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ACTS OF PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Arthur Lyulph Stanley, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:

- An Act to revoke the Permanent Reservation of certain land in the Town of Wodonga as a site for a Literary Institute and Free Library."
- An Act to incorporate the Law Institute of Victoria and for other purposes."
- An Act to extend the time for the Registration of Barmaids under the Licensing Acts."

- An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of Six hundred and seventy-five thousand one hundred and sixty-seven pounds to the service of the year One thousand nine hundred and seventeen and One thousand nine hundred and eighteen."

- An Act to make further and better provision for the Melbourne General Market and to extend the area thereof and to provide for the closing of portions of certain streets in the City of Melbourne and for re-vesting in the Crown certain lands in the said city and for other purposes."

- An Act to make provision for the Settlement of Discharged Soldiers on the land and for other purposes."

- An Act to extend the operation of the Tramway Board Act 1915 and to amend the Law relating to drivers or conductors of or attendant upon carriages of the Tramway Board."
- An Act to amend the Fruit Act 1915 and for other purposes."
- An Act relating to the purchase of goods machinery or materials for works undertaken by or on behalf of certain local authorities."
- An Act to increase the amount which the Prahran and Malvern Tramways Trust may borrow by way of overdraft."
- An Act to authorize the City of Malvern to construct and provide certain Permanent Works and Undertakings in lieu of certain other Permanent Works and Undertakings."
- An Act to revoke the Permanent Reservation and Crown Grant of portion of certain land situate in the municipal districts of the City of South Melbourne and the City of St. Kilda as a site for a Public Park."
- An Act to amend section Twenty-four of the Conveyancing Act 1915 and for other purposes."
- An Act to amend the Public Service Acts."
- An Act to amend the Fisheries Act 1915 and for other purposes."
- An Act relating to Nominations of Persons on War Service as Candidates at the next ensuing General Election for the Legislative Assembly."

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

REGULATION OF THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS.

No. 63.

THE Victorian Railways Commissioners, in pursuance of the powers conferred in that behalf by the *Railways Act, 1915*, do hereby make the following Regulation in regard to the qualifications, selection, and examination of candidates for employment as Junior Clerks, Apprentices, Lad Labourers, and Lad Porters, and do hereby repeal all previous regulations relating thereto.

1. Every person desiring to become a candidate for employment in any of the positions referred to herein must prepare, in his own handwriting, an application on the form prescribed, stating that he is an applicant for appointment to one of the vacancies specified in the public notice.

2. The age of each candidate shall be reckoned to the date fixed by the Commissioners for the opening of the applications, and shall be fourteen (14) years or over, but less than eighteen (18) years.

3. The salary of every Junior Clerk on appointment shall be at the rate of £55 per annum, and thereafter shall be in accordance with the provisions of any Regulation in operation for the time being; provided, however, that every successful candidate for the position of Junior Clerk who was in the Supernumerary Service of the Commissioners at the date of his permanent appointment may have any such Supernumerary Service in the capacity of a Junior Clerk taken into consideration in determining whether his salary on appointment shall be in excess of the prescribed minimum.

4. The rate of pay of every Apprentice shall be as under:—

and thereafter shall be in accordance with the provisions of any Regulation in operation for the time being.

5. The rate of pay of every Lad Labourer and Lad Porter shall on appointment be in accordance with his age, based on the following scale:—

and thereafter shall be in accordance with the provisions of any Regulation in operation for the time being.

6. Every Junior Clerk who, owing to the requirements of the Department, may be obliged to reside away from his home, shall, in addition to his salary, be granted a monthly allowance towards his board and lodging expenses on the basis of the difference between his annual salary and £70 per annum during such time as his salary continues to be less than £70 per annum; and every Apprentice, Lad Labourer, and Lad Porter, similarly circumstanced, shall, in addition to his ordinary rate of pay, be granted an allowance during such time as his wage continues to be

not more than 3s. 6d. per day in accordance with the following scale:—

7. Every candidate shall confine himself to one application for employment in one of the grades specified in the public notice, and, in the case of an Apprentice, to one application for employment in one of the Trades specified therein, and shall enclose such application in an envelope, which must be properly addressed, duly stamped, and posted, so that it will reach the Secretary for Railways (hereinafter referred to as the "Secretary"), Spencer-street, Melbourne, not later than the time fixed by the Commissioners for opening and dealing with such applications.

8. Every candidate shall furnish with his application a certified extract from the register of his birth. In the case, however, of a candidate born outside of the State of Victoria, a statutory declaration by one of his parents or by a near elder relative as to the date of his birth will be accepted as temporary evidence of age, but every such candidate who is selected will be required to take immediate steps to obtain an official Birth Certificate from the State or country in which he was born.

9. Every candidate who has at any time been employed in any capacity in the Railway Department or in the Public Service, whether as a permanent or supernumerary employee, shall furnish particulars with his application as to the period of such employment, and, if he has left such service, the cause of his leaving.

10. Any person who has been dismissed from the Railway Department, or the Public Service, or whose employment has been terminated for cause, or who has been convicted of a felony or misdemeanour, whether before or after selection or examination, shall not be eligible for employment in the service of the Commissioners.

11. The Secretary shall on the day and at the hour named in the public notice proceed to open the applications, and shall cause the name and address of the writer of each of such applications to be then and there registered in a book provided for that purpose, hereinafter called the "Register," and a consecutive number, commencing with the number one, shall be placed in the Register opposite the name of each candidate.

12. The candidates in any grade, if not more than twice the number to be employed, shall thereupon be subject to the course of procedure, and the conditions, defined in Clauses 13 to 30 inclusive of this Regulation.

13. The candidates in any grade, if more than twice the number to be employed, shall be reduced by a Board of Selectors (which shall be appointed within seven days prior to the date fixed for the selection) to a number not exceeding twice the number to be employed.

14. The members of the Board of Selectors shall not be informed of, nor acquaint themselves with, the names of the applicants, or any of them; and any candidate who either directly or indirectly attempts to influence any member of the Board of Selectors in favour of himself, or in favour of, or against any other candidate, shall be for ever disqualified for employment in the service of the Commissioners.

15. Every candidate shall be notified in writing by the Secretary of the place and time at which he shall present himself to the Board of Selectors.

16. Every candidate, immediately before presenting himself to the Board of Selectors, shall be furnished by the Secretary with a card bearing a number, by which number alone he shall be known to the Board of Selectors.

17. A list of the names of the candidates selected by the Board of Selectors shall be compiled and certified to by the Board of Selectors, and every candidate whose name has been enrolled on such list shall be entitled to present himself for examination by the Railways Medical Officer.

18. Every such candidate, and every candidate for employment in any grade for which the number of applicants is not more than twice the number to be employed, shall pass an examination by the Railways Medical Officer, and for such examination shall pay a fee of 5s.

19. Every such candidate shall, if certified as free from any physical infirmity, and as up to the standard prescribed in respect of vision, colour-sense, and hearing, present himself for an examination by the Educational Examiners duly appointed for that purpose at such time and place as may be notified to him by the Secretary.

20. Every such candidate for the position of Junior Clerk shall be required by the Examiners appointed for that purpose to pass an educational examination equivalent to the examination prescribed for the State School Merit Certificate.

21. Every such candidate for the position of Apprentice, Lad, Labourer, or Lad Porter, shall be required by the Examiners appointed for that purpose to pass an educational examination equivalent to the examination prescribed for the State School Exemption Certificate.

22. Every such candidate shall produce to the Educational Examiners satisfactory written testimony that he is of respectable character, and shall furnish the name or names of any person or persons or firms with whom he may have been employed during the preceding two years, and every such candidate who has had previous employment in the service of the Commissioners shall produce a statement of such service and a certificate of competency and good conduct from the Head of the particular Branch in which he is or may have been employed.

23. The Educational Examiners shall thereupon examine the candidates who have passed the physical, &c., examination, at such time and place as may be notified to such candidates respectively.

24. The Educational Examiners shall, immediately after the completion of the examination, forward to the Secretary the examination papers

of every candidate so examined, together with a certificate as prescribed hereunder:—

We, the undersigned duly appointed Examiners under the *Railways Act 1915*, do hereby certify that on the * 191, we examined for the position of in the Branch, and allotted him marks, and accordingly certify that he is for such employment.

Examiners.

25. After examination by the Educational Examiners the successful candidates, in any grade, if not in excess of the number required, will be employed forthwith, and their relative seniority for future promotion, &c., shall be determined by a ballot conducted in the manner prescribed in Clause 27.

26. The successful candidates in any grade, if in excess of the number required, shall be called together at a place and time of which due notice shall be sent them in writing, and shall then and there in the presence of the Secretary draw lots in accordance with the method prescribed in Clause 27 to determine the order of precedence in which their names shall be recorded for appointment, viz.:

27. Two ballot-boxes shall be provided; numbered 1 and 2 respectively, in each of which shall be deposited as many numbers in arithmetical progression, commencing with the number one, as shall correspond with the number of successful candidates.

Every such candidate shall then draw first from No. 1 box, and afterwards from No. 2 box in the numerical order ascertained by the drawing from No. 1 box. For instance, the candidate drawing No. 4 out of No. 1 box shall be the fourth in order for drawing out of No. 2 box, and the number drawn from No. 2 box shall fix his order of precedence for appointment, and in the event of two or more such candidates being appointed on the same day such drawing shall, all other things being equal, determine the relative seniority of each candidate for future promotion, &c.

28. Every successful candidate in any grade, if in excess of the number required by the Commissioners shall, in the order so decided, be eligible for appointment during the twelve months next ensuing from the date of the ballot without further or other examination.

29. Every appointment shall be on probation for a period of six months, and at the expiration of that period the appointment may be confirmed by the Commissioners, provided that the conduct, capacity, and industry of the probationer whilst in the service of the Commissioners have been satisfactory. No probationer, however, shall have his appointment confirmed until he has effected in one of the prescribed Life Assurance Companies an assurance of his life in accordance with the regulations of the Commissioners.

30. Every appointment shall be made on the distinct understanding that the services of the employee shall without previous notice be liable to be dispensed with either during or after the

period of probation, or, in the case of an Apprentice, either during or after the period of apprenticeship, and without his having any claim whatsoever against the Commissioners if at any time his services be so dispensed with.

31. Every Apprentice shall, immediately after appointment, attend, at either the Working Men's College, Ballarat School of Mines, or Bendigo School of Mines, as may be determined by the Commissioners, the classes of instruction appertaining to the trade to which he may be apprenticed, or such other classes as the Commissioners may direct, at such hours of the day and night as may be prescribed during the complete course of training, which, subject to the provisions of Clause 37, shall extend over a period of three years.

32. Every Apprentice shall provide the books, drawing instruments, &c., required at the College or School of Mines at his own expense, but the Commissioners will pay the College or School of Mines fees, as well as the wages of the Apprentice for such portion of the ordinary hours of duty as he may be required to be in attendance at the College or School of Mines.

33. Every Apprentice shall present himself for such examinations as may be prescribed at the College or School of Mines, and shall pass in proper sequence the examinations for each year of such course, and, in addition, shall do satisfactory work and be of good conduct in the service of the Commissioners.

34. Subject to good conduct, regular attendance, zeal, and industry in the service of the Commissioners, the Apprentices who each year of the three-years' period of tuition at the Working Men's College or School of Mines may be adjudged first and second in order of merit and as possessing the highest qualifications amongst all Apprentices who are pursuing the course applicable to the particular year, shall be awarded the prizes applicable to their particular trades as specified in Clause 35 of this regulation, provided that they obtain not less than 75 per cent. of the possible marks.

35. The prizes shall be allotted in the following manner, viz.:—

First Year—

The two Apprentices who may be adjudged first and second in order of merit shall be awarded prizes of £5 and £3 respectively.

Second Year—

The two Apprentices amongst those apprenticed to the trades of Blacksmith, Boilermaker, Coppersmith, Fitter and Turner, Iron Machinist, Moulder, and Springmaker, who may be adjudged first and second in order of merit shall be awarded prizes of £5 and £3 respectively.

Third Year—

The Apprentice amongst those apprenticed to the trades of Blacksmith, Boilermaker, Coppersmith, Fitter and Turner, Iron Machinist, Moulder, and Springmaker, who may be adjudged first in order of merit shall be nominated as a Student in either Electrical or Mechanical Engineering (as may be determined by the Commissioners), and the Apprentice adjudged second in order of merit shall be awarded a prize of £5.

36. The apprentice who is nominated as a Student in either Electrical or Mechanical Engineering shall be afforded facilities to attend for two years the full day course at either the Working Men's College, Ballarat School of Mines, or Bendigo School of Mines, as may be determined by the Commissioners, and any such Apprentice who passes the prescribed examination and gains a diploma of the College or School of Mines, as the case may be, in respect thereof, shall thereafter be employed by the Commissioners as an Engineering Assistant. During such course of two years the College or School of Mines fees will be paid by the Commissioners, and in lieu of wages the Apprentice shall be paid at the rate of £7 per month.

37. Any Apprentice who fails to pass either the First or Second Year Course, after having studied such course for one year, will be allowed a second year in which to qualify in such course, and shall attend such additional night classes as may be deemed necessary by the Commissioners, and shall pay the fees imposed in respect of such classes, and any Apprentice who fails to pass either the First or the Second Year Course after having studied such course for two years, or who is adjudged guilty of continual, frequent, or repeated misconduct at the College or School of Mines, or to have neglected to make a proper effort to qualify in the work at the College or School of Mines, will render himself liable to the immediate termination of his services, and shall not have any claim if at any time his services be so dispensed with.

38. The term of tuition at the College or School of Mines at the expense of the Department shall in every instance be limited to three years, and any apprentice who fails to complete the Course of Instruction within that period, and who desires to continue his studies, shall be required to pay the fees therefor, and will not be allowed to absent himself from duty during working hours for the purpose of attending the College or School of Mines.

39. The term of apprenticeship shall be five years, and each year thereof shall be deemed to mean three hundred and thirteen (313) working days, and shall be inclusive of any proclaimed holidays on which the Work-shops may be closed, and any annual recreation leave of absence, as well as any other leave of absence which may be allowed for any cause whatsoever, provided that such other leave of absence does not during the five years exceed sixty-five working days in the aggregate. In the event, however, of such other leave of absence to any Apprentice during the five years exceeding sixty-five working days in the aggregate, the term of his apprenticeship shall be extended beyond the five years for a period equivalent to the period of such excess leave of absence.

KILMORE WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1918 WITHIN THE KILMORE URBAN DISTRICT.

THE Commissioners of the Kilmore Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, make the following rate for one year from the 1st January, 1918, payable in two moieties, on the 1st January, 1918, and the 1st July, 1918. The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the occupiers and owners of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure, for domestic purposes, within the Urban District of Kilmore, as such district was proclaimed and defined on the 30th January, 1894:—

On every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of Twenty pounds and under, the sum of Twenty shillings.

On every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Twenty pounds, Five pounds per centum on the municipal value.

On every house which has been unoccupied for twelve months or more, the owner, by making a written application to the Trust, may have the rate reduced by one-half.

On every piece of vacant or unoccupied land supplied with water of the annual municipal value of Twenty pounds and under, the sum of Ten shillings.

On every piece of vacant or unoccupied land supplied with water above the annual municipal value of Twenty pounds, Five pounds per centum on the municipal value.

On every piece of vacant or unoccupied land containing one acre or under, not supplied with water, the sum of Five shillings.

On every piece of vacant or unoccupied land of a greater area than one acre, not supplied with water, the sum of Ten shillings.

The owner of every piece of vacant or unoccupied land supplied with water must provide a trough, with approved self-acting ball tap to prevent overflow.

The charge for water supplied from and after the 1st day of January, 1918, from the works of the Trust shall be as follows:—

1. For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, Fifteen shillings per annum for each horse-power of such boiler.
2. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement for manufacturing purposes, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, Sixpence for every 1,000 gallons.
3. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement for domestic and other than domestic purposes, One shilling for every 1,000 gallons.

The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure shall be—

- (a) If for manufacturing purposes, the quantity for which the charge at Sixpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied, is supplied otherwise than by measure.
- (b) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge at One shilling per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure.

The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the occupiers and owners of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure within the Urban District of Wandong, as such district was proclaimed and defined on the 30th January, 1894:—

On every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of Twenty pounds and under, the sum of Twenty shillings.

On every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Twenty pounds, One shilling and sixpence in the pound on the municipal valuation.

On every piece of vacant or unoccupied land of the annual municipal value of Twenty pounds and under, the sum of Ten shillings.

On every piece of vacant or unoccupied land above the annual municipal value of Twenty pounds, One shilling and sixpence in the pound on the municipal valuation.

The owner of every piece of vacant or unoccupied land supplied with water must provide a trough with approved self-acting ball tap to prevent overflow.

MORTLAKE WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR YEAR 1918.

THE Commissioners of the Mortlake Waterworks Trust do hereby, under the provisions of the Water Acts, and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, make the following By-law to deal with the rateable property within the Mortlake Waterworks District of the Mortlake Waterworks Trust, and with the minimum charges and the charges for the sale of water from the works of the Trust.

1. For every house including not more than $\frac{1}{4}$ acre of land and of annual municipal value of £20 and under the minimum charge shall be Thirty-two shillings.

2. For every house &c. of annual municipal value of £21 to £60 inclusive a rate of Two shillings and threepence in the £1 shall be paid, and any such properties exceeding £60 annual municipal value, shall pay a rate in addition of One shilling in the £1 for every £1 over and above £60 valuation.

3. Land adjoining the properties whose annual value does not exceed £20, shall be charged at the rate of Two shillings for each $\frac{1}{4}$ acre over and above the $\frac{1}{4}$ acre allowed with the house, up to a maximum of Ten shillings.

4. Unoccupied land and allotments shall be charged for as follows:—

Not exceeding $\frac{1}{4}$ acre 7s. 6d., not exceeding $\frac{1}{2}$ acre 10s., not exceeding 1 acre 12s. 6d., not exceeding $1\frac{1}{4}$ acres 15s., not exceeding 2 acres 20s., and if more than 2 acres 25s.

5. The charge for water supplied by the Trust by measurement, except in cases of special arrangement with the Trust, shall be One shilling and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons.

6. For water supplied to the Botanic Gardens, Recreation Reserve, Government buildings, Mechanics' Institute, churches, cattle yards and similar properties, the charge shall be by measurement or by special arrangement. If charged by measurement the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, provided that the minimum quantity to be charged for shall not be less in each case than the following:—

Churches, Masonic Hall, Temperance Hall, Court House, 20,000 gallons.

Mechanics' Institute, Shire Hall, Cattle Yards, Trucking Yards, Botanic Gardens, Recreation Reserve, Police Station, and Post Office, 35,000 gallons.

State School, Railway Station and residence, 70,000 gallons.

7. For every public water trough the charge shall be Four pounds per annum.

8. The Trust may in writing intimate to any owner or occupier using water for domestic or any other purposes that the water supplied is to be charged for by measure, and may by such notice require such owner or occupier to provide and fix a meter within twenty-one days after the sending of such notice, and thereupon such owner or occupier shall within the time specified and at his own expense provide and fix a meter.

9. Provided that where any person desires to have the service-pipe of the Trust extended to his property and is willing to pay the cost of such extension, the Trust shall have power to make a special agreement with him regarding the payment for the water supplied.

10. For a supply of water during the erection of new buildings there shall be a charge of Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, cement or plastering, or if there be no contract, then upon the value or upon the amount charged or paid for such work.

11. In all cases not herein provided for the Trust shall make such special provision as may be deemed necessary.

12. In the event of any dispute which may arise regarding the charge made by the Trust, the Trust shall have the power to decide or make a special charge.

13. The before-mentioned rates and charges shall be payable in advance on the 1st day of January 1918, except in the cases of water supplied by measure the charges for which shall be made annually and shall be payable on the 30th day of November in each year.

14. For water supplied from stand-pipe or hydrant, there shall be a charge of One shilling for every 200 gallons or under.

15. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may appoint from time to time for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive and collect the said rates and charges.

In the construction of the By-law the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation whether aggregate or sole and the word "Trust" shall mean the Mortlake Waterworks Trust.

AVOCA TOWNSHIP WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW No. 8.

THE Avoca Township Waterworks Trust doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Water Acts (and whose Waterworks District has been for the purposes of the said Acts proclaimed an Urban District) make the By-law following:—

The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers and owners of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1918 in respect of water supplied by the Trust (that is to say):—

1. On every house or tenement, whether occupied or not, a rate of Two shillings for each pound sterling on the amount of the municipal value thereof; but the minimum amount to be paid shall be One pound ten shillings sterling.

2. Unoccupied lands where no water is laid on shall be charged Ten pounds per centum on the amount of the municipal valuation.

3. Private water troughs shall be charged at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum each, except when the Trust shall order a meter to be used, in which case the minimum quantity of water to be charged for half-yearly shall be ten thousand gallons (10,000).

4. Water for gas engines shall be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for each engine, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.

5. For water supplied by the Trust by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, or otherwise provided for in this By-law the rate shall be Fifteen pence per thousand gallons (1,000).

6. For steam boilers the rate shall be Twelve shillings and sixpence per annum for each horse-power of each boiler, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.

7. On buildings in course of erection where water is required for purposes the charge shall be Five shillings per thousand gallons (1,000) and the contractor, owner, or occupier of such premises shall provide and fix the water meter and all necessary fittings for same, otherwise the contractor, owner, or occupier of such premises may, by special agreement with the Trust, pay a minimum charge of Ten shillings per centum on the total cost of the work for stone buildings, or Two shillings and sixpence per cent. for wooden buildings, when a meter will not be required to be provided; or they may by special agreement with the Trust, pay the cost

of labour of laying and removing the necessary pipes, fittings, and a meter and the hire of a meter, at the rate of Ten shillings per annum, and for water at the rate of One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons, payments in either case to be made in advance.

8. Supplies of water for purposes not specified herein must be paid for at such a rate as the Trust shall in each case determine and the preliminary payment at such rate must be made at the office of the Trust before a supply can be taken or used.

9. In the event of any dispute as to which sub-section applies to any particular case, the Trust shall have the power to make a special charge.

10. For water supplied to public gardens, parks, and show grounds, the charge shall be Ninepence per 1,000 gallons and the supply must be taken through a meter.

11. A minimum rate of Five shillings and a maximum rate of Four pounds sterling, as the Commissioners may determine, shall be charged for every person using a hose for garden or stable watering during the year, in addition to the assessed rate payable for the premises on which such hose is used.

12. For all tenements in the said district situated otherwise than on streets in which pipes for the supply of water have been laid down and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand pipe for the supply of water, the rate shall be one half, and where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand pipe and within half-a-mile thereof, shall be one quarter the amount which would be payable if such tenement were supplied with water from the service pipes.

13. The rate and charges herein mentioned are hereby made payable in advance on the first day of January, 1918.

14. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and recover such rates and charges.

RUSHWORTH WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1918, No. 23.

THE Commissioners of the Rushworth Waterworks Trust, portion of the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an urban district for the purposes of the Water Acts, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Acts, hereby make the following By-law:—

The following are the rates and charges which the occupiers or owners of such lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1918 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the urban district of the Trust.

1. For every house or tenement of Ten pounds annual municipal valuation or under, the sum of Twenty shillings.

2. For every house or tenement of an annual municipal valuation exceeding Ten pounds, a rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling.

3. For every unoccupied allotment of land, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling of the annual municipal valuation of such allotment or piece of land. Provided that in no case shall a rate less than Ten shillings be charged.

4. For all lands and tenements situated otherwise than in streets in which pipes are laid down, and which are within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe of the Trust, there shall be paid one-half of the above rates; and for all such lands and tenements being over a quarter of a mile, but within half-a-mile from such stand-pipe, one-quarter of the full rate shall be paid.

5. For every steam boiler supplied with water by the Trust, there shall be paid the sum of Five pounds sterling; and all water used in excess of 95,000 gallons shall be paid for at the rate of 1s. per 1,000 gallons.

6. All water supplied by the Trust by measurement shall be at the following rates:—15,000 gallons for the first 20s. of the assessed water rate, and for each additional 20s. of assessed rate or portion thereof at the rate of 1s. per 1,000 gallons; all excess water shall be

charged for at the rate of 1s. per 1,000 gallons, but in no case shall the amount to be paid be less than that which would be payable for the premises under its municipal assessment.

7. Water supplied to the Government Departments, religious denominations, public parks, bowling greens, and persons outside the Trust District shall be by measurement or special agreement.

8. The above-mentioned rates and charges (except for water supplied by measure) shall be payable in equal moieties half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1918. Water supplied by measure shall be paid for on demand any time after it has been supplied.

9. Such person or persons as the Rushworth Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

10. No person without previously having affixed a water meter to his service pipes shall use for other than domestic purposes water supplied by the Trust. Domestic purposes shall not extend to the supply of water for horses or cows.

11. No meter shall be affixed until it shall have been examined and approved, and a certificate from the Board of Works or other authorized person be produced for the inspection of the Secretary of the Trust for the time being that such meter is in proper order.

12. Any person requiring to remove or alter the position of any meter shall give six days' notice in writing to that effect to the Trust, and a registration of the quantity of water used shall be taken before such removal or alteration is made.

13. Every meter must be fixed truly level, with connections above ground, approved by the Trust's supervising officer, which must, wherever practicable, be level with the ground, and within three feet of the building line of the property. Two wrought-iron bands must be fixed on each side of the meter, or lead connections used. The use of elbows will not be permitted.

14. The Trust will, upon application, supply a meter at cost price for cash on delivery, or on time payment on the following terms:—Ten shillings cash deposit, and balance bearing interest of 8 per cent. per annum by annual payments of Ten shillings.

MURTOA WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW No. 11.

THE Commissioners of the Murtoa Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, do make the following By-law:—

The following are the rates and charges which the occupier or owners of lands and tenements situated within the Waterworks District of the Murtoa Waterworks Trust shall pay for the year 1918 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said district:—

1. For any house or tenement fronting any street wherein a pipe for the supply of water shall have been laid or where houses or tenements if not fronting such a street are supplied with water by reticulation and being of an annual value of Ten pounds (£10) or under, the sum of One pound (20s.).

2. For every house or tenement so situated of an annual value of above Ten pounds (£10), the sum of Two shillings (2s.) in the pound sterling on the annual value of such property.

3. For every house or tenement of the annual value of Ten pounds (£10) or under situated in streets with no pipes and if not supplied with water, the sum of Ten shillings (10s.).

4. For every house or tenement above the annual value of Ten pounds (£10) in streets with no pipes and if not supplied with water, the sum of One shilling (1s.) in the pound on the annual value of such property.

5. Such before-mentioned rates shall be based on the municipal valuation of the several houses or tenements.

6. Such rate is hereby made for the year 1918 and shall be payable on the 1st January, 1918.

7. Such persons or person as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates.

8. Water supplied to Government Departments, religious denominations, and to persons outside the Trust district, shall be by measurement or special agreement.

9. For water supplied by the Trust for domestic and other than domestic purpose by measurement (except in cases of water supplied by special agreement with the Trust), the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge at Two shillings per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by measure by the Trust in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of Ninepence (9d.) per 1,000 gallons. In cases of large consumers of water by meter the Trust by special agreement may make a reduction to not less than Ninepence (9d.) per 1,000 gallons.

10. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in the previous clauses the minimum charge for water supplied by measurement or under special agreement must not be less than the charge would be if the property was rated in the usual way according to the shire valuation. This By-law also applies to the freezing works.

11. On properties where the officers consider it necessary a meter will be ordered to be put on, and in case of non-compliance the water will be cut off, according to the powers conferred by the Water Acts.

The foregoing By-law No. 11 was made by the Commissioners of the Murtoa Waterworks Trust, under and by virtue of the provisions of the Water Acts this 22nd day of September, 1917.

THE following rates and charges are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the Boort Waterworks Trust District shall pay for the year 1918, namely:—

2. On every house or tenement abutting or fronting every street within which the Trust shall have laid a main pipe for the purpose of supplying water, and such house or tenement, being of the annual value of Twenty pounds or less, according to the municipal valuation of such house or tenement for the said year, the sum of One pound fifteen shillings.

3. On every house or tenement abutting or fronting any street within which the Trust shall have laid a main pipe for the purpose of supplying water, and such house or tenement, being above the annual value of Twenty pounds, according to the municipal valuation for the said year, the sum of One shilling and ninepence (1s. 9d.) in the pound of such valuation.

4. On every house or tenement not abutting or fronting a street within which the Trust shall have laid a main pipe for the supply of water, and to which house or tenement the water shall not have been laid on, a rate of Thirteen shillings and sixpence shall be paid where the municipal valuation of such house or tenement does not exceed Eighteen pounds. Where such valuation exceeds Eighteen pounds, a rate of Ninepence in the pound shall be paid, provided that in no case shall a rate of less than Thirteen shillings and sixpence be paid.

5. In every case where the water shall have been laid on to a house or tenement not abutting or fronting a street within which the Trust shall have laid down a pipe for the purpose of supplying water, the rates provided by clauses 2 and 3 of this By-law shall be paid.

6. Every consumer of water must provide meters; all excess water over allotment covered by the valuation rate to be charged for at the rate of 10½d. per 1,000 gallons.

The above rates shall be due and payable on the first day of February, 1918.

Such person or persons as the Trust may appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates.

UNDER the powers conferred by the Water Acts and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, on the recommendation of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, doth hereby declare, order, and direct as follows:—

1. That the area included within the boundaries defined in the Schedule hereto shall be and the same is hereby constituted an Irrigation and Water Supply District (and as on and from the first day of July, 1917, such area shall be deemed to be so constituted).
2. That the boundaries of such district shall be those set out and described in the aforesaid Schedule.
3. That the name of such district shall be Werribee Irrigation and Water Supply District.
4. That the scheme of works for the service of such district consists of reservoirs on the Werribee River and tributaries, diversion weir on the Werribee River near Werribee, a system of main and distributary channels, and appurtenant works.
5. That the portion of the estimated cost of such works debitable to such district is £125,000.
6. That the quantity of water assigned to such district is 12,000 acre feet per annum.
7. That the source of supply is to be the Werribee River and its tributaries.
8. That the season at which such supply is to be received is to embrace the whole year.

MUTTON BIRDS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the State of Victoria, and Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the said State and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Game Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do hereby prescribe the conditions upon which licences to take or destroy mutton birds and the eggs of such birds shall be issued, the terms for which such licences respectively shall be current, and the fees payable for such licences respectively as follows:—

CONDITIONS.

Licensees shall not—

- (a) camp on any mutton bird rookery; or
- (b) take or cause or allow to be taken, any dog on to any mutton bird rookery; or
- (c) damage, or cause to be damaged, any mutton bird burrow; or
- (d) remove birds or eggs from any mutton bird burrow except by using the hand or a crook made of double wire (or other suitable material) without protruding ends or sharp hooks; or
- (e) use any net for the purpose of taking or destroying mutton birds; or
- (f) take eggs of mutton birds except between the hours of Four o'clock in the morning and Seven o'clock in the evening; or
- (g) take or destroy any mutton bird or any egg of a mutton bird except from rookeries on Phillip Island.

If any licensee fails to observe any of the foregoing conditions his licence shall thereupon be forfeited.

TERMS.

The terms for which such licences respectively are to be current shall be—

- (a) for licences to take or destroy mutton birds, from the fifteenth day of April to the eighth day of May in the year of issue;
- (b) for licences to take or destroy the eggs of mutton birds, from the twentieth day of November to the fifth day of December in the year of issue.

FEES.

The fees payable for such licences respectively shall be—

- (a) for each licence to take or destroy mutton birds, Ten shillings;
- (b) for each licence to take or destroy the eggs of mutton birds, Two shillings and sixpence.

And I do further prescribe a penalty not exceeding ten pounds for any contravention of any of the foregoing provisions of this Proclamation.

And I do hereby further prescribe that any person not being the holder of a licence in that behalf who in contravention of the Game Acts takes or destroys any mutton bird shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds in addition to the sum of Five shillings for each mutton bird taken or destroyed; and that any person not being the holder of a licence in that behalf who in contravention of the Game Acts takes or destroys any egg of a mutton bird shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds in addition to a sum of Two shillings and sixpence for each egg taken or destroyed.

And I do further prescribe that any licensee who fails to produce his licence to the Inspector of Fisheries or any assistant to the said inspector, or any member of the police force when so required, or when afforded reasonable opportunity for so doing, shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds.

Any tag lost during the currency of the licence shall be replaced by another similar tag, to be purchased by the licensee from the Council at a like price.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.
