Exempted Buildings.

37. This By-law shall not apply to any building of the Government of the Commonwealth of Australia, the State of Victoria, Melbourne, and Metropolitan Board of Works, or of the municipality.

Procedure where Buildings Erected Contrary to By-law.

38. In the case of any building, erection, or construction contrary to the provisions of this By-law either in whole or in part—

(a) The Council may give to the owner or builder, or leave upon the site of such building, erection, or construction fourteen days' notice in writing (which notice may be signed by the surveyor or the Shire secretary on behalf of the Council) to bring the same into conformity with the said provisions, or requiring the pulling down or removal of such building, erection, or construction, and

(b) If default is made in complying with such notice, and notwithstanding the imposition or recovery of any penalty, it shall be lawful for the Council, through its surveyor, to, with a sufficient number of workmen, demolish and pull down the said building, erection, or construction, or any part or parts thereof, and to do any other act that may be necessary for the purposes, and to remove the materials thereof to some convenient place, and the Council in its discretion may sell the same in such manner as it thinks fit, and

(c) All expenses incurred by the Council or surveyor in demolishing and pulling down the said building or erection or construction, or any part or parts thereof, or in removing the materials thereof and selling the same, and in doing such other acts as aforesaid, and all fees or penalties due by the owner or builder thereof, may be deducted and retained by the Council out of the proceeds of such sale, and

(d) The Council shall pay over any surplus arising from such sale on application being made by the person entitled thereto.

Procedure in Event of Disagreement with Council's Decision.

39. If any builder or owner disagree with any decision of the Council or surveyor as to any of the requirements under the notice provided for in Sub-clause (a) of the immediately preceding clause, *i.e.*, 38, he may on giving notice in writing thereof to the Council, and on payment to the Treasurer of the sum of £2 2s., have the question referred to an architect of known ability appointed by the Council, and one appointed by the Governor in Council, and the said architect, in case of disagreement, may call in a third architect of known ability, and the decision of any two of such architects shall be final and conclusive, and binding in all respects on the parties.

Penalties.

40. Every person who shall by any wilful act or default be guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for any such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

Application of By-law to Municipality.

41. Except where a different intention is expressed herein this By-law shall apply to and have operation in and throughout the whole of the municipality.

Repeal of Previous By-law.

42. From and after the date of this By-law coming into operation By-law 18 shall be and the same is hereby repealed.

Definitions.

43. In this By-law save where the contents are inconsistent therewith—

"Alteration" means any change in the construction or plan of the building or erection or any change in the purpose for which any building or erection or any part thereof shall be used.

"Approved" means approved by the surveyor.

"Surveyor" means the building surveyor or acting building surveyor for the time being of the municipality or other officer having for the time being the administration of this By-law.

"Inspector" means the inspector or acting inspector for the time being of the municipality.

"Council" means the council of the municipality.

"Dwellinghouse" means the building used or adapted to be used wholly or partially for human habitation.

"Lane or right-of-way" means a street, road, or passage less than thirty-three feet wide.

"Shop" means a building in which or in part of which goods are regularly offered or exposed for sale or in which meals or refreshments are regularly offered or provided for payment and also includes the saloon or shop of barbers and hairdressers and offices of agents and auctioneers.

A *bond-fide* private boarding house shall not be included in this definition by reason only of the fact that meals or refreshments are occasionally supplied for payment to persons other than boarders.

"Square" applied to the measurement of any area means the space of 100 square feet.

"Street or road" means and includes "street" and "road" and "private street" and "private road" as respectively defined in the *Local Government Act 1915*, Section 3.

"Main Rooms" shall be deemed to mean and include all rooms used or which in the opinion of the council or the surveyor shall be intended to be used as bedrooms, dining-rooms, or ordinary living rooms, including kitchens.

"New Building" includes—

A. Any building erected or commenced to be erected after the date of this By-law coming into force.

B. Any building which for more than half its cubical contents has been taken down or destroyed by fire, tempest or otherwise, and if re-erected or commenced to be re-erected.

C. Any space between walls and buildings which is roofed or commenced to be roofed after the date of this By-law coming into force.
