# RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE MITIAMO PUBLIC CEMETERY.

I N pursuance of the powers conferred by the Cometeries Act 1915, the Trustees of the Mitimo Public Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations

- 1. These rules and regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the Government Gazette, and from and after such publication all rules and regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded
- 2. All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders are given.
- 3. Any person desiring ground for a private grave shall apply to the Trustees therefor, who, if the application is approved and the prescribed fees are paid, will issue a burial right (Schedule B) which shall give the holder and his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right on obtaining the permission of the Trustees, as hereafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotath, tablet, or other erection therein. taph, tablet, or other erection therein.
- 4. Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or other erection shall apply to the Trustees for permission to do so, and submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the Trustees.
- 5. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a Coroner, Justice of the Peace, or Registrar of Deaths has been delivered to the Secretary (gatekeeper or sexton).
- 6. Application for an order for interment shall be made at least eight working hours before the time fixed for the burial.
- 7. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below the ordinary level of the ground, and a layer of earth at least six inches thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.
- 8. The hours for burials shall be—On week days. September to April inclusive, 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.; May to August inclusive. 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. No interment shall be allowed on Sunday except when it is certified in writing by the Officer of Health of the district, or by a Police Magistrate, or Justice of the Peace that for sanitary reasons it is necessary that the burial take place on that day; and on payment of the special fee as provided.
- 9. No re-interment or removal from another cometery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the Coroner, Justice of the Peace, or Registrar of Deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.
- 10. The Trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but any person having paid the fee for a private grave and requiring a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same subject to the approval of the Trustees, but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented.
- 11. No private grave shall be re-opened or any interment permitted therein without the consent in writing of the person entitled to give the same.

- 12. No person employed by the Trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall he be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the Cemetery other than that for which he receives payment or for which he has special authority from the Trustees.
- 13. The Cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from 7 a.m. to sunset daily throughout the year.
- 14. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower, or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the Cemetery, unless with the previous authority of the Trustees.
- 15. No smoking shall be allowed nor any firearms discharged within the Cemetery.
- 16. No dogs shall be allowed in the Cemetery.

By-LAW No. 751.—General Rate.—Werniber Irrigation and Water Supply District.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law follow-

- 1. A General Rate of Twelvepence in the pound of the rateable value of all lands within the Werribee Irrigation and Water Supply District, except within any Uyban Division thereof, is hereby made under the provisions of the Water Acts, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of all such lands for the supply of water for the domestic and ordinary use of persons dwelling thereon, and for watering cattle or other stock.
- 2. Such rate is made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the first day of July, 1917, and ending with the thirtieth day of June, 1918, and shall be payable on the ninth day of November, 1917, at the office of the said Commission, at Werribee.
- 3. Such person or persons as the said Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rate.
- 4. For making and levying such rate, the value of the lands set out in the valuation made, in accordance with the provisions of the Water Act 1915, by Frank Bassett. valuer, returned on the 27th day of October, 1917, and adopted by the said Commission on the 29th day of

October, 1917, shall be deemed and taken to be the rateable value of such lands unless altered or amended as provided by the Water Act 1915, and if so altered or amended then the net annual value of such lands set out in such altered or amended valuation.

THE Commissioners of the Warracknabeal Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, make the following By-law for the year 1918.

The following are the rates which the occupiers or owners of land or tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied for domestic purposes by the Warracknabeal Waterworks Trust, that is to say, in regard to houses and tenements fronting any street in which pipes for water supply are laid, or which houses or tenements, if not on such street, are supplied by reticulation from such pipes: such pipes :--

1. For every allotment of land, whether occupied or otherwise, where water is not being used, and of less than Ten pounds sterling annual municipal value, the sum of Two shillings in the pound on the amount of the sum of

municipal valuation.

2. For every house or tenement of Thirteen pounds or under, municipal value, a rate of One pound shall

be paid.

3. For every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Thirteen pounds per annum, the sum of One shilling and sixpence in the pound shall be paid on the annual value of such property.

4. For all tenements in the said district situate otherwise than on streets in which pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within one-quarter of a mile from any main or stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the above-mentioned rate, and where such tenements are more than one-quarter of a mile from such main or stand-pipe, and within half-a-mile, one-fourth the beforementioned rate.

5. Such owners of tenements as are supplied with water

stand-pipe, and within half-a-mile, one-fourth the beforementioned rate.

5. Such owners of tenements as are supplied with water by meter shall pay at the rate of One shilling and three-pence per 1,000 gallons up to the quantity they would be entitled to receive according to their assessment, and at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons for anything over that quantity.

6. Such occupiers or owners of tenements not within the Trust area, and who have agreed with the Trust to be supplied with water by meter, shall pay at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

7. Such owners or occupiers of gardens, steam engines, or stock who are supplied from the Trust reservoir with water shall, if the Commissioners think fit, pay an extravate beyond that which they are already paying (if any) if, in the opinion of the Trust, such occupiers or owners are not paying a just proportionate rate for the water they are using. Such occupiers or owners-to be notified in writing of such charge.

8. Such rates are hereby made payable half-yearly, in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1918. Such person or persons as the Commissioners may appoint from time to time for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

(e) For every vacant allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust District beforementioned, separately from any building, a rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling on the amount of the annual municipal valuation of the same.

(f) A minimum rate of One pound five shillings sterling, and a maximum rate of Six pounds sterling, and a maximum rate of Six pounds sterling, as the Commissioners may determine, shall be charged every person using a hose for gardening and stable purposes during the year, in addition to the rate on the annual municipal valuation.

(g) For every trough or other receptacle used for watering horses or other stock, a rate of One pound sterling per annum, provided that the trough or other receotacle is situated within the Trust district, a rate of Fifteen shillings per annum will be charged.

(h) The charge for water supplied by meter shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons up to the maximum quantity covered by the rate payable in respect of, the property in connexion with which the meter is affixed, and One shilling per 1,000 gallons for all water used in excess of such quantity. Provided that the water used be for manufacturing purposes, the quantity used in excess, shall be Sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

(i) For the temporary supply of water during the erection of new buildings, a sum of Ten shillings per centum on the amount of contract for brick and plastering shall be made, or if there be no contract, then upon the value, or on the amount charged or paid for brick work or plastering. All persons about to build must notify the Trust of their intentions to do so.

(j) In any case where rates, charges, &c., are not naid when due the water may be cut off until

do so.

(j) In any case where rates, charges, &c., are not paid when due, the water may be cut off until such amounts are paid.

(k) The charge for water supplied from the Trust's stand-pipe shall be Threepence per 100 gallons.

2. The foregoing rates are hereby made payable in equal moieties, half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January, 1918, and 1st day of July, 1918.

THE Commissioners of the Bairnsdale Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, hereby make the following By-law for determining the rates and charges to be paid in respect of water supplied or available for supply within the Urban District of the Trust during the calendar year

1918:—

(1) The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers or owners of land, houses, and tenements situated within the Urban District of the Trust shall pay in respect of water supplied or available for supply to such land, houses, and tenements situated on any street in which pipes for water supply are laid, or which land, houses, or tenements, if not on such street, are supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes for the year commencing on the first day of January, 1918, and ending on the 3ist day of December, 1918, and such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges:—

(a) On every house or tenement of Twenty pounds annual municipal value or under, Twenty shillings per annum.

(b) On every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Twenty pounds, at a rate of One shilling for every One pound per annum of such valuation.

(c) On all vacant allotments of land, at a rate of One shilling for every One pound per annum of the municipal valuation thereof.

(d) For water supplied from the wharf at Bairnsdale for shipping and other purposes, a minimum charge of Sixpence per 100 gallons, or Sixpence for any fractional part thereof, and a minimum charge of Three shillings per 1,000 gallons, or Three shillings for any fractional part thereof exceeding 500 gallons, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust.

(c) For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, or water supplied under terms of sub-section (g) of section 1 of this By-law, One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

- (f) Water supplied to manufactories, aerated water and cordial makers, brewers, bakers, butchers, livery and coach-horse stables, hotel premises, and for any other than domestic purposes may be charged for by measurement at the discretion of the Trust.
  (g) Water supplied to Government Departments, mechanics' institutes, churches, cricket clubs, and bowling greens shall be charged by measurement at the discretion of the Trust.
  (h) Private water troughs will be charged for at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum, where the valuation of the property on which such troughs are situated does not exceed £20. Such trough charge of 20s. will mean to include the rate at valuation. Where the valuation of the property exceeds £20, the trough to be exempt from rating purposes, except when, in the opinion of the Trust, a meter shall be necessary.
  (i) The charge for water supplied to market
- when, in the opinion of the Trust, a meter shall be necessary.

  (i) The charge for water supplied to market gardens or fruit gardens shall be at the rate of 1s. per 1,000 gallons, by measurement at the discretion of the Trust, a meter to be fixed at the expense of the ratepayer.

  (j) For water supplied for new buildings being creeted, at the rate of £1 per cent. on the contract for labour and material of all stone, brick, concrete, and plastering work, or any other work where water is used, and to be arranged for before the work is commenced.

  (k) The service-pipe for conveying the water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of the consumer shall in no case exceed the follow
  - consumer shall in no case exceed the following diameter:-

g diameter:

(1) For domestic supply of premises not exceeding £40 annual municipal value, half (½) inch diameter.

For the domestic supply of premises with an annual municipal valuation of £40 or over, a three-quarter of an inch service may be allowed at the discretion of the Trust.

(2) For the supply of water for other than domestic purposes and for supplies by meter, such diameter as the Trust shall authorize in each case.

(1) Each house or tenement must be provided with

- Each house or tenement must be provided with a separate service from the main. Water supplied to market gardens, nurseries, or for any irrigation purposes shall be charged for by meter at the rate of 1s. per 1,000 gallons in addition to the usual rate for a domestic supply on the basis of valuation. A separate service from the main for a domestic supply may be allowed at the discretion of the Trust.
- (2) The rates and charges for water and all sums due to the Trust under this By-law shall be paid by and recoverable from the occupier of the premises, or owner, or the person requiring, receiving, or using the supply
- (3) The said rates and all charges for water supplied otherwise than by meter or by special agreement, shall be payable in advance, by equal instalments, on the 1st day of January, 1918, and on the 1st day of July, 1918.

All charges for water supplied by meter or by special agreement shall be payable half-yearly, or at such time or times as may be determined by the Trust. The first payment shall, in respect of rates, be made at the time when the occupier or owner shall become liable to pay the rates for the supply of water hereinbefore mentioned.

In construction of this By-law the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole, and the word "Trust" shall mean the Bairnsdale Waterworks Trust.

(3) For every occupied or unoccupied allotment, or vacant lot, the rate to be paid shall be at the rate of Eightpence in the pound sterling, according to the municipal valuation of such allotment. Provided that in no case shall a less rate than Six shillings each be charged.

(4) For every township allotment on which there is a stock trough or any other facility for watering stock, a charge of Ten shillings (10s.) per annum shall be paid.

(5) For all lands and tenements situated otherwise than in streets in which pipes are laid down,

(h) In case of any dispute as to the sub-section applying to any particular case, the Trust shall have the power to decide or to make a special rate.

(i) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure for domestic or other purposes shall be the quantity which at Fourpence per 100 gallons equals the amount of assessed rate for the year which would be payable for the premises or land supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

The above-mentioned road-making materials shall, when consigned to City, Town, Borough and Shire Councils, and the freight charges on the consignments are paid by the Councils, be charged the rates specified hereunder. The trucks must be loaded as far as possible to the full carrying capacity, and the minimum charge shall be as for 6 tons per four-wheeled truck.
